 Gays hammocks, but I have made arrangement for
 some and are in hopes of getting them ~~to~~ to you in time
 also with other articles our friends may have to send
 We had a meeting this week which was quite interest-
 ing I was please to the Eyes of the members for the paper
 I have also given some of them to Mr Maul Moselle
 of Saint Gays, who promises his cooperation, but I
 am sorry to say that from Mr Croft & Subey we may not
 expect much. from the fact that they think by meeting
 the Question here will not tend to foster the Emancipa-
 tion of the Enslaved, or that the Question is unpop-
 ular here. the latter I am afraid is the Cause, but I hope

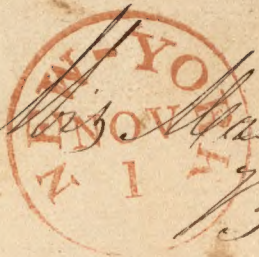
When we have received our Constitution. and the
