The interest you have taken & manifested in the anti Slavery cause, I feel will be a sufficient passport for an excuse for the ^{liberty} take in making to you a suggestion in regard to the lectures in course of delivery at Amory Hall. The object of the lectures as I understand the matter was a pecuniary one for the ^{of} Anti Slavery Society, that object has probably been attained by the tickets sold, to the extent that it will be, or nearly so. "Therefore" would it not be obtaining another and perhaps more important end, if tickets ~~were~~ ^{should} be distributed, among that class of persons, who do not take interest enough in the cause to pay for what they might learn by hearing this course of lectures, I think no one who has purchased tickets would feel hurt. if tickets should be distributed. to fill the hour - our representatives are a "curious" class of men, perhaps, an impression favorable for the Anti Slavery cause might be made on them, I might write more, but will leave the subject to your good description -
