 Canterbury & Brooklyn, where all is commotion, but the
 cause of the oppressed, will be maintained, the school
 will go into operation next week, and I trust will be
 nobly supported. Brother May stands his ground, and
 having truth, & the God of truth, on his side, finds
 no great difficulty, in contending against, ^{a host} of his enemies,
 who have had to resort, to the base measures, of falsehood,
 and misrepresentation, and to Colonization, to sustain
 themselves, as you will see, by the Common Repub-
lican, which I mailed to you yesterday, The
 Courier of this week, published in the same city,
 contains an article, signed by several, of the
 Canterbury Sentinel, which paper, I could not get,
 but you would do well to procure it, if prop-
 ible, for any thing better calculated to deceive, was
 never penned, but they have committed a most
 mistake, in appealing to the principals of the Colo-
 nization Society, to excuse their hostility to the school,
 and to the welfare of our free coloured popula-
 tion, the anxiety which I feel to see the best
 measures adopted, at this critical juncture, will
 probably bring me to your city next week, if I
 do not hear from you before. As I wish to say
 a good deal to you, & others, before another agent, is
