when at my House some four weeks since
1²⁵/₁₀₀ Dolly for six months subscription of
the Liberator, to be sent to this office for
F. J. Hays, he call'd to day to see me about
it says he has call'd at the post office for it

him please enquire whether it has been
forwarded, If they are on hand please com-
mence with the back numbers, so far as
to have the proceedings of the women's
rights meeting in Phila as he is anxious
to see the account of their proceedings,
Lucy Stone had three Lectures here after
the West Chester meeting, her meetings
increased in numbers and respectability
to the last, she realised about 50 Dolly over
expences by the three Lectures, and we
were much gratified by having her in
our family during her visit here, she
is a sweet spirited pure woman, I took
her to see Sarah Ann Scofield, the female

Machinist, mention'd at the women's
rights meeting in Phila, and I think
they were both pleased with the inter-
view - My list of Slaves has now got
to 1874 having pass'd seven this day
week, and one the day previous, and the
best of it is, for our little State they were
all natives of Delaware, would to God, that
all the remaining Slaves would run off before
this time next year, so that we might
take rank with the nominally Free States.
for I have hopes, that bad as they have
been, and still are, there is some evidence
of Improvement. - with sincere desires
for thy health and Happiness I remain
