 ed our most sanguine expectations. They  
 were about \$145<sup>c</sup>. After the close of our  
 fair we had a pleasant entertainment, speeches,  
 &c (a miniature seizure) ~~to which we were~~  
~~indebted~~ to which we are indebted for about  
 \$25. of our receipts + much good feeling &  
 we hope advantage to our cause generally.  
 Many of our best articles have been of  
 course selected, and an exposure for sale  
 five or six days, cannot fail to injure the



appearance of fancy goods, but we send them to you as they are, that you may dispose of them to the best advantage, adapting the prices to the demand, if they are too high. — I see little prospect that we shall be represented this year. —

We received the letter cases package, one day after the closing of our fair the 10<sup>th</sup>. We had intended to have made that an occasion for their disposal, that they might in addition to their dissemination, have been a source of income to the fair. —

We have not yet appropriated our money, but it will probably, \$100 — if it redeem our pledge to the Am. Soc. \$50 go to the Liberator, and the balance for local expenses. — Wishing you all success the coming week, I am Truly Yours
