Gray Hall Edinburgh 11-11-1853

My dear Friend, above thou hast a statement of the contents of the box of contributions sent off yesterday to be shipped by first Boston steamer for the Anti-Slavery Bazaar. I hope they will all reach thee in safety & prove available for the good cause. We shall be glad to learn if they escape a heavy duty - as certainly such things should go duty free - being free contributions to the cause of freedom. Our invoice includes contributions from Boston, Leigh - Chelmsford, Leeds, Nottingham & Maidstone but of course these comprise but a small part of the whole. Our own Edinburgh friends have come out well & could bring all our gossippities, we have not much cause to complain - although of course we should have wished to send double the amount, if we could. My mother has

written a letter to thee which is enclosed with a
 parcel from Mrs Buchanan - it is a small parcel
 mention it that it may not escape thy observation
 think there is no end for my adding more as she
 has said all we wish to say - we have much
 enjoyed during the summer seeing some of the anti-slavery
 friends from your land - Among others Cornelius Brumley
 his wife, James Miller McKim of Philadelphia of
 course Harriet Beecher Stowe - although the interest
 connected with each of these individuals is per-
 different I cannot but think that all are united
 by the one great wish I earnestly work in the
 great work of hastening the day of the Slave's
 emancipation - we watch with increasing interest
 all the movements going forward amongst you
 for this object, I earnestly desire that all may
 tend to promote it - we have not yet had the pleasure
 of seeing thy sister but yet hope an opportunity
 may be afforded us for this gratification - Mary Estelle
 writes that her father is better I do hope his recovery
 may be permanent for he is a faithful worker -

About a month since Wilson Armitage offered
 forward to us for enclosure a large package of his
 new tracts - but the parcel would have made our
 boxes quite unwieldy - so with his consent we despatched
 it direct - It first has arrived in safety - the tracts
 are a very useful series we are glad to have them for
 distribution to help to enlighten the good people of our
 country - we see that the "Cain, Doll" is published separate
 if you are sending gazettes (we hope to have as many as you
 can share) we should like a few copies of "Mary's Doll" I shall
