New York May 1,1833.

My dear Brother;

In after minutes, I leave this port for Liverpool, in the packet ship Hibernia; consequently I have scarcely to scrawl my name. The packet ship Mr. Mervin was promptly delivered. I had considerable conversation with Mr. Tappan, respecting you as an agent for the N.Z. anti Slavery Society. His only doubts seemed to be whether you could arrange your business and whether your compensation could be secured as the funds of the Society were nearly exausted. I think he regards such an agency favorably. I wish you would correspond with Sammel Z. Sowell, Baje., the Corr. Sec. of the Society, and state to him, confidentially but explicitly, your views and situation.
