My dear Debra

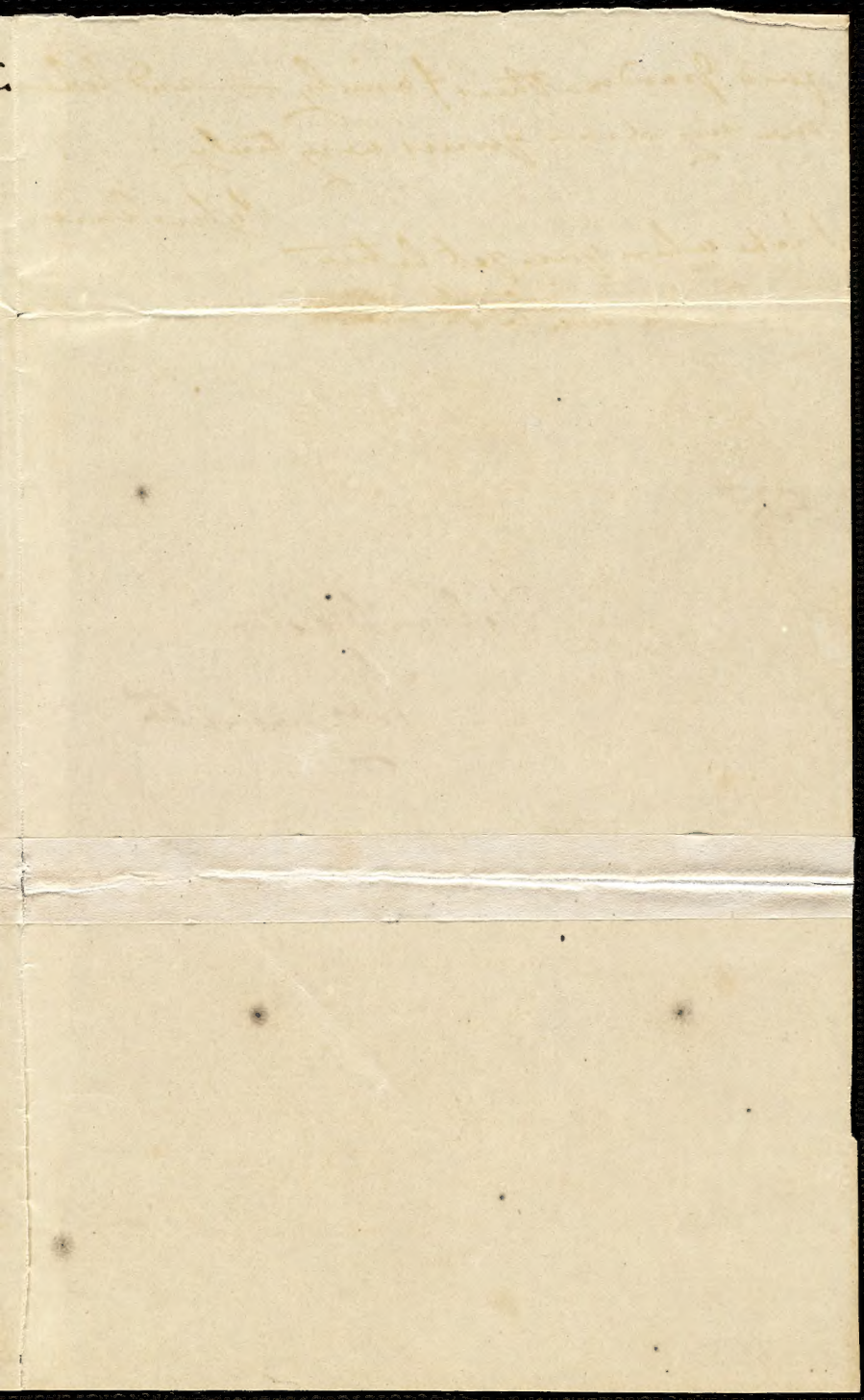
I am almost ashamed
