My dear Friend

Last evening whilst looking over the
list of arrivals by the Ades in a Manchester
paper of yesterday morning, I saw the
names Miss A. W. Weston & Mr Weston.
Although I was not here an opportunity of
taking you by the hand I don't like to
omit welcoming you to my neighbour-
hood, as W. P. Rogers might have said.
It is ever so long since I had a line from
any of your family. Mrs Chubman, from
whom I used to hear so often, best writes
to me now. Indeed I cannot blame her
for I have little to take which she would
care to hear - and although my interest in
America is as warm and as active as
ever, I have ceased to be even a fly on the
wheel of reform. I know you cannot write
much - but I would be very glad to hear
how you and how all your letters are
and what is your view in the present ~~season~~

momentary crisis of American politics.
A very few lines from you or on your
behalf would be a great gratification
to me.

About a year ago in consequence of
the excitement ~~caused~~ of a contested election
in Dublin I had an attack of heart disease
from which I have not entirely recovered.
I was obliged to spend three months
at a sanatory establishment in which
Turkish Batters are the principal curative
agency. I took eighty of these batters &
was wonderfully benefitted. I look
well as ever on my health, but am easily
fatigued and am unable to walk for
intervals feeling more tired than the efforts
seem to warrant.

I hope next week to visit Manchester
to attend the Local Society Convention,
but chiefly in the hope of see meeting Miss
Ettles whom I have not seen for a long
time. We will both stay with a mutual
friend Mrs Moore, Park Street.

I hope you have not had a very
bad time on the paper. Here the
