I have your letter of the 11th inst. & thank you

prove themselves eventually to be on
the right side; some of the noisy ones
have been heard on the wrong side &
some of us have been kept in a degree
of silence by our anxiety that your
nation should command the voice
on your side as that of the right.
I am sure you must be glad that
there have now been many to speak
out on the side of the North - inasmuch
as the North has been the friend of
the slave - I do hope it will be more
so. - I was uneasy about the admission
of Sumner, who was received into the
Senate with slaves, as a premium to
loyalty - so it seemed - I should like to

very gratifying. I enclose a speech of
the Duke of Argyll which I think is
deserving of a place in the Standard Liberator.
