1833

My dear Miss Weston

I trouble you
with a note & apologise
for the mistake that
was made in sending
our last Bazaar Box
without having prepaid
the carriage, it arose
from an accidental
misunderstanding on the
part of the person who
undertook to forward it.

I believe I mentioned
when I wrote last, that
I had received no bill

of ladning & enclose, w
my letter to you; but
though I feared, that
omission might cause
you some trouble in
claiming the box, I was
not aware (until I had
repeatedly applied to
Mr. Jarr. & Co. of Liverpool
for their account) that
they had, inadvertently
made it chargeable
upon you. I hope
this mistake may
not have occasioned
you much trouble or
inconvenience. And,
if you will be good

enough & let me
know, when you write
again, the amount,
you have thus been
compelled to advance
for our Society

I will take the
earliest opportunity
of transmitting it
& you through a
mercantile house
