writes I think ~~these~~ contributions
must far exceed ours - we took
no list of ours and cannot
therefore guess at their value
with any exactness - We find
a ridiculous parcel was gone in
one box - one lady brought a
parcel of old linen for another
lady belonging to the Committee,
and after the box was sent
to the steamer, the parcel
was nowhere to be found!
