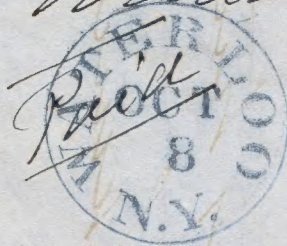

under the hospitable roof of our
friend Thomas McClintock. I came
here to lecture against Capital
Punishment, on my way to a large
meeting at Dundee on Seneca
Lake. Soon after my arrival -
friend McClintock put into my
hands yours of the 4th, received last
evening. It has relieved my anxiety
about you in some respects - but
increased it in others. - I have not
known - nor suspected until now the
nature of your disease. Frederick
Douglass was very much troubled
that he did not get any tidings
from you when he reached Syracuse
on the 24th of Sep. He left you delect-
edly - yet thinking that you would
follow on in a day or two - and as
he did not get any word from
you at Waterloo, nor at Auburn,
