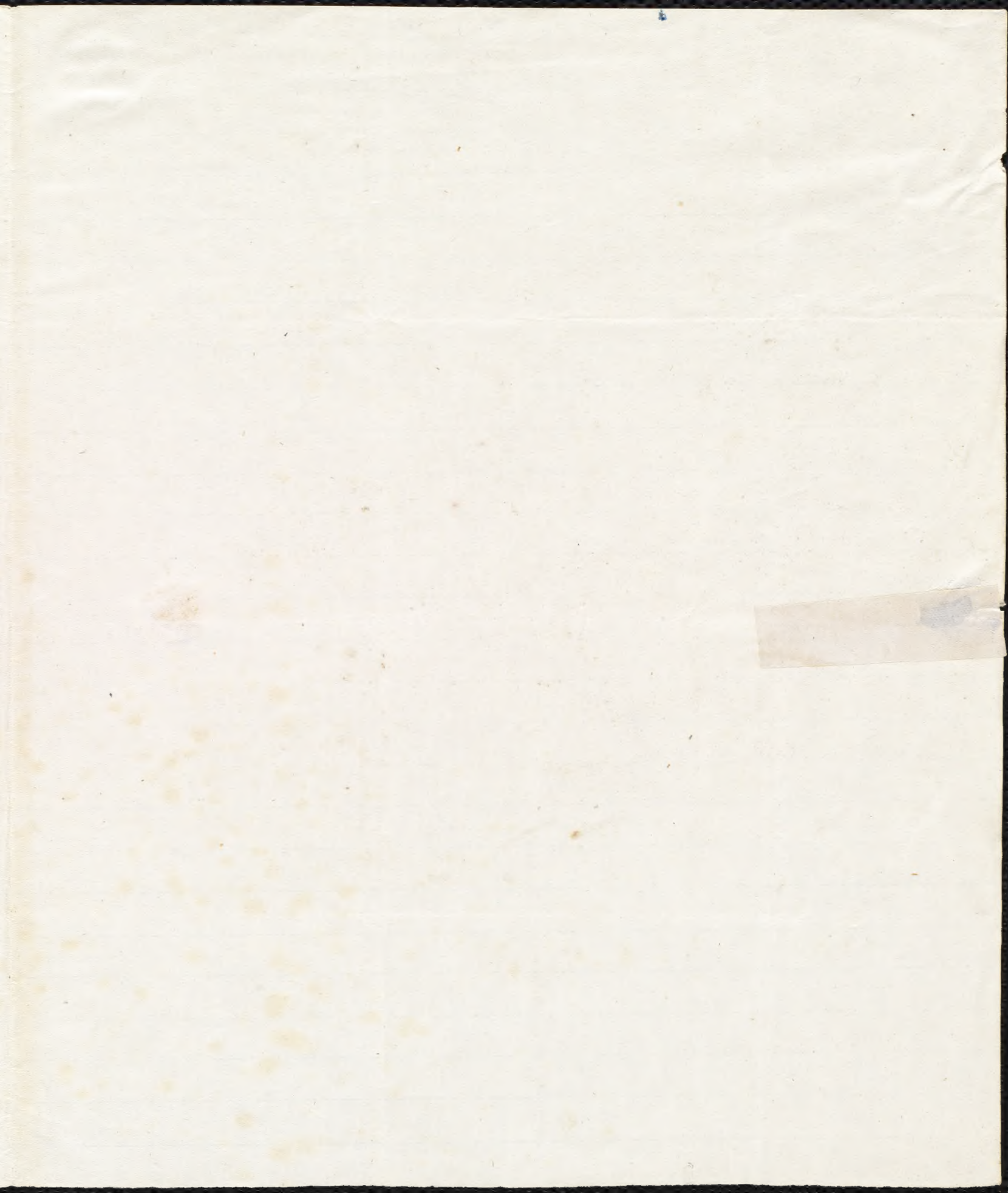
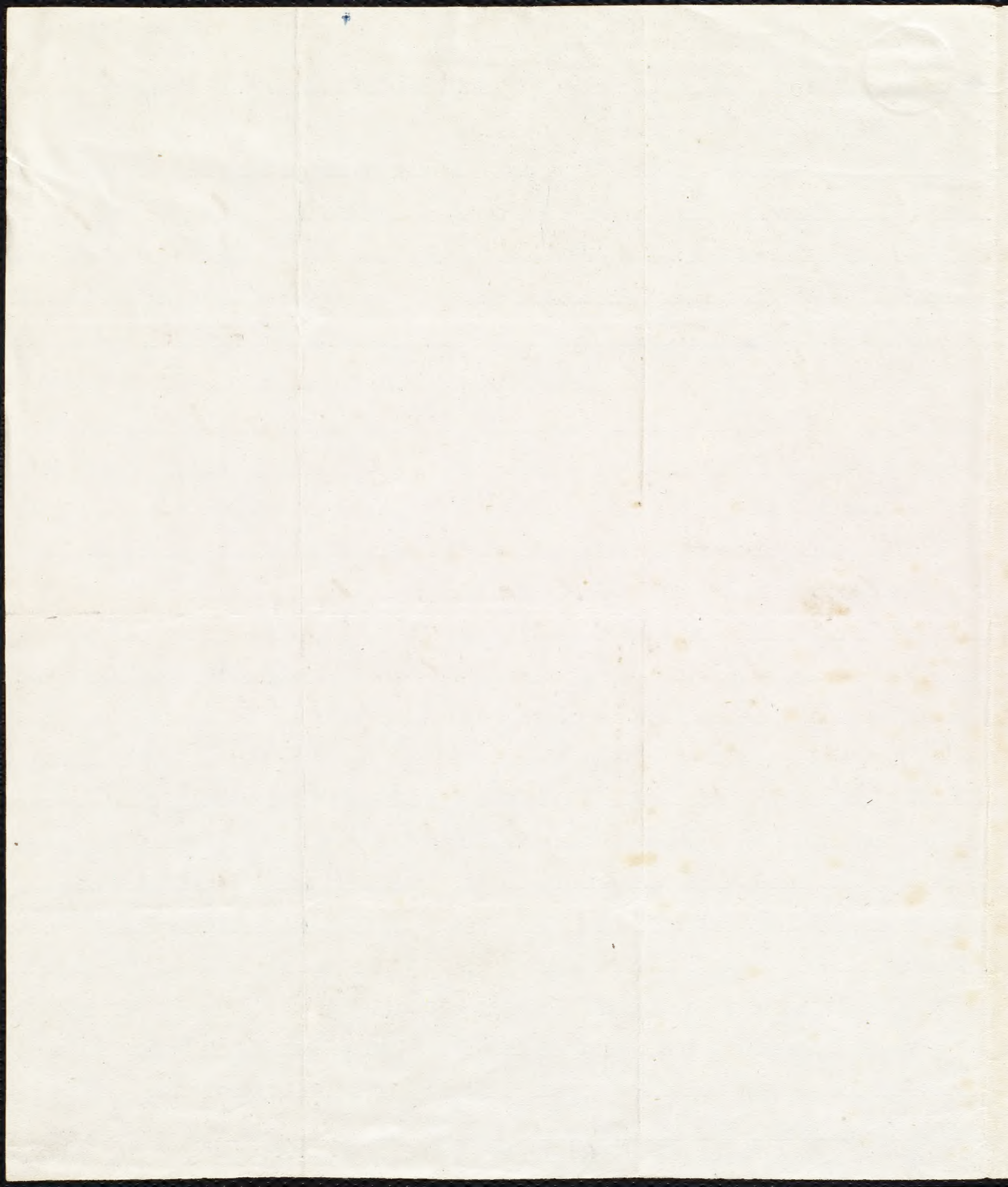

Thou wilt perceive by the hand-bill that accompanies this brief communication that we have had some colonisation agitation & thou wilt likewise perceive that we have pleaded ourselves to meet them or to have a meeting to show to the public as I have no doubt thou canst better than any other person the wickedness & deception of the colonisation scheme. I therefore make this earnest request in behalf of the ^{Executive committee of the} "Soc. A. S. Society" that thou wilt favour us with thy company & a Lecture on the subject on 10th day Evening next the 10th Inst. if that time will be as convenient for thee if not please specify some time that will be more so within the time specified in the hand-bill.

I would suggest to thee to prepare thyself with the ^{most} new developments in regard to the colony & of our committee spoke of Dr. Skinner's report. The two Agents that have been lecturing here are Doct. Brown a Resident Physician & a Rev. Mr. Corntius who has resided in the colony some time they deny that the former statements against the colony any longer exist or therefore wish to meet them with new facts that they may not be prepared to dispute or deny. I conclude by again requesting thee to come without fail. I will meet thee at the depot in Seabrook any time, please write by return mail thy friend Quind Mitchell
