On another page you have an account of the Maryland Scheme. Mr. Knapp's bill shows 2000, but all I received from the binder was 1987. These I credited you at 3% per hundred, being a little advance on the cost. The account is made out according to the best of my judgement no particular agreement having been made by us in relation to them. You will see that we have sold but very few. I thought not best to keep many on hand. If the account is not rendered as you consider proper, you will please return it as soon as may ^{be} and state wherein you think it should be altered.

I send also your other account with our Society, thinking you might like to know how it ^{stands}. You can act your pleasure in regard to sending the balance by Mr. May. I feel no other care about it than this - a considerable item in the account is for the Oasis, the pay for which Mrs. Child can put to very good use at any time
