Rockledge, Sunday Evening. <sup>Oct. 29</sup> 1865

My dear Mr Kim:

I send you Mr. Gazzam's  
 letter, in order to say, that I shall  
 hold myself bound to give my first

lecture in Pittsburgh, before the Tennyson Club, on the evening designated Monday, Dec. 4th. I have written to him that, on the whole, I prefer not to give a subsequent lecture, but rather to leave Pittsburgh on Tuesday for Philadelphia, and wish him to so apprise the friends. At the same time, I have expressed a willingness to meet a select company on Sunday evening or Monday afternoon, in private, in behalf of the Freedmen's Commission.

You see if I hold two public meetings consecutively at Pittsburgh, the pecuniary result for the Tennyson Club will be diminished, even though I should speak first for them. Besides, I expect to be fairly broken down by that time, and shall wish to get away on Tuesday morning, the 5th for Philad. I send this for your guidance.
