The rally moved rapidly with skits, routines, and cheers by the Songleaders and Cheerleaders. Preceeding the announcement of the queen, the classes were led in the Spirit Yell, with a Sophomore victory.

A parade began the evening with the queen's float and those floats of the classes, and organizations. At half time the float winners were announced, with seniors taking firșt, juniors second, and sophomores third.
