The beginning of a new adventure, the end of adolescence, we now look upon the paths opening into the future that awaits us all.

In 1972, nervous and reluctant freshmen scanned the corridors of Liberty Union High School and the Class of 1976 took their new place in the world of higher education. To lead the 367 wide-eyes and wondering were the brave Ben Tutor, president; David Broussard, vice president; Ruth Maiocco, secretary; Daniel Broussard, treasurer; Greg Robinson, representative; and Miss Reta Pirtle and Mr. Dennis Buckley, advisers.

The Class of 76 experienced their first scheduling of classes during the September "Merry-go-round" in which they had a very confusing time.

As Homecoming rolled around, the freshmen put all their know-how together to produce their third place float with the theme "Stomp the Mats". They also placed second in the bike race and fourth in the tug-o-war contest. Ruth Maiocco received the Most Spirited Awards for their freshmen class.

Busy in their kitchens and with water hoses, (although not always squirting cars) the freshmen made their profits from numerous bake sales and car washes.

These wide-eyed freshmen soon found themselves to be the most wide-mouthed sophomores that the campus of Liberty has ever seen. To prove our point, these once scared freshmen turned into sophomores who won every competition yell at all the rallies-well, all except one. Renee Vornhagen and Greg Wong became recipients of the Most Spirited Sophomores Award.

This class also moved up on the charts as they placed second in the float competition during their second Homecoming with the theme "Grind the Liver-more". To help with the organizing of this float and the various bake sales and car washes were Kathy Serna, president; Lisa Mune, vice president; Terri Tipton, secretary; Lori Modrall, treasurer; Julie DeSair, representative; and Miss Pirtle and Mr. Jerry Black (who replaced Mr. Buckley) as advisers.

On April 26, 1975, experiencing their first semi-formal dance with the theme "In the Still of the Night" the sophomores held their Sophomore Hop. To highlight the evening was the crowning of Greg Robinson and Sandy DelBarba as the King and Queen. The Princess runner-ups were Debbie Celoni, Ruth Maiocco, Faye Pastor, and Kaye Pastor, while the Prince runner-ups were David Hernandez, Bob DePiazza, Tony Berumen, and David Broussard. These unforgettable moments were filled with the sounds of "Madness".

To provide the guiding lines for the juniors, Sandy Pittman, president; Terri Tipton, vice president; Jennifer Beaver, secretary; Becky Rebeiro, treasurer were elected. Miss Pirtle and Mr. Black again aided them but this time through the years known as "Big Bad Juniors".

With long hours of making flowers, the juniors shot their way to second place with the theme "Take off to Victory". Homecoming proved to be successful as Lisa Mune and Rick Howard captured second place in the egg toss and Della Ramos ate her way to third in the "Pie Eating Contest". Because of their continuous help and spirit, Mari Puente and Ken Rogers received the Most Spirited Award for juniors of their class.

On the eve of April 5, 1975, the juniors all met together to form their Junior Prom with the theme "Memories". They danced to the sounds of "Get Ready". Again this marked one of those unforgettable times that filled their lives while in attendance at Liberty.

As the Summer of ' 75 passed, the juniors soon found themselves to be the "Mighty, Mighty, Seniors". Through all the knowledge and experience of age gained in their years here at Liberty, they tied for first for the Homecoming Trophy. The points were won by devoted seniors who spent all hours making and putting up posters, saving pennies, and winning events such as the "Pie Eating Contest". The all faithful Leslie Roma and Rick Mello were the last of their class to receive the Most Spirited Awards.

The seniors chose April 24, 1976, at Boundary Oaks as their date and location for that one last dance together. They were served Top Sirloin Steak and danced the night away to the sound of "Elements Precise". Many seniors were filled with joy as they realized "Our Day Has Come"; others felt only sadness.

The seniors next went to Great America in Santa Clara on their GRAD Night. For their senior picnic they went to Oak Park in Stockton where they ice skated, played tennis, baseball, swam-and most of all-ate.
We should give thanks to Laurie McLendon, president; Debbie Rego, vice president; Lauir Bausch, secretary; Julie Conway, treasurer; Miss Pirtle and Mr. Black, advisers; for making all the necessary arrangements for these senior activities.

On June 11, 1976, the 262 graduating seniors walked down the track of life, the Ohmstede Field, together for the last time of their lives. But as the "LIBERTY BELL RINGS AGAIN" they will carry a vibration of that bell with them forever.

The future senior class, the juniors, were envolved in numerous bake sales, candy sales, and car washes. Leading their class to this success were officers: Deana Harris, president; Debbie Cottrel, vice president; Suzanne Moore, secretary; and Brian Lyons, treasurer. Dances sponsored by the juniors included the Homecoming Dance and the Turn-a-bout.

An unusual event this year was the combination of the Junior Prom and the Sophomore Hop into one dance. Both the junior and sophomore classes worked together to make this one of the most unforgettable of all the dances.

Sophomore class officers included: Dana McCampbell, president; Christina Bacchini, vice president; Erica Jensen, treasurer; Jeanette Amar, secretary. These officers worked right through the summer with their classmates to raise money by running the dart throwing booth during the 4th of July carnival and also held a car wash.

The freshmen started the year by electing officers: Anna Juarez, president; Debbie Sapp, vice president; Yvonne St. John, treasurer; and Gina Combs, secretary. This class proved to be very spirited and won the Spirit Flag three consecutive times. Not only did this class show spirit but also creatively in money-making activities: they raffled off a large five foot sandwich! That just goes to show you what a little brain power will do.

In the future when we, as adults, will look back upon our brief passing through Liberty we will always remember the bombardment of the staff room with snow balls from a freak snow storm, the stink bomb that somehow found its way into Mr. Springer's classroom, the girls' locker room filling with smoke from the newly established smoking area which then had to be moved (the smoking area, that is), and flaming garbage cans; all this and much more will be left resounding through the corridors as the Class of 1976 makes its way forward to the theme of "Liberty Bell Rings Again."

## Frosh Girl Expresses Delight During Homecoming



The 1975-76 sports season proved to be one which the school can be well proud of. Venturing into our second year in the Foothill Athletic League showed to be more rewarding than the first year. The varsity football team, sincere, dedicated, loyal, and determined group of young men coached by Jack Ferrill, never lost belief in themselves and their teammates when faced with some of the discouragingly closes losses that could have given them a winning season. From a win and loss point of view, 4-6, their record was not successful, but as players and men they were very successful. This year marks the end of the coaching career at LUHS for Coach Ferrill, who will always be remembered for his dedication and help to football. A 6-4 record for the junior varsity football' team was an exceptional record due to the fact that no one weighed over 170 pounds. Leading the team were the three most valuable players; Joe Moreno, Stan Nunn, and Barry Schwitters, who between themselves played a total of 13 positions throughout the season. The frosh football team ended with a record of 4 wins, 1 loss, and 3 ties. The Lion Cubs were led by the play-calling and passing of quarterback Craig Chavez. Running backs Albert Ragonton and Randy Brunt led the fierce Lion ground game, which helped the team average of 265 yards to the opponents 145 yards in total offense.

Due to maturity of the players and transfer students, the varsity soccer team climbed the ladder from last place in the standings of last year to second place this year. In the F.A.L., Miguel Pulido was awarded best goalie and Roberto Amigo best defensive player.

Experiencing their biggest turnout in 8 years, the cross country team ran many dusty, windy. and rainy miles. Bret Hazen, who finished fifth at the league meet, was awarded most valuable, while Monte McKinney was chosen team captain by the members of the cross country team.
With a 6-4 record, the varsity volleyball team placed fourth in the G.F.A.L. The team was led by team captains Jan Martin and Tweety Billingsley. Julie Schwitters and Jeanette Carter received the Most Valuable Player Award and Most Improved Award, respectively. Stepping even higher in the league was the JV volleyball team who came in second. Rookie of the Year Award went to Shelley Poerio, Most Improved Award to Cheryl Drake, and Most Outstanding went to Roslyn Rodriquez.

Having an excellent season, the gymnastic team won their first two dual league meets by beating Alhambra and Piedmont. Helene Dawson, Liberty's outstanding gymnast at the league meet, won first place in the novice floor exercise.
In spite of few wins against the strongly competitive girls in the F.A.L., the players of the girls tennis team enjoyed a successful season and increased their game skills considerably.

After three years of absence, the girls basketball team has revived again due to the help of Coach Fred Valverde. The team was led off by Captain Marilyn Sanabria, while Jan Martin led the team with 136 rebounds and 86 points for the season. Proving that the skills had not been lost during the three years of rest, the JV girls basketball team came off the bench undefeated all season, 15-0. The team was led by Roslyn Rodriquez and Shelley Poerio.

Finishing with a record of 7 wins and 6 losses in league play enabled the varsity basketball team to place second in the East division of F.A.L., which allowed Liberty to go on to the F.A.L. play-offs. Rooters saw the team win big games against powerful Amador, Campolindo, and Del Valle. Rick Howard led the Lions averaging over 20 points and 13 rebounds per game. Establishing an over-all record of 12 wins and 8 losses, the JV basketball team won 11 of their last 13 games making it possible for them to become champions with a 10-3 league record. Determination and hussle along with a balanced scoring attack and a pressing defense allowed the team to have a winning season and to become F.A.L. Co-Champions. ending with a record of 8-5, the frosh basketball team was led by Nico Diaz and Willie Howard in scoring, who were the Most Valuable Players. Hal McCauley, Albert Ragonton, and Willie Howard led in rebounds to help the team both offensively and defensively.

The wrestling team, although having a good year for individual wrestlers-Ruben Rios, Raymond Rios, and Arthur Jacobsen-did not have a good year as far as record is concerned. This year also ends the wrestling coaching career of Coach Keith Dawson, who has been associated with wrestling for 23 years.
A year of setting new school records in the 440 yard low hurdles, the mile relay, the triple jump, the sprint medley relay, the two mile realy, the triple jump relay, and the four mile relay, and placing second in the F.A.L. Championships proved for the track team to be a very successful year. This season also finds the 440 relay team, the mile relay team, and Sophomore sprinter 440 man, Robert Maiocco, going on to compete at the Meet of Champions.

Due to the high competition in the F.A.L., the swim team chose to swim independent this season. Kent Evje was awarded Most Valuable Swimmer.

Becoming the 1976 Rio Vista Tournament Champions, the varsity baseball team showed what a determined team can do. With a league record of $7-6$ the Lions went on to beat number 12 and 14 ranked in the East Bay, Miramonte and Las Lomas, respectively. Centerfielder, Joe Briseno, Top Offensive and Defensive Player, batted .343 in league and received no errors in the entire season. Team Captain, Tony Berumen, ace on the pitching staff, totaled a number of 66 strike outs and ended with a record of 5 wins and 4 losses. The JV baseball team, after a shakey start in league, ended with 7 wins, 5 losses and 1 tie. With his fantastic pitching, Barry Schwitters, Most Valuable Player, led the team by winning 6 games and losing only 1 in league competition. With an average of .357 Tom Bloomfield led the team in hitting. Greg Morgan and Tony Olan were chosen as co-captains. The frosh baseball team, having 8 players who batted over .300 and a team average of .305 , ended with a fine $10-2$ record. The team as a whole had 54 stolen bases for the season. Most Valuable Awards went to Mike Morado and Hal McCauly while Nico Diaz, Steve Samples, and Tom Lawler were chosen as team captains.

The golf team, struggling through another windy season at the Bethel Island Golf Course, finished with twelve team members earning either a JV or varsity award. Liberty placed eighth out of 9 schools. Rick Howard, Most Valuable Player for the fourth consecutive year, averaged 42.32 during his entire golfing career at Liberty.

In their second year of competition, the Liberty girls track team placed second in the league with an outstanding record. Individual league champions were Marilyn Johnson in the long jump and high jump, and Shelly Poerio in the 440. The team work of Mari Puente, Helene Dawson, Renee Vornhagen, and Shelly Poerio in the mile relay also allowed them to become league winners. Mari Puente, whose performances in the mile, 440 , and relays were consistently outstanding to score points for the team, became the recipient of the Most Valuable Award.

With a record of 11 wins and 3 losses, the girls softball team, coached by Kaye Axelgard for the third year, took second place. Debbie Taylor, team captain, batted the highest average on the team, who along with Rose Martinez, pitched for the team.

Despite a losing record, the boys tennis team enjoyed one of its best seasons ever. The team finished, tied for fourth place but were only four points away from finishing second. Singles players, Rick Walls and Mike Portwood, finished with records above 500 per cent. The doubles team of Greg Wong and Rick Bradley pulled upset victories against Campolindo and Acalanes.

1975-1976 has been a sounding-board for many new ideas, one of these being the Physical Education issue. Independent P.E. was offered for the first time to those students participating in an after school sport. The State of California ruled that physical education was no longer mandatory for juniors and seniors and the administrative board along with the coaching staff reviewed the pros and cons to decide on whether this ruling would have any effect here at Liberty. At first the credit system was revised. Then later, it was passed that starting the fall semester students would only be required to enroll in P.E. during their first three years of high school and that thirty credits must be earned in this time. Seniors would then be allowed to substitute another class in place of P.E. Reactions from the students concerning this move were gained through polls and a P.E. Committee comprised of approximately twenty students. Many favored it; others preferred physical education.

Another change has been in that of class scheduling. Instead of Liberty's customary 1-7 periods, there was an addition of an "A" period beginning at 7:37 in the morning. Two classes took advantage of this early period: ROP Auto and Annual Staff, taught by Mr. Doug Kirk and Mr. William Batze respectively. This gave students a chance to enroll in subjects that their schedules would not ordinarily allow.

The ROP meat program was a new course offering this year.
LEA was honoured with a fine list of officers: Mr. Dennis Buckley, president, Miss Kaye Axelgard, vice-president, Mr. Harold Child, secretary, and Mr. Roy Krumland, treasurer. This committee spent much time reviewing collective bargaining because of SB 160; the Board of Trustees did the same.

Mr. Philip Devine directed a number of very successful plays this year. These include: "Bye, Byr Birdie", "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum", (ordinarilly the actors were students, but in the last mentioned play the entire cast was made up of staff personnel), "Charlie's Aunt", and "Oliver".

Mrs. Billie Fortner was the first staff member to become a Thespian.
The Turkey award was taken by Mrs. Evelyn Griffith for missing a curtain call and the Trooper award was given to Mr. John Meyers.

The Performing Arts gained a dimmer hoard, funded by the class of 1971, the student council, and the Play makers. Much emphasis was put on the lighting facilities and many improvements were made with two added spots, two area lights, and a light bar. Performances are now played in style.

Much commotion was caused by the installation of a sink in Mr. Philip Devine's room. "It looked like World War I," he said.

The AG Farm received a new large Green House for the horticulture class.
A new Arts and Crafts Department was formed which was previously coupled with the Performing Arts and is now a division of its own. This year Arts and Crafts' creativeness placed Best of Show over all divisions in the Contra Costa Fair (In the last eleven years it has consistently placed first in High School Art.) and was also awarded the Best of Show competing against adult artists, a title that few high schools are able to bragabout. The new department is comprised of Mr. Louis Racke, Mr. John Meyer, Mr. James Nabas, and headed by Mr. William Peters.
Mr. Philip Devine and Mr. Steve Brunsvold, teachers of the American Experience Class, have been retained by the San Francisco Unified School District as consultants. Part of their job as such will be to exchange information regarding the development and teaching of this class.

Mr. Laurance Welch started a new motorcycle training program for those students over sixteen years of age who are interested in learning basic motorcycle skills. He was able to find a sponsor who supplied six motorcycles and the course has been reported as successful this year.

Under the direction of Mr. Oliver Bascom a new English program for sophomores was started that resembles an over-all composition class. At times all the English classes offered during corresponding periods were combined and taught through the mutual efforts of Mr. Richard Hackett, Mr. Robert Russell, and Mr. Oliver Bascom as one large class.

Mr. James Plato was hired to the agriculture department to replace Lynn Harmonson.
Mr. Ernest Albertson was added to the staff to teach English and Business courses.
The Social Studies department gained Mr. Joe Ortega and Mr. Joe Tovar.
Mr. Jean-Paul Bosque-Oliva is our new English, Spanish, and French instructor.
Mrs. June Drake stopped working at the Oakley school to devote more of her time at Liberty.
Mr. Vernon Noble has made an effort to work closer with the students.
Mr. Frank Valverde became the girls' Basketball coach.
Mr. Allan Jones took the Stage Band to Reno and began a Brentwood Community Recreational Band.
In the Homecoming activities in October, the faculty tied for first with the seniors. Hurrah!
C and I (Curriculum and Instruction), a committec established to look at the overall high school to see it it meets the need of the students and to suggest changes in innovations, was headed by Mr. Dewel Morgan.

Mr. Eleanor Madrigal is a new addition in the attendance office. She works as a bi-lingual secretary.
In the attendance office tardy slips were done away with, in the counseling section report cards were redesigned, and there was a revision of data processing of materials.
In the coaching staff we saw a new line-up: Coach Jerry Black became the varsity baseball coach due to the resignation of Coach Robert Glenn last year, followed by coach Joe Ortega as the junior varsity and Coach Joe Tovar as frosh.

Another change was that of the reorganization to the approach to special education. Mr. Dewel Morgan, resource specialist, began with fifteen other schools in the county working in a pilot program to develop a master plan for special education. Six differing areas in California carry this on. At the end of the high school period, counselors meet to discuss senior progress based on these plans.
Also a work shop was started for admissions to college, tech schools, and community colleges. Based on their Cal Guidance scores, juniors considered the field most appropriate for them and listened to speakers of various profesions talk about their work. This gave juniors a series of 5-6 units to look at future careers that interested them and cape to be called Careers Day.
