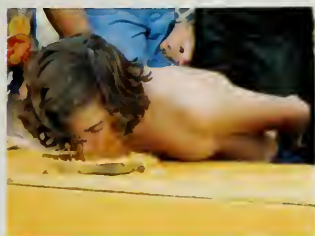

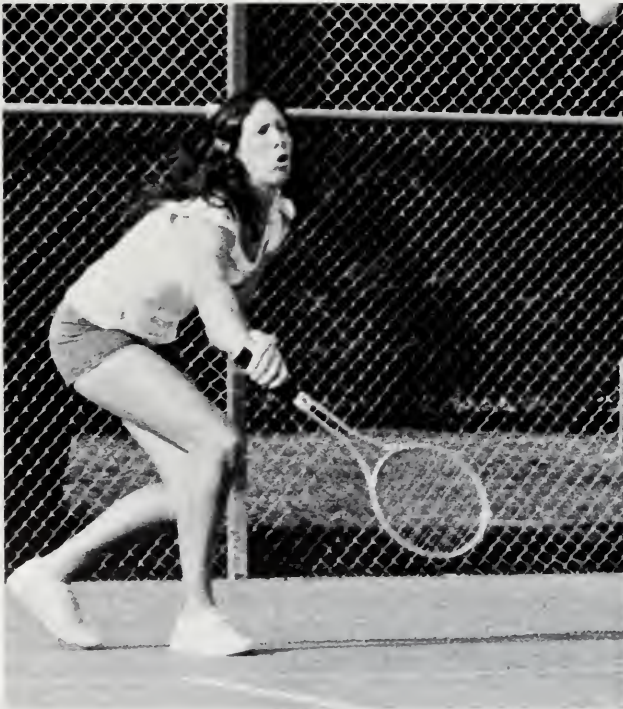

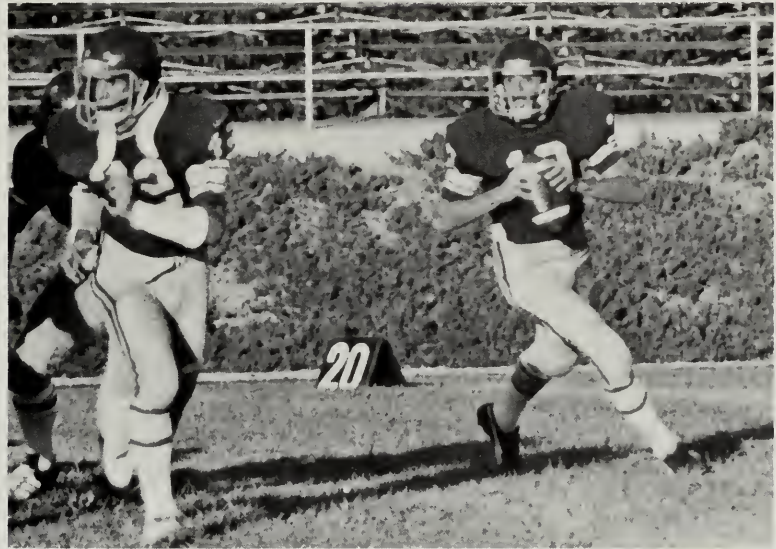

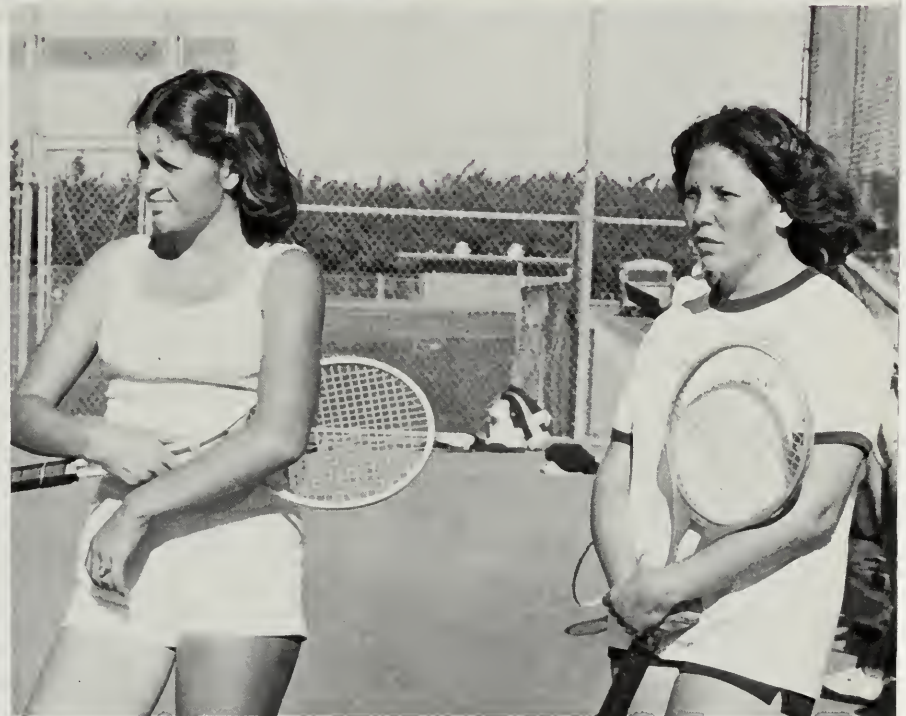

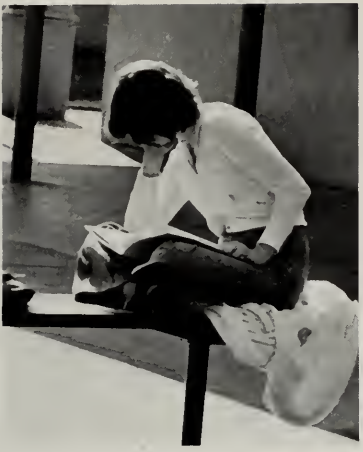

Entitled "Grind the Trojans" the float was disqualified when it fell apart just as it passed in front of the reviewing stand. Class advisors were Mrs. Bomben and Mr. Child.

Finally placing in the Homecoming Float competition the Class of 78, as juniors won second place with "John the Dons". With officers Stan Nunn, president; Robert Aguirre, vice-president; Christina Bacchini, treasurer; Laura Sanabria, secretary and advisors still Mr. Child and Mrs. Bomben the class sponsored the girls-ask-boys Turn-about Dance.

In their last year at high school the Class of 78 got their act together and captured the coveted Homecoming Spirit Trophy by amassing the most points.

During the summer months the seniors held bake sales to raise money for their Senior Ball. In September they sponsored an aftergame dance with music provided by "South Bound." The Class of 79 led by Anna Juarez, president; Regina Rios, vice-president; Mary Rosa, secretary; Lisa Schwitters, treasurer and advisors, Mrs. June Drake and Mr. Joe Tovar, was extremely active this past year. They won the first football and basketball rallies. During Homecoming Week the Junior Class captured their third straight first place in float competition. They also captured first places in Dress-up Day, Jersey Day, Hat and Sunglasses Day, and in the Pie-eating contest.

The juniors also kept busy sponsoring money-raising events such as cleaning up after football games, selling raffle tickets for five-foot sandwiches and selling candy suckers. They joined with the Sophomore Class in hosting the combined Soph Hop/Junior Prom in the gym with a theme of "Always and Forever."

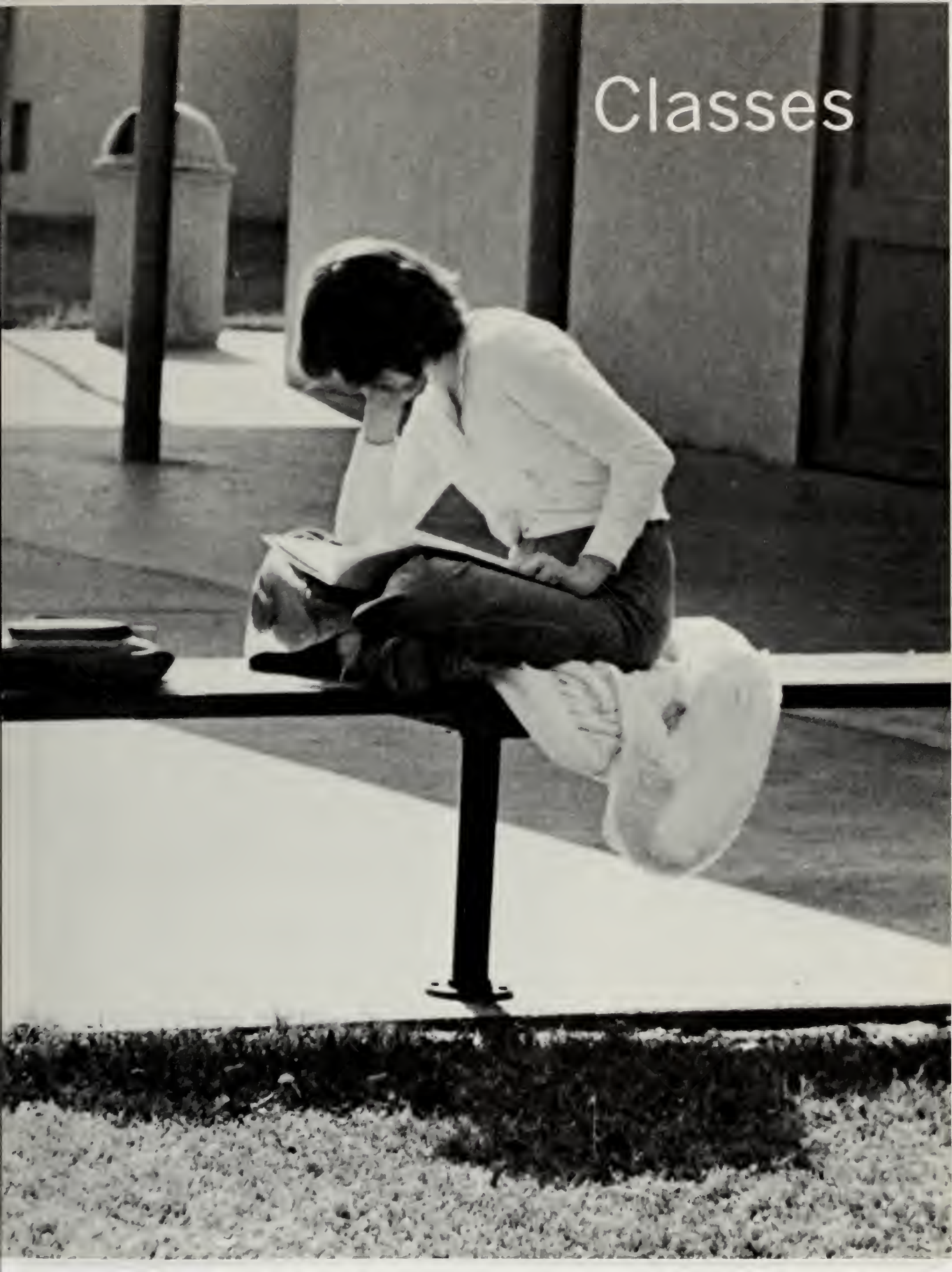

To raise money the Freshmen Class sold candy, hosted a disco dance, washed cars and had a cake sale. The Senior Class will take with them the memories of four years of high school, of sandwich sales, late nights during Homecoming Week, senior cut-day, parties on the beach, Grad night and trips to Santa Cruz. It was a fun four years for the Class of 1978.

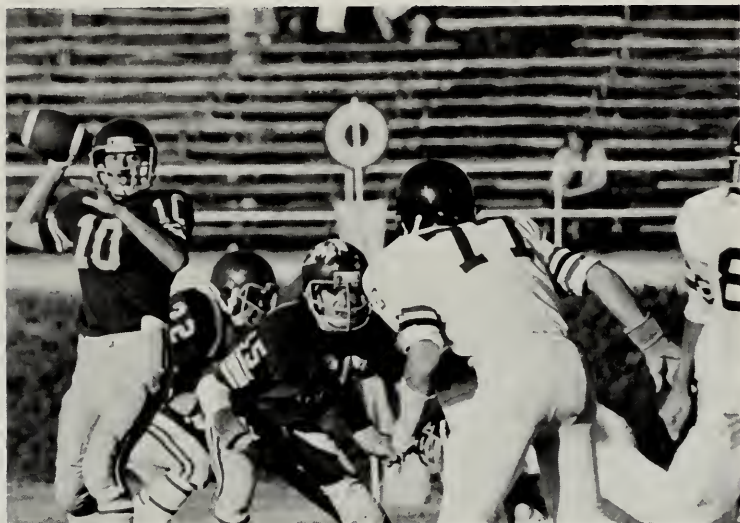

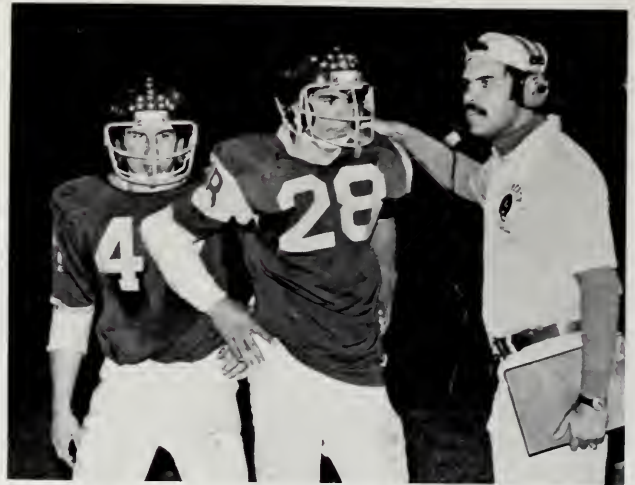

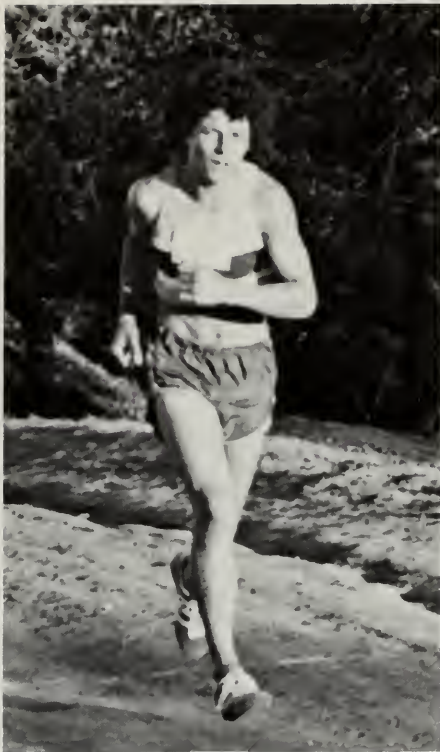

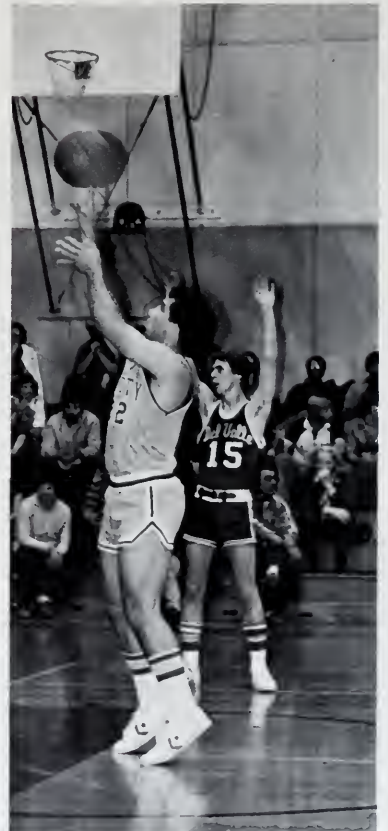

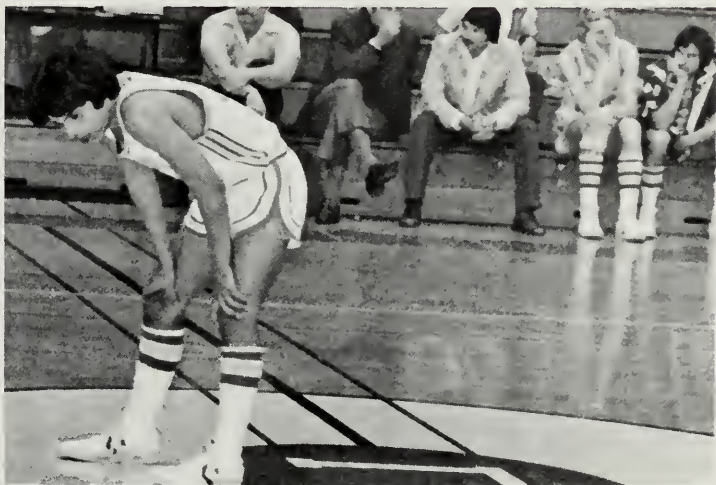

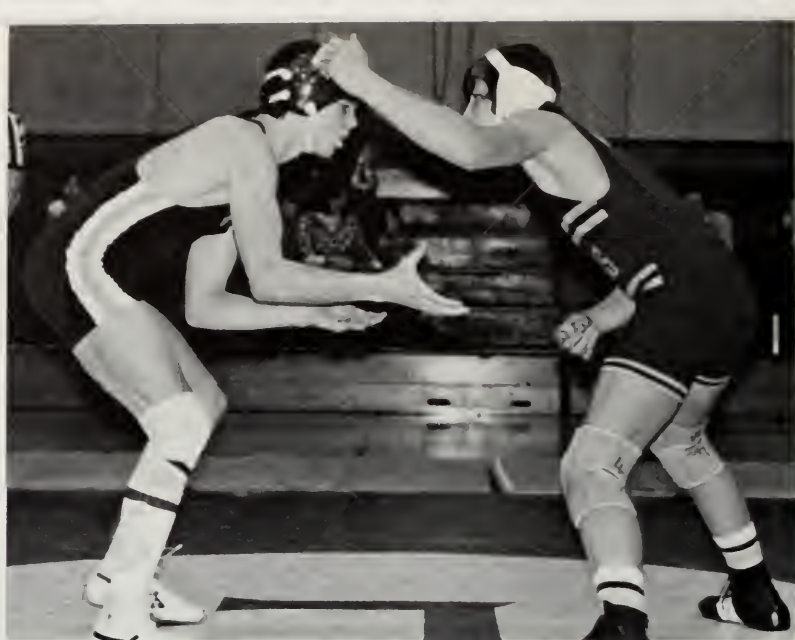

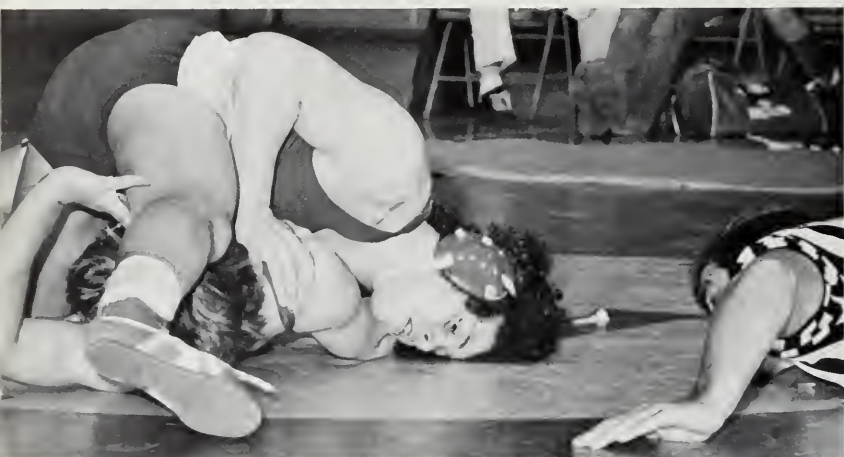




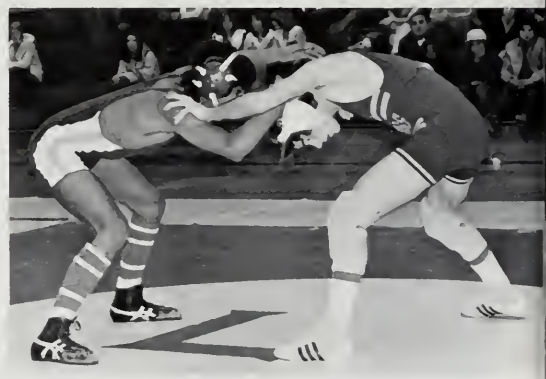

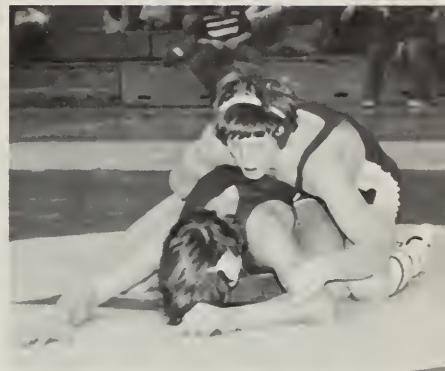

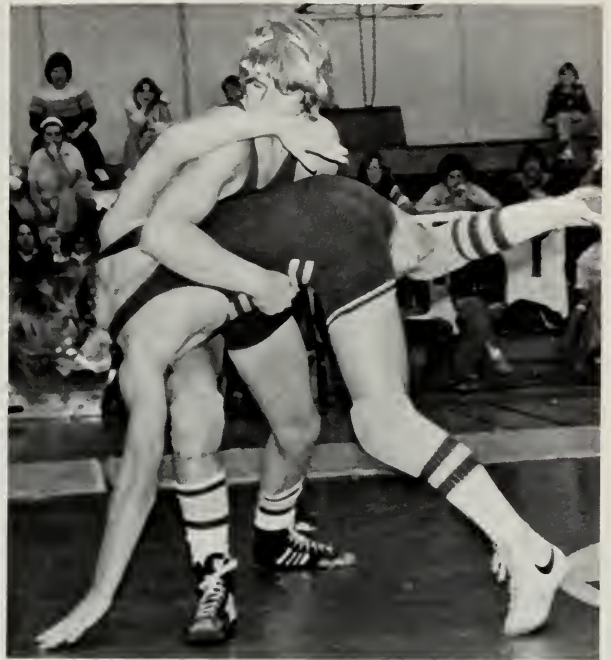

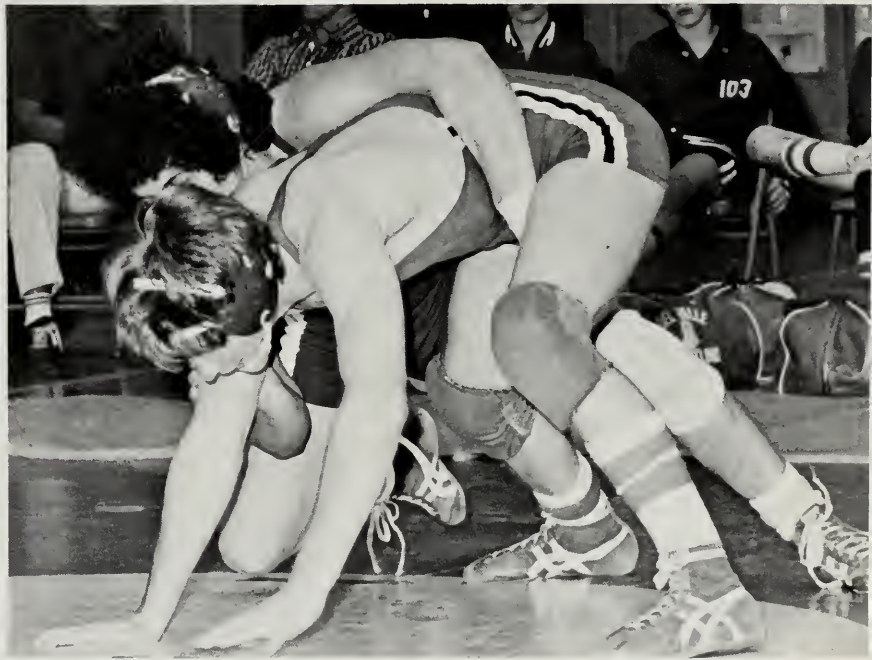

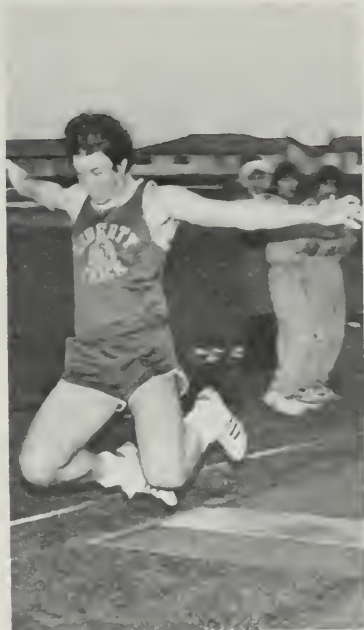

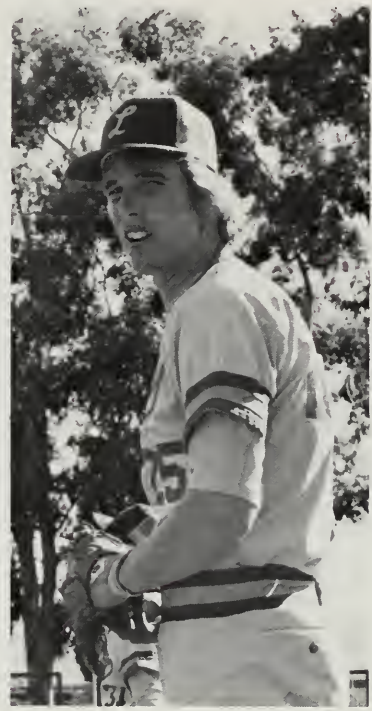

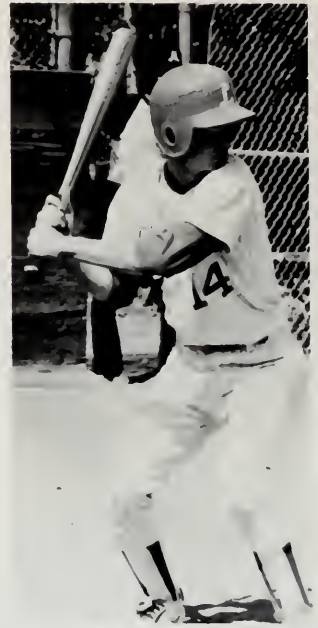

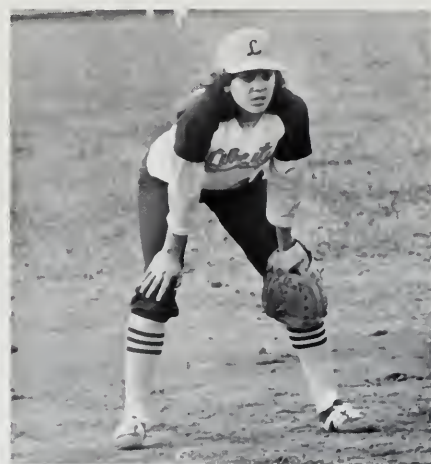

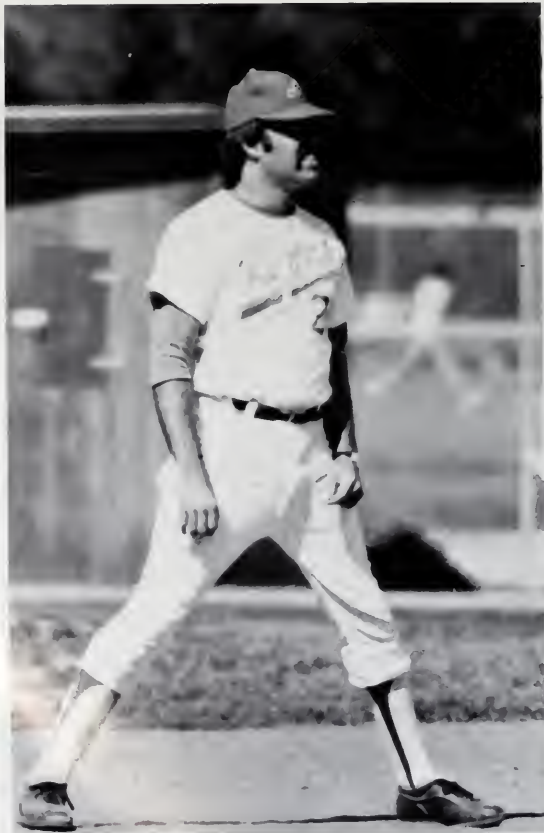

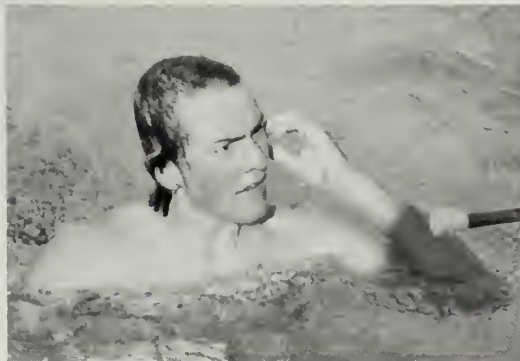

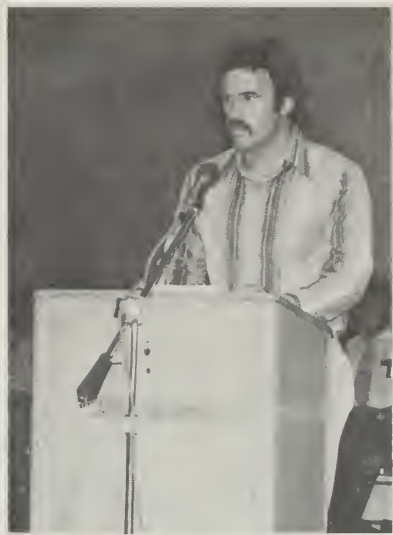

Heading the list of new things for the classified and certified staff was the addition of a Bi-lingual, Bi-Cultural department with a new director, Mr. Roy Correa, and new teachers and support staff.

With the departure of Dr. Mike Adams for a new job at Half Moon Bay the board of trustees and staff were again faced with the problem of selecting a new superintendent. The field was narrowed down to five candidates by April with the selection of the superintendent in early May. The new superintendent selected is Mr. Ronald Stewart. Other items that were changed or are completely new- a career center was installed near Toad Hall, the counseling department was reorganized to use teacher advisors (Mr. Ron Overton half-a-day and Mr. Mark Watson full time) and counselor aides.

To the delight of most staff members and all students class periods were shortened to 45 minutes with the school day starting early (8:20) but ending earlier also (2:45). The shortened day allowed less interruption of afternoon classes because of sports and allowed better utilization of space and lessened class conflicts seventh period.

The Science Department was provided with a new office in D Wing as the Annual Staff/Journalism darkroom was moved from the end of D Wing to the area in the library. Mr. Phil Devine was appointed Student Activities Director and given expanded duties and responsibilities.

Heading the slate of officers for the Liberty Education Association were Mr. Bill Michaud, president; Mrs. Sue Fortner, vice-president; Mr. Harold Child, secretary and Miss Reta Pirtle, treasurer. For the California State Employees Association Chapter the officers were Mrs. Robin Beck, president; Mr. Barkley Garner, vice-president; Mrs. Judy Dye, secretary; Mrs. Billie Casey, treasurer and Mrs. Faith Mattos, reporter.

In the attendance office Mrs. Teresa Villa was added as a full-time bi-lingual secretary and behavior policies were changed because of a new state law.

With two constitutional amendments added in early April, the Student Government held a nominating convention to narrow the list of candidates to three. For the first time Rally Squad members were not elected by the student body as-a-whole. Rather they were selected by a committee comprised of students, workers and community members.

Another new/old face at Liberty was Mr. Leonard Lucio. After Dr. Doris Otilar left for a dean position at Albany High School, Mr. Lucio returned part-time. Mr. Lee Hernandez assumed the responsibility of coordinating counseling activities for the rest of the school year.

For the thirteenth straight year art students won first place at the Contra Costa County Fair. This year the students swept the awards given in Fine Arts- Debi Clark, first; Susie Vasta, second; Gary Holdeg, third and Pam Knowles, fourth.

Basic Industrial Arts was dropped in favor of semester courses in the Industrial Arts Department. Shade Tree Mechanic and Farm Power were new classes added in auto shop. Mr. Dale Cozby will be sabbatical leave for the 78-79 school year to work on a vocational credential.

Vocalist of the month and Girls' Ensemble were new additions to the Performing Arts Department.

The Board of Trustees was reorganized in April with Mr. Joe Cutino elected president and Mrs. Arlene Poerio as clerk.

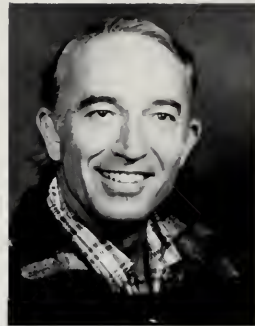

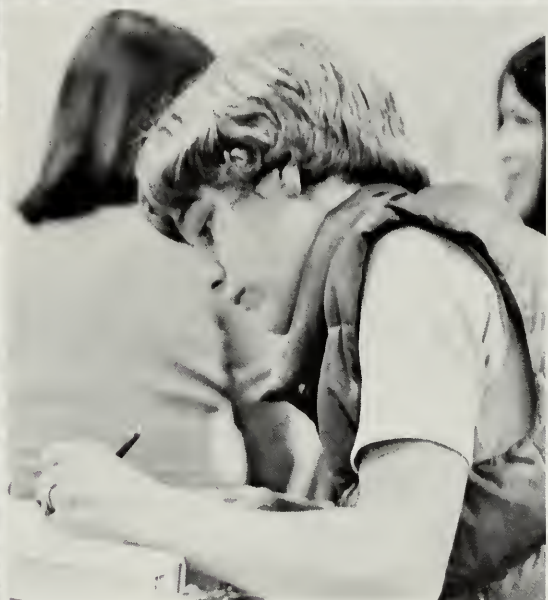
