

LIBERTY UNION HIGH SCHOOL'S first building looked like this on Second St. when the campus opened for business back in 1902; it contained offices, classrooms and library under one roof.































Career Center became a well-heard phrase around campus this past school year. With special finding we were able to house the new center in a portable building near the woodshop. Under the direction of Mr. Ron Overton, Career technician Mrs. April Weaver attempted to make career information, job placement and vocational plans available to all grades. If a student is unsure as to what to do, the center was able to give the interest surveys to assist them in matching their interests with possible occupations that would be suitable for them. The center assisted in helping the students to compare their SAT scores with possible vocational choices to see if the two were compatable. The computor in the center helped students to decide about their vocational choices by providing the following information: discriptions of vocations, how to trade schools and colleges, answers specific questions about different schools, visit filepeople who have volunteered to talk about their own individual vocations (pros and cons) and a quest file that helps students decide on vocations by having then answer a series of 21 questions.







CURRICULUM

With the absence of Mr. Jerry Clayburn (on leave for a year) counselors took on an added responsibility as they had to handle their normal counseling load as well as deal with discipline problems of their own individual counselees.

New to the Liberty staff this year were Ms. Toni Gull, biology; Mrs. Sue Anderson, English; Mr. Art Santoyo, bilingual, Mr. William Mercado, social studies; Mrs. Barbar Rude, bilingual; and Mrs. Paula Kaplan, special education.

After learning that funds for the 1979-80 school year would be reduced the entire district was forced to take a serious look at reducing the school day (to five periods) and staff (13 to be laid off). But with additional funds coming in staff reductions were to be kept to four temporary positions reduced and students would be allowed to take 6 classes.
