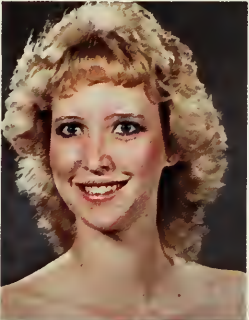

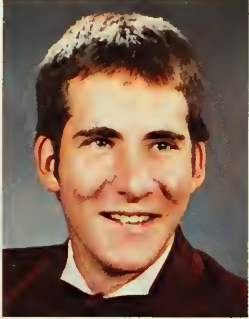

LOOKIN' GOOD in classes meant looking at the Class of '84, the SENIORS!!

For a first year class the Class of '84, as freshman, surprised everyone and captured first place in the Homecoming Parade float competition, with the theme, "Chomp the Mats." They were led by Aimee Vasta, president; Gina Gonzalez, vice-president; Lisa deFremery, secretary; Rebecca Garcia, treasurer; and advisors Mr. Bill Batze, and Mrs. Jean Noble. The class of '84 was quite successful in raising money: they sold flowers at Homecoming, sponsored a candy sale and held a DJ dance with a Rock-104 disc jockey, Jim Kirk.

Led by second-time president, Aimee Vasta, the Sophomore Class had a very successful year. For fund raisers the class sold 200 cases of candy, almost 250 flowers on Homecoming Day, hosted several cake raffles at basketball games, sponsored the Sadie Hawkins Dance and held a car wash. Aimee was assisted by Manette Joksch, vice-president; Lisa deFremery, secretary; Shelly St. John, treasurer; and advisors, Mr. Bill Batze and Mrs. Sue Churchill (replaced Mrs. Jean Noble in November). The Sophomores won the Homecoming float competition for the second straight year with the theme, "Can the Cougars." In the spring the Classes of '83 and '84 co-sponsored the highly successful Sophomore Hop/Junior Prom where Mike Miller and Shelly St. John were crowned king and queen.

The class of 1984 was led by Amiee Vasta for the third year in a row as juniors. She had plenty of help from her officers: Manette Joksch, vice-president; Lisa deFremery, secretary; and Shelly St. John, treasurer. Mr. Bill Batze and Mrs. Gretchen Tovar (She replaced Mrs. Sue Churchill in September), lead support and direction for our class. The juniors took first place in the float competition for the third year in the row with the theme, "Pac the Mats." With successful fund-raisers, candy sales, flowers at Homecoming and raffles during the basketball season, the Class of '84 was in excellent financial shape for the start of their senior year.

They started their senior year with class officers: Kimber Dittmore, president; Manette Joksch, vice-president; Cathy Siino, secretary; and Annamarie Coelho, treasurer. LOOKIN' GOOD in sports meant Championships. From the first ever in wrestling to the second in a row for the Boys' Varsity Basketball team, to the third straight title for the junior varsity softball team, Liberty athletes were looking good in '83-'84.

Led by Mario Ochoa with 29 pins, the varsity wrestling team won its first ever championship in the FAL this year. Mario had a record 7 pins in the first round and earned a trip to the State Meet. Coached by Greg Chappel, the wrestlers hosted the first Lou Bronzan Tournament under less than ideal weather conditions.

For the second straight year in a row, the Boys' Varsity Basketball Team went 10-0 in league and grabbed sole possession of the title. The Lions played a pre-season, practice game against Oakland High in the Arena at the Oakland Coliseum complex. The team scored 99 points in two games and named Mike Miller, Mario Oseguera, Scott Wilgenbush, and Sean Lasher to the All-league Team.

Paced by the hot bat of Dorsey Berlinn (25 hits) and RBI's (16) and the run scoring of Sara Sipes (27), the junior varsity softball team breezed to the third consecutive FAL title. Under the Coaching of Rich Barrios, the jv's outscored their opponents 330 to 121. Bernie Sanabria, Dorsey, and Sara were all named Most Valuable

Player. "This team started the year without a pitching staff and no catcher!" But through a struggle in the early part of the season, came through with a championship. Sara made the switch from shortstop to catcher and earned All-League at that position. Wendy Haag who pitched a one-hit shutout in her first stint on the mound. In their pocket, the girls traveled to Hayward to play in North Coast Section game against Moreau but then lost to San Ramon. Nancy Burnett, Cori Burnett, and Sara Sipes earned All-league honors.

The Girls' Varsity Basketball team shared the championship of the FAL with Campolindo. They lost the first game to Campolindo but then defeated them the second time and grab a share of the crown. Tamara Teixeira was named Most Valuable Player for the team.

The Varsity Baseball team played a genial host to Antioch (6-34) before the largest paid crowd in Liberty's history. The varsity team swamped Las Lomas 20-7 and closed the season with a 14-7 win over arch-rival Alhambra. The junior varsity earned victories against Arroyo and also closed the season with a win over Alhambra (28-7). The baby Lions had trouble putting the ball over the goal line and came away with only a single victory in seven attempts. They squeaked by Las Lomas 8-7.

The Girls' Varsity Basketball team were the perennial bride's maid of the FAL as they handled every other team in the league with ease but still couldn't beat nemesis Campolindo. They won the Merced Tournament and earned an at-large berth to North Coast. Val Poerio was named to three tournament All-teams and was selected All North Coast Section and All-league. Debbie Geysler made one All-Tournament team, was the Most Valuable Player at the Merced Tournament and was selected co-most valuable player of the FAL. Laura Goldman earned second team All-league honors.

In varsity volleyball, the girls beat Campolindo one game to hand them their first defeat in 33 games. Led by co-captains and most-valorables Monica Carvajal and Janice Johnson, the varsity team had an 11-11 season; but as Coach Linda Ghilarducci said, "I'm proud of them, they never gave up!"

Highlights of the varsity baseball season was beating Campolindo for the first time since . . . 6-5, and shutting out Acalanes 6-0 to knock them out of the championship. Coach Jerry Black used David Reil at shortstop, the first freshman to play varsity baseball for 20 years. The team captured third place in the Alhambra Easter Tournament. Roger Farr was awarded the top-hitter award, Mike Ligon was named top defensive player, Santos Tobar was selected team captain, Jeff Pace was designated as the most-inspirational player, and Scott Flechsing was crowned most-valuable. This was a young team and Coach Black will have eight players back including a vastly improved Eric Cordua (only shut-out of the season).

Batting .415, Darren Williams was named most-valuable for the junior varsity baseball team. With a young team (10 freshmen), the jv's finished strong. They named David Jensen and Mike Sigman co-captains. Coach Rod Beaver was very pleased with the tremendous potential of pitcher, Ray Cabral. He also felt that Marc Stowell is a great defensive player.

Two new sports were reactivated this last season. Under the guidance of first-time coach Tim McHugh, the soccer team learned fundamentals and how to score. While in the water, Mr. Bob Jesse lead the swimmers to a victory over Calveras High. Nicole Simoni was selected as the most-valuable and also placed fifth at the FAL Championships in the 50 free-style. Captains were Greg Perry and Margaret Freeman.

The junior varsity girls' basketball team captured second place as they could not seem to beat one team even though they had three chances (first game was shortened without telling the coach).

Rickey Fisher and Brian Baude battled it out in golf for the top spot.

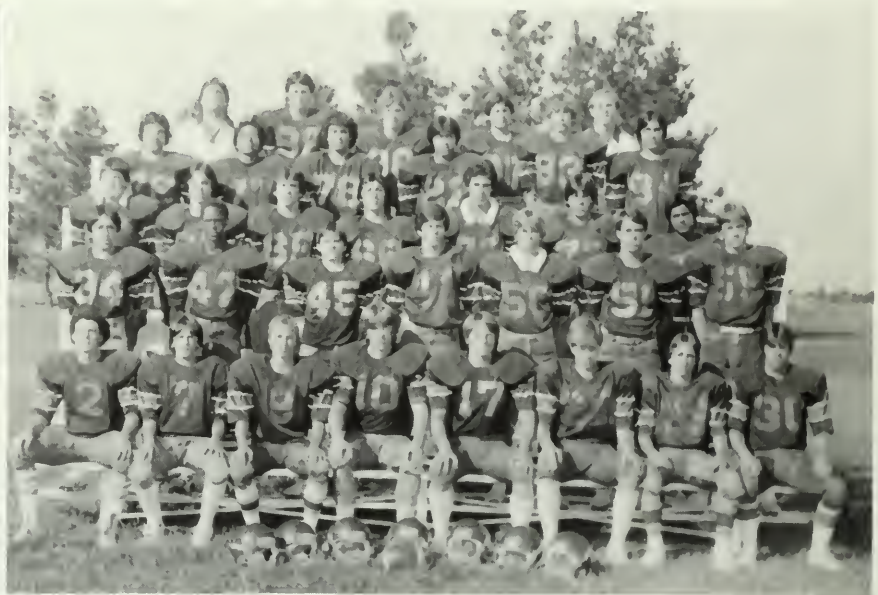

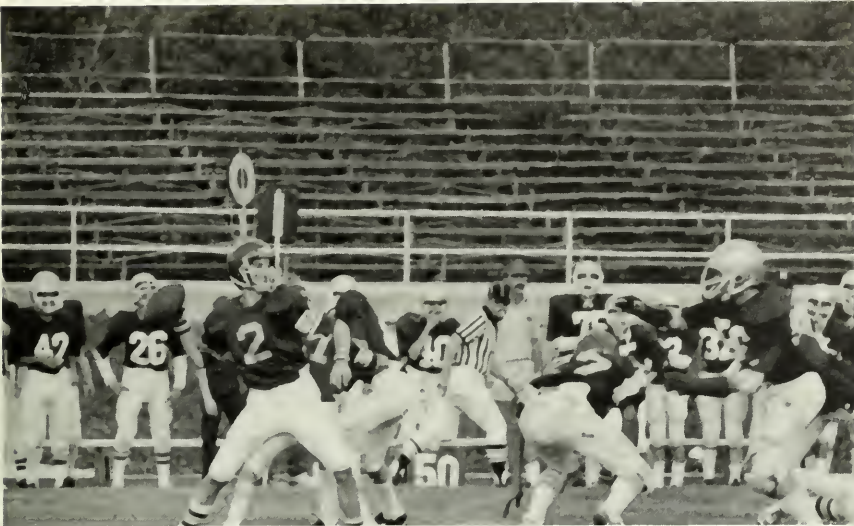

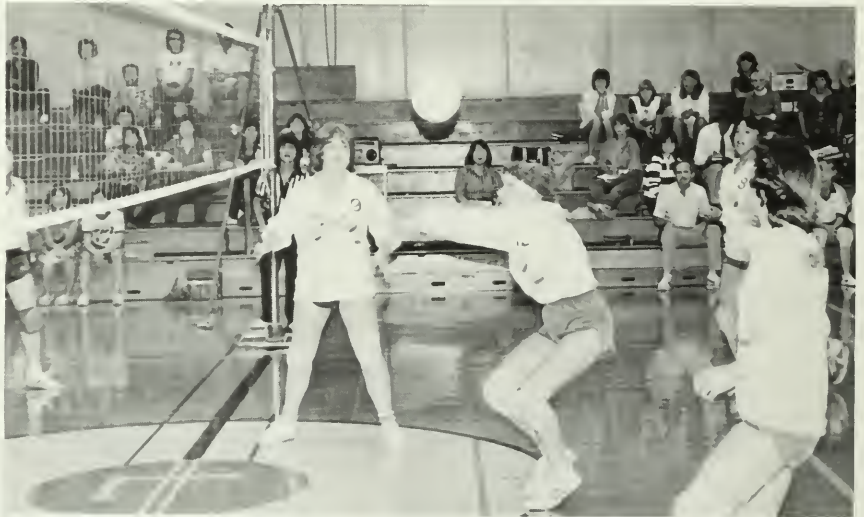

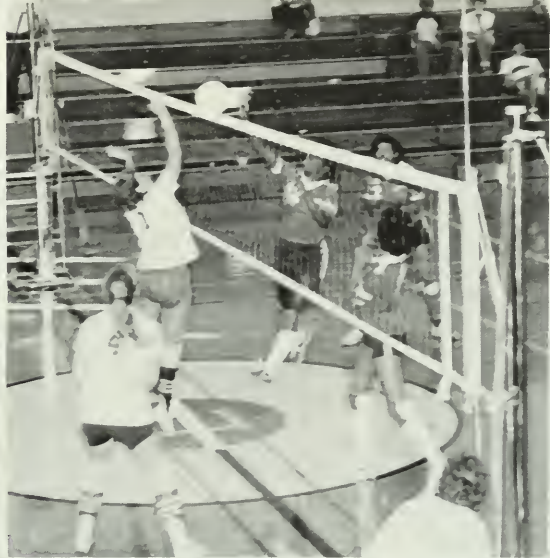

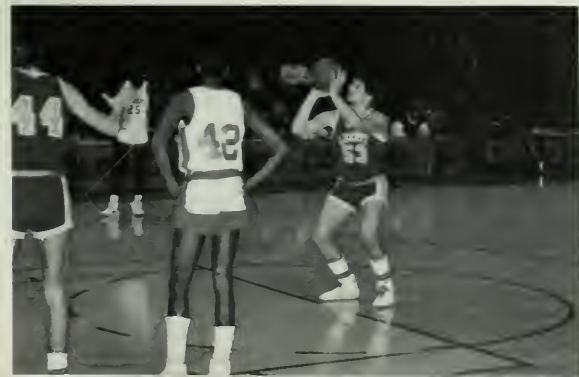

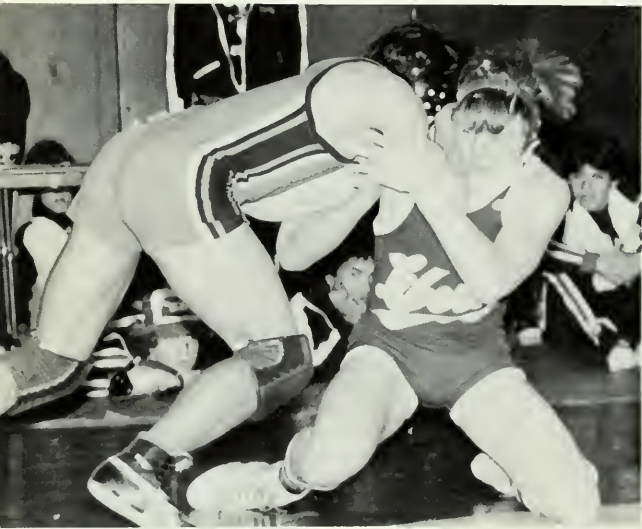

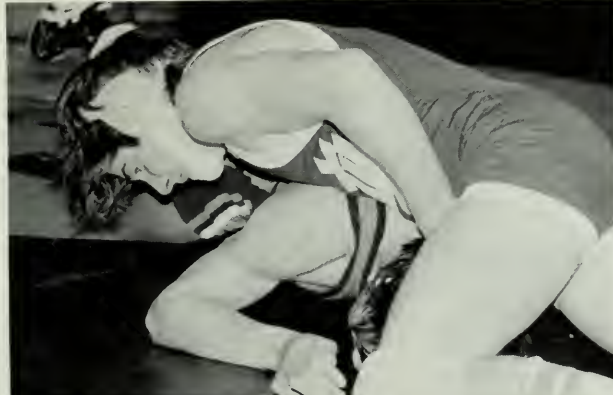

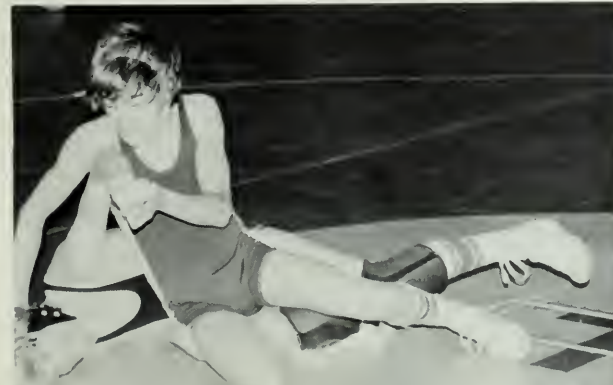

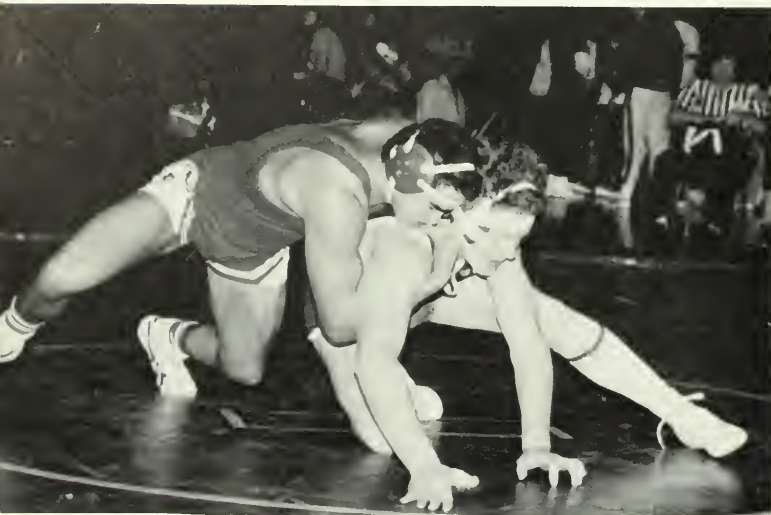

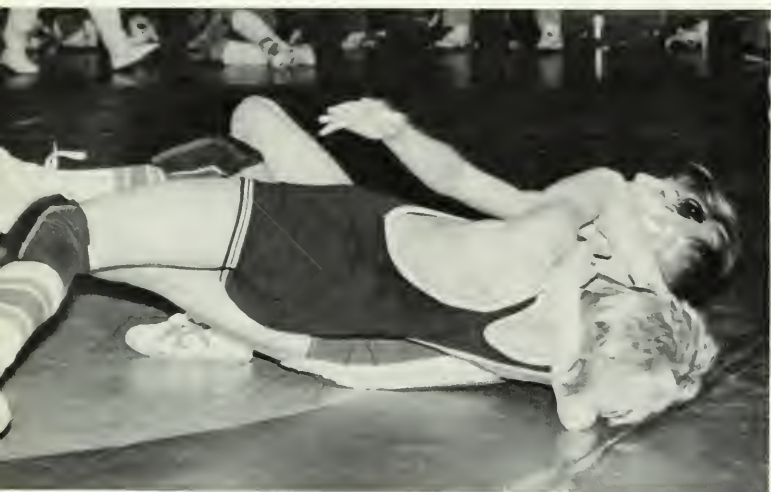

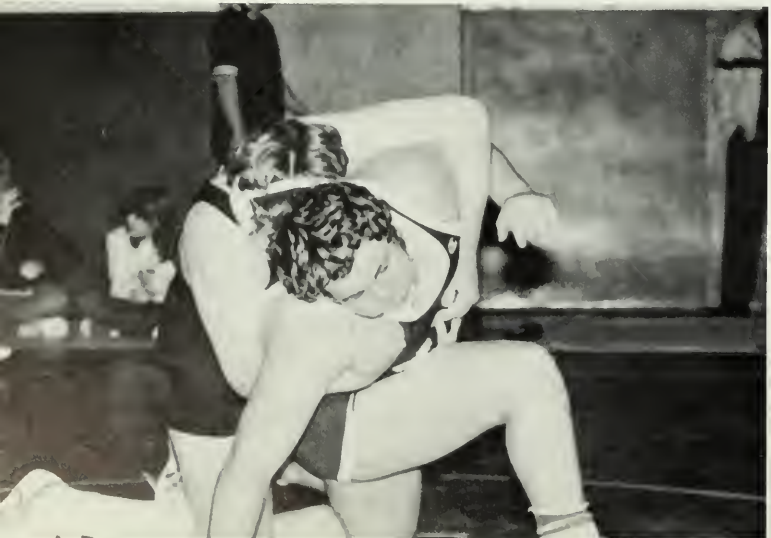

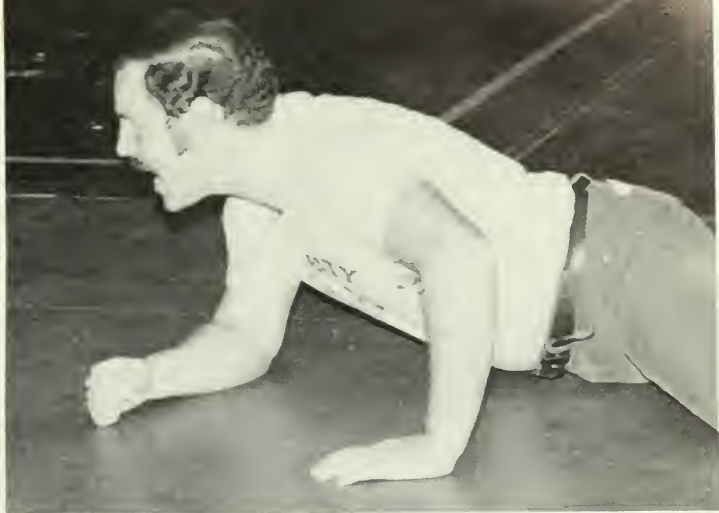

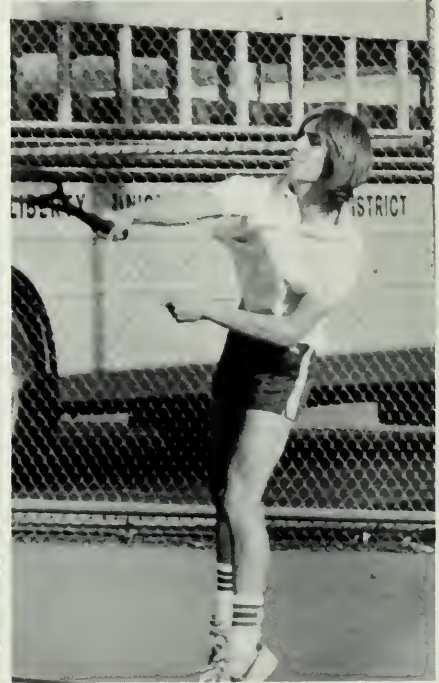

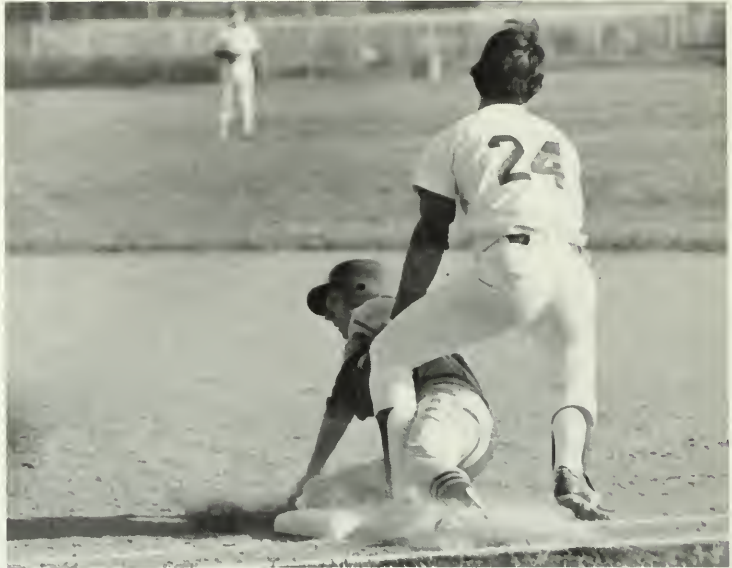

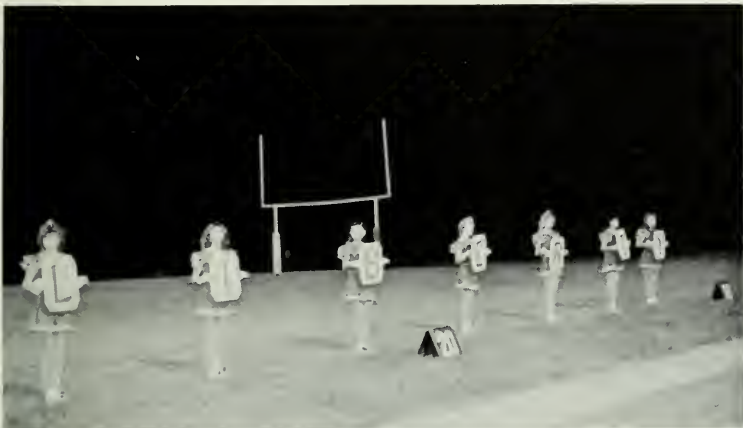

Shelly St. John captured the Jenny Lind Award in Choir, while Valerie Poerio was named the winner of the John Philip Sousa Band Award.

Besides their monthly Brown Bag Theatre, the Playmakers were kept busy with One Acts and their two major plays of the year. In the Fall, the Playmakers put on the drama "Diary of Anne Franke" followed by the humorous "Tom Jones" in the Spring. For the first time, the Playmakers had a dinner theatre with the production of "Tom Jones".

Climaxing four years of study and work was the Awards Assembly in June. The seniors were recognized for their efforts in the classroom with scholarships, grants, and awards. For the first time the Assembly was held in the Bristow Theatre. The Chamber Singers entertained the audience and provided a nice break in the presentation of awards. Manette Joksch garnered the most awards with seven followed by Aimee Vasta and Valerie Poerio with six and five respectively. The Yearbook Award for the outstanding Senior Male and Female Athlete went to Chris Brown (football and wrestling) and Monica Carvajal (volleyball, basketball, and track) while Valerie Poerio earned the coveted Scholar-Athlete trophy for having the highest grade point and earning a Varsity letter. Ron Tiongeo and Valerie Poerio were honored by the Army Reserve for their athletic and scholastic ability (this was the first time for this award). Mrs. Sue Fortner was in charge of the evening's festivities.

On June 14, 271 Seniors marched onto Ohmstede Field to the tune of "Pomp and Circumstance" to receive their diplomas from the Board of Trustees. Breaking tradition not once but several times, the Class of '84's Graduation was almost a total student affair. The key-note speaker was Cathy Siino. William Davis was the class valedictorian (3.99 g.p.a.) while Valerie Poerio was named Salutatorian (3.98 g.p.a.). Suzanne Zahn gave the Invocation while the Senior Choir members sang the Benediction. For the first time faculty members participated in the processional. This year the physical set-up for Graduation was changed to allow more seating as both stands were opened and the graduates were placed in the middle of the field facing the Board and south goalpost. The Class of '84 donated \$600 for the new speakers on the east side of the stands, \$300 to the incoming Freshman Class (Class of '88), and the remainder of their treasury was given to the PRIDE Committee for student reward projects.

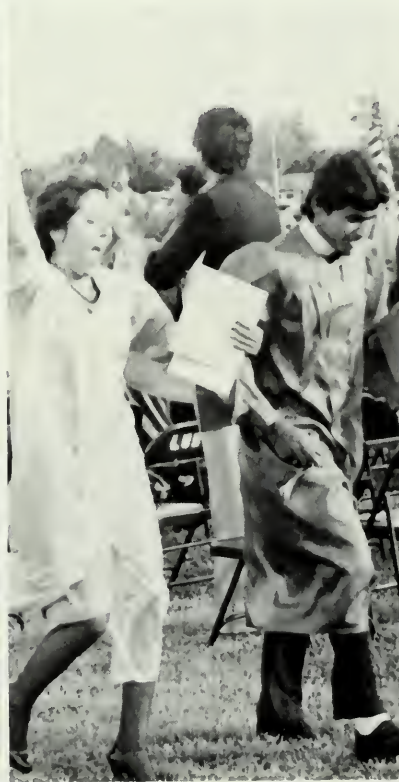

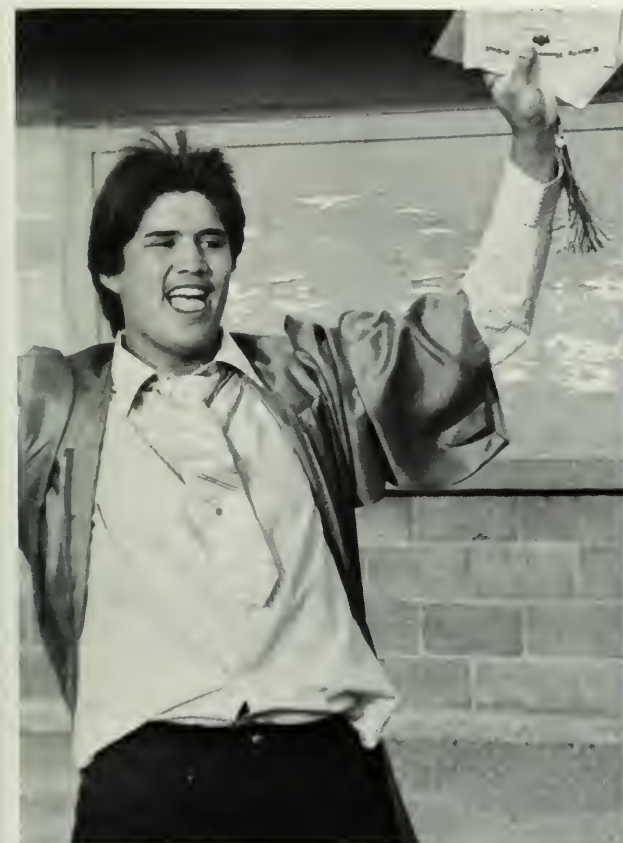

LOOKIN' GOOD in Curriculum meant new looking. With a new superintendent, principal, vice-principal, librarian, special education director, and four new teachers, curriculum was definitely looking good.

Although Mr. Dean Bettker came to us as Superintendent in April of 1983, it was really his first full year on the job. Many of his problems dealt with the problem of money. Because of the potential growth in this part of the county, the Liberty Union High School District and elementary districts within our boundaries, were faced with the problem of constructing and financing new schools to the tune of \$93 million in the years to come. Mr. Bettker spent numerous hours with developers and at the state capital to try to solve the problems of growth.

With the retirement of Mr. Lou Bronzan as principal, Mr. Tom Himmelberg was hired as our new principal. A former middle-school principal, Mr. Himmelberg brought youth and enthusiasm to the job. He saw the first Academic Decathlon participation for Liberty students and the development and printing of a school-wide calendar. He commented, "I am very pleased to be a part of the Liberty tradition. We have a caring and dedicated staff and enjoy much community support for various programs."

Mrs. Catherine Sorenson became the new head librarian with the retirement of Mr. S. The former library clerk, Mrs. Sorenson worked diligently to make the library a place that everyone would want to use. She continued her education, working toward a credential to go along with her library credential and bachelor degree.

With the retirement of Mr. Dewel Morgan, Mrs. Doreen Forlow became the special education director. Part of her thrust this year was to try to help individual departments realize some of their goals of helping special education students; this year Science and Social Studies were targeted for extra help. Mrs. Forlow brings a great deal of expertise and experience to the job of director.

When Mrs. Carol Russell took a leave of absence for the remainder of this school year (and all of 84-85), Mr. Jack Ferrill moved into her position as vice-principal on an interim basis. Because of his fine work, Mr. Ferrill's interim appointment became permanent for the 84-85 school year.

Four new teachers were added to the staff of the high school. In Social Studies, Mr. John Renteria comes to us fresh from student teaching and taught four periods of World History and one period of U.S. History. For his hard work and dedication, Mr. Renteria was rewarded with an advanced placement course in U.S. History for 84-85 (a new, pilot course for the high school). Mr. Tim McHugh was hired to become not only the new health teacher but also the coach for the reactivated soccer team. Coming from Humboldt State, Mr. McHugh brings a solid background in health and science. New to the Language Arts Department was one of the two women teachers hired this year. Mrs. Norma Equinoa not only taught five periods of English, she was also the advisor for the Sophomore Class. She commutes daily from Linden and still finds time to give those students extra help who needed it. The last new teacher hired this year was not in a single department but rather three of them. Mrs. Cathy Dickey had a health class, handled a World History section, and also taught P.E. When Mr. Von Schopp went on medical leave, she moved more into a full-time position in the Language Arts Department. She was also the principal of the Summer School Program with a theme of "Go for the Gold".

Mr. Allan E. Jones had several milestones in his career this school year. With the active support of band and community members, the uniforms were replaced with brand new ones for the first time in 20 years (to the tune of \$25,000). Mr. Jones also toured Oregon for four days with the band and played three concerts while there. During the year, Mr. Jones announced that he was hanging up his baton and retiring after Graduation on June 14, 1984. Good Luck with your retirement Allan!

Words, words, words. With the addition of Key Word Glossaries in U.S. History and Art Classes, students were made more familiar with concepts and vocabulary. The SIP financed the development of these two projects. Computers continued to play an important role on campus. New computers were purchased for the Special Education Department and the Career Center. In addition to those, four computers were purchased with SIP money and portabilized for use in any classroom. The computer literacy class was expanded to 2 sections both semesters and were full.

With the full ramifications of SB813 still unclear, the district and staff moved closer to a longer school year for 84-85 and a change in graduation requirements. Two years of math and science would be now required for graduation.

Mrs. Lucille Nerby served as the California School Employees Association president, while Mr. Bill Batze replaced Mr. David Kirby as the Liberty Education Association president.

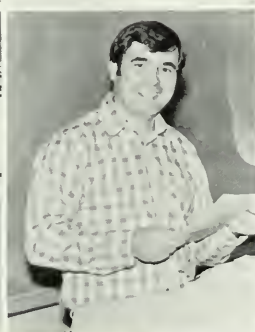
