









With the addition of two new teams to the FAL next year, the Lion teams face an exciting future.









































Curriculum

This has been a year of change for the staff at Liberty. Changes started last July with the sudden resignation of Mr. Tom Himmelberg as principal. With this vacancy existing the Superintendent, Dean Bettker, had a decision to make whether to go outside the district and recruit or promote from within. The decision was made to promote vice-principal Jack Ferrill to the principal position. Mr. Ferrill, who had been in charge of discipline and is a former PE teacher and coach, immediately had to fill his former position. Again, the administration chose to promote from within and Mrs. Cathy Dickey was selected to be the acting vice-principal in charge of discipline.

With the departure of Ms. Marcile Wright in October yet another opening was created. Mrs. Bev Sadler was picked for Marcile's Director of Curriculum and Instruction replacement; while Mr. Bob Glenn took over the project end of the job.

Two new mentor teachers were named this year bringing the total to four. Mr. Bill Batze was chosen in late January, while Mr.

Rolla Lewis was designated in May.

During the year Mr. Bettker became Dr. Bettker with the successful completion of his doctorate at USC in October.

The Board of Trustees saw change as incumbent, Mrs. Janet Berumen, was defeated in her election bid for another four years. She was replaced on the board by new-comer, Mrs. Joanne Byer. Successful in re-election bids for the Board were Mr. Leonard Gerry and Mrs. Arlene Poerio. Shortly after the elections, the Board voted not to renew the contract of Dr. Bettker. On May 15, the Board of Trustees designated Mr. Philip White as Superintendent of Liberty Union High School District. Mr. White was Principal of California High School. He had been with that district since 1979. He is a charter member of the San Ramon Rotary and has received the Paul Harris Award from the organization. Mr. White is involved with the San Ramon Valley Business and Education Round Table. Mr. White has a wife and two teenage daughters.

Starting change already for next year, the school saw a number of staff members retiring this year: Mr. Keith Dawson (PE), Mr. Roy Krumland (Business), Mrs. Gayle Krumland (Home Ec), and Mrs. Bernice Weborg (English, Math and History) and Mrs. Billie Casey and Mrs. Alta Ackerman secretaries. The Krumlands had been with the district for 37 years; while Mrs. Casey had 21 years and Mrs. Ackerman had 27. Mr. Dawson came to the district in the 50's and will continue as head Varsity track coach.

The 1985-86 school year welcomes the new teachers at Liberty which are Mr. Hugh Peterson, Mr. Mark Gates and Mr. Jim Sanford (English); Mr. Bob Reed (Science), Mrs. Libby Miller (Math), and Mrs. Lori Rivera/Smith (Foreign Language).

Nine teachers were granted tenure this year. They are Mrs. Cathy Dickey, Mrs. Norma Equinoa, Mrs. Velma Gonzalez, Mr. Don Lopez, Ms. Jan McAlister, Mrs. Norma McCain, Mr. Tim McHugh, Mr. John Renteria and Mrs. Katherine Sorenson.

One of the biggest changes to hit the campus this school year was a disastrous fire in the Attendance/Counseling Office complex. Set deliberately by an arson on January 20, the fire completely gutted the Attendance Office and smoke-damaged the Counseling end of the building. Virtually all permanent records and grades were salvaged but the SASI computer equipment had to be completely replaced. The Counseling Office moved to the Career Center while the Attendance Office took up headquarters in the old computer lab.

The fire delayed not only the construction of the new science complex but the rennovation of the older buildings. As if that weren't bad enough, leaking, underground tanks forced further delays in the science complex. When soil samples were taken in the area of the new science complex, it was discovered that gasoline had leaked into the ground from two tanks that had been

abandoned years before.

Change was evident in the physical appearance of the campus. Seven new portables were added during the summer and "Portable City" was born. The new classrooms were welcomed by the "gypsy" teachers who had been forced to teach in staff rooms, the gymnastics room, and the cafeteria for virtually the first quarter. Later in the school year, the portables that would house the King Vocational students arrived and were rapidly set up. These students were expected to be on campus the third week of June. Even more portables are on order as the community continues to grow rapidly.

Change has already started with the classified personnel. Mrs. Gale Fitzgerald accepted a better position as press operator for Contra Costa County and Mr. Bret Loomis was hired to replace her on our campus. With the retirement of Mrs. Casey, the search

started for a new principal's secretary; Mrs. Robin Beck, registrar, was selected to the position.

Yes, it was indeed a year of change for the staff of Liberty.
