## CHANGE! CHANGE! CHANGE!

These words seem to highlight what has happened to our campus in the last twelve months since our lass yearlook his the streets. The newest, major changes started last spring as the heavy equipment moved onto the jv sofiball diamond at the east end of Nash Hall. Within days the diamond was a dim memory as first the grass was stripped and piled, the ground semi-graded, and then fill was brought in to bring it up to the necessary height. After compacting the fill and waiting for a few days the entire area, less a small part for new lawn, was paved twice. Then the construction started on the foundations for the new bathroom and Home Ec. classroom. With the foundations intact, portable buildings began to arrive in flocks and it wasn"t long before there were eight new portables in place; two on foundations and six resting on treated wood on the blacktop itself. Finally it became time to move two trailers (an easy task despite some low tires) and five "not so portable" portables (it was finally decided to move them intact). With the opening of school rapidly approaching, the desperate scramble continued to get the new buildings wired and the fire alarms in and approved. When school opened the new "Portable City" was ready and both the administration and maintenance heaved massive sighs of relief.

The five portables that were not new that were moved were renovated after they were moved and became respectively: the counseling office ( $\mathrm{P}-2$ ), the attendance and vice-principals offices ( $\mathrm{P}-1$ ) , and the career center ( $\mathrm{P}-3$ ). The other two portables remained math classrooms but were completely refurbished with new carpet, siding, and paint. The old attendance office became a staff room for both classified and certificated staff with a fridge and micro-wave available for use.

Change became evident on the campus itself as Mrs. Dorothy Weeks and Mrs. Robin Beck both worked hard to raise over $\$ 400$ for new trees. With that money and some donated trees; Mr. Bud Ross and Mr. Rudy Ramirez were keprt busy for almost a week digging holes, putting in a soil dressing and deep-watering pipes and planting the trees themselves. Unsafe sections of concrete were removed outside the library and near the gym were removed and replaced with fresh slabs. The benches near the library were refitted wish new aluminum seats.

When students arrived on campus in September they were greeted with new unfinished lockers in the Nash Hall. However, by the first of October the new lockers were ready and the congestion was on. Seniors were a little luckier and were given lockers in E and S Wings. Students were forbidden to use the lockers in either C or D Wings. The new lockers were smaller on the ouside and not as high as the old ones but had almost the same cubic displacement as the ones they replaced.

The Science Department spent a number of days moving chemicals and equipment out of storage areas in D Wing in anticipation of the rennovation of that wing in September. A trailer was moved next to the T Portables to house the moved materials. When it became obvious that the state would not have the necessary funds 10 remodel any of the $30+$ year-old buildings, two of the former classrooms were equipped with desks and utilized for the remainder of the school year. The lack of funds from the state kept many projects for change on the back burner including the start of construction on the science wing and vocational complexes.

In an effort to overcome the lack of state funding, the Board of Trustees voted to put a $\$ 10$ million bond election on the ballot in June. The bond would be used to buy land in the Oakley area for another high school site, rennovare C and D) Wings, and do other necessary building while we wait for state funds to be freed up or state bonds to pass.

More changes took place on the campus as two new diamonds were constructed and a third was renovated. Using part of the old varsity softball diamond, a beautiful new diamond was laid out and constructed and included fences on thrce sides. The entire diamond, practice area was redone and reseeded and began to look postively beautiful by April. A new fence was constructed along side the practice area seperating it from the rest of the campus. Another new diamond was constructed next to the foorball stands and featured a unique oval backstop; this diamond would be utilized mainly for little and peewee league baseball. The old, old varsity softball diamond was brought up to par and utilized as the new jv softball diamond. Red clay was brought in to fill the infields of all five of the diamonds.

Change was evident in the staff of the school as well. Joining the certificated staff: Mrs. Larraine Anderson, English Skills 3, Advanced English 3, English 1; Mrs. Alice Bush, Practical Spanish, English Skills 3, Spanish 1; Ms. Joyce Dellamore, Reading Skills and Special Education Coordinator; Mr. John Gist, Introduction to Biology and Life Science; Mrs. Carolyn McLaughlin, Algebra 100-101, and Algebra 1A; Mr. John Carroll, English 1, English IV, and Speech; and Mrs. Bonnie Tilton, Algebra 100101, Algebra $100 \mathrm{~B} / \mathrm{L}$. Mr. Carroll replaced Mr. Robert Russell in the English Department. Mr. Russell went on leave of absence starting the end of January.

This year Liberty applied for a Distinquished School Award and was visited by a team from the State Department of Education in the Spring. At press time the decision had not been announced by State Superintendent of Education Bill Honing.

There was one major change in administration as Mr. Greg Wright became the new head counselor replacing Mrs. Sue Fortner who was on leave of absence. The other change in administration was Mr. Gerald Hardt replacing Mr. Robert Glenn as Projects Administrator. Mr. Phil White continued as superintendent; Mr. Jack Ferrill was principal; while Mrs. Cathy Dickey and Mr. Mike Schrader were the two vice principals. Board of Trustees continued as Mr. Leonard Gerry, Mrs. Arlene Poerio, Mrs. Joann Byer, Mrs. Susan Hopkins, and Mrs. Barbara Ghiselli. Mr. Maggie Fajardo continued as transportation supervisor while Mr. Bryan Roofe was still supervisor of buildings and grounds. Mr. Larry Anzini became the new cafeteria manager as Mrs. Barbara Clark retired after 22 years of service. With the retirement of Mr. Bill Snow, Mrs. Bev Sadler became the SIP Coordinator as well as continuing as Director of Curriculum and Instruction. One of Mrs. Sadler's major tasks this year was to oversee the rewriting of the SIP plan for the next three years. Mr. Roy Ghiggeri continued to wear three hats as he was Director of Adule Education, Athletic Director, and Director of Student Activities. Mrs. Wanda Lathrope was Business Manager for the District.

Mr. Rob Russell was named a new mentor teacher in Video Coaching while Mrs. Joanne Nash was tabbed as Math Mentor. Mr. Rolla Lewis had his 1 -year term renewed for three years and would specialize in the English Department. Mr. Bill Batze continued as mentor for classroom management and instructional strategies. Mrs. Sadler served as mentor coordinator.

The DC/DC Committee was completely realigned this year and certain department chairs were made members of it. The department chairs are as follows: Mrs. Kaye Axelgard-Reeves, P.E.; Mr. Batze, Social Studies; Mr. Jerry Crawford, Math; Ms. Joyce Dellamore, Special Education; Ms. Virginia Diehl, English; Mrs. Jeanne Glenn, Homemaking; Mr. Glenn, Science; Mr Robert Gonzalez, Applied Arts; Mr. Don Lopez, Agriculture; Mr. Bill Peters, Fine Arts; Ms. Reta Pirtle, Business; and Mr. Robert Smith, Performing Arts. Counselors were Ms. Julia Arce, Mr. Jerry Black, Mr. Elias Hernandez, and Mrs. Barbara Whitfield.

Yes, change was in the air as Liberty moved towards the 90 s and the 2 Ist Century.
