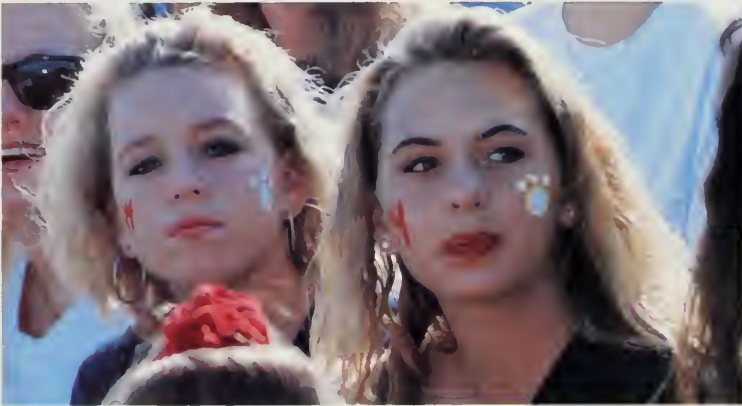

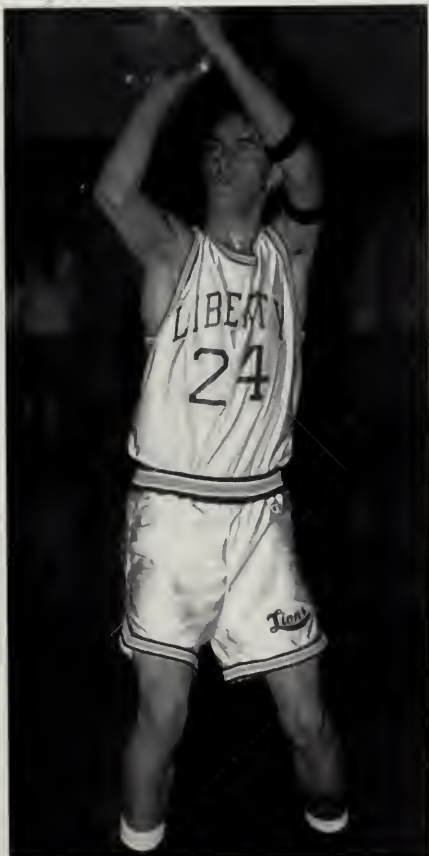

The Varsity finished the dual meet season with but a single loss to College Park. Moving into a new league will mean even tougher competition for the wrestlers next year.

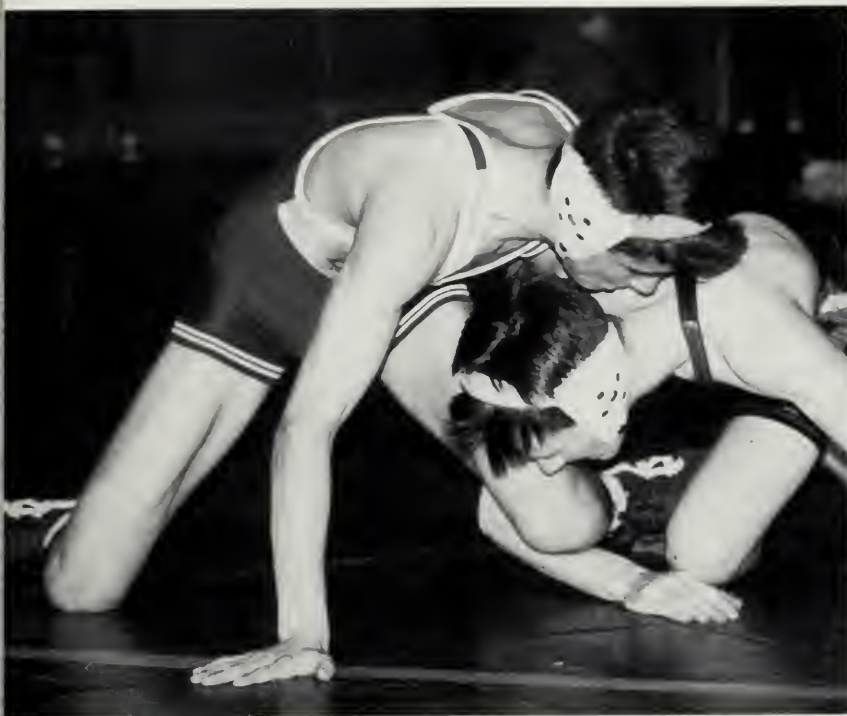

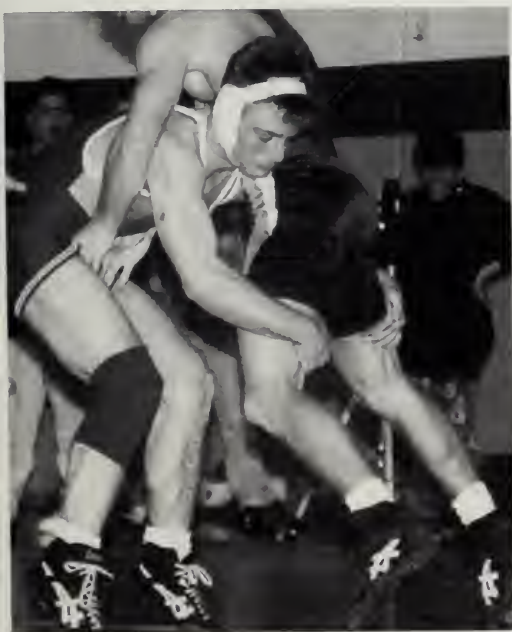

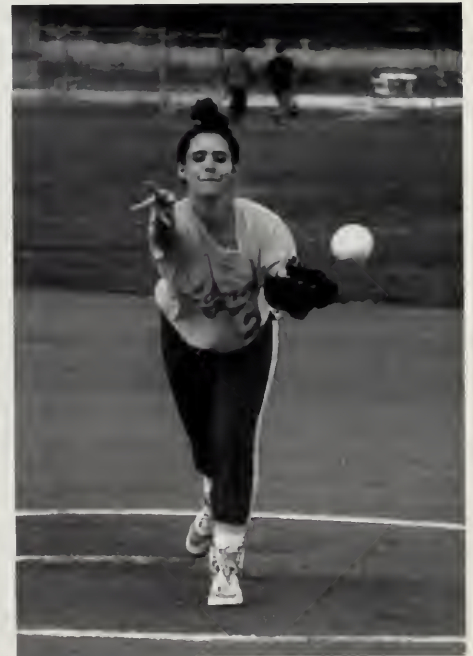

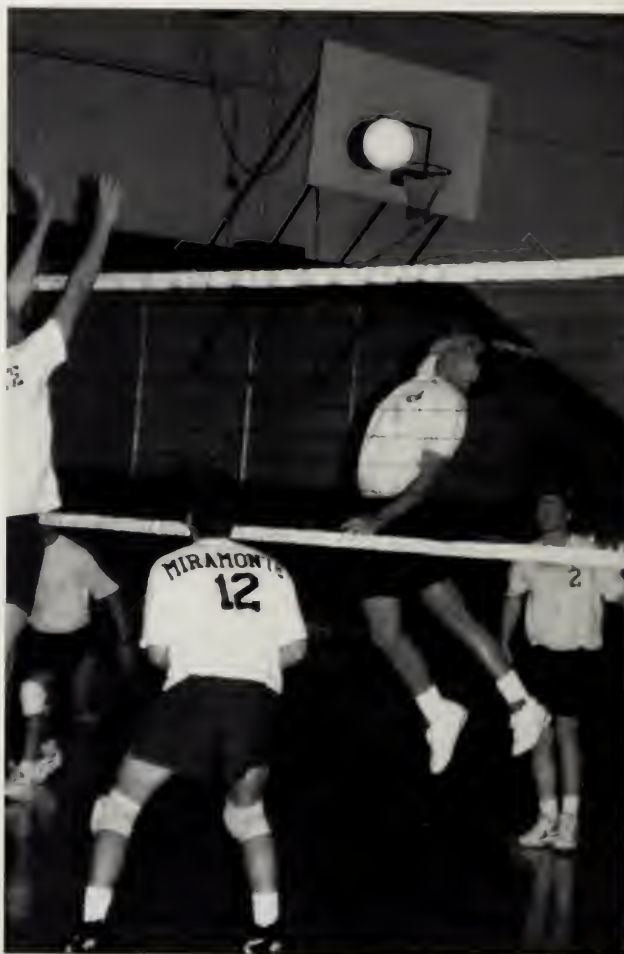


lamming their way into the league, the athletic department added boys' volleyball to its list of competition teams at Liberty.

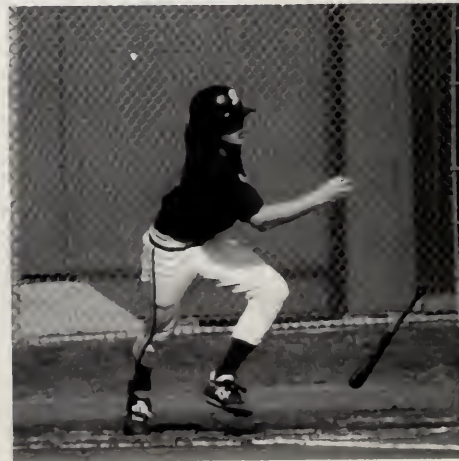

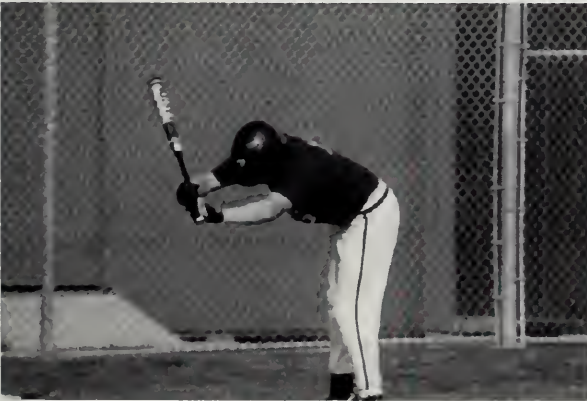

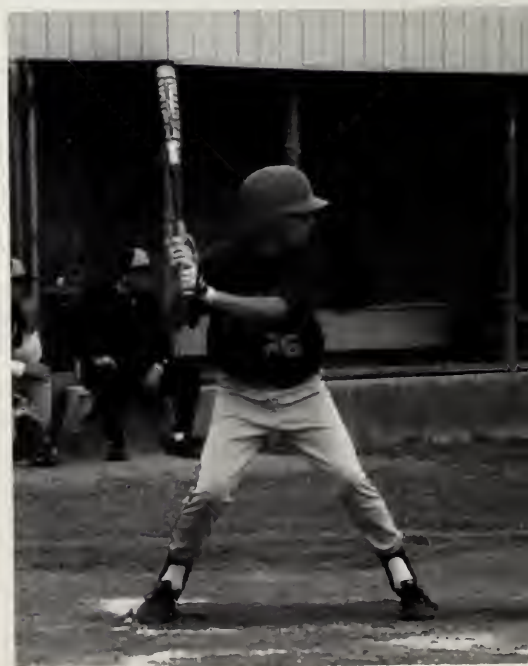

Cameras were overabundant as friends tried to capture the memories of their last dance together; the night the Class of '93 was "Forever Young".

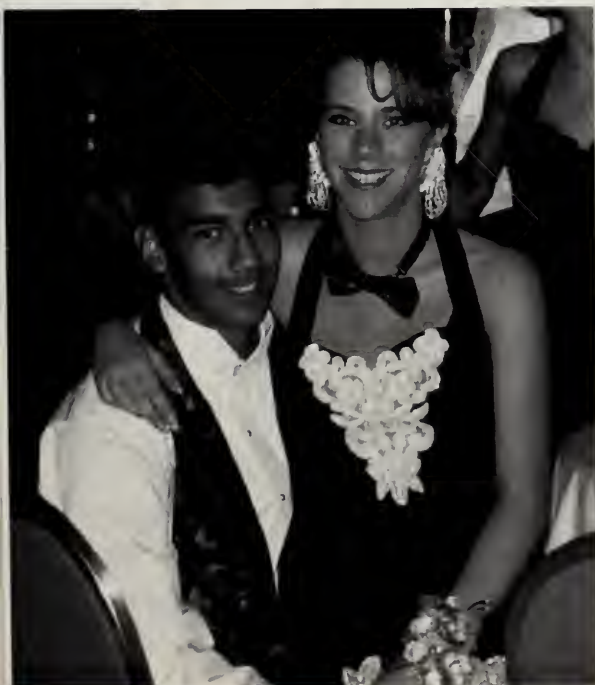

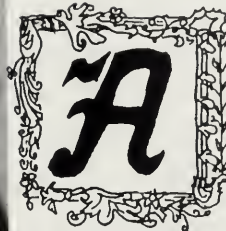
