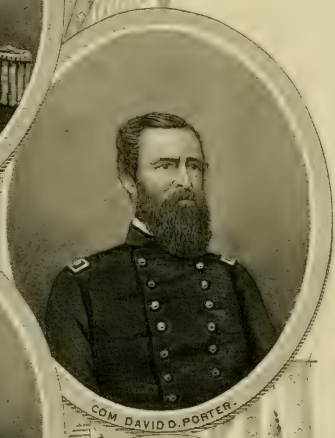
I think there would be quite as much chance of the passage of the measure in this shape as in the one you propose, and it has the advantage of being simpler, and more just to the Claimants.

New Orleans to Galveston, on the Bar at the mouth of the harbour.

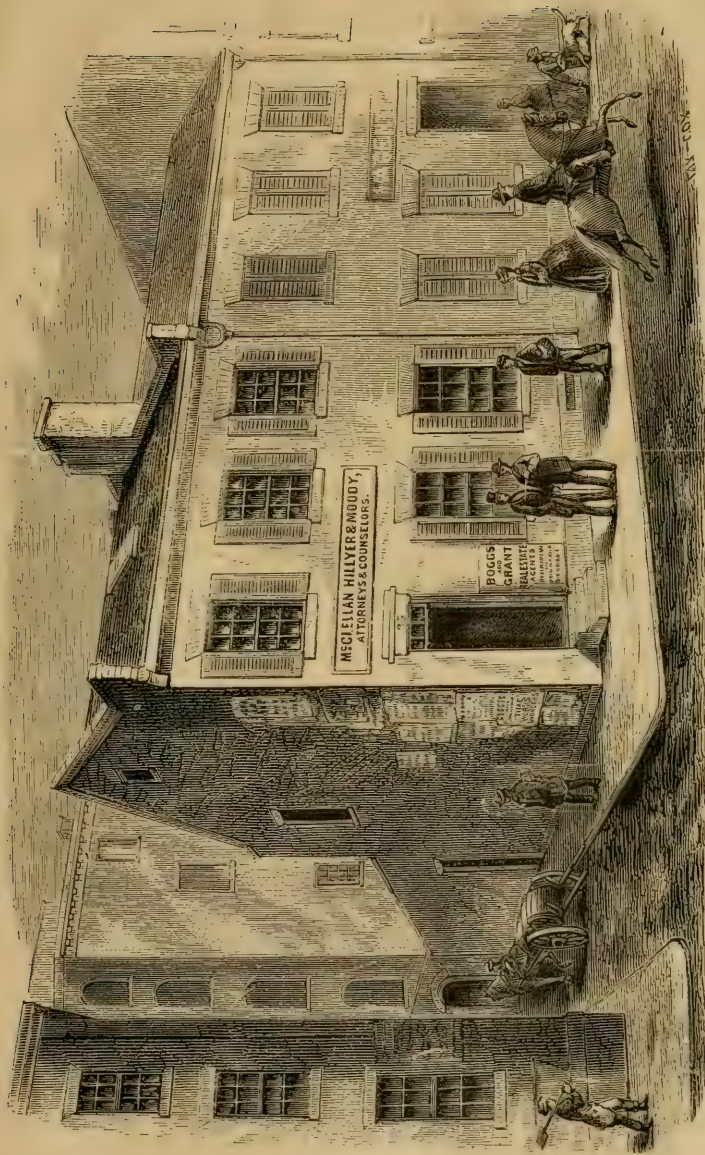
A vessel was seen on the 10th by C. A. Rogers Esq. the Consul at that
