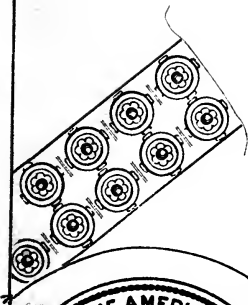

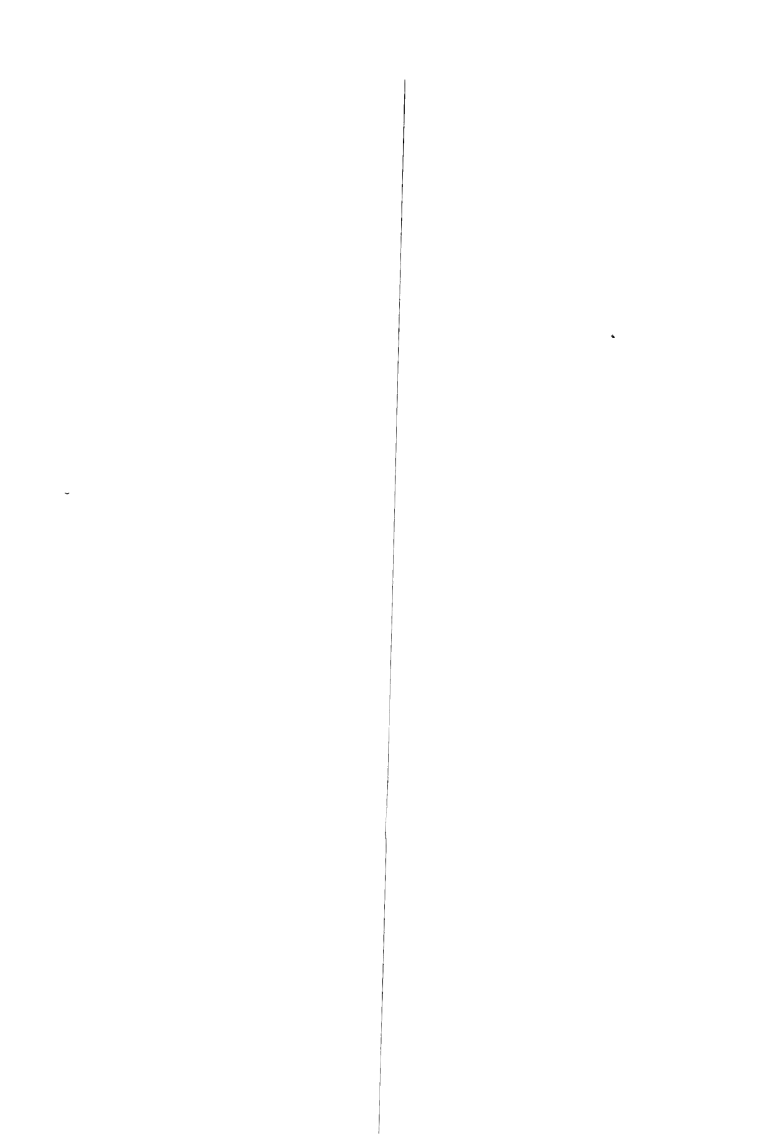

THE ORGANIZATION OF THE SOCIETY.

THE National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution was organized in the city of Washington, in the parlors of the Strathmore Arms, October 11, 1890, the Anniversary of the Discovery of America by Columbus.

The Society was incorporated under the laws of Congress June 8, 1891.

The Charter Membership, numbering 818, closed October 11, 1891.

The objects of this Society are—

(1) To perpetuate the memory and the spirit of the men and women who achieved American Independence by the acquisition and protection of historical spots and the erection of monuments ; by the encouragement of historical research in relation to the Revolution and the publication of its results ; by the preservation of documents and relics, and of the records of the individual services of Revolutionary soldiers and patriots, and by the promotion of celebrations of all patriotic anniversaries.

(2) To carry out the injunction of Washington in his farewell address to the American people. "to promote, as an object of primary importance, institutions for the general diffusion of knowledge," thus developing an enlightened public opinion, and affording to young and old such advantages as shall develop in them the largest capacity for performing the duties of American citizens.

(3) To cherish, maintain and extend the institutions of American freedom, to foster true patriotism and love of country, and to aid in securing for mankind all the blessings of liberty.

ELIGIBILITY.

The sole requisite for eligibility to membership in this patriotic and national Society is *proven lineal descent* from an ancestor who, with unflinching loyalty, rendered material aid to the cause of Independence as a recognized patriot, as soldier or sailor, or as a civil officer in one of the several Colonies or States, or of the United Colonies or States ; or from the mother of such a patriot ; provided that the applicant shall be at least eighteen years of age and acceptable to the Society.

SEAL.

The seal of the Society shall be one and seven-eighths of an inch in diameter, charged with the figure of a dame of the Revolutionary time



sitting at her spinning-wheel, with thirteen stars above her, the whole surrounded by a rim containing the legend, "Daughters of the American Revolution, 1776-1890," and the motto, "Home and Country."

THE INSIGNIA.

The insignia of the Society shall consist of a badge in the form of a spinning-wheel and distaff, to be worn on ceremonial occasions upon a bow of ribbon. The wheel is seven-eighths

of an inch in diameter and of gold, with thirteen spokes and a field of light-blue enamel upon its tire bearing the name of the Society in letters of gold. Upon its outer rim, opposite the ends of the spokes, are thirteen small stars, which may be set with precious stones at the discretion of the owner. Underneath the wheel is a golden distaff one and one-half inches long filled with silver flax. Upon the back of the wheel the registration number of the owner shall be engraved, and her name may be added. The ribbon to be worn with the wheel is dark blue with a white edge ribbed and watered, following the colors of Washington's staff. A rosette of the prescribed ribbon attached to a stick-pin may be worn as an informal badge upon ordinary occasions.

Granddaughter of George Steptoe Washington and Lucy Payne, his wife.

Great-granddaughter of Col. Samuel Washington and Annie Steptoe, his wife. Samuel Washington was a colonel in the Virginia Line of the Revolutionary Army.

Also descendant on her maternal side from Col. Charles Francois Joseph Count de Flechir, who was born in France in 1755, died in New York in 1815, and who served in the War of the Revolution.

Granddaughter of Gen. Thomas Fletcher and Nancy McIlhenney, his wife. Gen. Thomas Fletcher served in War of 1812 on the staff of Gen. William Henry Harrison. He was grandson of Col. Flechir, who came to Virginia with his friend and maternal kinsman Marquis de Lafayette, and entered the service as a private. He was soon elected captain of Company H, "Independent Washington Guards;" reporting to the Commander-in-Chief, he was ordered to Canada.

Great-granddaughter of Samuel Fletcher and Abigail West, his wife. Col. Flechir's name was Americanized and spelled "Fletcher."

Great-great-granddaughter of Charles Francois Joseph Count de Flechir, and Ruth Phillips Sourency, his wife.

Col. Charles Francois Joseph Count de Flechir served in the War for Independence as colonel of horse, in Canada.

MRS. SARA AGNES RICE PRYOR. 2

Born in Virginia.

Wife of Roger A. Pryor.

Descendant of Rev. David Rice and Col. John Otey.

Daughter of Samuel Blair Rice and Lucinda Walton Leftwich, his wife.

Granddaughter of William Rice, of "Greenwood," Charlotte county, Va., and Mary Bacon Crenshaw, his wife.

Great-granddaughter of David Rice, of Kentucky, and Mary Blair, his wife. David Rice acted in the capacity of clergyman and orator to the Hanover militia in 1775. He was, in 1792, a member of the convention which framed the first constitution of the State of Kentucky.

Also granddaughter of Rev. William Leftwich and Frances Otey, his wife.

Great-granddaughter of Col. John Otey, of Bedford, Va., and Mary Hopkins, his wife. Col. John Otey served as colonel and captain of a battalion of riflemen.

Also descendant of Col. William Leftwich, Chaplain Samuel Blair, and Maj. Gen. Joel Leftwich.

MRS. ELLEN HARDIN WALWORTH. 3

Born in Illinois.

Descendant of Col. John Hardin, of Virginia.

Daughter of John J. Hardin and Sarah Ellen Smith, his wife.

Granddaughter of Martin D. Hardin and Elizabeth Logan, his wife.

Great-granddaughter of John Hardin and Jane Davies, his wife.

John Hardin was lieutenant in Morgan's Rifle Corps, colonel in Wayne's campaign, etc. At the battle of

Saratoga he performed distinguished services and received the public thanks of Gen. Gates. In 1792 he was sent from Kentucky by special order of Gen. Washington on a mission of peace to the Indians in Northern Ohio and was massacred by them.

Also descendant of Gen. Benjamin Logan, who did great service in establishing the Commonwealth of Kentucky, as well as distinguished service during the Revolutionary period.

MISS MARY DESHA.

Born in Kentucky.

First member, and one of the organizers, of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

Descendant of Marguerite Briarley, mother of Col. John Montgomery, Jr., a soldier in the Revolutionary Army.

Daughter of John Randolph Desha, M. D., and Mary Curry, his wife.

Granddaughter of Joseph Desha (a soldier in the Revolution at 15 years of age; with Mad Anthony Wayne in '96, a major general in 1812, and governor of Kentucky in 1825) and Margaret Bledsoe, his wife.

Great-granddaughter of Robert Desha, a soldier of the Revolution.

Great-granddaughter of Isaac Bledsoe and Katherine Montgomery, his wife. Isaac Bledsoe was a pioneer of Tennessee, a famous Indian fighter (called by the Indians "Tullituskee"—the waving corn-blade—or perpetual motion, because they never caught him napping), and also a soldier of the Revolution.

Great-great-granddaughter of John Montgomery, Sr., and Marguerite Briarley, his wife.

John Montgomery, Jr., the son of John Montgomery and Marguerite Briarley, was an officer in the Revolutionary Army.

Great-granddaughter of Joseph Wheeler, a lieutenant in Braddock's army and a soldier of the Revolution.

Great-great-granddaughter of Katherine Montgomery, "a dispatch bearer" during the Revolution, sister of Col. John Montgomery.

MISS F. PAGE ROBINSON. 5

Born in Virginia.

Descendant of Col. William Robinson.

Daughter of Maj. Thomas Robinson and Mary S. Hoomes, his wife.

Granddaughter of Col. Beverly Robinson and Sarah Downing, his wife.

Great-granddaughter of Maj. John Robinson and Katherine Page, his wife.

Great-great-granddaughter of Rev. William Robinson and Agatha Beverly Smith, his wife. Rev. William Robinson was a clergyman and soldier in the Revolutionary War, and bore the title of colonel.

MRS. MARY V. ELLET CABELL. 6

Born in Virginia.

Descendant of Israel Israel, of Pennsylvania.

Daughter of Col. Charles Ellet, Jr., and Elvira Augusta Stuart Daniel, his wife.

Granddaughter of Charles Ellet and Mary Israel, his wife.

Great-granddaughter of Israel Israel and Hannah Erwin, his wife.

Israel Israel was a member of the Committee of Safety of Pennsylvania and a recognized active patriot.

Also granddaughter of Judge William Daniel and Margaret Baldwin, his wife.

Great-granddaughter of Dr. Cornelius Baldwin and Mary Briscoe, his wife.

Cornelius Baldwin was surgeon in the American Army throughout the Revolution.

Also great-granddaughter of Ensign William Daniel and Pattie Allen, his wife.

Ensign William Daniel served in the War of Independence as ensign in Capt. Arda Allen's company. He was appointed in April, 1776.

MRS. CAROLINE SCOTT HARRISON. 7

Born in Ohio.

Wife of Benjamin Harrison, twenty-first President of the United States.

Descendant of John Scott and Saul Rea.

Daughter of John Witherspoon Scott and Mary Neal, his wife.

Granddaughter of George McElery Scott and Anna Rea, his wife.

Great-granddaughter of John Scott and Agnes McElery, his wife.

Great-great-granddaughter of John Scott and Jane Mitchell, his wife.

John Scott was commissary general of the Pennsylvania Line.

Also descendant of Saul Rea, who held civil office during the Revolution and was a member of Congress.

Daughter of Bushrod Washington and Henrietta Bryan Spotswood, his wife.

Great-granddaughter of John Aug. Washington and Aug. Washington and Hannah Bushrod and Ann Ayllett, their wives.

Great-great-granddaughter of Aug. Washington, his first wife, Jane Butler, second, Mary Ball, and of John Spotswood and Mary Dandridge, his wife.

MISS ELIZABETH WESTWOOD WASHINGTON. 9

Descendant of Mrs. Catherine Storke Washington.

Descendant of Col. William Washington.

Daughter of Thomas D. Condé and Jane Washington Ancrum, his wife.

Granddaughter of James Hasell Ancrum and Jane Washington, his wife.

Great-granddaughter of William Washington and Jane Elliott, his wife.

William Washington was colonel of cavalry in the Revolution.

MRS. MARGARETTA P. JACK HETZEL. 12
