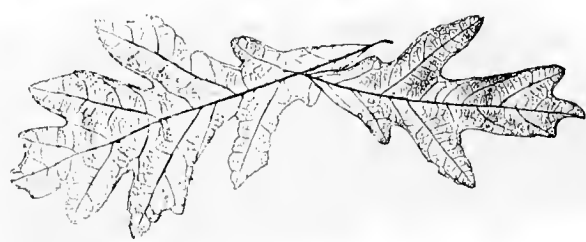


Activities

JOHN BRAINE

John Braine, an outstanding British novelist, spoke to Peace on "The Creative Novelist at Work." He is best known for his first novel *Room at the Top*, which has been a best-seller in the United States as well as in England and has also been made into a motion picture. John Braine is from Yorkshire and has been devoted to writing since 1951.



EUGENE JEMISON

Eugene Jemison is a talented and versatile artist, a painter, a folk-singer, and a photographer. He gave an interesting lecture at Peace, speaking on "The Creative Aspects of Folk Music." Mr. Jemison is an accomplished singer of folk songs and a recognized scholar in the field of folklore and folk music. Also, Mr. Jemison conducted discussion classes on graphic arts and printing.



DR. CHARLES S. MCCOY

Dr. Charles S. McCoy, professor of Religion in Higher Education at the Pacific School of Religion in Berkeley, California, lectured at Peace on "The Coming Agony in Higher Education." Dr. McCoy held classes and informal meetings with students and faculty and discussed "The Divine Disguise." Dr. McCoy is a native of North Carolina, who attended Duke University Divinity School and received his Ph.D. degree from Yale University.

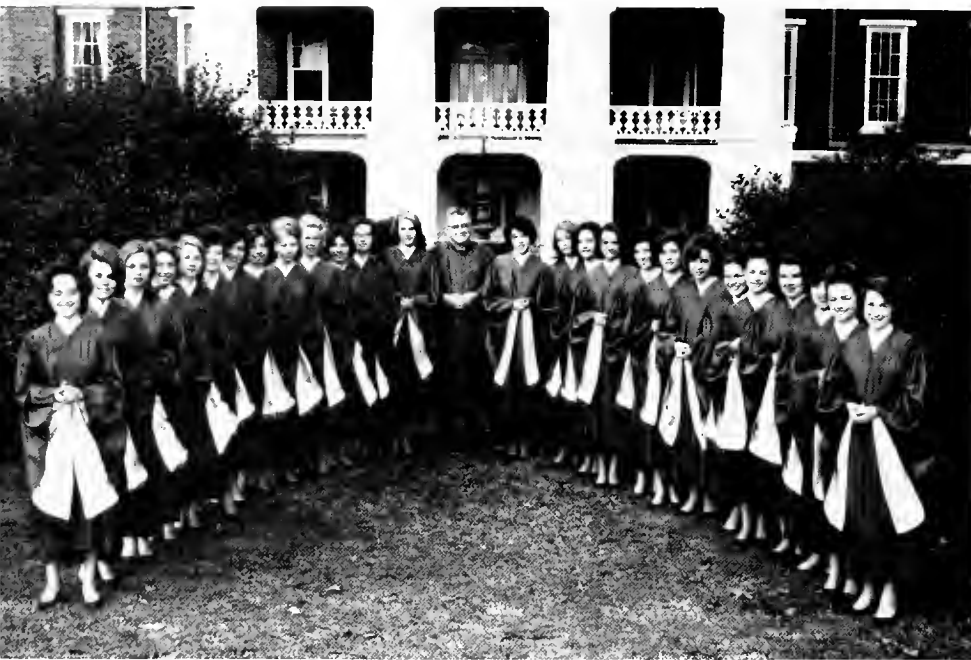
PEACE TIMES
