Peace College students expand their efforts to help

In the Eighties college students were criticized for their self-absorption. In the Nineties, Peace College students are being lauded for their willingness to help others.

About a fourth of Peace College's roughly 500 students are involved in volunteer programs ranging from tutoring small children to distributing clothes to the homeless. The students are involved in about eight different community service projects this year.

The student volunteers will be recognized during a special cha-

pel service April 18.

Their volunteer spark wasn't lighted by well-meaning advisers either. The Peace Student Christian Association decided it was time students at the two-year women's college provided a little more community service.

Association members long have done service projects. But aside from the annual Crop Walk and a Christmas party for children at a nearby public housing development, most were on-campus activities such as blood drives and fund-raisers for faculty gifts.

"We wanted to expand to serve not just Peace but to serve the community, too," Jan Cowan, president of the association, said. "It's too easy to stay in your own

little world and not see what's going around you."

All Peace students automatically are members of the association, but its active membership totals about 100. It is run by a 10-member cabinet representing the various denominations on campus. The expanded volunteer program

is the association's first organized attempt to attract more students.

Students decided to focus their efforts on children and homeless people. Then they had to decide how to start. That's where Raleigh's First Presbyterian Church came in. The church, which has a strong ties with the Presbyterian

college, provided a number of volunteer opportunities.

About 18 Peace students work in the church's soup kitchen each week helping to prepare and serve its Wednesday lunches. Through the church, several students have become Big Sisters to youngsters with disabilities, and every Friday afternoon 20 students sort clothes from the church's clothes closet.

Carol O'Brian, First Presbyterian's community outreach coordinator, said the students had done a good job with the clothes closet.

"We have an awful lot of clothes come through here . . . and we've not had a lot of time to get

Peace College Foreign Study Program Cambridge, England

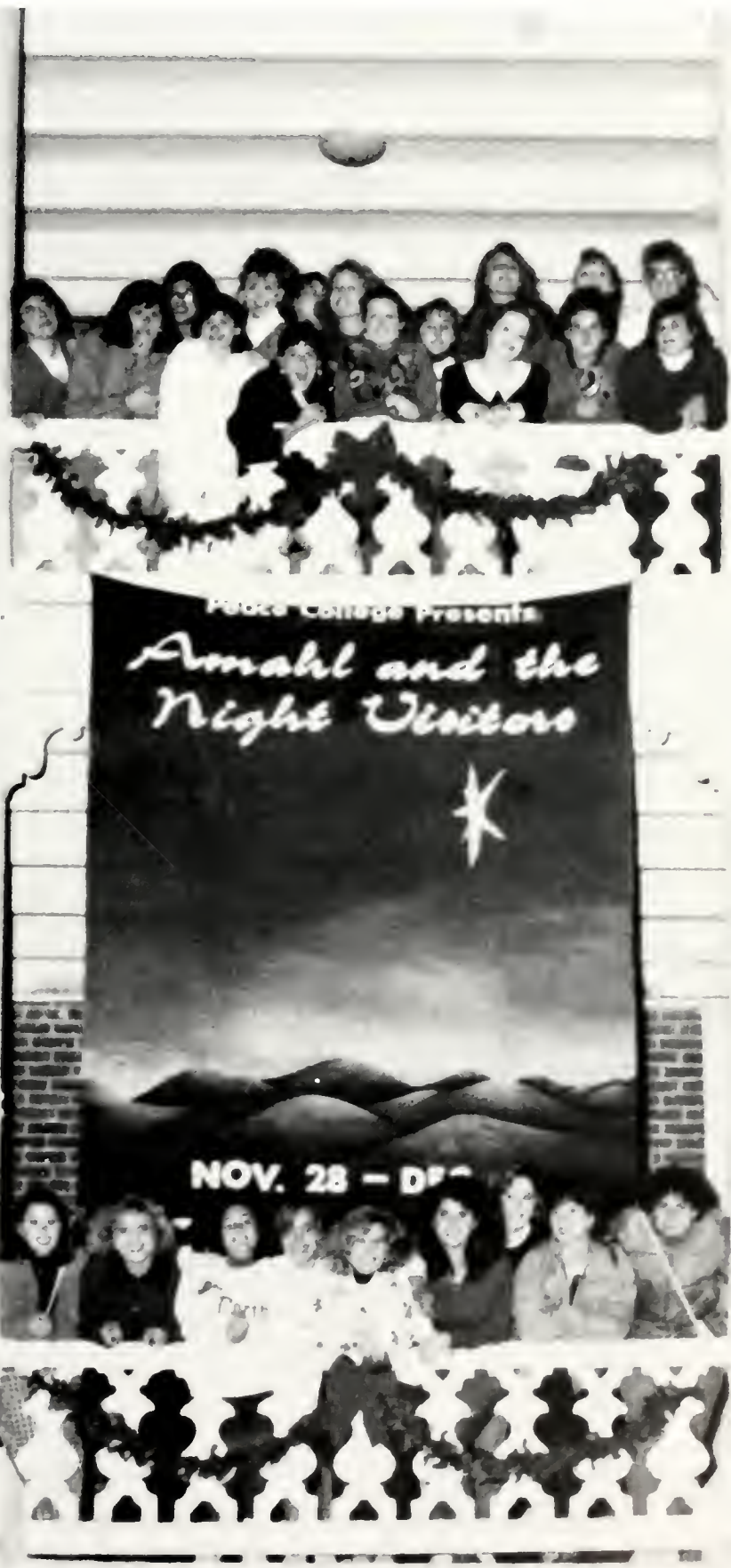

They then visited related landmarks such as Ely Cathedral, Shakespearean Theatre in Stratford-upon-Avon and the Tate Gallery in London. Students had free time in and around Cambridge and were able to explore for themselves, in groups of two or three, places such as Bath, Sudbury, and London. Honor Court

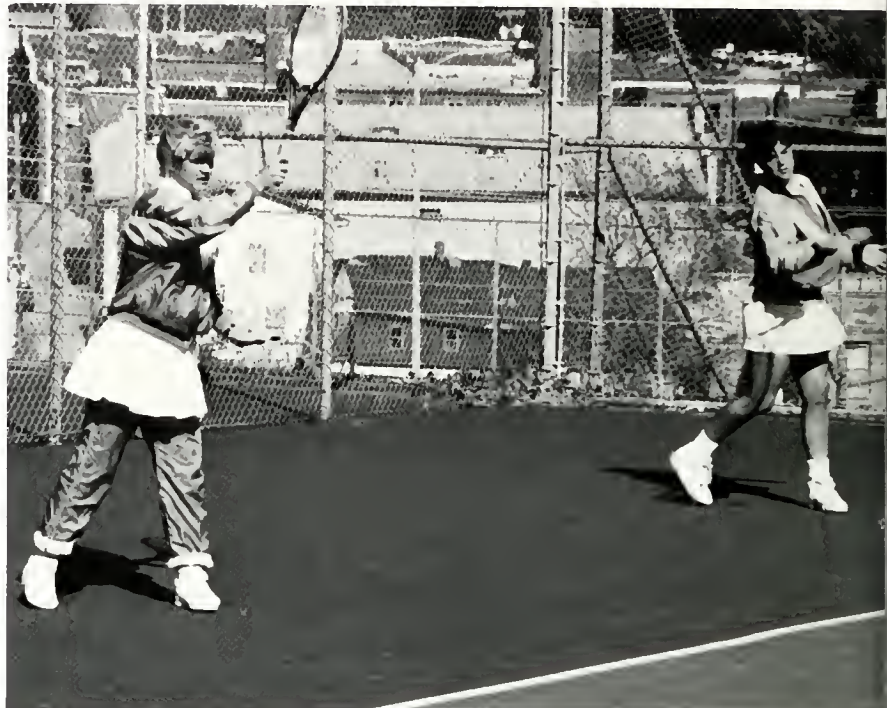


Peace College Tennis

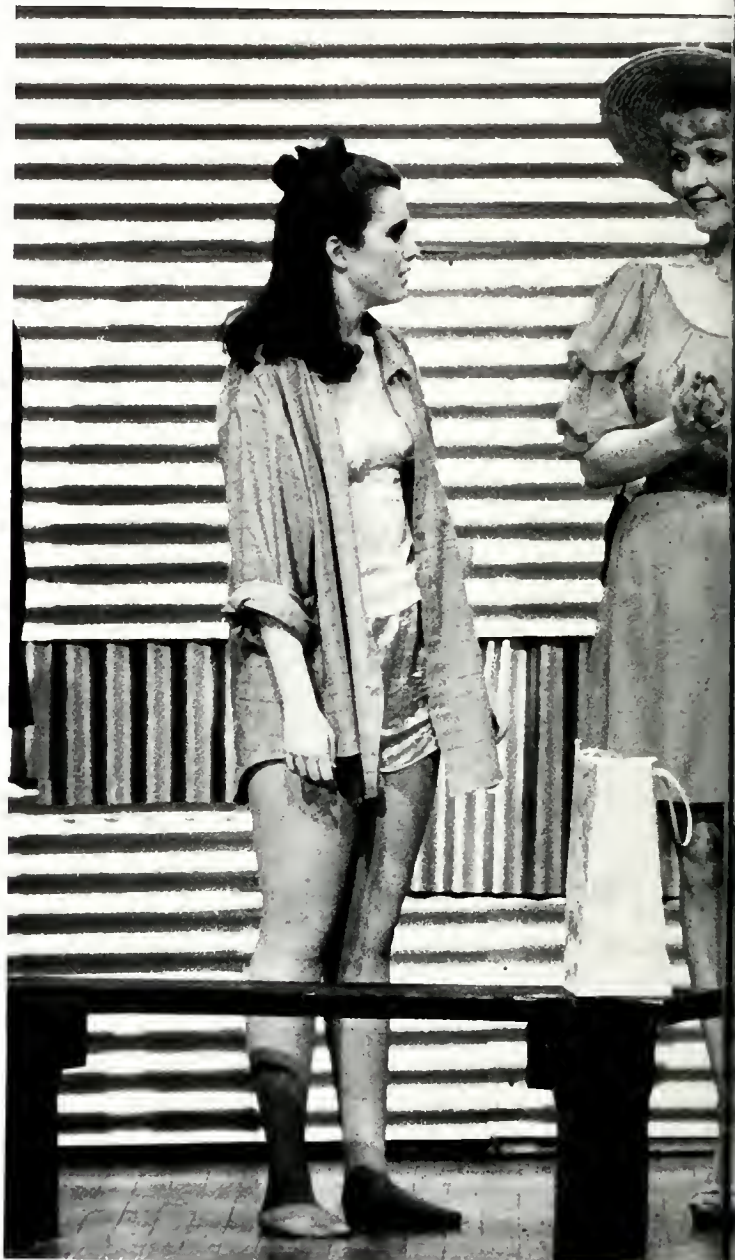
