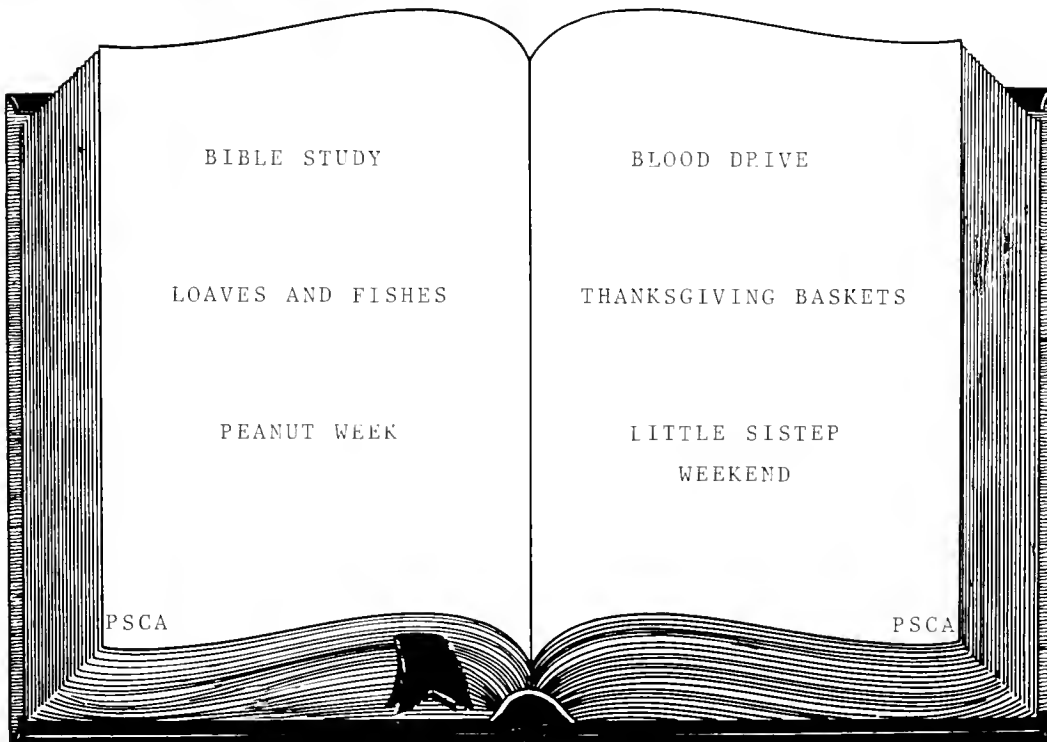

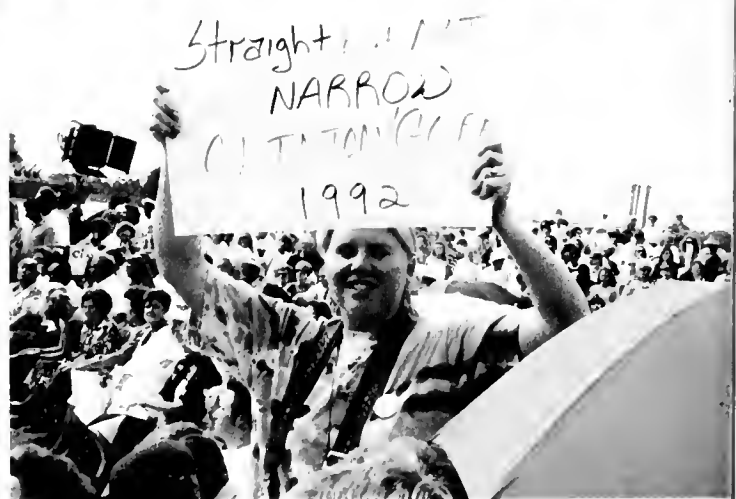

Each day after, choices must be made. The Code helps remind each girl that even though the moral thing to do is not always the easiest, she should trust her own instincts.

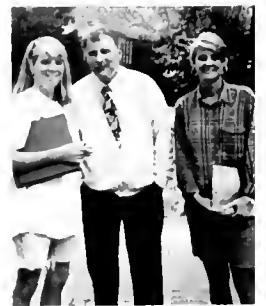
However, sometimes the wrong choices are made, and the court becomes involved, again serving as a Judiciary Board for the violation of the Honor Code.

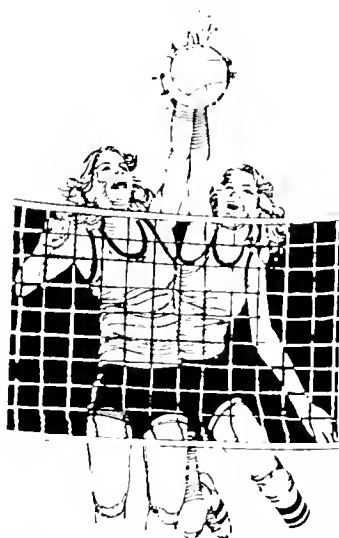
SOCCER

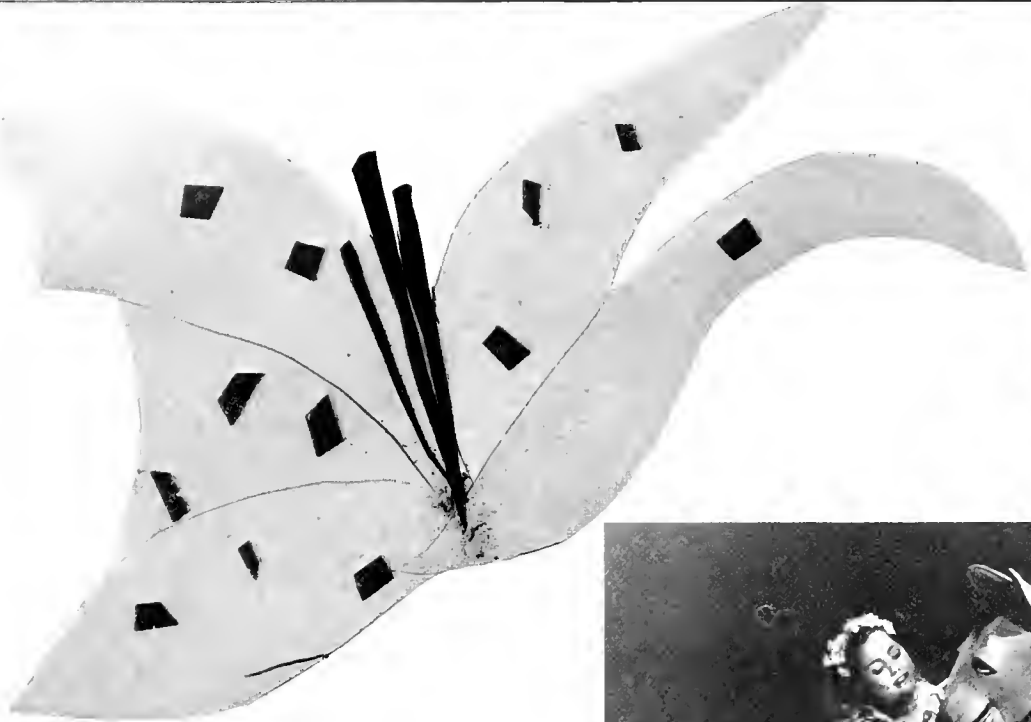

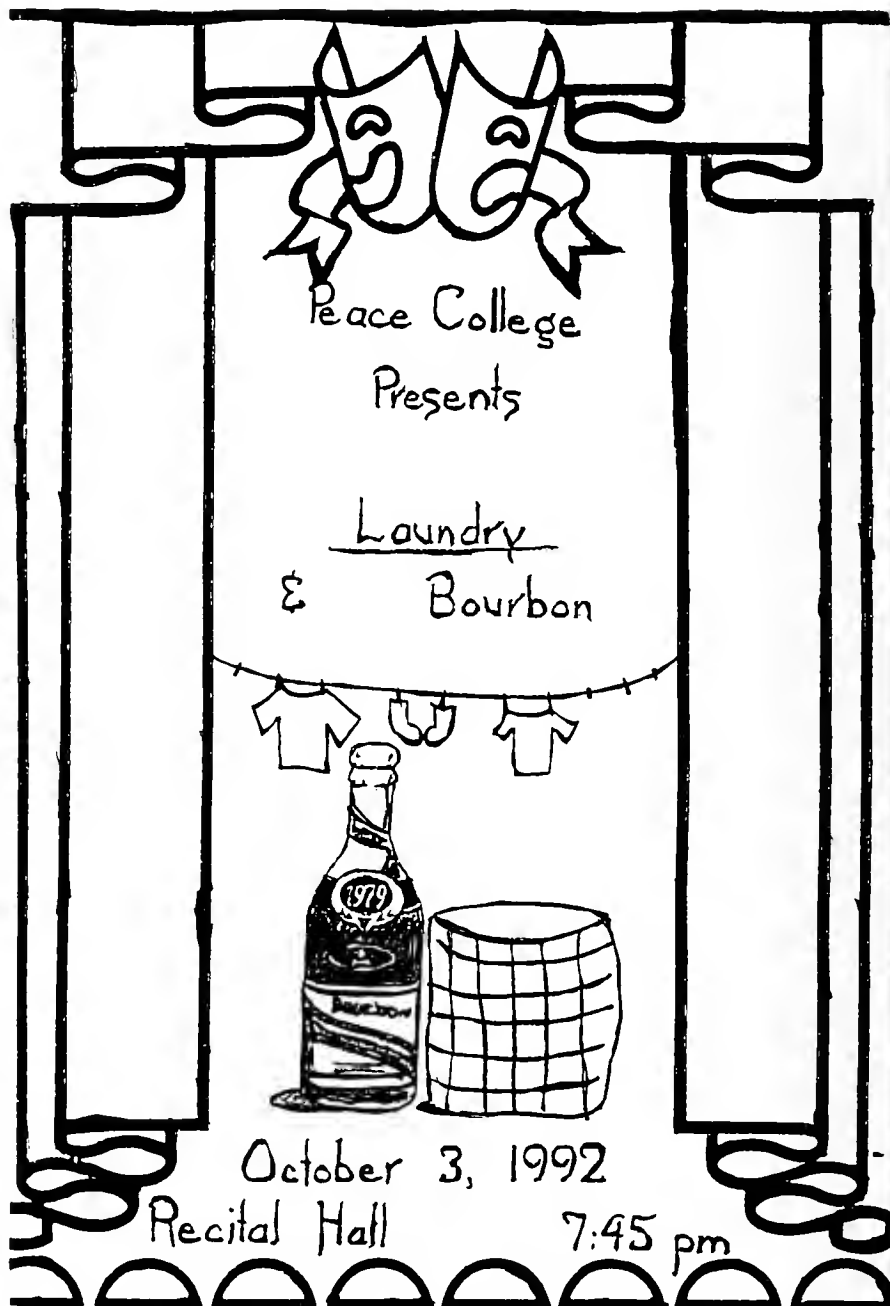


Laundry and Bourbon

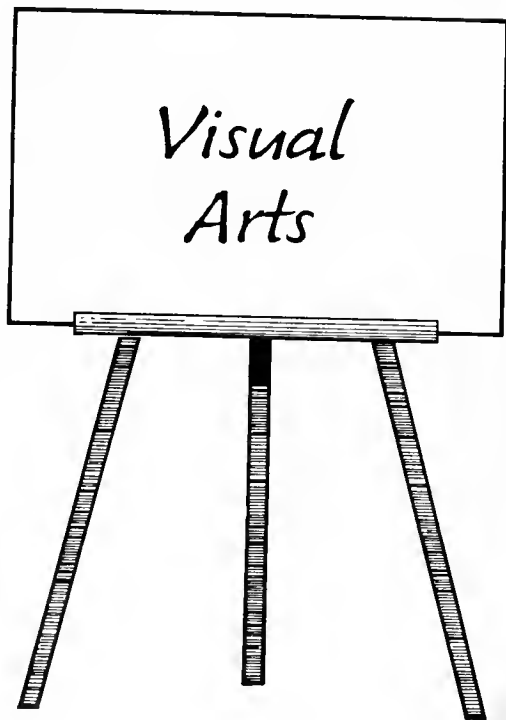
Agnes of God
