## SOME PARENTS GO THE EXTRA MILE

The parents of our students form an important constituency of the College. They have more than a casual interest in the College, its academic program, and the "home away from home" it provides for their sons and daughters.

We know that, with half our students receiving some form of financial assistance, many parents are unable to make voluntary contributions to Lycoming. However, some parents have responded to our appeals for support and for this we are most appreciative. Some of them, as this report reveals, have made gifts sufficient to qualify them for membership in our prestige clubs, a special way of saying thanks.

During 1971, ninety-seven families contributed \$7,772 to Lycoming. If we include alumni who are also parents, the total exceeds \$10,000. A few of these earned matching gifts from their employers.

Our appeal to parents is simple and direct. Lycoming College urgently needs private support from all its constituencies. If you can help us, please do!

## NEW DONORS INCREASE FUND

Again this year it is the new donors who have helped to increase the annual fund. We certainly welcome the gifts of those who have never before supported their alma mater in her annual solicitation for funds. As more alumni pledge their support of the college on an annual basis, along with their other charitable concerns, the college will be equipped to continue to offer a quality educational program.

## TRUSTEE CHALLENGE STILL IN EFFECT

The Trustee Challenge, which was announced in a special issue of this Report is still in effect for 1972. Basically, the challenge means that our Board of Trustees will give us additional endowment funds on the basis of:

1. The number of alumni who contribute to the Lycoming College Fund in 1972.
2. The number of alumni in the leadership clubs.
3. The amount of money given by alumni in 1972.

In 1971, we were able to charge the Board of Trustees with \$7,150. We hope to double this amount and go for the total amount possible in the terms of our challenge which is \$15,000 in one calendar year.

The Executive Board of the Alumni Association has adopted a 1972 goal of \$10,000—an increase of \$10,000 over the 1971 goal. With the help of our alumni of Dickinson Seminary, Dickinson Junior College, and Lycoming College, this goal can be met and our challenge realized to its full capacity.

## LYCOMING CALLING IN 1972

A further expansion of the telephone program begun two years ago will result in phone calls to our alumni in more distant areas during 1972. A great number of alumni who have received calls in the past have expressed their appreciation at being able to talk personally with someone about the college. Some had questions which were answered by a college representative who was present at the telephone. Others just enjoyed reminiscing with one of the classmates on the other end of the line. The telephone has helped to increase our donors—and especially from alumni who have never before given to the College.

## TWO FOR ONE

About 700 companies, both large and small, now have a matching gift program as a part of their effort to support higher education. The plan is very simple: for every dollar your company matches gifts given to an institution by an employee, the employer also gives a dollar. Some companies will match only alumni gifts; others will match gifts of any employee. Matching gift forms and instructions are available at participating company locations.

In 1971, Lycoming received matching gift support from twenty-seven companies. In some instances, the same company matched gifts from several different employees. We urge all donors and prospective donors to find out whether their employers have matching gift programs. There is no easier or less painful way to double your gift.







# CAPITAL CAMPAIGNS—INSTANT MONEY

There are, among the naive, those who believe that when an organization or institution needs money for some urgent project that the way to get it quickly is through a fund-raising campaign

Some agencies — United Funds, Cancer and Heart Funds, and others — are very successful with their annual drives and raise substantial sums of money each year. This has become an established pattern in most communities and everyone knows it's going to happen during a certain month or period of the year. The fund-raising organization remains more or less intact from year to year and the appeal is pitched to community service needs. There is a close parallel here to the annual fund drives the colleges have used for years.

A capital fund-raising campaign for a college, however, is a different proposition. Perhaps it is wise, at this point, to define some terms that may not be familiar to all concerned. A capital fund-raising campaign is designed to raise money that will be used primarily for new buildings, equipment, the purchase of land, or endowment. Endowment, simply put, is the college's savings account or other investments which produce interest or dividends. The money earned from these sources is used for annual operating expenses.

The larger capital campaigns are not aimed at getting instant money. The dollar goals are too great to raise in one year, therefore, it is common to project them over periods ranging from three to ten years. This being the case, the installment plan comes into play, and donors are asked to pledge X dollars over X number of years. Needless to say, there is some shrinkage between what is pledged and what is actually paid.

Lycoming conducted capital campaigns in 1965 and 1966. The earlier one resulted in pledges of just over \$1 million, \$760,000 of which is unpaid. The latter campaign received \$1,275,000 in pledges, of which \$366,000 is currently outstanding. This brings the total of pledges yet to be paid to more than \$450,000. Most of this will eventually be paid, in fact, a large part of it was pledged over a ten-year period and payments are on schedule. It should be clear, however, that we cannot spend these funds until we have them, and that will be years from now.

Future campaigns — if there are any — will be similar, instant money is very hard to come by. There is, of course, one source of it we have not mentioned — money can be borrowed. This subject is a good one for a later article.
