PRESIDENT'S CORNER

TUITION AND THE BUDGET

As announced in the most recent issue of the catalog, the comprehensive fee for 1974-75 will be increased to \$1,150 per semester. Residence hall charges remain at \$250, but board has been increased to \$325 per semester. This represents an addition of \$50 per semester to the comprehensive fee and \$25 to each semester of board.

The Board of Trustees is certain that students and their parents will understand the necessity for this small upward revision of charges. The College's costs are subject to all of the inflationary pressures of our economy, and we must increase instructional and staff salaries if we are to maintain the high level of proficiency and personal attention which has marked Lycoming during the past few years.

We have been meeting with faculty and student leadership for some time now to effect careful economies in non-personnel items of our annual budget. Although we have been reasonably successful in this project, it is now certain that the College must also reduce personnel in order to give necessary support to those colleagues who continue on the faculty and staff.

Faculty and staff consultation has enabled us to plan for a small reduction of personnel over the next two years which will leave the academic program and services essentially in their present strength. National socio-economic conditions will reduce the enrollment of all privately-supported institutions to numbers considerably below the high point of the late sixties and early seventies. Lycoming has been most fortunate in its experience thus far, and we have every reason to be confident that our enrollment will stabilize at 1,250 to 1,350 students. Interestingly enough, this was the size that our College planning anticipated twelve years ago.

NEW FACES

DR. VIOLA L. CATT comes to Lycoming as an assistant professor in psychology. After earning her bachelor of arts, magna cum laude, at Indiana University where she was a research assistant in the honors programs, she taught a year at the United Fund Center for Handicapped Children in Indianapolis. While earning her master of arts and doctor of philosophy degrees at the University of Denver, Mrs. Catt was a National Institute of Mental Health research assistant a year each in Littleton and Denver, Colorado, and a research assistant in the University of Denver psychology department, where she was an instructor in the spring and summer 1973 quarters. She has co-authored several technical reports. Viola has a five-year old son Bruce.

RICHARD R. ERICKSON will be a teaching fellow in physics to substitute for Dr. Willy Smith who is on sabbatical until September 1974. As a National Merit Scholar he earned his bachelor of arts at the University of Minnesota with honors in astronomy (summa cum laude) and in mathematics (magna cum laude) and a minor in geology. While earning Phi Beta Kappa honors, he was a lab instructor for an introductory astronomy course for three years and gave lectures on astronomy and geology to grade-school children.

After graduation he spent a year at Churchill College - University of Cambridge on Woodrow Wilson, National Science Foundation, and Churchill Foundation fellowships doing radio astronomy research.

CAMPUS NOTES

A \$6,600 NATIONAL SCIENCE FOUNDATION GRANT has been awarded to the chemistry department. Lycoming has matched the grant to buy a Nuclear Magnetic Resonance spectrometer with oscilloscope. Students and faculty will use the instrument primarily to determine and/or confirm the structure of chemical substances. New courses will be possible and teaching aids for presec classes will be improved. Dr. Andrew B. Turner, assistant professor of chemistry, and several students have begun using the instrument to investigate intermediates in the synthesis of tropane alkaloid analogs.

A \$5,000 LIBRARY GRANT, the maximum available under Title II of the Higher Education Act of 1965, has been received from the College Library Resources Program of the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare.

A \$2,000 SPERRY AND HUTCHINSON FOUNDATION GRANT to sponsor a series of public lectures on "Cultural Survival: Thoughts on the Future" has been received.

ERNEST D. GIGLIO, associate professor and chairman of political science, will serve as the first Director of the Internship Program. Immediately responsible to the Dean of the College, he will be responsible to encourage departments to participate, to maintain the quality and spirit of the program, to prepare written agreements between the College and participating agencies, to review each internship proposal, and to submit periodic reports on the status of the program. "I suspect that they were concerned that such a picture would suggest food shortages," Dr. Roskin said. "Both the police and the men who filed the complaint wanted to take my camera. But I told them they would have to shoot me first. They gave up. My requests to call the United States Embassy in Moscow were ignored, and that is against the U.S. -USSR Consular Convention. The incident itself was minor and probably typical. But the flaunting of the Consular Convention is more serious."
