Annual giving rises

This issue of the Lycoming College Report is devoted primarily to the annual report of gifts and contributions received during 1979. A summary of the total amount contributed from all sources is shown to the left.

You will notice that the total of \$1,282,231.41 is about \$100,000 more than the \$1,180,632.74 contributed in 1978. The increase is attributed primarily to the contributions of business and industry, which more than tripled over 1978, and the gifts of alumni, which rose 168 percent over 1978. Much of this increase went into the Partners in Progress Fund drive that is paying for construction of the new Physical Education and Recreation Center.

Decreases in non-alumni giving and in money generated through foundations offset a large percentage of the increase. But it must be recalled that the 1978 total included a \$200,000 grant from the Pew Foundation.

The Lycoming College Fund shows a slight decrease from 1978. This is attributed to reduced giving to this annual fund by contributors who made gifts instead to the capital campaign.

President's Corner

Giving till it hurts so good

Last January the Chronicle of Higher Education published an essay written by a professor of English from a mid-western school which surely struck a responsive chord among many professionals. The essay was written in reaction to many appeals the author had received through the years to give till it hurts. "I want to tell you, administrators and friends--I have given! I am giving more. It hurts! Though I have not sent you a dime in all those years, I figure that my contributions as a professor will soon make me eligible for the \$100,000 club."

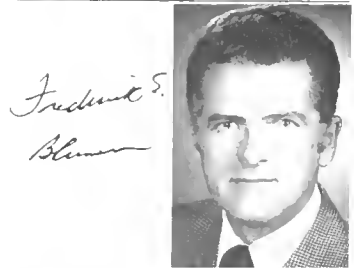
His complaint is one I've heard many times. He recounts the cost of his education, paying special attention to the cost of earning graduate degrees. He then compares his salary over the years with that of his brother, a chemist. He concludes that he has forfeited potential income of more than \$90,000 during his 25-year career and announces proudly that this is his gift to education.

As a young professor, I was almost as impressed by this kind of argument as by my

own sense of self-importance. But after working with generous colleagues who gave dollars that could be deposited--that is, after observing the generosity of the real patrons of education, I feel only pity for the mid-western English professor. Anyone with talent can point to more lucrative job opportunities which over the years may have been declined. But that begs the real question. If we have any wealth at all, we have something to share with others. The only legitimate dilemma is that of selecting among worthy causes.

Is Lycoming College worthy of support? If so, Fred Blumer should consider its claims upon my resources, whatever these happen to be. If not, how in good conscience can I invest my life here? Unless with miserly greed I assume I have nothing to share, I dare not disqualify my college employer as one potential recipient of my philanthropy. It is tragic, truly pathetic, that the mid-western English professor has never learned the joy of giving. "Though I have not sent you a dime in all those years, I figure..."

Jesus told us about a widow's mite. He put the real question succinctly. If you have any wealth at all, you have something to share with others. The only legitimate



dilemma is that of selecting among worthy causes.

As educators and professionals, we are most effective as models. We won't teach others this joy of giving by offering questionable services inflated by self-adulation in lieu of some share of our shekels! Our students, colleagues and alumni know hypocrites and misers when they see them! They also know how to teach us to become more generous. Their contributions reported in this issue prove what good teachers they are. I'm grateful for their gifts, but I'm even more grateful that their generosity answers Professor Scrooge by encouraging us to give until it feels good.

Cagers make playoffs; 3 wrestlers named all-Americans

The winter sports season at Lycoming is now history. Despite a 29-34-2 record, it was a season of many team and individual triumphs.

Coach Dutch Burch's cagers provided the most excitement. They won 15 of 24 regular-season games, including eight in a row to tie the school record for consecutive wins, and earned a berth in the Middle Atlantic Conference Northern Division playoffs with a 9-4 league mark.

The season came to an end when Scranton University avenged an early-season loss to the Warriors with a 74-56 win in the play-off semifinals. Scranton went on to win the MAC crown.

Another highlight of the season was Ray Graff's breaking of the 1,000-point mark. He finished the season with 1,175 points to become the seventh leading scorer in Lycoming history. The senior from

Upper Darby, Pa., also was named to the MAC Northern Division second-team all-star squad.

Coach Budd Whitehill's grapplers closed out the dual-meet season with a 9-8-1 mark. They entered the MAC tournament seeking their fourth-straight title. But Elizabethtown College, which edged the Warriors during the regular season, 23-20, edged them again for the MAC championship, 124½ to 109½.

Still, three Warriors won MAC championships. Tim Spruill at 167 pounds, his second straight, John O'Shea at 126 pounds, his second straight, and Ed Allen at 190 pounds, his second title in three years. Three other Warriors finished as runners-up: Chris Shaner at 150 pounds, Mark Walters at 158 pounds and Mark Sawyer at 177 pounds.

All six wrestlers advanced to the Division III national championships at the U. S. Coast Guard Academy in New London, Conn., where three earned all-American honors. Sawyer placed sixth and Shaner and Allen placed seventh. The top eight wrestlers in each weight class gained all-American distinction.

Coach Deborah Holmes' women cagers lost their last six games to finish 4-9. But the team showed tremendous improvement in only its second year of intercollegiate

competition, winning three more games than a year ago and losing five games by a total of 22 points.

The very young squad started three freshmen, a sophomore and a junior so it shows promise for next year. One more MAC win this year would have gotten them into the playoffs. The squad was 1-2 in league play.

Coach Dave Hair's swimmers dropped seven of eight dual meets with a tie and placed third in a tri-meet before entering the MAC tournament. There the squad placed 12th with one medal winner--Bill Torney, who placed fourth in the one-meter diving event. Mark Fultz also set a new Lycoming record in the 200-freestyle event in the tourney, finishing in 12th place overall. Other place winners were Andrea Deufel, who finished 12th in both the 100 and 200 backstroke events, and the 400 medley and 400 freestyle relay teams, which finished 11th and 12th respectively in those events.

Despite the 12th-place finish, Hair was very pleased with the way the season ended. The team came a long way this year and was competitive in almost every meet on the schedule, which was upgraded by dropping three weaker opponents for three Division III powers. Hair sees the season as another rebuilding step toward a swimming program that could eventually emulate the highly successful one of the 1960's.
