This issue of the Lycoming College Report is devoted primarily to the report of gifts and contributions received by the college from Jan. 1, 1980, to June 30, 1981. A summary of total contributions received from all sources is shown on this page.

The summary is based on an 18-month total because Lycoming switched from a calendar-year to a fiscal-year accounting of giving in 1980 (May, 1980, issue of the Lycoming College Report). Therefore, all contributions made in 1980 and in the first six months of 1981 are being credited to the 1981 fiscal year. In the future, contributions will be credited on a 12-month basis, from July 1 to June 30.

Because the \$2,378,614 contributed in fiscal year 1981 is based on an 18-month time period, it is difficult to compare the total with that of the preceding 12-month accounting period, the year of 1979, when \$1,282,231 was contributed. A comparison of contributions during the two time periods based on a monthly average, however, shows that giving increased an average of 24 percent a month during the 18-month period. Translated into dollars, giving was approximately \$132,145 a month during 1980 and the first half of 1981 as compared to \$106,852 a month in 1979.

The increase in giving is attributed to four sources: business and industry, foundations, bequests, and other organizations.

Monthly decreases in giving by the church, alumni, other individuals, and the government offset some of the total increase.

The Lycoming College Annual Giving Fund also showed a nine percent monthly decrease during the 18-month time period. This decline is attributed directly to reduced giving to the fund by contributors who gave instead to the Partners in Progress capital campaign for the new Physical Education and Recreation Center. The decline in annual giving was not unexpected. Indeed, it is common for giving to annual funds to drop dramatically during major capital campaigns.

President's corner

This summer I learned something I have suspected for years: that vacations are a source of significant stress. A vacation can generate more stress than being apprehended for a minor violation of the law and almost as much as taking on a significant mortgage or increasing the number of family get-togethers!

It's strange, or so it seems to me, that stress is generated by almost any change in our daily routines. Having a lot more or even a lot less trouble with the boss causes stress. Changes in eating habits, revisions in the way we dress, and even changing the type or amount of recreation in our lives can be a source of added stress. We are creatures of habit.

I was thinking about stress, its causes and effects, as I sat with white knuckles grasping the arms of the seat while we landed in the Atlanta International Airport. Because the air traffic controllers were on vacation, I knew for sure vacations are a source of significant stress.

As the plane taxied to the boarding gate, I managed to relax, anticipating the last leg of my flight to Washington, D.C. A few minutes later, I was assigned a new seatmate, a fellow who said his name was Ernest and that he had been conducting negotiations on behalf of the air traffic controllers. As we took off, my mind for some reason returned to the subject of stress, so I broached the subject with my new acquaintance.

"Been on vacation?" I asked him.

"Why, yes," he answered. "How could you tell?"

"Oh, I just noticed how tense you are," I replied. "It was just an educated guess."

"But vacations are supposed to be relaxing," he complained.

"Not true," I replied gleefully. "That's the propaganda of travel agents and resort hotels. Vacations often create significant stress. That's why bellhops at resorts want to be paid like air traffic controllers."

"I see," he answered with an earnest look on his face.

Maybe that's why our negotiations are going so poorly. The air traffic controllers have been off for a week already. It we get much more vacation, our nerves will be shot beyond repair!

"Vacations are horrible," I said. "I took a month off last year and it took eight months back at my job to recover."

"What do you do?" he asked. "You look like a gambler. I'm a college president," I replied.

"That explains it," he said. "At first you reminded me of a guard from Attica prison I sat with going down, but you common citizens all look alike to me. But don't misunderstand me. Some of my best friends are college presidents."

We flew in silence for a few minutes after that. Then he resumed the conversation.

"I gave a gift to a college once," he said. "That was just after my daughter left for college and just before my wife divorced me."

"Once in a lifetime experiences, I thought to myself, sources of real stress for this guy, every one!"

"Do you suppose giving that money away affected my nerves?" he continued. "Usually I can relax in my country house, but since that pledge, I've had difficulty sleeping."

"Doing anything out of the ordinary can be stressful," I replied, "but sometimes it's worth it."

"Somehow I thought you'd say that," he said. "Farther on in this report, you'll read about some other people who have made gifts to a college: this college. I'm sure at least some of those gifts generated a little stress. Sacrifice often does. But I'm grateful the purpose in life isn't to avoid all stress. Like a vacation, life is supposed to be stressful enough to be exciting and a source of joy. So as you read about the generous supporters of Lycoming College, ignore that new twitch in your left eye. It's only a signal that you're reading something exciting."

Nursing chairman among new faculty

Among the 10 new faculty and staff members at Lycoming are the college's new directors of the nursing and mass communications programs, a new campus minister, and a new director of career development.

Dr. Janet A. Rodgers is the chairman of Lycoming's new nursing department. She comes to the college as a former chairman of the nursing program at Old Dominion University, and as a former deputy chairman of the nursing department at Herbert H. Lehman College of the City University of New York. She also has taught at the University of Pennsylvania and Wagner College. Dr. Rodgers holds a Ph.D. and an M.A. from New York University and a B.S. from Wagner College.

Dr. Malffion M. Anapol, former coordinator of the Howard University communication arts program, is the new director of the mass communications program. Dr. Anapol also has taught at the Universities of Delaware, Hartford, Pennsylvania, and Maryland, and Denison University. He holds a Ph.D. from The Ohio State University, an M.A. from Temple University, and a B.S. from Rutgers University, and has studied at the University of Connecticut School of Law.

Lycoming's new campus minister is the Rev. Jerry L. Escheld, who served previously as pastor of the United Methodist Church in North Bend. The Rev. Escheld also has been associate pastor at Trotwood Church of the Brethren, Ohio, and a counselor and referral specialist for the United Way of Dayton, Ohio. He holds a master of divinity degree from United Theological Seminary, Dayton, and a B.S. from Mansfield State College.

 Other new full-time faculty members are Geoffrey L. Gordon, Dr. Gene D. Sprechtn, Roll T. Carlson, Dr. Kathryn M. Ryan, and Dr. Ellen Leininger.
 Gordon is an instructor in business administration. He worked previously as a consultant for Arthur Andersen and Company of Charlotte, N.C., owned a small business in Durham, N.C., and also worked for Capital Financial Services, of Williamsport. He holds an M.B.A. from Duke University and a B.S. from Lehigh University.
 Dr. Sprechtn is an assistant professor of mathematics. He taught previously at the University of Kentucky and State University of New York, at Binghamton. He holds a Ph.D. and an M.S. from SUNY at Binghamton and a B.S. from Wilkes College.
 Carlson is an assistant professor of theatre. He taught previously at the Universities of Arkansas and Montana. He holds an M.F.A. in technical production from the University of Montana and a B.S. from Kearney State College, Nebraska.
 Dr. Ryan is an assistant professor of psychology. She taught previously at the University of Pittsburgh's School of Dental Medicine. Dr. Ryan holds a Ph.D. and an M.S. from Pittsburgh and a B.S. from the University of Illinois.

Sports

Football

Since 1975, the Lycoming football team has averaged 7 wins and 1 1/2 losses per season. With a glut of talent returning from last fall's school-record 9-1 campaign, the pre-season prognosis for 1981 is that the won-loss ratio probably will not suffer.
 Nevertheless, coach Frank Girardi, beginning his 10th season, knows football is not as simple as statistics and ratios. "We are not going to be able to step on the field and win automatically," he cautioned. "We are going to have to work hard to win."
 As if to have some warning, trend began six years ago. Lycoming will rely on defensive strength to shut down the opposition and be the catalyst for the offense. Although five seniors were lost to graduation from the 1980 unit, defensive coordinator Steve Wertz has assembled another hard-hitting, yard-adding force. Returning starters include end Mickey Peas (Philadelphia) and Chris J. Howser (Snow Shoe). Both seniors tackle Doug Schimowell (Lycoming) and sophomore Wade Hitter (Lock Haven), junior middle guard Neil Hemshoff (Allentown) and junior cornerback Dave Nolan (Norristown). Tose Howser, Schimowell, and Nolan received all-Middle Atlantic Conference Northern Division recognition last year.

The big question in most Lycoming minds, however, is who after Burd? All American Kick Burd, the holder of every Warner passing record, has graduated after a brilliant three-year career. Replacing him will be either junior Pete Waldron (Conard, N.J.) or sophomore Dominic Fauci (Philadelphia). Both were impressive in brief appearances last autumn as Burd's backups, and both reported to camp on Aug. 21, prepared to play, according to Girardi.
 "Starters returning to an offense that scored almost 30

points a game in 1980 include senior receivers Mike Burd (Lock Haven), Jeff Wert (Stroudsburg) and Andy Ryan (Harrisburg), interior linemen Joe Bours (Norristown) and Tom Moran (Philadelphia), Fran Hagen (Philadelphia), and John Whalen (Paoli), and running backs Mike Santelen (Berwyn) and Thatcher Burman (Marvsville). Burd, Wert, and Bours are returning all MAC North selections. In addition, Burd, the light end, was bestowed with Eastern College Athletic Conference and Little All-America recognition in 1980.
 As the Warriors prepared for the season opener with West Branch Valley, rival Lock Haven State, Girardi was optimistic for a good season. "At this point, pre-season our defense has never looked better," he said. The offense is not far ahead, he said, but he feels confident that it will be adequate by game day.
 Lycoming, which missed an opportunity for a third consecutive MAC North championship, undetected season and invitation to the NCAA playoffs when Delaware Valley upset the Warriors last Oct. 10, will face its steepest competition early in the year. After the opener with Division II Lock Haven, the Warriors play MAC foes Susquehanna and Wilkes on successive Saturdays, followed by Division II Waynesburg, and a Parents' Weekend return encounter with Delaware Valley on Oct. 11.

Soccer

With seven starters returning, soccer coach Scott McNeil looks to field a significantly improved team this fall. How ever, with the Warriors facing national Division II defending champion Lock Haven State, Division III runner-up Scranton, and perennial power Elizabethtown during a 12-match season, Lycoming will be challenged to improve last fall's 3-7 record.
 Veteran starters include three seniors, fullback Bob Ortega (Lyttleton), the captain, halfback Chad Bremer (Denville, N.J.), and wing John Cahill, Frank (Lock Haven, N.J.) and sophomores Jimmy Dodge (Cluster, N.E.) and Lyle Spitzer (Montoursville), halfbacks.
 The four other positions, including goals, probably will be filled with the freshmen of a highly regarded recruited class.

Although Lycoming is still a year or two away from challenging the super powers on the schedule, McNeil promises a hustling, well-conditioned, maturing, and inspired team in '81.

Women's Tennis

With her No. 1 and 2 singles players returning from the best Lycoming tennis team in five years, coach Debbie Holmes is optimistic her 1981 team will improve on last fall's 4-4 record.
 Sophomore Deanna Capps (Warringers Falls, N.Y.) and junior Kim Paul (Cambridge, Md.) return to the top spots after posting identical 5-2 singles records a year ago. Two seniors, captain Betsy Rabold (Williamsport) and Isabelle VanDeusen (Westfield, N.J.), add depth and exper-

ience. Other returnees include juniors Lon Compton (Williamsport) and Faith Heas (Bloomsburg), and sophomore Anne McGeorge (Downington). Four freshmen complete the roster.
 It things fall into place during early-season matches, Holmes believes the Warriors can qualify for the Middle Atlantic Conference playoffs for the first time in the sport's 10-year history at Lycoming.

Field Hockey

Keep your eyes on the padded figure in the goal mouth. No. 1 punter/runner Robin Wert (Stroudsburg). After earning all-Middle Atlantic Conference recognition as a freshman, Wert advanced to national competition last fall. She played for the Eastern representative in the United States Amateur Field Hockey Association tournament last November in Michigan.
 In 1981, Wert and coach Louise Courtney will be looking for more help on offense and defense from the returnees of last year's 2-6-1 squad. Ten other new starters include forwards Barb Heim (Pleasantville, N.Y.), Leah Davis (Cherry Hill, N.J.) and Kathy Wert (Stroudsburg) and halfbacks Ann Taggart (Blomington, N.Y.) and Jenny Reed (Gettysburg). Reed is a senior. Heim and Davis are juniors. Wert and Taggart are sophomores. All are capable scorers.
 An 18-woman roster includes eight freshmen, some of whom will be counted on immediately for help.

"Hall of Fame" begun

The enshrinement of superior athletes of Lycoming's past is now possible with the recent establishment of a school-wide athletic hall of fame.
 Hall of fame nominees, who will be accepted from any source by a selection committee, are eligible for this recognition five years after their graduation from the college. A maximum of five candidates will be selected for induction within a given year, although up to eight nominees may be approved in the inaugural year.
 Eligible nominees, according to the hall of fame constitution, should have performed in a manner and to a degree that is considered outstanding and should have exemplified desirable personal character traits usually expected of a college athlete.
 Good post-graduate citizenship is also required for a nominee's acceptance.
 Induction into the hall of fame is granted when a majority of the seven-member selection committee votes affirmatively.
 Members, as elected, will be officially recognized at an induction ceremonies, and their names will be inscribed on a hall of fame plaque to be displayed with the inductee's photograph in the Physical Education and Recreation Center.
 Clarence Dutch, Burch, Lycoming's athletics director, is chairman of the selection committee. Dale V. Bower, assistant athletics director, is secretary.
