It is recommended and earnestly requested that church treasurers remit monthly such funds as are in hand, and that the final remittance for each calendar year be sent before January 10, if credit is desired in the next Year Book.

The churches are requested to contribute through the treasurers of their Associations for the expenses of the Conference a sum as Fellowship dues equivalent to \$1.50 for each member, based upon the total membership of January 1, 1969, and the treasurers of the Associations are requested to forward the amounts as soon as possible to the Conference Treasurer, 14 Beacon St., Boston 02108.

The "Minutes" are sent to the churches by direction of the Conference, with distribution of one copy to every minister, one to every church clerk, one to every Conference official or committee member, one to each local Association official named within, and one to every life member of the Massachusetts Home Missionary Society. As long as the edition lasts, other copies may be secured for One Dollar, upon application to the Registrar, 14 Beacon St., Boston 02108. It is suggested that every church preserve a copy of the "Minutes" with its other records.

#### HISTORICAL SKETCH

The Massachusetts Missionary Society was organized on May 29, 1799, in Boston. There were thirty-eight charter members, mainly followers of the theology of Samuel Hopkins. They were "impelled by a deep commiseration for the unhappy state of those who were perishing for lack of those precious means of salvation which we enjoy." Their intention was to spread "the knowledge of the glorious Gospel of Christ among the poor Heathens and in those remote parts of our country in which the inhabitants had not enjoyed the benefits of a Christian ministry and Christian ordinances," i.e., outside Massachusetts. Nathaniel Emmons, fifty-four years pastor at Franklin, was the first president. The Society was, incorporated in 1808.

#### ORIGIN OF MASSACHUSETTS HOME MISSIONARY SOCIETY

In 1827 the Massachusetts Missionary Society and the Domestic Missionary Society of Massachusetts Proper (which had come into being in 1818 to "see every parish in the State well supplied with a faithful Minister of Christ"), were united under the name of the Massachusetts Missionary Society. This meant that while the Domestic Missionary Society of Massachusetts Proper lost its name, the Massachusetts Missionary Society was henceforth to work almost exclusively in Massachusetts.

The Massachusetts Missionary Society became the Massachusetts "Home" Missionary Society in 1844. This was simply to emphasize that the work of the Society had become exclusively for America and for the Massachusetts part of America.

#### ORIGIN OF MASSACHUSETTS CONFERENCE

The General Association of Massachusetts came into being in 1802. This ultimately became the Massachusetts Congregational Conference. The Conference then merged with the Massachusetts Home Missionary Society in 1927, to become the Massachusetts Congregational Conference and Missionary Society. This was the result of twenty-seven years' agitation, accelerated by a recommendation of the National Council in 1907. The charter of the Massachusetts Home Missionary Society was used as the basis for the union of the two organizations. In 1953 the name was changed to Massachusetts Congregational Christian Conference. In 1966 the name was changed again to the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ. The Conference assumes responsibility for all Congregational missionary work done in Massachusetts. It supports a staff of fifteen persons who give ministerial and executive leadership to a broad program of work designed to help the churches, to develop the fellowship of the ministers and churches, and to cultivate practical support for denominational and interdenominational projects and programs.

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## BY-LAWS OF THE MASSACHUSETTS CONFERENCE OF THE UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST

#### ARTICLE I

#### Purpose and Terminology

- 1. The purpose of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ as stated in its charter (1799) is "diffusing the knowledge of the Gospel of Jesus Christ . . . and in concert with other ecclesiastical bodies for the general increase of Christian union and spiritual efficiency and the advancement of Christ's Kingdom on earth."
- 2. Whenever in these By-Laws the word Conference is used it shall be held to refer to the Corporation as a Conference of the United Church of Christ and as a Conference of Massachusetts Congregational Christian Churches.
- 3. All churches which are members of associations in voluntary fellowship with and recognized by the Conference, whether or not such churches are a part of the United Church of Christ, are entitled to elect voting members of the Conference in accordance with these By-Laws.
- 4. Whenever in these By-Laws the word Area is used, it shall be held to refer to those associations or combinations of the associations decided upon by the agreement of the respective associations and recognized by the Conference.

#### ARTICLE II

#### Denominational Basis

Following Congregational principles, this Conference shall under no circumstances exercise authority over churches or individuals or interfere with the government or discipline of the churches. It shall advise and counsel the churches when requested, but it is recognized that each church has the power of self-determination in all matters.

#### ARTICLE III

#### Doctrinal Basis

This Conference declares its steadfast allegiance to the faith which our fathers confessed, which, from age to age, has found its expression in the historic creeds of the Church Universal and of this Communion.

#### ARTICLE IV

#### Membership

Voting Members. Every Church or Congregation which is or shall become a member of an association in fellowship with the Conference may annually choose two delegates (of whom it is suggested one shall be a layman and the other a laywoman) and additional delegates (one for every three hundred members or major fraction thereof in excess of 300 members) and these delegates, together with the pastor or pastors, and Christian education directors holding United Church of Christ certification, of each church (who shall be members ex-officis) of the Conference including the members of the Board of Directors and any person who shall have been elected an Officer Emeritus,

the committee members of the Conference, ministers called to extra parochial tasks within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts shall constitute the voting membership of the Conference; provided, however, that pastors shall have the privileges of honorary members only unless they shall have ministerial standing in an association in fellowship with the Conference.

Honorary Members. Delegates from corresponding bodies and persons appointed to speak before the Conference, such persons as may be made honorary members by a vote of the Board of Directors, and such other persons as the Conference may from time to time vote to admit, shall be honorary members of the Conference, with the privilege of speaking, but without vote.

#### ARTICLE V

#### Officers

- 1. There shall be a Moderator, a Vice-Moderator, a Recording Secretary, all of whom shall be elected by ballot at each annual meeting of the Conference for a term of one year or until their successors are chosen.
- 2. The executive officers of the Conference shall be a President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, an Assistant Treasurer and such other officers as the Conference may from time to time elect. Any of the said Executive Officers except those of President, Secretary and Treasurer may be abolished by vote of the Conference. They shall be nominated by the Board of Directors meeting in executive session, and elected by ballot at each annual meeting of the Conference for a term of one year or until their respective successors are chosen. They shall bear such additional titles as the Conference or the Board of Directors determine.
- 3. The Moderator, or in his absence, the Vice-Moderator, shall preside over all meetings of the Conference.
- 4. The President shall be the chief executive officer of the Conference and shall, subject to the direction of the Conference and of its Board of Directors, have general charge of its missionary and benevolent work and of its other activities. He shall be a member ex officio of all standing committees named in the by-laws. He shall have the power to delegate to members of the Staff the authority to represent him upon any of the said standing committees. He shall be the representative of the Conference and of its Board of Directors among all the churches (both those financially independent and those aided by the funds of the Conference) and in all denominational and interdenominational gatherings (including meetings of Conference Executives) unless representation is otherwise provided. He may seek to assist pastors and churches with fraternal counsel. He shall keep informed as to opportunities for extension work through founding new churches or strengthening old ones and shall recommend to the Conference and to the Board of Directors measures for meeting such opportunities.
- 5. The Secretary shall keep the records of the Conference, except as hereinafter provided, and shall assist in its general work under the direction of the President. He shall devote himself in co-operation with the Area Ministers and under the direction of the President, to counseling with and assisting the churches in the area assigned to him, and shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Board of Directors or the President. He shall have the custody of the records and of all bonds given by the treasurer as as hereinafter provided. He shall furnish copies of the record certified under the seal of the Conference (which shall be in his keeping) to such persons as may be entitled thereto.

The Secretary shall collect and publish in connection with the Annual Report of the Conference the statistics of ministers and churches and make up the official roll of the ministers and churches in accordance with the usages of the denomination. He shall present to the Conference at its annual meeting a general statistical statement of the progress of religion in the churches for the past calendar year. He shall give suitable notice to the churches of the time and place of each annual meeting, notify officers and committees of their election or appointment and fulfill such other functions as the Conference or the Board of Directors from time to time direct.

- 6. The Treasurer shall receive and hold the property of the Conference subject to the direction of the Board of Directors and shall keep particular accounts of the Conference's funds and of the disposal thereof. He shall, under the direction of the President, assist, so far as he may be able, in the general work of the Conference and shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Board of Directors. He shall make a report at each annual meeting of the Conference and shall make such other reports as the Conference or the Board of Directors may from time to time require. He shall receive all contributions for benevolences sent to him by the churches and by individuals and shall disburse the same in accordance with the instructions of the donors. He shall give such bonds for the faithful performance of his duties as may from time to time be required by the Board of Directors. The Assistant Treasurer shall perform such duties as may be assigned by the Treasurer, and act in his stead in event of incapacity or absence.
- 7. The Recording Secretary shall record the complete minutes of each annual meeting and shall transcribe and deliver the same to the Secretary. The Board of Directors may, at their discretion, appoint a deputy to assist in the keeping of the records under the direction of the Recording Secretary.

#### ARTICLE VI

#### Board of Directors

- 1. The Conference shall elect by ballot at each annual meeting a Board of Directors, one Director for every 8000 members or major fraction thereof, from the churches in each of the Areas of the Conference, provided that each Area shall have at least one Director. One-third of the members of the Board of Directors shall be ministers, one-third laymen, and one-third laywomen as nearly as may be. The President, the Moderator and the Vice-Moderator of the Conference shall also be members ex officis. The terms of Directors, save when chosen to fill vacancies, shall begin at the close of the meeting at which they are elected. No member of the Board of Directors, having served a full term of four years, shall be eligible for re-election for one year.
- 2. The Board of Directors shall have and may exercise all of the powers of the Conference between meetings of the Conference and actions taken shall be reported to the next annual meeting of the Conference.
- 3. The Board of Directors shall have responsibility for policy formulation, program development, coordination between the functional committees of the Conference, evaluation and planning. It shall employ staff and other agents in support of Conference activities and operations.
  - 4. Nine members shall constitute a quorum.
- 5. At its first meeting after each annual meeting of the Conference, the Board of Directors shall choose one of its members to serve as chairman and another member to serve as vice chairman for the ensuing year.
  - 6. Except as otherwise provided in the charter of the Conference or in these

By-Laws, the Board of Directors shall administer and dispose of the property of the Conference and shall manage all of its business and affairs, and all officers and agents of the Conference shall act under its direction. The Board of Directors shall cause the accounts of the Treasurer to be audited at least once a year by certified public accountants selected by the Board.

- 7. Without restricting the generality of the foregoing, the Board of Directors shall in particular have the following powers:
  - (a) To choose a Clerk, to appoint its own meetings and form its own rules of business, to appoint committees and delegate any of its powers to such committees.
  - (b) To appoint and, at pleasure, remove all agents of the Conference and to define their duties.
  - (c) To fill any vacancy in any office of the Conference (including vacancies in the membership of the Board) until the vacancy shall be filled at a succeeding meeting of the Conference.
  - (d) To remove any officer or director of the Conference who may be guilty of disregard of his duties or of such conduct as shall be seriously prejudicial to the interests of the Conference.
  - (e) To direct efforts to promote missionary interest and giving among the churches of the Conference.
  - (f) To direct efforts to promote ecumenical concerns, interests and relationships of the Conference.
  - (g) To direct efforts of evaluation and planning with respect to the program and activities of the Conference.
  - (h) To direct efforts of coordination in the program and activities of the Conference through the appointment of one or more Directors to the functional Conference Committees as liaison between the Committees and the Board of Directors.

#### ARTICLE VII

#### Retirement and Annuity

- 1. No person shall continue as a member of the Executive Staff beyond the close of the Annual Meeting following his 70th birthday. With respect to employees not members of the Executive Staff, it shall be the policy of the conference to retire every such employee upon his or her attaining the age of seventy years, provided, however, that this shall not affect the power of the Directors temporarily to employ from time to time persons who have passed that age (including former members of the executive staff) whenever in particular cases the Directors shall deem such temporary employment essential to the efficient conduct of the Conference's work.
- 2. Ordained ministers who are members of the executive staff shall be expected to be members of the Annuity Fund for Congregational Ministers, and the Conference shall not provide for them any other retirement annuity. Toward each annual premium in the Annuity Fund of any member of the staff the Conference shall pay each year an amount equal to 11% of the charge on his salary.
- 3. Lay members of the staff shall be expected to be, so far as practicable, members of the Retirement Fund for Lay Workers, and the Conference shall pay, as the annual premium for each lay worker who is a member of the Fund, 8% of the charge on his salary plus such amount as the Conference as employer shall pay for his United States Social Security.

#### ARTICLE VIII

#### Meetings

- 1. The Conference shall hold its regular annual meeting for the choice of officers, the hearing of reports, the discussion of matters of general interest and the transaction of other business at a place designated by the Board of Directors on the third Monday of May, or at such other time in the month of May as the Board of Directors may deem expedient.
- 2. Special meetings of the Conference shall be convened at such times and places as may be determined by the Board of Directors, provided, however, that notice of any special meetings so convened shall, at least one week before the date of the meeting, be sent by mail to each of the churches connected with the Conference, posted in the general office of the Conference and printed in newspapers published in Boston, Worcester and Springfield.
- 3. The Moderator or, in his absence, the Vice-Moderator or, in the absence of both of them some member of the Board of Directors shall call the Conference to order.
- 4. At each annual meeting the Conference shall adopt and propose to the churches the annual rate of Fellowship dues for the expenses and other purposes of the Conference. The Conference, upon recommendations of the Board of Directors, shall at each annual meeting determine the amount to be retained from Our Christian World Mission giving of the churches.

#### ARTICLE IX

#### Committees and Councils

- 1. Immediately after the opening of the Annual Meeting, the Moderator shall appoint:
  - (a) A committee on Credentials, to which all credentials shall be referred.
  - (b) A Business Committee, the duty of which shall be to prepare and present at each session all matters of business not presented through the Board of Directors or some committee of the Conference.
- 2. There shall be a Program Committee, of which the Moderator, the Vice-Moderator, the Secretary of the Conference and the pastor of the church which is to entertain the next annual meeting, shall be ex-officis. At each annual meeting, three (3) members, at least one of whom shall be a member of a Conference committee, shall be elected by voice vote for terms of three (3) years. This committee shall prepare the program for the next annual meeting.
- 3. The following Conference Committees and Councils shall be constituted each with twenty (20) members, four (4) from each of the (5) Areas within the Conference, one (1) member from each Area to be elected each year by voice vote to serve a term of four (4) years. No member of a Conference committee, having served a full term of four (4) years, shall be eligible for re-election for one (1) year. As far as possible, an equal distribution of ministers, laymen and laywomen shall be maintained in the membership of the Conference committees.
  - (a) A Church and Community Committee shall be concerned with the outreach of the churches and the Conference in the community, whether rural, suburban, or urban and for social action in developing programs and services, policies and procedures for confronting situations and conditions arising out of changing social and economic environment in the general community.
  - (b) A Church and Education Committee shall be concerned with the educational thrust of the churches and the Conference in all aspects and

- shall function to provide and develop and assist educational programs and services in the churches and among other groupings.
- (c) Church and Leadership Committee shall be concerned with leadership discovery and manpower utilization through the various organizations of the Conference. This committee shall make nominations for each office, committee, board or council to be elected at the annual meeting, when nominations are not otherwise provided for in these By-Laws. It shall also nominate delegates to the General Synod. It shall suggest at the request of the Board of Directors nominees to fill any vacancies occurring between annual meetings.
- (d) A Church and Ministry Committee shall be concerned with the churches and their responsibilities to establish and maintain high standards in fellowship with other churches, whose standing is held in the associations. It shall be concerned also with the ministry, whose standing is held in the associations, to establish and maintain high academic, professional, and moral standards of ordained and professional personnel. It shall be concerned further with the relationships between churches and ordained and professional personnel, and the welfare of the churches and associations, in order that the whole Church may be strengthened.

The Conference shall maintain a special roll of ministers to which names may have been transferred by the associations. This special roll shall be in charge of the Church and Ministry Committee and the presence of a name there shall constitute evidence that the man has been duly ordained and has had standing in a member association; but the Committee shall not issue credentials to a man whose name appears on this roll unless they find in concurrence with the Committee on the Ministry in his association, that his character and qualifications are satisfactory.

- (e) A Church and Mission Committee shall be concerned with the mission of the churches and the Conference. It shall encourage the understanding and support by the churches in ecumenical mission, Our Christian World Mission, Massachusetts Ministries, city missionary societies' programs, special fund raising efforts and other mission endeavors. It shall invite and evaluate financial requests for mission projects and recommend priorities to the Budget Committee of the Board of Directors.
- 4. All committees are free to organize their work, to establish sub-committees for special assignments, and to co-opt other persons with special interest and skill as required.
- 5. A person who is a member of any committee ex-officio shall be entitled to vote.
- 6. The reports of all committees that are to be presented to the Conference shall be furnished to the Secretary on or before April first of each year, and shall be printed and distributed to the churches not less than two weeks before the annual meeting. These reports need not be read to the Conference but the Program Committee may arrange for the adequate discussion of any or all of the topics presented in the reports.
- 7. Such committees, boards, councils or other ad hoc groups as the Conference may vote to constitute or recognize shall be established by voice vote at each annual meeting for such terms as the Conference shall determine. The Board of Directors shall present at each annual meeting a list of committees, boards, councils or other ad hoc groups, the appointment of which it recommends.

8. The Conference recognizes a Council of the Laity as a movement of spiritual renewal in the life of the churches and the Conference.

It shall be the responsibility of the Council of the Laity to increase, develop and coordinate the activities and participation of the laity through a process of continuing education and training; to assist the churches to develop programs which will train and free the laity to participate in the whole task of the Church.

#### ARTICLE X

#### Relationships

- 1. As a Conference of the United Church of Christ, the Massachusetts Conference is a body of the United Church of Christ and is related to the General Synod as described in the constitution and by-lays of the United Church of Christ. It discharges those duties and provides those services set forth in its own charter and by-laws and which are not inconsistent to the constitution and by-laws of the United Church of Christ.
- 2. Delegates of the Conference to the General Synod, as provided for in the constitution and by-laws of the United Church of Christ are elected from the membership of the churches in the Massachusetts Conference which are affiliated with the United Church of Christ by voice vote at a meeting of the Conference.

#### ARTICLE XI

#### Board of Ministerial Aid

The Board of Ministerial Aid shall be the agent of the Conference in the work of aiding needy ministers and their families and shall make an annual report to the Conference. On notice of a vacancy in the membership of the Board of Ministerial Aid, the Conference shall nominate a person to fill the vacancy.

#### ARTICLE XII

#### Boston Seaman's Friend Society

The Boston Seaman's Friend Society shall be the agent of the Conference in the work of promoting the spiritual and temporal welfare of seamen and shall make an annual report to the Conference. The Conference shall annually elect five members of the Society for a term of three years each.

#### ARTICLE XIII

#### Board of Pastoral Supply

The Conference shall elect seven members to represent it on the Congregational Board of Pastoral Supply, two members to be elected each year to serve for a period of three years, and a third member to be elected in any year to serve for a period of three years whenever necessary to satisfy the requirement of seven members. The Board shall, through its Secretary, make an annual report to the Conference.

#### ARTICLE XIV

#### Corporate Seal

The seal of the Conference shall consist of two or more concentric circles, with the words, "Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ" around the circumference between these circles and the words, "Inc., 1808" within the inner circle.

#### ARTICLE XV

#### Special Orders

- 1. All matters of business presented to the Conference, except those presented by the Board of Directors or through duly appointed committees of the Conference, shall be referred to the Business Committee unless referred to some other committee by special vote of the Conference.
- 2. All matters of business referred to the Business Committee shall be reported for action before the final adjournment of the annual meeting.

#### ARTICLE XVI

#### Rules of Order

All proceedings of the Conference shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.

#### ARTICLE XVII

#### Amendments

- 1. These by-laws, except Articles II and III, may be amended at any regularly called meeting of the Conference by a two-thirds vote, provided the amendment was proposed at the preceding annual meeting of the Conference or is recommended by the Board of Directors.
- 2. Articles II and III may be amended by a two-thirds vote, but only after the proposed amendment has been submitted to the Conference in writing at the previous annual meeting and notice has been sent to the several churches connected with the Conference at least three months prior to the meeting at which action is to be taken.

#### MINUTES OF THE 170th ANNUAL MEETING

of the

## MASSACHUSETTS CONFERENCE OF THE UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST

May 16-17, 1969

Eastern States Exposition, West Springfield, Massachusetts

#### FRIDAY, MAY 16, 1969

The doors of the Better Living building of the Eastern States Exposition opened at 9:30 A.M., Friday, May 16, 1969, for registration. Refreshments and opportunity for browsing through the colorful and interesting exhibits were scheduled for the remainder of the hour.

At 10:45 A.M., the Moderator, Mr. David W. Bartlett, called the 170th Annual Meeting to order and welcomed the delegates and guests.

The Rev. Douglas Trottier, assisted by young people from the Hope Church, Springfield, led the assembly in "Worship For A New Day."

The Rev. Charles G. King, chairman of the Host Committee, and minister of the Mittineague Church, West Springfield, brought the greetings of the host churches. These included: the Mittineague Church, the Rev. George Condon, associate minister; First Congregational Church, West Springfield, the Rev. Carlyle Smith, minister; First Church, Agawam, the Rev. Floyd C. Bryan, minister; Feeding Hills Church, Agawam, the Rev. Arthur N. Sweeney, minister.

The Moderator made the following appointments:

Business Committee: the Rev. Robert B. Dennett, Chairman; Mr. Joseph E. Eaton, Mr. Clayton R. Ford, Mrs. Robert J. MacLeod, Mr. Ralph F. Tuller, Mr. Kenneth Fowle.

Credentials Committee: The Rev. Norman R. Farnum, Chairman; Miss Doris Hillsgrove, Mrs. Robert C. Ames, Miss Winifred Eastwood.

In recognition of two special guests of the conference, it was moved and

VOTED: That the Rev. Dr. Ben M. Herbster, President of the United Church of Christ and the Rev. Dr. Howard Spragg, Executive Vice-President of the Board for Homeland Ministries be made honorary members of the conference.

For the purpose of facilitating the operations of the annual meeting, it was moved and

VOTED: That no member of the Conference may speak more than twice and no longer than three minutes on the same subject without permission of the Conference.

The Chairman of the Board of Directors, Mr. Clayton R. Ford, was introduced for his report as was printed and distributed in advance of the meeting. His report follows:

#### REPORT OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors has recognized that it was a new creation under the revised by-laws, so all through the year it has seriously concerned itself with how its work should be done. It has seemed that the intent of the by-law revision last year was to set up a Board which:

- 1. Would provide leadership.
- 2. Would be capable of action.
- 3. Would maintain effective liaison with the Committees of the Conference.
- 4. Would be responsive to the needs and ideas of churches and ministers in all parts of the state.
- Would be close enough to the Conference executive to be confident that the staff was performing capably.
- 6. Would be good stewards of Conference assets, walking the thankless way between being misers and spendthrifts.

These are tremendous responsibilities and to make this first "shake-down" year even more difficult, the needs of "Mission: Advance!", and the retirement of Dr. Penner were major complications.

How have we done? The minutes of our meetings have gone to the churches - we have not worked in hiding.

You all know that a Search Committee, representing geographic and interest areas was set up and has been very active in its task. You will hear and judge the record on "Mission: Advance!"

The Board decided to organize itself into two major committees; an Executive Committee with personnel functions and a Finance Committee with budget functions.

We have given major attention to a discussion of the Congregational Fund. As a consequence of a discussion with some of their members, the Fund has created an Income Fund and an Equity Fund, in addition to the Balanced Fund in existence for many years. The Conference instituted these two new funds by a transfer of \$1 million of its investment in the Balanced Fund to each of these new funds. Hopefully, the Congregational Fund will become more useful to more churches.

We have dealt with a number of meaningful ventures, including financial help in some cases. These include:

- I. Ad Hoc Committee for Racial and International Peace
- 2. Camp Anderson
- 3. Project Equality
- 4. U.C.C. Committee on Mission Priorities
- Adoption of the Parsonage Equity program and election of Trustees to manage the Fund.
- 6. Employed a staff member, the Reverend George Thomas, to the Church and Community post and another, the Reverend Robert Knowles, to to serve in the area of Church and Education.
- 7. Established a committee to consider the resolution of the last annual meeting concerning the term of officers and the staff.

The Board took a number of actions involving staff:

- Established salary ranges based on the recommendations of the Committee on Compensation.
- 2. Set a sabbatical leave policy and recommended it to the churches.

- 3. Set a modest policy of terminal leave for staff members who leave after five years.
- 4. Requested the Committee on Compensation to develop job descriptions of the staff positions.
- 5. Sponsored a new family protection program for ministers to bring them closer to the insurance benefits offered by other employers.

The Reverend Arthur Litton, Jr., Mr. Milton Hagins and Mr. Sarkis Serdarian resigned from the Board during the year. Such resignations are regrettable but inevitable if the Conference chooses able and busy persons. We are pleased that two of these vacancies have been filled by Mr. Clifford Clarkson and Dr. Wade Kornegay.

The Board established a rule that any member who misses two consecutive meetings without explanation, or three consecutive meetings for any reason, shall be considered to have resigned. With only eight regular meetings in a year, all members are needed to get the work done. The Board also recommended the same policy to the Conference committees and some of them have already adopted it.

The matter of attendance by all of the staff at all Board meetings was also considered in depth, with the result that no staff member is required to attend a meeting unless by special direction, but all are encouraged to attend to permit optimum communication.

The Board recognized that the "Mission: Advance!" program was behind schedule and reluctantly directed the staff to give it first priority. The staff was already deeply committed to very important responsibilities and this decision caused real hardship to them. They responded magnificently and the widened band of enthusiastic response to "Mission: Advance!" is the very substantial approval of the action of the Board. We are all delighted that this burden on the staff is about over.

We have had an exciting year with some successes. What about our failures? We have not resolved the conflict between the long agenda and the busy volunteer directors who are always on one other committee and some on two. There are limits to the time the Conference can expect.

We have not developed a method to fill vacancies quickly enough. We have not been able to provide adequate orientation early enough in the year so that directors can act with broad knowledge. We have not learned how to relate effectively to the Conference committees. We have not developed enough understanding of the work of the staff. We have not seriously considered the future.

So, we leave challenges to match our accomplishments.

#### CLAYTON R. FORD, Chairman

The Moderator requested the Vice-Moderator, the Rev. Dr. Herbert R. Smith, to join him on the platform and appointed Mr. Loomis Patrick, Parliamentarian, who also joined the Moderator at the podium.

The Treasurer, Miss Pauline Cutler, presented the Treasurer's Reports for the year 1968 and spoke to the printed reports in the hands of the delegates.

The Moderator then presented the remaining printed reports for questions or comments. Following some discussion regarding the negative statistics in the Secretary's Report, it was moved and

VOTED: That the Committee on Church and Education be asked to study the negative statistics reported in the Conference Secretary's report and make

whatever recommendations to the Conference as may seem appropriate. The study should cover the decline in church membership, church school enrollment and the number of new members accepted on Confession of Faith.

Following further discussion, it was moved and

VOTED: That the printed reports be accepted.

The Moderator called on Mr. Leonard Allen, Chairman of the Church and Leadership Committee for his report. It was agreed that the election of officers and committees would take place on Saturday. In the meantime, questions were raised concerning the slate as presented thus far by the Committee on Church and Leadership: What is the relationship of Association officers and committee members to the State Conference slate of officers and committees? What percentage of the present slate falls within the 20-25 age group?

The business session was interrupted for luncheon which was served in the assembly hall. The Rev. Malcolm Kilborn of Stockbridge gave the Invocation.

At 2:00 P.M., the Moderator called the meeting to order and introduced the Rev. Dr. Howard Spragg who addressed the annual meeting on the subject, "The Church as an Immigrant in Time." Dr. Spragg alerted the company to the major issues of today which must be confronted by the Church and the possible posture of the Church in the face of these issues.

At 2:45 P.M., the Moderator presented a panel composed of the Chairmen of the Standing Committees of the Conference; Rev. T. Thomas Boates. Jr. - Church and Community; Mr. Leonard Allen - Church and Leadership; Mr. Clayton R. Ford - Board of Directors; Rev. Frederick Lyon - Church and Education; Mr. Harry Purple - Council of the Laity; Rev. Donald Overlock, Church and Ministry; Mr. Albert O. Wilson, Jr., Church and Mission. The panel made presentations on the subject, "What Is The Conference's Thing?" and detailed the work, problems and proposals of these working committees.

The Order of the Day was called at 4:00 P.M. and a group of young singers, the Musicampers, under the direction of Mrs. David Thomson, led the assembly in folk songs.

At 4:15 P.M., the Moderator presented the Rev. Dr. Ben M. Herbster who gave an address on the topic, "Tasks for the Years Ahead." He challenged the Church to be a healing, reconciling agent in the world today and to assess its need for recruitment and for restoring of spiritual resources in order to be a match for the crises of the day. A standing ovation was accorded Dr. Herbster at the conclusion of his speech.

With some time remaining before adjournment, the Moderator called the Rev. T. Thomas Boates to read three resolutions being presented to the annual meeting by the Committee on Church and Community. There was no action at this time.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:00 P.M., following prayer by the Rev. Judith Hjorth, Congregational Church, Lynnfield Center.

Beginning at 6:30 P.M., a Testimonial Banquet was held in the assembly hall in honor of Dr. and Mrs. Albert J. Penner. The Moderator, Mr. David W. Bartlett, served as Toastmaster and the Rev. Dr. Oliver Powell, First Congregational Church, Winchester, gave the Invocation. Guest speakers included: Rev. Dr. Forrest L. Knapp, Massachusetts Council of Churches; Dr. Ben M. Herbster, United Church of Christ; Dr. Alford Carleton, United Church Board for World Ministries; Dr. Ray Gibbons, personal friend and former Executive Director of the Council for Christian Social Action; the Rev. Dr. Oliver Powell, minister of the Penner's home church; and Mr. Clayton R. Ford for the Board of Directors. Mr.

Bartlett made the presentation of gifts including a check and two volumes of letters from friends and co-workers of the Penners throughout the eleven years of Dr. Penner's term as Minister and President of the Conference. Dr. Penner made a warm and affectionate response. Members of the Penner family and other head table guests were presented.

At the climax of the program, on behalf of the Board of Directors, Mr. Clayton R. Ford brought a recommendation. It was moved and unanimously

VOTED: That the Conference support by acclamation the following vote of the Board of Directors: "That the Rev. Albert J. Penner, be Minister Emeritus of the Massachusetss Conference of the United Church of Christ, to be effective September 1, 1969, at the time of his retirement."

In addition to the testimonial program, the newly ordained ministers and those who have come to the Conference in the past year were recognized and two ministers who are marking their 50th year in the ministry: the Rev. Norman Cawley of North Carver and the Rev. Benjamin Andrew of Keene, N. H. who made the response for himself and Mr. Cawley.

The program concluded with the singing of a hymn and the meeting adjourned at 9:30 P.M.

#### SATURDAY, MAY 17, 1969

On Saturday morning, May 17, 1969, at 7:30 A.M., Dr. Albert J. Penner, assisted by members of the Conference staff, conducted the Conference Communion service in the Storrowton Village Meetinghouse. A Communion breakfast followed in the assembly hall.

The annual meeting was called to worship at 9:30 A.M. and a group of young people, under the direction of the Rev. Boardman W. Kathan, conducted a "Mod Worship" experience.

The Moderator then presented the Rev. Dr. Albert J. Penner, Minister and President of the Conference, for his eleventh and final annual report.. Members of the staff gathered on the platform and were introduced by Dr. Penner. The absence of three was noted: Mr. W. Elliott Pratt who was on vacation; the Rev. Pierre D. Vuilleumier who was attending the graduation of his twin sons at Defiance College and where Mr. Vuilleumier was giving the Baccalaureate Sermon and receiving an honorary degree; and the Rev. Dr. Myron W. Fowell who is in Greece on a study tour. Dr. Penner's report is as follows:

#### THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS - ANNUAL MEETING, MAY 1969

For the eleventh and last time it is my privilege to report to the churches of our Conference about our life and work together. Since much of this is already in your hands in the printed reports of staff and committees, or comes to your attention as the agenda for this meeting unrolls, I shall try in my remarks to provide a somewhat broader scope, including at least a very brief and necessarily superficial review of the past eleven years.

I begin by acknowledging Mr. Beck's very considerable contribution to the planning and preparation for our Annual Meeting. For the first time he bore the full-load of responsibility for entertaining such a convention. With the help of Darrell Holland, he devised the new format for our advance reports, with an attractive plastic folder. He set up a schedule for advance mailing to all our ministers well before this meeting, and, to all the lay delegates in so far as we had their names. He organized the local committee, and supervised the details of the planning for our entertainment. He tells me that at all stages he received the finest cooperation, and I'm sure we are grateful to the management of these facili-

ties for their friendly hospitality, and to the local committee from the host churches for their very great help.

An enormous variety of things have engaged my thoughts and attention during the past decade. I was surprised, though, at how many things were related to Conference restructuring, and not nearly all of this stemmed from the recommendations of the Arthur D. Little report.

Miss Cutler and Mr. Pratt are the only members of our Executive Staff who were here when I came. We have greatly developed and refined the Area structure, and provided full-time Area Ministers for each of the five Areas. From twenty Associations in 1958, we have reduced their number to *fifteen*, and further reductions are likely.

Nine years ago we undertook the operation of Craigville on the Cape as a second Conference Center. This splendid setting by the sea, with its glorious beach, was originally given for religious purposes. The original style, the Camp Meeting, had gone out of fashion and the corporation controlling this property was hardly prepared to operate a program. For years the original religious purpose had laid dormant, but now under the creative leadership and management of Marion Vuilleumier, it is alive, and I believe in the future it will continue to be an ever greater resource for our fellowship.

Our Framingham Conference Center is being used for Conference purposes to a far greater extent than ever before. A corrolary of this is that 14 Beacon Street is being used less. There are several reasons for this. Parking in the City is expensive and often hard to find. Framingham is convenient, central, and parking is no problem. We've also changed our style of operation. Two years ago all our Trustee meetings were held in Boston and all meetings of the Executive Committee — now none. Many of our meetings begin in the late afternoon, and continue through dinner into the evening. Virtually all of our committees now meet regularly at Framingham. And Jane and Dexter Rice and their staff are accommodating and provide such ample, attractive and tasty meals that it has become our favored spot. How lucky that we have it, and how wise to develop its use further.

We've done many things there, we need to do more. We've built a fine home for the Director; we've built an excellent swimming pool; we've developed a full scale Day Camp and Family Camp program. We now need to take some of the next steps in rehabilitation and new building which are being studied, and will be proposed by a competent planning committee.

Several years ago we opened a branch office in Amherst in three rooms provided by the First Congregational Church. It is the base for our Western Area Minister and one of the Ministers of Christian Education. It provides a convenient place for meetings and a center for information and materials.

Two totally new offices have been created. One is that of the Vice-President for Administration. The eventual scope of this office is not yet fully set. It includes office management, purchasing, mailing, shipping, and the hiring of clerical staff. It is becoming closely related to the Treasury department, especially in the oversight of budgeted expenditures. It is our hope to bring the accounting of our two centers under this office, as also the management of other properties which the Conference owns (a farm in Covington, houses in Deerfield and Belchertown, parsonages on College Campuses). The need for such an office is fully established and its service very important for responsible business operation.

Likewise, we now have a full time Director of Communication. In all modesty, I say that our *Pilgrim State News* is the best Conference paper in the United

Church of Christ. Circulation has increased from approximately 6,000 three years ago to approximately 65,000 copies today. It is our best instrument for communication.

Many of our operations are in a somewhat fluid state, and we don't know precisely in what directions they may develop. The Council of the Laity particularly is, I think, attempting to remain open to new directions. Our whole program of Campus Ministries has changed. We are now fully integrated into the United Ministries in Higher Education with the Presbyterian, Methodist, Baptist, and Disciples denominations. We no longer appoint any of our own denominational chaplains; all are appointed ecumenically. All our budgeting is done cooperatively.

In the field of community action, the recent past can tell quite a story. Least important, perhaps, is the fact that we've passed resolutions. I know they represent only the opinions of the people who make them but the people who make them are representative of the members of our churches. I have used these resolutions from time to time in support of statements I have made at public meetings.

We've responded to crises, — as for example in helping to resettle Cuban refugees. Our interest and money got Baldwinville started. We strongly promoted the development of St. Mark Social Center into the Ecumenical Center. The Scholarship Fund for Black Students has already helped at least 396 students go to college. We played a key role in the development of the New England Heifer project. Social action has been a key concern of this Conference, and I trust it will continue to be so.

As a structure of the denomination, we have faithfully sought to play a strongly supportive role. The Massachusetts Conference fulfilled its quota of \$750,000 for the Church Building Loan Fund; it contributed more than \$1,200,000 to the Christian Higher Education Fund; it has formally expressed its intention to increase its contributions to Our Church World Mission by \$100,000 in each of the three years of Mission: Advance. We kept that commitment in 1968. But in other ways than financially we desire to play our full part as a member of the United Church family.

This year we shall be entertaining the 7th General Synod of the United Church of Christ. We shall have sixty-two voting delegates in attendance. Visitors are welcome at all sessions, and I hope that many of you will take the opportunity to get acquainted with our denominational leadership and with some of the programs of our fellowship.

I can hardly be expected to give this report without at least mentioning Mission: Advance. The need was first spoken of at our Annual Meeting in Pittsfield in 1964 — five years ago. I think it is true to say that no single thing has commanded so much of my time and thought during this five years as this. I shall not review the process, and because the full report — for which I know you are anxiously waiting — is to be made later this morning, I shall not say more at this time. Except this: I am glad the Conference had the courage to undertake it, and that we could complete it before my retirement.

I wish also to express appreciation to Marts and Lundy for the leadership they provided, and especially to Mr. John Carlson and Mr. Paul Collyer. The same goes for two young ministers, Deane Lanphear and Richard Simonson, who at considerable risk accepted a one-year appointment and gave fine service. In fact, every member of the staff has participated effectively and with general good will. In addition, the Churches Campaign Committee, with the Reverend Robert W. Little as Chairman, deserves special mention and our warmest thanks.

Let me now turn from what has been in part a backward glance to some comments about our present involvements. We are living amid a tremendous social ferment. There is "a shaking of the foundations," and the Church is inevitably and irresistibly being drawn into the swirling vortex of world events.

Now there are those who counsel withdrawal into the private sector of pietism and otherworldliness. There are individuals and groups in our denomination, perhaps in all our churches, who fear and deplore every involvement of the Church in social action. I think it would be tragic to heed their fears. To do so would be to repudiate the implications of our Gospel. To do so would also serve to alienate still further the brightest of our youth, leaders among the intellectuals, and especially masses of the poor, and also the Blacks who can only be persuaded when they perceive action to match our profession.

We have made much progress in America in extending social and economic benefits, and for this we can be deeply grateful. However, the fundamental social fact of our time is still "the division between poor and rich, weak and powerful, exploited and exploiter." There is a lot of unfinished business on the agenda of Society, including the agenda of our Churches. Among the unfinished business to be taken up *now* with boldness and resolve is the struggle for justice and the achievement of peace.

We are committed by our Gospel to the struggle for justice and brotherhood.

The roots of our charter are in the Bible. "Let justice roll down like water, and righteousness like a mighty stream," said the prophet. Or Jesus: "Woe to you, Scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for you pay tithes of mint and anise and cummin, and have omitted the weightier matters of the laws, — justice and mercy and faithfulness."

In our country the struggle for justice and brotherhood involves most of all the righting of our ancient wrongs to the black members of our society.

We have passed fine sounding resolutions, of which this one from 1959 is typical:

We believe that segregation is a sin. Segregation is contrary to the Gospel. Segregation denies the Christian doctrine of man. Segregation violates the nature of the Church of Christ.

We call upon our churches and their members to pray and work:

- 1. For the elimination of pride and prejudice from our hearts;
- 2. For the end of racial segregation in our communities in church life, in housing, in employment, in education, in public accommodations and service, and in the exercise of political rights;
- 3. For the furtherance of human rights and respect for all persons as children of God.

The right words have often been spoken and token actions taken, but these are not enough. Senator Richard Russell admitted that the Civil Rights Bill of 1963 would not have been passed by the Congress if it had not had the strong support of the Churches, but, he asked, "Where have you been during the last 200 years?" It is a fair question. Our denial of the Gospel has caught up with us. It is no longer possible to make unilateral decisions and to plead for more time. The time is now for action to match our Gospel. We cannot afford the luxury of inaction. We shall not be permitted to do so.

What forms that action should take I cannot predict. I am quite sure it will call for a new style of response which demonstrates in deeds what we've said in words.

Mr. James Forman and other militant blacks are making demands for \$500,000,000 in reparations from the churches. I hope that black leaders like Bayard Rustin regard this as "ridiculous." It is also unrealistic, and I don't know where the money would be coming from, or how it might be raised. But if we really, in our hearts, realized and admitted that we had for generations done wrong to a large proportion of our people; if we understood this feeling and with imagination, we would discover ways now of doing the *more* that needs to be done.

We must get beyosd a reluctant response to pressure, to an eager search for opportunities to help the blacks who are disadvantaged and who have been sorely exploited. I am glad that so large a portion of Mission: Advance! will go toward assistance in the Ghetto: to Project Equality, the City-Missionary Society, a Family Counselling center in Springfield, an Urban Coalition project in New Bedford, the Ecumenical Center and the Commission on Church and Race.

Like all redemption it must begin in genuine repentance, but it must move into bold and meaningful action. We shall not escape the struggle for justice and brotherhood, nor should we wish or seek to do so. It deserves the highest priority.

We are committed by the Gospel to Peace. Our charter is rooted in the prophets who spoke of the day when "They shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks. Neither shall they learn war anymore." It is rooted in our faith in Christ as the "prince of peace."

My concern at this moment is with the possibilities for peace in Vietnam. I was startled to realize that it was a year ago that I said in my report, "All of us must look with hope and a prayer toward the negotiations in Paris where, may it please God, there is at last the beginning of the end of America's most divisive foreign war." I was a bit too optimistic. It was not, a year ago, "the beginning of the end;" it was only the beginning of the beginning of the end.

At last there is some more hopeful evidence that this unhappy conflict may be drawing to its close. But peace will not have come when the fighting is over. There will be an enormous task of restoration and reconciliation. No war since the Civil War has so deeply divided America. We must bring America together again. Our churches should take the lead in supporting actions on all levels that would most quickly bind up our nation's wounds. Such action, in my opinion, should include generous action toward those of our youth who have in conscience resisted this war, and who have suffered for it. It should include amnesty for those in prison or facing prosecution, or who have chosen exile in Canada or Sweden. We must bring America together again, and our churches should take the lead.

I feel I must say something about the internal health and unity of our churches. Back in the fifties we heard much about the widespread revival of religious interest in America. Statistics about church membership and church attendance were high. Now all the statistics point the other way, and there is no way of knowing when or whether the trend may be reversed. There might even be differences of opinion as to what the trend reveals.

Opinions vary widely as to the causes of this decline. It is true that all institutions are under attack. The establishment is everywhere on the defensive. Many people sense a new freedom. There are so many other things to do which

seem so much more interesting and worthwhile. Some think the Church has had it and that it has nothing to contribute to further the life of mankind. There is perhaps as much interest as ever in ultimate questions, but they are not necessarily tied up with being in church on Sunday morning.

In this situation what are our churches to do? To me it is clear that they will not and should not close up shop, nor should they continue to go on in traditional and familiar ways. A new style of church life is required.

Many of our churches are experimenting with new forms of worship. In at least one of our churches there are two Sunday morning services: one entirely traditional, and the other untraditional, using play readings, films, discussions, folk singing, and other means of participation. Increasing numbers of churches are offering opportunities for worship and learning during the week. Our churches must be more open to and ready for change if they are to serve the spiritual needs of modern man, and those which show such flexibility will continue to attract the seekers for truth.

Let me address a special word of pleading to the laymen and women who are here. You are among the leaders in your church. You have a good deal to say about what happens or does not happen in your Church. You have a lot of responsibility for setting policy and program. You probably stand closer to your minister than the average member of your congregation.

We hear a good deal today about a gap between the pulpit and the pew, and I think this is a fact. Your minister was graduated from a seminary, and especially if he is a fairly recent graduate, he has been exposed not only to a rigorous academic discipline, but also to serious confrontation with the grave problems of scoiety. He is a minister because he is committed to the Gospel and to our Christian faith. It is fair to assume that he has thought deeply about these things. He is impatient with things as they are. He is likely to be impatient with what he sees in the local church. He wants it to move, to be flexible, and to show some courage. He wants it to be open to change, receptive to new ideas, and willing to try new programs.

A first duty is to trust your minister and to try to understand him. Try also to share his vision, and then to really support him in his endeavors.

The gap between the pulpit and the pew may be the fault of the minister. Some of us are inept, we don't communicate properly, we fail in our leadership: but much of the fault lies with the laity, in their unwillingness to trust their minister and look to him for leadership.

This Conference intends to be of real help at this point, in helping to provide stronger support for our professional leadership. The success of Mission: Advance! will enable us to do many things which we hope will greatly strengthen the local church and narrow the gap between pulpit and pew.

Let me now bring you a few concluding remarks.

For Christians the mission in never accomplished. We are on pilgrimage. So it is with the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ. Much has been undertaken in recent years, but more remains to be done. Now that I hand the baton of leadership to the unnamed person who shall be my successor, I do so with the deep feeling of gratitude that eleven years ago you invited me to be your leader.

When the new Minister and President comes, give him the confidence, the courtesy, the support which I feel you have given me. He will not have an easy

task. He will need your prayers and your help. He will have my prayers, and my continuing deep interest in the work of the Conference.

Bertrand Russell has said that a person should care deeply about what is to come after him. I do care deeply about what will happen here in this blessed fellowship of which it has been my privilege to be a part for most of forty-two years. I believe that, under God, the best is yet to be.

May I now finally say a special word on behalf of the members of your staff. They are as fine and as competent a group of people as you will find. I must single out one person, Walter Telfer, whose resignation, to head the Department of the Ministry at Andover Newton, has been accepted with real regret. Walter has been an ideal Area Minister in every regard, combining a deep pastoral concern with sound judgment and firmness. We certainly wish him well in his new post, though we shall greatly miss him from our team.

I will remember all my colleagues — past as well as present — with affection and very high regard. Give them your confidence and your strong support. They are worthy of it.

Many years ago I bought a set of encyclopedias from a fast-talking salesman. When the set arrived, I felt that I had been taken in. For Volume I ended not at the end of an article, or even the end of a paragraph, but in the middle of a sentence. I was put out, but there is a moral here. Not every episode in life is a neatly wrappd package. Many break off rather abruptly, with much still to be done, as though in the middle of a sentence. . . . With that comment I break off this chapter in what I hope may be a still continuing ministry.

#### Albert J. Penner

At the conclusion of his report, the delegates and guests gave Dr. Penner a heartfelt standing ovation.

Upon receiving Dr. Penner's resignation the Board of Directors issued a statement which follows as a part of this record.

#### A STATEMENT BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

#### November 20, 1968

The Board of Directors has received the statement of Dr. Albert Penner, Minister and President of our Conference, indicating his intention to resign no later than September 1, 1969.

We, the members of the Board react in kind as we sense the mixed feeling of Dr. Penner.

We are sorrowful over his decision to leave but we rejoice with him and are thankful for his eleven years of leadership.

In these years, our world and our society have undergone vast changes unmatched in history. Great voids have been wrought although communications have improved. The gap between wealth and poverty increases. Black and white form sides and make issues. Peace is elusive.

In the midst of the confusion and turmoil, Al Penner has used the mantle of leadership to challenge and redirect the mission of this Conference toward the ever expanding needs created by the agenda of the Almighty at work in the world.

OCWM concern and commitment, in a period of decline in a number of churches, has nearly doubled that of 1958.

He has constantly sought ways to promote ecumenical ventures and cooperation.

He has seen the conference through a critical period of self-evaluation and structural change.

He has called us, the Congregationalists of Massachusetts, to renew ourselves by the cleansing power of the Holy Spirit to seek our places in God's Mission.

He even now leads us as we seek to Advance this Mission.

These tasks have not been easy. Success has, in large measure, resulted from the personal contribution of Al Penner.

We have admired the clarity of his vision in the midst of stress and confusion. We have loved him for his ability to remain serene amidst controversy and remain above personal prejudice and pettiness. We will miss his ability to capture and formulate the core of issues and his amazing memory for detail.

Persons throughout the state and the nation have come to know him for his wisdom, friendly smile, and sincere dedication. His reputation for keeping a steady balance among many demands is permanently established.

While we regret the time when his resignation becomes effective, we are happy for the months we will still enjoy with him — tall and straight among us, truly a man reflecting the image of the Father of us all.

While we regretfully accept his resignation, we pray for many years of fruitful experiences yet to come to Dr. and Mrs. Penner, and we pledge them our continued support and friendship in the years ahead.

There was a change of pace at 11:00 A. M. Coffee and pastrics were served and a folksinging group entertained with a group of songs.

At 11:10 A. M., the Rev. George Thomas, staff advisor to the Committee on Church and Community, read the remaining resolutions to be acted upon later in the meeting.

The Rev. Ellsworth Comins of Merrimac was given a minute to announce the upcoming meeting of a new group, "Society for Professional Clergy" and invited ordained clergy to attend.

At 11:30 A. M., the Committee on Church and Mission made its presentation of Mission: Advance! Those participating included: the Rev. Paul E. Shanabrook, Minister of Church and Mission; the Rev. Cameron R. Borton, Winchendon; the Rev. Dexter B. Rice, Director of Framingham Conference Center; Mr. Elliot V. Brabill for the Boston City Missionary Society; the Rev. Vernic Bolden, Springfield; Mr. Roger Wentworth, Lawrence; Mr. John T. Heald, Hingham; Mr. James Ball, Orange; Mr. Albert O. Wilson, Jr., Chairman, Committee on Church and Mission; and the Rev. Deane R. Lanphear and the Rev. Richard E. Simonson, Associate Directors of Mission: Advance! Enthusiastic, inspirational, testimonials

were given of what Mission: Advance! is already meaning in the life of the Conference, ministers and local churches. The climax of the presentation came when the Rev. Dr. Albert J. Penner announced that as of May 14, 1969, \$2,114,484 has been pledged and committed for Mission: Advance!

Appreciation was expressed to the Conference Staff for the great tasks they have undertaken for Mission: Advance! in addition to their regular portfolios. The staff acknowledged grateful applause.

Mr. Clayton R. Ford led the assembly in a prayer of thanksgiving.

Luncheon was served at 12:45 P. M.

The Moderator called the meeting to order at 1:45 P.M. and the Rev. Boardman W. Kathan introduced the Massachusetts United Church of Christ Youth Council to the delegates and guests. This group includes:

The Moderator then ruled a portion of time to be given to the delegates for any comments they might wish to make on the proceedings thus far. A number of persons came to the microphones for statements.

The Moderator then called upon the Mission: Advance! team for its summary. The Rev. Robert W. Little, chairman of the Church Committee, gave a concluding report and expressed appreciation for the tremendous work done by the Area Chairmen: Ray Atkinson, West; James Bateman, Central; Carl Holdridge, Southeast; Henry Rust, Metropolitan Boston Association and Julian Steele, Northeast.

Upon expression of opinion from the floor, it was moved and

 $\it VOTED$ : That the discussion of Mission: Advance! be concluded and that the agenda be continued.

Ballots were passed out for the election of officers. It was moved and

VOTED: That the report of the Committee on Church and Leadership be accepted.

The Chair then entertained nominations from the floor:

Miss Valerie Bryan, Agawam, was nominated for the Board of Directors for a four year term;

Rev. Wesley Raney was nominated for the Board of Directors for a four year term.

Rev. Edmund W. Nutting was nominated for Moderator.

It was determined that, in order to keep the proper balance and representation of areas on the Board of Directors, Miss Bryan would be running against the Rev. Virgil V. Brallier, Monterey, and the Rev. Mr. Raney against Mrs. William H. Ruhl, West Dennis.

It was moved and

VOTED: That nominations be closed.

The delegates marked their ballots and they were collected by the ushers.

It was moved and

VOTED: That the Secretary cast one ballot for the delegates to General Synod.

The Moderator then turned to the election of Conference Committees.

It was moved and

VOTED: That the Committee on Church and Community be elected as printed.

It was moved and

VOTED: That the Committee on Church and Education be elected as printed.

It was moved and

*VOTED*: That the Committee on Church and Leadership be elected as printed, with the inclusion of Mr. Nathaniel Smith, Cambridge, 1973.

It was moved and

VOTED: That the Committee on Church and Ministry be elected as printed.

It was moved and

VOTED: That the Committee on Church and Mission be elected as printed with the inclusion of Mrs. Theodore Hunt, Methuen, 1970.

It was moved and

VOTED: That the Council of the Laity, the Program Committee, Board of Pastoral Supply, Corporate Members of the Boston Scaman's Friend Society, Directors of the Churchmen's League for Civic Welfare be elected as printed.

It was then moved and

VOTED: That the ballot of all committees be elected.

The Moderator then turned to action on the proposed resolutions.

Following questions and discussions, it was moved and

VOTED: That the following resolution on State Youth Services be adopted:

WHEREAS it is fundamental to our Christian faith that every individual be given opportunity to fulfill his potential, especially in situations when he has become alienated from society by actions of his own choosing or because of circumstances beyond his control; and

IVHEREAS it has become evident from objective studies by both government and private commissions (U.S. Children's Bureau, Mass. Committee on Children and Youth, etc.) that the present Division of Youth Services has not produced the positive results originally expected, but conversely has perpetuated severe conditions preventing physical, social, educational, and spiritual rehabilitation of most juvenile offenders in our state; and

WHEREAS these conditions are becoming widely publicized, thus creating the climate for change in current legislative proposals, and

WHEREAS the successful results of this reorganized Division depend in large measure on support and participation by groups and individuals to counteract the apathy shown during these last twenty years:

Therefore be it RESOLVED that the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ give immediate notice to the General Court of Massachusetts that it actively supports Bills S-1001 and H-2870, establishing a Department of Youth Services and providing for the administration of laws relating to children and youth by said Department; and

Be it further RESOLVED that our churches and their individual members become well-informed about the state services to youth and that they participate actively in preventive and rehabilitative measures concerning youthful offenders.

Following considerable discussion, it was moved and

VOTED: That the following resolution on Anti-Ballistic Missiles be adopted:

WHEREAS our Christian tradition bids us ever to seek peace and avoid war; and

WHEREAS specifically the Prophet Micah helps us dream of the time when men "shall beat their swords into plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up a sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more"; and

WHEREAS we are in accord with the fear of the late Dwight David Eisenhower that the vested interest of the military and industrial establishment in the United States is exerting an inordinate power of influence over national policy; and

WHEREAS there is ample and responsible scientific and military opinion that the deployment of an anti-ballistic missile system is militarily fruitless and diplomatically inflammatory; and

WHEREAS there is reason to fear that the so-called "modified" anti-ballistic missile system is in fact the beginning of a very extensive system; and

WHEREAS we desire to trust our federal government, but fear that we have both in the past and present situations not been given all the facts;

Be it therefore RESOLVED that the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ urgently petition members of the Massachusetts Congressional delegation not only to vote against the appropriation of funds for an ABM system, but also to exert their leadership urging members of the House and Senate to join them in such a negative vote.

The vote on Anti-Ballistic Missiles divided: 229 - yes and 189 - no. It was moved and

VOTED: That the count as taken on the Resolution on Anti-Ballistic Missiles be included when the resolution is sent to Washington, D. C.

The Moderator, Mr. Bartlett, announced the vote on the ballots for officers and Board of Directors: 607 total ballots cast; 175 voted for the entire slate; 62 — Rev. Edmund W. Nutting; 172 — Rev. Wesley Raney; 258 — Miss Valerie Bryan; 38 ballots spoiled. The nominees as printed on the ballot were elected.

The Rev. Dr. Herbert R. Smith, the newly elected Moderator, took over the gavel at the request of Mr. Bartlett.

Discussion of the resolutions continued. It was moved and

VOTED: That the following resolution on Housing Needs and Zoning Laws be adopted:

WHEREAS there exists in the entire Commonwealth an extreme shortage of decent, safe and sanitary housing at rents and prices within the means of families and individuals of low and limited economic resources; and

WHEREAS there does not now exist a sufficient number of agencies which are adequately providing through new construction, rehabilitation or other ways for the production of the necessary volume of decent, reasonably priced housing, for sale or rent, that is available to such families and individuals, and

WHEREAS the availability of low and modest-priced housing for large families, elderly families and individuals of low and limited economic means is usually confined to areas with very low levels of municipal services, educational programs and amenities; and

WHEREAS churches of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ usually are located in neighborhoods and cities and towns characterized as having decent housing, amenable neighborhoods with high levels of service and convenience, and quality educational systems, and more often than not characterized by disproportionate concentrations of families and individuals of moderate incomes,

Be it therefore RESOLVED that the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ recommend to the churches of the Conference that local churches establish a task force for housing in their own community to study carefully and diligently the housing supply in their own neighborhood, city or town, with specific concern for families and individuals of low and limited economic means; and

Be it further RESOLVED that the Minister of Church and Community of the Conference and his state committee, in co-operation with other agencies working to fill the housing need, assist any church desirous of establishing such a task force.

It was moved and

VOTED: That the following resolution on Injustice Breeds Disorder be adopted:

WHEREAS one of the basic principles upon which our national government and our Christian faith were founded was the establishment of laws which provide order, stability and justice; and

WHEREAS the term "law and order" has come to denote excessive emphasis on restraint and control over disorderliness and violence especially by Black Americans; and

*WHEREAS* the greater the emphasis on repression and restriction, the less the awareness of the basic injustices which affect the total lives of minority groups in this country; and

WHEREAS insensitive and planned injustices are just as much "disorder" (disorder in terms of God's law and man's need) as the violence which they cause.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ sets before the Board of Directors of the Conference and the Church and Community Committee the responsibility to give high priority attention to the education of our church members to the fundamental causes which give rise to the anger and the bitterness which explode in our streets; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that churches take steps to combat the fundamental causes of anger and discontent within their own lives as well as in society.

It was moved and

VOTED: That the following resolution on Personal Appearance be adopted as amended:

WHEREAS the Christian Gospel clearly compels us to accept in love all persons without prejudgment; and

 $\it WHEREAS$  racism and prejudice are expressions of a basically unaccepting and rejecting style of life; and

WHEREAS such rejection of persons is manifest in a variety of ways including hostility to differing personality styles as well as differing races, creeds and ethnic origins; and

WHEREAS there is increasing evidence of discrimination in employment, housing and education; because of unusual grooming or dress; and

WHEREAS the Epistle of James, Chapter 2, specifically enjoins Christians to disregard personal appearances as a criterion of personal judgment; and

WHEREAS Christ was not loathe to identify with persons of unpopular styles of life, moral perception and personal mannerisms, and

WHEREAS the Biblical message is consistently open to changes in the style of temporal life including the style of dress and appearance;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ sets before the conscience of all men of good will its concern that persons not be prejudged according to their grooming and dress.

Upon receiving word of action taken this afternoon at the State House, it was moved and

VOTED: That the delegates of the 170th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ commend Governor Francis Sargent for his courageous stand on vetoing the bill on Beano.

Dr. Smith thanked Mr. David W. Bartlett for his role as Moderator and the delegation gave Mr. Bartlett a standing ovation.

Upon recommendation of the Rev. William Hulteen, East Weymouth, speaking from the floor, it was moved and

VOTED: WHEREAS a significant number of United Church of Christ parishes found in our Conference are to be found in suburban settings; and

WHEREAS charges have been made that the ministry of such parishes by and large lack relevance and are parasitic obedients of the middle class; and

WHEREAS there are many clergy and laymen who are struggling to find relevance in such settings; and

WHEREAS there is a growing sense of alienation between such parishes and the Conference; and

WHEREAS our Conference has, in the past, been able to exert creative leadership in areas of concern; and

WHEREAS suburbia has emerged as a major mission field of the Church; and

 $\it WHEREAS$  the Conference is in a position to struggle with needs as they are given priority;

BE IT RESOLVED that this meeting go on record to ask our Committee on Church and Ministry to appoint a Task Force to develop guidelines for Conference programs specifically dealing with the crisis of the suburban parish in a challenging, sensitive way.

Upon recommendation of Mr. William W. Welch, Jr., Belleville and Newburyport, speaking from the floor, it was moved and

VOTED: WHEREAS our members, churches, state conference, and General Synod have given continuous support to the cause of education; and

WHEREAS our educational systems, secular and religious, are in the midst of turmoil as pupils, parents, educators, administrators and governing boards seek ways of improving curriculum and instruction processes; and

WHEREAS such turmoil does produce conflict among the parties and thus ever within our churches as our members represent all sides (sometimes within the same congregation); and

WHEREAS our Christian traditions call for a witness of leadership by our educators and they are responding;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ under its Church and Education committee cause to have formed a commission of members who represent all the parties to attempt to find realistic Christian avenues for the reduction and/or resolution of the conflicts arising under pupil, parent, and teacher militancy for the improvement curriculum, administration, and personnel practices.

There was considerable discussion of the portfolio of investments of the Massachusetts Congregational Fund and of the stock in the Dow Chemical Company in particular. Because of the pressure of time and the lack of a quorum of delegates present, it now being past 5:00 P.M., upon recommendation of the Business Committee, it was moved and

VOTED: That this Annual Meeting be recessed to an appropriate time in the fall of 1969 to consider action relative to Fellowship Dues, the Special Committee to Study Terms of Office and Elections, the report of the Search Committee, the election of the President and Minister of the Conference, a continuation of the discussion regarding the holding of Dow Chemical Company stock in the Congregational Fund, and such other business that may legally come before the meeting.

The credentials committee, the Rev. Norman R. Farnum, Greenfield, chairman, made the following report of attendance:

Dr. Oliver Black, Holyoke, gave the closing prayer and Dr. Albert J. Penner pronounced the benediction.

The meeting adjourned at 5:30 P.M.

### RECORD OF PERTINENT DATA NOT VOTED ON AT THE 170th ANNUAL MEETING, MAY 16 AND 17, 1969

Since the meeting was recessed due to lack of a quorum, the following items were not voted on but are included for the record and for guidance in the recessed meeting in the fall of 1969.

Resolution on Dow Chemical:

WHEREAS, it has been noted that since the first of April, 1968, the Congregational Fund has acquired, among other additions to its investment portfolio, 1,575 shares of stock in the Dow Chemical Company valued at approximately \$119,000; and

WHEREAS, this has ironically occurred at a time when several groups, including the Unitarian-Universalist denomination, have divested themselves of their holdings in the Dow Company, the manufacturers of napalm, as an act of opposition to the use of napalm in Vietnam; and

WHEREAS, our church can and ought to seek more creative ways of investing its moneys than in the manufacture of napalm;

The following resolution is proposed to be voted by the Conference:

It is the sense of this Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ that we urge the members of the Corporation of the Massachusetts Congregational Fund to divest itself of the Fund's stock holdings in the Dow Chemical Company and to channel these funds into areas of more humane and creative potential.

Resolution on Hospitality:

WHEREAS this the 170th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ, has enjoyed the hospitality, the spiritual and material blessings of the many groups and individuals of West Springfield during its stay here, it is therefore

RESOLVED that we extend deep appreciation and heartfelt thanks to the

- 1. First Congregational Church and Mittineague Church, West Springfield; Feeding Hills Church, and the Agawam Church all serving as our host churches, with special recognition of the outstanding services rendered by the Hospitality and Arrangements Committee, and the Pastors; and
- To the many individuals in these churches, the community, and on the Conference Staff who have planned and worked with great zeal for our comfort.

By-Law Change Proposed by Special Committee on Terms of Office and Elections, Approved by Board of Directors 4/16/69, Article V Officers and Staff:

1. As officers of the Conference there shall be a Moderator, a Vice-Moderator, and a Recording Secretary, all of whom shall be elected by ballot at each annual meeting of the Conference for a term of one year or until their successors are chosen.

- a. The Moderator, or in his absence, the Vice-Moderator, shall preside over the meetings of the Conference.
- b. The Recording Secretary shall record the complete minutes of *each meeting* of the Conference and shall transcribe and deliver same to the Secretary. The Board of Directors may, at their discretion, appoint a deputy to assist in the keeping of the records under the direction of the Recording Secretary.
- 2. The Conference Executive Officers shall be a President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and such other Executive Officers as the Conference may from time to time elect. Any of the said Executive Offices, except those of President, Secretary, and Treasurer, may be abolished by vote of the Conference. The Board of Directors shall make nominations for Conference Executive Officers for terms of one year. Elections shall take place by ballot at each Annual Meeting. Those elected shall hold office to the end of their term or until their respective successors are chosen. They shall bear such additional titles as the Conference or the Board of Directors may determine.
  - a. The President shall be the chief Executive Officer of the Conference and shall, subject to the direction of the Conference and of its Board of Directors, have general charge of its missionary and benevolent work and of its other activities. He shall be a member ex officio of all standing committees named in the by-laws. He shall have the power to delegate to members of the Staff the authority to represent him upon any of the said standing committees. He shall be the representative of the Conference and of its Board of Directors among all the churches (both those financially independent and those aided by the funds of the Conference) and in all denominational and interdenominational gatherings (including meetings of Conference Executives) unless representation is otherwise provided. He may seek to assist pastors and churches with fraternal counsel. He shall keep informed as to opportunities for extension work through founding new churches or strengthening old ones and shall recommend to the Conference and to the Board of Directors measures for meeting such opportunities.
  - b. The Secretary shall keep the records of the Conference, except as heretofore described and provided for, and shall assist in the general work of the Conference under the direction of the President. He shall devote himself in cooperation with the Area Ministers, and under the direction of the President to counselling with and assisting the churches, and shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Board of Directors or the President. He shall have the custody of the records and of all bonds given by the treasurer as hereinafter provided. He shall furnish copies of the record certified under the seal of the Conference (which shall be in his keeping) to such persons as may be entitled thereto.

The Secretary shall collect and publish in connection with the Annual Report of the Conference the statistics of ministers and churches and make up the official roll of the ministers and churches in accordance with the usages of the denomination. He shall present to the Conference at its Annual Meeting a general statistical statement of the progress of religion in the churches for the past calendar year. He shall give suitable notice to the churches of the time and place of each annual meeting, notify officers and committees of their election or appointment and fulfill such other functions as the Conference or the Board of Directors from time to time directs.

c. The Treasurer shall receive and hold the property of the Conference subject to the direction of the Board of Directors and shall keep particular accounts of the Conference's funds and of the disposal thereof. He shall, under the direction of the President, assist, so far as he may be able, in the general work of the Conference and shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Board of Directors. He shall make a report at each annual meeting of the Conference and shall make such other reports as the Conference or the Board of Directors may from time to time require. He shall receive all contributions for benevolences sent to him by the churches and by individuals and shall disburse the same in accordance with the instructions of the donors. He shall give such bonds for the faithful performance of his duties as may from time to time be required by the Board of Directors. Any Assistant Treasurer shall perform such duties as may be assigned by the Treasurer, and act in his stead in event of incapacity or absence.

#### 3. Area Ministers

The Conference may, from time to time, employ such staff as is deemed necessary to fulfill pastoral and fellowship functions and purposes within the Conference in the established Areas of the Conference, such staff to give counsel and leadership to the churches and ministers in those Areas, such staff to be employed by the Board of Directors in consultation with the President of the Conference, and in consultation with, or upon the recommendation of the Area committee/council involved, and/or in consultation with other appropriate parties.

- 4. Conference Program Staff and Administrative Staff
  The Conference may, from time to time, employ such staff as is deemed necessary to fulfill the program purposes and administrative needs of the Conference; such staff to be employed by the Board of Directors in consultation with the President of the Conference, and where applicable with such committee/committees and parties as may seem appropriate to the function which said position is to fulfill.
- 5. Performance Evaluation, Job Review, Professional Support
  The President shall present to the Board of Directors, for all Executive
  Officers and staff other than himself, periodic reviews of job performance,
  job content, and professional support status. The Board of Directors shall
  be responsible to see that such periodic reviews are carried out for all
  Executive Officers and staff, that such reviews are based upon sufficient
  facts and consultations, and that the scope, findings and recommendations of such reviews are appropriate. Persons nominated or employed by
  the Board of Directors as Executive Officers and staff shall be informed
  of Conference practice with regard to review of job performance and content and professional support status.

The City Missionary Society has been the social service arm of Congregational churches in Metropolitan Boston since 1816. It now has an important place in the life of the Metropolitan Boston Association, whose constitution refers to the Society as "a recognized instrumentality of the Metropolitan Boston Association." Committees of Metropolitan Boston Association and of City Missionary Society are working together on several programs.

CMS holds membership in the Family Service Section of the Greater Boston Community Council, the National Conference on Social Welfare, and the New England Camping Association.

Its nine missionary social workers are attached to Congregational churches in the inner city, and they work closely with public and private social agencies. The Society's social workers are aided by many volunteers who engage in numerous useful services of visitation, teaching, manual labor, etc. A Voluntary Case-Aide Program has 30 dedicated volunteers from Roxbury and from several suburban communities, assisting relocated multi-problem families.

Through the Friendly Town Program 425 children spent a two week vacation in the homes of host families in suburban, small town, or rural areas. Through this program city and suburban or rural families gain a better understanding of each other.

The Society's summer camping programs provide meaningful activity for children of all ages and for adult members of low-income families. Camps Andover-Waldron on Lake Winnisquam, in Meredith, N. H., are open to children 9-16 years of age. They provide opportunities for interracial and intercultural contacts in a Christian setting. Family Camps and weekend retreats for church groups are held under sponsorship of CMS at the Farrington Memorial property in Lincoln, Mass.

CMS receives no income from United Funds. Principal support comes from Congregational Churches in Metropolitan Boston, from interested indi-

viduals and trust funds, and from endowment. Much aid in relief comes from the Howard Benevolent Society. Many churches and Sunday Schools regularly aid with collections of clothing, furniture, Christmas gifts, and special funds.

The Society's income in the fiscal year ending October 31, 1968 was \$317,425.00 (this amount included legacies of \$65,057.00, some of which were for limited use). Churches in the Metropolitan Boston Association and other churches in Massachusetts contributed \$55,918.00. The operating deficit in 1968 was \$46,922.00.

City Missionary Society was incorporated in 1820. Its corporate members are elected at the annual meeting, held in November each year. Every supporting congregation is entitled to nominate a representative to serve a two year term on the corporation.

## THE CONGREGATIONAL LIBRARY OF THE AMERICAN CONGREGATIONAL ASSOCIATION

(Proprietor of the Congregational House)

The Congregational Library was founded in 1853 to gather and preserve books, pamphlets and manuscripts on Congregational history and to promote the general interests of Congregational churches. In addition to the historic collection on Congregationalism the library has important collections of Bibles, in a variety of languages and versions, hymnals, and histories of local churches and towns. New books, with the exception of fiction, are purchased every week in the fields of: preaching and pastoral work, philosophy and theology, Biblical commentary, church history, religious education, worship and devotion, missions and the ecumenical movement, church arts and architecture, denominations, sects, and world religions, social problems, and biography.

These resources, approximately 200,000 books and pamphlets, are available to ministers, lay preachers, church officers, church school teachers, students, and all interested in reading for enrichment of life. Books are mailed without charge to all parts of the United States. A letter or postcard giving author, title or the subject of books desired, will receive prompt attention. The Library is open for study and research Monday through Friday, 9-5. A copy of a leaflet, "The Congregational Library" and the Bulletin will be sent to those writing for further information.

### GRANTS FROM THE MASSACHUSETTS CONFERENCE OF THE UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST

Grants for the aid of churches and certain other types of work are made by the Conference through the Board of Directors, following recommendation by the Committee on Church and Mission.

Grants are made to local churches (to strengthen the ministry of the church); to hospital chaplaincies; to the Ecumenical Center in Roxbury; to other interdenominational projects in Massachusetts; and other work as need arises. In co-operation with the Committee on Education grants are made for student work through the United Ministries in Higher Education.

Requests for grants come to the Committee on Church and Mission through the member of the Conference executive staff who is particularly concerned either with the area or the type of work.

Grants to local churches are made under the following circumstances:

- 1. Where a community is too far from a church to benefit from its privileges. the Conference encourages the establishment of regular religious services, and, if possible, the organization of a church, or a branch of a neighboring church.
- 2. Applications by a church for financial aid should be made by the vote of the church, and upon forms furnished by the Conference, and should have the approval of the Advisory or Grants Committee of the local association of churches.
- 3. Churches applying for aid should show that they have met in full all financial obligations to their ministers and are doing their utmost toward self-support.
- 4. In granting aid, different amounts will be appropriated according to the necessity, importance, and prospects of each field.
- 5. Every church aided by the Conference should consult the Area Minister or President before making arrangements for pastoral service.
- 6. When the service of the minister or other worker, for whose support an appropriation is made, shall terminate, the appropriation shall lapse, except under special circumstances.

The Conference advocates adequate compensation for every minister and church worker and has approved a salary scale.

The Conference favors hearty co-operation with other denominations, the avoidance of overlapping and competing work, and the consolidation or federation of churches of different denominations in over-churched communities.

We are indicating in this copy of the Minutes the churches that received conference grants in the year 1968 by placing the reference "\$" before the names of these churches in the section of the Minutes entitled, "Associations of Churches and Ministerial Standing." In cases where the grant was discontinued during the year the letter "d" appears.

All grants coincide with the calendar year. Applications must be processed through the association grants committee and presented to the Committee on Church and Mission through the area minister by May 1.

#### STATISTICAL TABLES

#### EXPLANATORY

#### The tables which follow comprise:

- 1. The statistics of the churches, giving the ministers, church membership, additions, removals, Sunday school membership, and the amount of benevolences and expenses. These tables, in accordance with the vote of the Conference in 1887, are made to conform to those in the National Year Book;
  - 2. The Associations of Churches, with the names of officers;
- 3. The Ministerial Standing, giving the date of ordination of each minister, the date of membership in the Association, the residence and his "employment";
  - 4. The Ministerial Record, containing lists of ordinations and deaths.

The tables of the first part contain the names of all the Congregational and United Church of Christ churches in Massachusetts, the towns and cities being arranged alphabetically. This is not a postal guide. It is a listing of the location of the church for the convenience of persons seeking to find the church. The first name in the list of churches is the name of the town or city in which the church is located; then follows the name of the church and directions for locating the church.

Church members are reported as numbered January 1, 1969. Admissions and removals cover the year 1968. "Sunday School" includes total membership of officers, teachers and scholars January 1, 1969, or when the school is in operation (if not at that date), covering "branch schools," "mission schools," and "home departments," so far as maintained by the reporting church.

The months and days in the dates of the organization of churches are omitted. They will be found in the publications of 1873, those of churches since organized being given in the "Minutes" of each year. Months and days in the dates of ordination of Congregational and United Church of Christ ministers may be found in the lists of the local associations which follow the tables.

Figures pertaining to Church School enrollment, contributions to home expenses are usually for all the churches grouped together in the federated church.


