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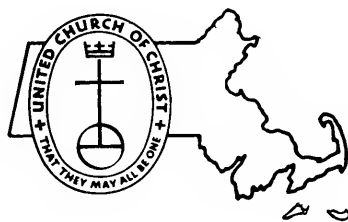

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BYLAWS OF THE
MASSACHUSETTS CONFERENCE OF THE
UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST

ARTICLE I

Purpose and Terminology

1. The purpose of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ as stated in its charter (1799) is "diffusing the knowledge of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. . . and in concert with other ecclesiastical bodies for the general increase of Christian union and spiritual efficiency and the advancement of Christ's Kingdom on earth."

2. Whenever in these Bylaws the word Conference is used it shall be held to refer to the Corporation as a Conference of the United Church of Christ and as a Conference of Massachusetts Congregational Christian Churches.

3. All Churches which are members of Associations in voluntary fellowship with and recognized by the Conference, whether or not such Churches are a part of the United Church of Christ, are entitled to elect voting members of the Conference in accordance with these Bylaws.

4. Whenever in these Bylaws the word "Area" is used, it shall be held to refer to those Associations or combinations of the Associations decided upon by the agreement of the respective Associations and recognized by the Conference.

ARTICLE II

Denominational Basis

Following Congregational principles, this Conference shall under no circumstances exercise authority over Churches or individuals or interfere with the government or discipline of the Churches. It shall advise and counsel the Churches when requested, but it is recognized that each Church has the power of self-determination in all matters.

ARTICLE III

Doctrinal Basis

This Conference declares its steadfast allegiance to the faith which our forebears confessed, which, from age to age, has found its expression in the historic creeds of the Church Universal and of this Communion.

ARTICLE IV

Conference Meetings

1. Stated Meetings. In each year the Conference shall convene its Annual Meeting within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts within the period from April fifteenth through June fifteenth, as the Board of Directors may deem expedient to elect Officers, Executive Officers, Committees, Councils, and a Board of Directors for full or unexpired terms, as the case may be, the hearing of reports, to determine the annual rate of Fellowship Dues to be proposed to the Churches, to act on the recommendation of the Board of Directors concerning the amount or proportion to be retained from Our Christian World Mission giving of the Churches, to adopt a budget for the following fiscal year, and to transact any other business.

2. Special Meetings.

a. Special meetings of the Conference may be convened by the Board of Directors, at such times and places within the Commonwealth as may be determined by the Board, provided, however, that notice of any special meeting and the purposes thereof shall, at least three weeks before the date of the meeting, be sent by mail to each of the Churches entitled to send delegates to the meeting, posted in the general office of the Conference and printed in newspapers published in Boston, Worcester and Springfield.

b. A special meeting of the Conference shall be convened by the Board of Directors upon receipt by the office of the Secretary of the Conference or Chairperson of Board of Directors of a written petition stating the proposed purposes, and signed by not less than one hundred persons who shall be voting members of the Conference as defined and who shall represent at least fifty Churches, within sixty days of the receipt of such petition unless an already scheduled meeting of the Conference will be held within ninety days.

c. No action shall be taken on any item of business not specified in the notice of the meeting.

3. Call to Order. The Moderator or in his absence the Vice Moderator, shall call the meeting to order and preside. In the absence of both of them, a member of the Board of Directors shall call the meeting to order and conduct the election of a Moderator Pro-tempore.

4. Budget. Not later than one month prior to the meeting of the Conference at which the budget will be presented for approval, there shall be mailed to each Church entitled to send delegates to the meeting sufficient copies of the budget and of the Treasurer's report to provide one copy for each minister and for each delegate to which the Church is entitled. Changes in the budget, either increases or decreases, (except hereafter noted) shall not be considered on the floor of the Conference Meeting unless a written proposal has been filed with the Office of the Treasurer at least ten days prior to the meeting. However, any increases or decreases in the budget may be proposed on the floor of the Conference meeting without advance notice provided 2/3 of the delegates vote to consider the proposal. The rate of Fellowship Dues and the proportion to be retained from Our Christian World Mission shall be voted at the Annual Meeting, and may not be changed by a subsequent meeting in any given year.

5. Quorum. At all meetings of the Conference a quorum shall consist of 200 voting members.

ARTICLE V

Conference Meeting Membership

Voting Members. The voting membership of a Conference Meeting shall consist of

- a. the following representatives from each Church or Congregation which is a member of an Association in fellowship with the Conference:
 - (1) two delegates chosen by and from each such Church or Congregation to serve at its pleasure; and one additional delegate chosen by and from each such Church or Congregation to serve at its pleasure for every three hundred members, or major fraction thereof in excess of a multiple of three hundred, as determined by the number of its members as of December 31 of the year immediately preceding; (Churches are urged, in conformity with the spirit of actions taken by the General Synod, to choose delegates from all areas of interest, in order to have a lay delegate body with equal representation of men and women, representation of minority groups, and with a goal of 20% of all lay delegates under 30 years of age.)
 - (2) the pastor or pastors, including lay pastors, of each such Church or Congregation, provided such pastor shall have standing in an Association in fellowship with the Conference; and
 - (3) the Christian Education Director or Directors of each such Church or Congregation, provided such director holds United Church of Christ certification.
 - (4) the other ordained persons who are members in each such Church or Congregation and who have standing in an Association in fellowship with the Conference.
 - (5) Commissioned Workers who have standing in an Association in fellowship with the Conference.
 - b. the Officers and Executive Officers of the Conference, including any person who shall have been elected an Officer Emeritus;
 - c. the members of the Board of Directors;
 - d. the members of the Conference Committees and Councils;
 - e. the members of the professional staff of the Conference, as such staff may be determined by the Board of Directors; and
2. Honorary Members. The honorary membership of a Conference Meeting, with privilege of speaking but without privilege of voting, shall consist of:
- a. the delegates from corresponding bodies;
 - b. the persons appointed to speak before the Conference;
 - c. the persons who may be made honorary members by a vote of the Board of Directors;
 - d. such other persons as may be made honorary members by a vote of the Conference.

ARTICLE VI

Officers and Staff

1. As Officers of the Conference, there shall be a Moderator and a Vice Moderator who shall be elected by ballot at each Annual Meeting of the Conference for a term of one year or until their successors are chosen. The Moderator or, in the absence of the Moderator, the Vice Moderator, shall preside over the meetings of the Conference.

2. The Conference Executive Officers shall be a President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and such other Executive Officers as the Conference may from time to time elect. Any of the said Executive Offices, except those of President, Secretary, and Treasurer, may be abolished by vote of the Conference. The Board of Directors shall make nominations for Conference Executive Officers for terms of one year. Elections shall take place by ballot at each Annual Meeting. Those elected shall hold office to the end of their term or until their respective successors are chosen. They shall bear such additional titles as the Conference or the Board of Directors may determine.

- a. The President shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Conference and shall, subject to the direction of the Conference and of its Board of Directors, have general charge of its mission and of its activities. The President shall be a member ex officio of all standing committees named in the Bylaws and shall have the power to delegate to members of the staff the authority to represent the office upon any of the said standing committees. The President shall be the representative of the Conference and its Board of Directors among all the churches (both those financially independent and those aided by the Conference), and in all denominational and interdenominational gatherings (including meetings of the Conference Executives), unless representation is otherwise provided by the Conference President or the Board of Directors. The President may seek to assist pastors and churches with counsel and shall be kept informed as to opportunities for extension work through founding new churches or strengthening old ones, and shall recommend to the Conference and to the Board of Directors measures for meeting such opportunities.
- b. The Secretary shall keep the records of the Conference. The Secretary shall perform the duties incident to the office and such other duties as may be assigned to the office by the Board of Directors or the President. The Secretary shall have the custody of the records; the seal of the Conference; and of all bonds given by the Treasurer as hereinafter provided; and shall furnish copies of the records certified under the seal of the Conference to such persons as may be entitled thereto.
- c. The Treasurer shall receive and hold the property of the Conference subject to the direction of the Board of Directors and shall keep particular accounts of the Conference funds and of the disposal thereof. The Treasurer shall, under the direction of the President, assist in the general work of the Conference and shall perform such other duties as may be assigned by the Board of Directors. The Treasurer shall make a report at each Annual Meeting and shall make such other reports as the Conference or the Board of Directors may from time to time require.

The Treasurer shall receive all contributions sent to the Conference by churches and by individuals, and shall disburse the same in accordance with the instructions of the donors. The Treasurer shall give such bonds as may from time to time be required by the Board of Directors. Any Assistant Treasurer shall perform such duties as may be assigned by the Treasurer, or by the President in the absence or incapacity of the Treasurer.

3. Area Ministers. The Conference may, from time to time, employ such staff as is deemed necessary to fulfill pastoral and fellowship functions and purposes within the Conference in the established Areas of the Conference. The staff shall give counsel and leadership to the Churches and ministers in those Areas, and shall be employed by the Board of Directors in consultation with the President of the Conference, and in consultation with, or upon the recommendation of the Area Committee/Council involved, and/or in consultation with other appropriate parties.

4. Conference Program Staff and Administrative Staff. The Conference may, from time to time, employ such staff as is deemed necessary to fulfill the program purposes and administrative needs of the Conference. The staff shall be employed by the Board of Directors in consultation with the President of the Conference, and where applicable with such Committee/Council and parties as may seem appropriate to the function which said position is to fulfill.

5. Performance Evaluation, Job Review, Professional Support. The President shall present to the Board of Directors, for all Executive Officers and staff other than himself, periodic reviews of job performance, job content, and professional support status. The Board of Directors shall be responsible for seeing that such periodic reviews are carried out for all Executive Officers and staff, that such reviews are based upon sufficient facts and consultations, and that the scope, findings and recommendations of such reviews are appropriate. Persons nominated or employed by the Board of Directors as Executive Officers and staff shall be informed of Conference practice with regard to review of job performance and content and professional support status.

6. Retirement Age. The mandatory retirement date for any paid Executive Officer, or any member of the Executive Staff or General Staff shall be the Annual Meeting following his/her attaining age 70. However, the Board of Directors may temporarily employ, from time to time, any persons beyond age 70 when such temporary employment is deemed to be in the best interest of the Conference.

7. a. Retirement Annuities. The Conference expects every paid Officer, staff member, or other employee to be a member, as appropriate, of the Annuity Fund for Congregational Ministers or the Retirement Fund for Lay Workers and will pay the full normal annual premium to the Fund, except as otherwise specified in employee policies for General Staff. It will not provide any other retirement annuity.
- b. Employee Benefits. The Conference, as an employer, may provide such other employee benefits as the Board of Directors deems appropriate, and such programs, and the extent to which the Conference bears the expense, shall be reported in the Treasurer's annual report.

ARTICLE VII

Board of Directors

1. Organization

a. There shall be a Board of Directors consisting of:

- (1) One director elected by the Annual Meeting from each Association with additional members elected by the Annual Meeting so that no Area has fewer than three directors. Membership of the Board of Directors is to be distributed as equally as possible among men and women of the MACUCC and at least two-thirds of the members shall be lay persons. Efforts shall be made to have diversity in the membership in terms of race and age.
- (2) The President, Moderator, Vice Moderator, Chairperson of the Council for Local Church Life and Ministry, and Chairperson of the Council for Mission Outreach and Social Responsibility, *ex officio*.

b. The term of an elected director shall be four (4) years and no director, having served a full four-year term, shall be eligible for re-election for one(1) year. A director who moves from one Association to another shall be expected to resign from the Board of Directors at the close of the next Annual Meeting.

c. Nine members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum.

d. At its first meeting after each Annual Meeting of the Conference, the Board of Directors shall choose one of its members to serve as Chairperson and another member to serve as Vice Chairperson for the ensuing year. It shall also choose a Clerk to maintain a record of its proceedings.

2. General Powers. Subject to the provisions of Section 3 of this Article, the Board of Directors shall have and may exercise all of the powers of the Conference between meetings of the Conference, and actions taken shall be reported to the next Annual Meeting of the Conference.

3. Except as otherwise provided in the charter of the Conference or in these Bylaws, the Board of Directors shall administer and dispose of the property of the Conference and shall manage all of its business and affairs, subject to the following limitations:

- a. Corporate assets other than real property or tangible personal property which are not restricted as to use by the donor shall not be disbursed or granted between two consecutive Annual Meetings in an amount exceeding 20% of the value thereof at the previous year-end or \$250,000, whichever is greater, except as authorized or directed by a vote of the Conference.
- b. Title to real property with a market value of \$250,000 or more shall be encumbered, or conveyed in whole or in part, except as authorized or directed by a meeting of the Conference.

4. The Board of Directors:

- a. Shall have responsibility for policy formulation, program development, budget development, coordination between the functional Committees or Councils of the Conference, evaluation and planning.
- b. Shall employ staff and other agents in support of Conference activities and operations and define or approve the definition of their duties;

- c. Shall cause the accounts of the Treasurer to be audited at least once a year by certified public accountants selected by the Board;
- d. Shall provide direction for all Officers, Executive Officers, staff and agents of the Conference.

5. Without restricting the generality of the foregoing, the Board of Directors shall in particular have the following powers:

- a. To appoint its own meetings and form its own rules of business, to appoint Committees and delegate any of its powers to such Committees.
- b. To remove at pleasure any member of the staff, any employee or any agent of the Conference.
- c. To remove any Officer, Executive Officer or Director of the Conference who may be guilty of disregard of the duties of the office or of such conduct as shall be seriously prejudicial to the interests of the Conference.
- d. To fill any vacancy in any Office, Executive Office, Committee or Council of the Conference including vacancies in the membership of the Board until the succeeding Annual Meeting of the Conference.
- e. To direct efforts to promote missionary interest and giving among the Churches of the Conference.
- f. To direct efforts to promote ecumenical concerns, interests and relationships of the Conference.
- g. To direct efforts of evaluation and planning with respect to the program and activities of the Conference.
- h. To appoint one or more Directors to the functional Conference Committees and Councils as liaison between the Committees or Councils and the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII

Committees and Councils

1. The Moderator shall appoint from the membership of the Board of Directors and Program Committee a Business Committee for Conference Meetings. The Business Committee shall prepare the agenda for the business sessions, recommend changes therein during sessions, and appoint any necessary committees to expedite the business of the meeting.

The Moderator shall appoint a Committee on Credentials at least one week prior to the opening of any regular Conference Meeting.

2. There shall be a Program Committee to plan the program of each regular meeting and such other meetings of the Conference as the Board of Directors may request. The Committee shall consist of the Moderator and the Vice Moderator, plus twelve elected members. At each Annual Meeting, four members shall be elected by voice vote for three-year terms.

3. There shall be two Councils: the Council for Local Church Life and Ministry and the Council for Mission Outreach and Social Responsibility. Each shall have twenty-four (24) members with eight (8) elected each year for three-year terms. No person who has completed a three-year term on any council may be re-elected to that council until one year shall have elapsed. The membership of each council shall be drawn from each of the five geographical regions of the Conference, shall be drawn from different ages and races, and shall include at least forty percent (40%) of each gender and not less than one-half shall be laity.

The two councils shall function as program arms of the Conference. They shall be responsible for both research and development of program. The work of the councils shall be carried out by task forces appointed by the appropriate council.

The Council for Local Church Life and Ministry shall be responsible for programs fostering evangelism, education and our mutual ministry.

The Council for Mission Outreach and Social Responsibility shall develop and relate to specific mission and social action tasks.

4. There shall be a Nominating Committee consisting of eighteen members, with six elected by the Annual Meeting each year for three-year terms. No person who has completed a three-year term on the committee may be re-elected to that committee until one year has elapsed. The membership of the committee shall be drawn from different ages and races and shall include at least 40% of each gender. Not less than one-half shall be laypersons.

The Nominating Committee shall be concerned with the discovery and appropriate utilization of leadership within the Conference. This committee shall make nominations for the following offices and positions: Moderator, Vice Moderator, members of the Board of Directors, Program Committee, Councils and General Synod delegates. At the request of the Board of Directors, it shall also suggest nominees to fill any vacancies occurring between Annual Meetings. The Board of Directors shall nominate members of the Nominating Committee to be elected by the Annual Meeting.

5. All Committees and Councils are free to organize their work, to establish sub-committees for special assignments, and to co-opt other persons with special interest and skill as required. A person who is a member of any Committee or Council ex-officio shall be entitled to vote.

6. The reports of all Committees and Councils that are to be presented to the Conference Annual Meeting shall be furnished to the Secretary eight weeks before the Annual Meeting, and shall be printed and distributed to the Churches not less than four weeks before the Annual Meeting. These reports need not be read to the Conference Meeting but the Program Committee may arrange for the adequate discussion of any or all of the topics presented in the reports.

7. Such Committees, Councils, or other ad hoc groups as the Conference may vote to constitute or recognize shall be established by voice vote at each Annual Meeting for such terms as the Conference Meeting shall determine. The Board of Directors shall present at each Annual Meeting a list of Committees, Councils or other ad hoc groups, the appointment of which it recommends.

ARTICLE IX

Conditions of Office

1. Qualifications. Each Officer, Executive Officer, Director, Committee member or Council member may serve only while a member in a Church or Congregation eligible to send delegates to the Conference Meeting.

2. **Beginning of Term.** The terms of Officers, Executive Officers, Directors or Members of a Committee or Council of the Conference shall begin at the close of the meeting at which they are elected; however, in the event a meeting is recessed for more than one month following election, the terms of those elected shall commence at the close of the session in which the recess was declared.

3. **Unexpired Term.** Any person elected at an Annual Meeting of the Conference to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of that vacancy.

4. **Automatic Resignation.** Any person elected to the Board of Directors or any Committee or Council of the Conference who shall fail to attend two consecutive regular meetings thereof without an explanation of absence, or fail to attend three consecutive meetings for any reason, shall be considered to have resigned. Whoever is nominated to the Board of Directors or any Committee or Council of the Conference on the basis of residency in one of the five Areas of the state shall be considered to have resigned if during the term of office the person moves to a different Area of the state or moves from the state. It will be the responsibility of the Board of Directors, Committee, or Council involved to determine whether to accept a resignation.

ARTICLE X

Relationships

1. As a Conference of the United Church of Christ, the Massachusetts Conference is a body of the United Church of Christ and is related to the General Synod as described in the Constitution and Bylaws of the United Church of Christ. It discharges those duties and provides those services set forth in its own charter and Bylaws and which are not inconsistent with the Constitution and Bylaws of the United Church of Christ.

2. Delegates of the Conference to the General Synod, as provided for in the Constitution and Bylaws of the United Church of Christ, shall be elected from the membership of the Churches in the Massachusetts Conference which are affiliated with the United Church of Christ, and such delegates shall be elected by voice vote at a meeting of the Conference.

ARTICLE XI

Board of Ministerial Aid

The Board of Ministerial Aid shall be the agent of the Conference in the work of aiding needy ministers and their families and shall make an annual report to the Conference. On notice of a vacancy in the membership of the Board of Ministerial Aid, the Conference shall nominate a person to fill the vacancy.

ARTICLE XII

Boston Seaman's Friend Society

The Boston Seaman's Friend Society shall be the agent of the Conference in the work of promoting the spiritual and temporal welfare of seamen and shall make an annual report to the Conference. The Conference Meeting shall annually elect by voice vote five members, for a term of three (3) years each, to the Board of the Society.

ARTICLE XIII

Corporate Seal

The seal of the Conference shall consist of two or more concentric circles, with the words, "Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ" around the circumference between these circles and the words "Inc., 1808" within the inner circle.

ARTICLE XIV

Special Orders

1. All matters of business presented to the Conference Meeting shall be referred to the Business Committee unless referred to some other Committee or Council by special vote of the Conference.

2. All matters of business referred to the Business Committee shall be reported for action before the final adjournment of the meeting.

3. There shall be a "Revolving Fund for Cash Flow" designated to the purpose of providing cash at times of low flow during a given year.

- a. The limit of the Fund will be determined from time to time by the Board of Directors.
- b. The sources of capital will be from unrestricted monies designated to the Fund by the Board of Directors or from special gifts restricted to the purpose of the Fund, with the distinction between the two preserved.
- c. The cash of the fund may be borrowed by action of the Conference executive officers for the specific purpose with the expectation that it can and will be returned to the Fund within the calendar year of use. In the event that this is not possible due to unforeseen circumstances, there will be no borrowing from the Fund during the succeeding calendar year until outstanding borrowing has been repaid.
- d. At no time will the Fund be used as collateral for other loans.
- e. No interest will be paid to the Fund for the use of its cash.
- f. Unrestricted monies placed in the Fund may be withdrawn only by vote of the Conference Meeting.
- g. The Fund shall be invested in a manner appropriate for its purposes, as determined by the Board of Directors. Income earned shall be administered as unrestricted receipts from invested income.

ARTICLE XV

Rules of Order

All proceedings of the Conference Meeting shall be governed by the latest revised edition of Robert's Rules of Order, and, unless otherwise required thereby or by these Bylaws, action of the Conference shall be by the majority vote of voting members present.

ARTICLE XVI

Amendments

1. These Bylaws except Article II and III, may be amended at any Annual Meeting, or other meeting, of the Conference by a two-thirds vote, provided the amendment is recommended by the Board of Directors or was proposed at a previous Conference Meeting. Any amendment to the Bylaws must be received by the Churches and delegates at least 30 days prior to the Conference Meeting at which the amendment will be considered.

2. Articles II and III may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any Annual Meeting, but only after the proposed amendment has been submitted to the Conference in writing at a previous Annual Conference Meeting and notice has been sent to each of the Churches entitled to send delegates at least three months prior to the Conference Meeting at which action is to be taken.

MINUTES OF THE 185th ANNUAL MEETING
of the
MASSACHUSETTS CONFERENCE OF THE UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST
June 15, 16, 17, 1984
South Hadley, Massachusetts

The 185th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ began at 1:00 p.m. on Friday, June 15, 1984, at Mount Holyoke College, South Hadley, Massachusetts, with an opening worship in Abbey Chapel, with the Rev. Mr. Donald Overlock, Western Area Minister, giving the sermon. The theme of the meeting was "Waking Up to God's Age: Education for Transformation."

The first plenary session was called to order at 2:30 p.m. in Woolley Hall by the Moderator, Mrs. Carole Duhamel. The Moderator announced her appointment of the Business Committee, in accordance with the bylaws, consisting of Mrs. Susan Dickerman, the Rev. Ms. Carole Baker, Ms. Patricia Hovey, chair, Mr. Albert Horton, Ms. Mary Tuttle, and the Rev. Mr. John Williams. The Moderator announced her appointment of the Credentials Committee consisting of Mr. Edmond Steele and Ms. Mary Tuttle. Ms. Tuttle presented the report of advance registrations as follows: 260 clergy, 490 delegates, 95 visitors, and 90 others, making a total of 935.

The Moderator declared a quorum present. The Moderator announced her appointment of the ushers as tellers, and noted that they were being coordinated again this year by the Rev. Dr. and Mrs. Donald Simpson.

The Moderator introduced the Vice Moderator, the Rev. Dr. Eric Bascom; the Parliamentarian, Mr. Richard Osterberg, Esq.; the Recorder, Mrs. Florence Hand; and the Rev. Ms. Carole Baker of the Board of Directors.

The Moderator called on the Chair of the Program Committee, Susan Dickerman, who reviewed the highlights of the Proposed Standing Rules. It was moved, seconded and voted to amend the Proposed Standing Rules by deleting 4B and 5. (It was previously voted to leave in 4A.) It was moved, seconded and voted that:

The Moderator called on Susan Dickerman to present the Proposed Order of Time and Events. She expressed the hope of the Program and Worship Committees that the meeting would end with the 11:30 a.m. worship service Sunday. It was moved, seconded and voted that:

The Moderator introduced the Rev. Dr. Alfred E. Williams, Minister and President, who introduced the following honorary delegates and it was moved, seconded and voted that:

The Moderator called attention to the statistical report of the Conference Secretary, Mrs. Marion Vuilleumier, which was printed in the delegate advance materials, and mentioned that Mrs. Vuilleumier would be unable to attend the meeting until the next day.

Mr. Gordon Thorp, Treasurer, who was introduced by the Moderator, gave his report. Patricia Hovey, Chair of the Board of Directors, gave a report for the Board which included an audio-visual presentation of the work of the Conference. This was followed by a talk by Dr. Williams who spoke of the work on racial and economic justice being done in the Conference.

The Moderator introduced the Rev. Mr. Stephen Wayles of Brockton, who led the meeting in singing.

The Moderator called on Mr. Merrill Ewing, Chair of the Finance Committee of the Board of Directors, who gave a presentation of the 1985 budget and announced that there would be a hearing on the budget that evening, with opportunities for questions.

The Rev. Mr. Walter Davis, Chair of the Nominating Committee, was introduced by the Moderator. He presented the slate of nominees for Conference officers; members of the Board of Directors, the Program Committee and the two Councils, and General Synod delegates and alternates, and invited any other nominations to be brought to the Nominating Committee table in the Marketplace. He also presented the slate of nominees for the Conference Nominating Committee and for the Board of Directors Nominating Committee.

The Moderator introduced the Rev. Mr. John Williams of the Program Committee who explained the resolutions process and reviewed the resolutions, recommendations, and information on hearings, noting the procedure for "late" resolutions.

The Guidelines for Clergy Compensation for 1985 were reviewed by Patricia Hovey. She also presented a Proposed Bylaw Change printed in the delegate advance materials, pointing out that Essex South Association and Essex North Association have merged and are now "Essex Association." It was moved, seconded and voted that:

BYLAW AMENDMENT 84-AM-4	The 185th Annual Meeting amends the Bylaw Article VII as printed. (The amendment is included in the Bylaws printed in this yearbook.)
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Dr. Williams presented recommendations regarding the 1984 budget, explaining a number of line items. Copies of a memorandum from Dr. Williams regarding present budget and program realities, and recommendations for 1985 and 1986, were passed out. Dr. Williams indicated all church members in our Conference need to look at our Conference aims and objectives closely and make tough decisions about them.

The Moderator called on the Rev. Ms. Lorain Giles, who introduced the Rev. Dr. Reuben Sheares, II, Executive Director of the Office for Church Life and Leadership, who gave theological reflections.

Following a number of "Pitches," the Moderator declared a recess until Saturday morning and noted that the evening would be spent in Area Meetings which would process the amendments on ministry to the UCC Constitution.

SATURDAY, JUNE 16

The plenary session was reconvened by the Moderator at 8:00 a.m. The meeting was led in song by Ms. Kathy Timpany, accompanied by Stephen Wayles on the piano. The Moderator called on Ms. Faith Johnson, Secretary for Family Life and Women's Issues of the Board for Homeland Ministries, who gave the opening prayer.

Following participation by several persons during "Speak Out," the Moderator called on John Williams who requested reports on resolution hearings by each manager. Various minor changes made by delegates at the hearings were accepted by the meeting and appear in the final copies of resolutions attached to these minutes. Mr. Williams then asked the delegates to complete their polls of the order in which the resolutions would be considered, and he announced there would be an additional resolution on affirmative action to come before the meeting, as allowed by the Business Committee, and it would be the last resolution considered.

The Moderator called on Dr. Alfred Williams, who spoke of the work of the staff of the MACUCC, called attention to the gray sheets in the delegate packets entitled "Personnel Chart of the MACUCC," and introduced members of the staff.

The Rev. Ms. Susan Savell led the meeting in song, accompanied by Kathy Timpany.

Dr. Williams then addressed the meeting, calling the Holy Spirit the "schoolmaster in educating for transformation" and stressing the importance of naming the name of the Holy Spirit in our midst so that we do not disempower ourselves and give the impression God is not present and that no more educational and transformational work remains to be done.

The meeting was again led in song by Susan Savell, accompanied by Kathy Timpany.

The Moderator called on Merrill Ewing for consideration of the 1985 budget, and it was moved, seconded and voted that:

The Moderator then introduced Susan Dickerman, Chair of the Program Committee for the Annual Meeting, who spoke on the theme "Education for Transformation."

Patricia Hovey presented the Board of Directors' recommendation on "Guidelines for Clergy Compensation 1985" and it was moved, seconded and voted that:

The Moderator called on Dr. Williams who introduced the following 50-year ordinands: Ross Cannon, Howard Horn, Gordon Kenison and Gifford Towle. They were presented with sterling silver UCC logo pins from the Conference, and Dr. Williams announced a special luncheon for them.

Dr. Williams presented the following persons who have recently been ordained: Patricia Coughlin, Susan Harlow, Karen Jones, Ross Lilley and Dudley Rose.

The Moderator called upon Reuben Sheares who gave theological reflections.

Ms. Marnie Warner of the Program Committee was introduced by the Moderator, and she explained the seminars.

Following announcements, the Moderator declared a recess until afternoon.

The plenary session was called to order by the Moderator at 3:30 p.m. Saturday. She called on John Williams to announce the results of the resolutions poll, and it was voted to take up the resolutions in the order determined by the poll.

The Moderator called on Walter Davis who presented new nominations and it was voted that nominations be closed.

Mrs. Mitzi Hill was called on by the Moderator to introduce Dr. Thomas H. Groome of the Institute of Religious Education and Pastoral Ministry at Boston College, who delivered an address entitled "The Church: Educator for Transformation?"

Kathy Timpany led in song, accompanied by Stephen Wayles.

The Rev. Theodore Walker of Brockton presented Moderator Carole Duhamel with a custom made UCC Moderator T-shirt.

The Moderator reviewed the Standing Rules pertaining to resolutions, and action on resolutions began.

It was voted to amend the "Resolution on U.S. Foreign and Military Policy in Central America," proposed by the Council For Mission Outreach and Social Responsibility, by striking "\$180 million" in line 2, and ending the first paragraph with the word "squads" in line 3; changing line 30 to add "and have been sent by the United Church Board for World Ministries and the Office for Church in Society under their auspices to Honduras and Nicaragua to fact find under the mandate for peace of General Synod XIV"; amend line 35 to insert after the word "government" the words "and all other external governments"; strike the word "all" in line 36; strike "as voted by the House of Representatives" in lines 43 and 44, and add to line 47 "for the Peace Movement in Nicaragua and our nation." It was moved, seconded and voted that:

A "Resolution on Calling on United Church of Christ Congregations to Declare Themselves Open and Affirming" was proposed by the Rev. Rose Ann Olmstead and spoken to by Ms. Suarez. It was voted to continue debate on this resolution following dinner.

There were theological reflections by Reuben Sheares, then a number of one-minute "Pitches." Following announcements by the Moderator, the session adjourned until after dinner.

The plenary session was called to order by the Moderator at 7:00 p.m. She turned the gavel over to Eric Bascom, Vice Moderator, who conducted the rest of the session. Following a number of "Speak Outs," the Moderator called on Susan Dickerman who reviewed the proposed amendments to the U.C.C. Constitution which were printed in the Annual Meeting edition of the Pilgrim State News. Following discussion, it was moved, seconded and voted that:

The Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ ratifies the Constitutional Amendments of paragraphs 3, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 31, 34, 36, 40 as adopted and recommended by the Fourteenth General Synod.

Attention then returned to further discussion on a "Resolution on Calling on United Church of Christ Congregations to Declare Themselves Open and Affirming," which had been discussed before dinner. Several proposed amendments were defeated, and it was moved, seconded and voted that:

The plenary session was called to order by the Moderator at 8:30 a.m., and began with singing led by the Rev. Mr. James O'Brien of Holliston, accompanied by Kathy Timpany. Gifford Towle, retired missionary and 50-year ordinand, led the meeting in prayer. Following several "Speak Outs," the Moderator introduced Mrs. Susan Ames of the Nominating Committee who presented the slate. The Recorder was instructed to cast a single ballot for the election of executive officers, officers, members of the Board, Councils and Committees and General Synod delegates and alternates.

A "Resolution on World Peace Tax", proposed by the Council for Mission Outreach and Social Responsibility, was presented by Ms. Beverly Smith, and it was moved, seconded and voted that:

It was voted to amend by inserting after "Shalom" in line 7, "/Salaam." It was moved, seconded and voted that:

Mr. Martin pointed out the following changes by the Council for Mission Outreach and Social Responsibility: lines 13-15 become lines 6-8 and the other numbers are moved down, so that the biblical texts are in the order in which they occur in the

Bible; the words "and justice" need to follow "peace" in line 1; all the words following "WHEREAS" in lines 26 and 27 need to be in the lower case; and the words "and justice issues" should be inserted after "peace" in line 32. These amendments were voted, and it was moved, seconded and voted that:

Amendments to begin the resolution with "WHEREAS five years..." and to add "to God" after "thanks" on line 14 on page two were accepted by the proposer, and it was moved, seconded and voted that:

The Moderator reminded the meeting of their voted wish not to cut down on resolution time and that they therefore would have to return following worship and lunch for a final plenary session to complete business. There were theological reflections by Reuben Sheares, and the Moderator declared a recess for a communion service at the chapel.

The meeting was reconvened at 2:00 p.m., and a quorum was declared. A "Resolution on Affirmation Action," proposed by some 24 proposers, was presented by Ms. Carol Downe, who called on Ms. Valerie Russell to speak to it. The following friendly amendment was agreed to by the proposers: on page 1, line 4) following the word "Discrimination" insert "and the Boston Area Office of the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission." It was moved, seconded and voted that:

The Moderator called on Susan Dickerman who thanked everyone who had worked on the Annual Meeting. Edmond Steele, Chair of the Credentials Committee, reported attendance as follows: 509 lay delegates, 272 clergy, 17 ex-officios, 102 visitors, and 81 others, for a total of 981 persons present at the meeting.

The Moderator called on Dr. Williams for closing words. He announced a gift for Ms. Duhamel, and she in turn presented a quilt she had made for the Conference, to be used in whatever way Ms. Rose Levonian, Associate For Conference Centers and Outdoor Ministries, chooses.

The Moderator turned the gavel over to Eric Bascom, Vice Moderator. All women planning to attend the National Women's Meeting in Milwaukee in July were asked to come forward, and Dr. Williams said a prayer for them.

Moderator Bascom then called on Susan Dickerman, who thanked all participants for their participation, and the meeting was adjourned at 3:15 p.m.

Appendix A - GUIDELINES FOR CLERGY COMPENSATION 1985

The 185th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ, concerned with the growth of its churches and the compensation of its ordained leaders, commends the effort of the local churches in endeavoring to reach the goals recommended in Guidelines for Clergy Compensation, 1984.

The 185th Annual Meeting recommends:

- (1) that churches not yet at the present minimum salary of \$14,500 continue working toward that minimum;
- (2) that churches at, or very close to, the present minimum work at improving C, D, E, and F below;
- (3) that churches already at or above the present minimum and also providing for C through F give a cost-of-living increase.

(PLEASE NOTE that these abbreviated guidelines are designed to be used in conjunction with Guidelines for Clergy Compensation booklet from the Conference office.)

A. CONSIDERATIONS FOR DETERMINING CLERGY COMPENSATION:

While the ministry is a unique profession requiring special patterns of financial compensation, several overall factors can be considered in determining the level of support for clergy. The total compensation package could justly be comparable to the median income of the parish and perhaps be on a par with that of the local high school principal, showing consideration for years of service and special skills and training and including annual cost-of-living increases.

B. CASH SALARY:

The cash salary (not including housing and other expenses) ought to be no less than \$14,500 for a full-time person in ordained ministry; less than \$14,500 would indicate a person called to part-time work.

C. SOCIAL SECURITY ALLOWANCE:

The church, as an employer, should provide an amount equal to at least one-half of the self-employment SS tax of 11.8%; such an allowance would be taxable income but would ease the burden of the big SS tax bite.

***D. HOUSING THAT PROVIDES:**

1. a furnishings allowance, all utilities, and an equity development plan for those living in a parsonage; OR
2. a housing allowance for those who want to rent or own their homes.

E. BENEFITS SHOULD INCLUDE:

1. a pension plan, with a church contribution of 14% of salary basis, which is (a) at least 130% of cash salary plus any furnishings allowance for those living in a parsonage, or (b) cash salary plus housing allowance for those with such allowance;
2. a family protection plan, including disability insurance, which is an additional 1% of pastor's salary basis;
3. group life insurance, which costs \$50 per year;
4. Medical and health insurance, plus dental care, as provided through the United Church of Christ (e.g., \$2544 in 1984 per family or \$1272 for single);
5. continuing education funding;
6. sabbatical leave plan;
7. holiday and vacation time;
8. maternity/paternity paid leave.

F. ALL PROFESSIONAL EXPENSES:

These expenses are the cost of "doing business" for the church and should be paid directly or fully reimbursed and not considered salary. Included are:

1. books, professional subscriptions;
2. professional memberships;
3. travel expenses and car allowance (church-owned car or travel reimbursement);
4. any other expenses incurred by the pastor and directly attributable to the exercise of ministry.

Appendix B - RESOLUTION ON U.S. FOREIGN AND MILITARY POLICY IN CENTRAL AMERICA

WHEREAS the current administration is requesting increased military aid to the government of El Salvador in spite of continuing brutal activities of right-wing death squads;

WHEREAS the Amnesty International has documented at least 3,000 killings of Indians by government forces in Guatemala and yet military aid continues to flow to that country;

WHEREAS the U.S. has significantly increased the amount of military aid to Honduras, has been building new military bases there, and has been conducting continuous joint military exercises on the Nicaraguan border;

WHEREAS the constant attacks and the threat of even wider hostilities have forced the Nicaraguan government and people to divert scarce material, human, and financial resources from the vital tasks of reconstruction and development to the buildup of the country's defense capabilities;

WHEREAS Costa Rica, in difficult financial straits, has accepted at least \$2 million for the training of its Civil Guard and is under increased pressure from the U.S. to become militarized;

WHEREAS the Latin American Council of Churches has urged the churches in the U.S. to oppose any form of Aggression against Nicaragua, and the assembly of Evangelical Churches of Nicaragua has specifically requested the support of churches in the U.S. to stop the escalation of hostilities against that nation;

WHEREAS members of the United Church of Christ in this Conference and throughout the country have participated in the Witness for Peace in Nicaragua and have been sent by the United Church Board for World Ministries and the Office for Church in Society under their auspices to Honduras and Nicaragua to fact find under the mandate for peace of General Synod XIV;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the 185th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ

1. calls upon the United States government and all other external governments to reverse their policies of seeking military solutions to the conflicts in Central America. Instead, we urge the United States government to utilize all diplomatic channels for peaceful negotiating and to allow self-determination in all Central American countries in pursuit of every opportunity to obtain just solutions to long-standing domestic problems;
2. asks individuals, congregations, and other bodies to call upon the United States government to cease all covert or overt activity designed to destabilize the government of Nicaragua;
3. supports the ongoing, non-violent, biblical, and prayerful Witness for Peace in Nicaragua for the Peace Movement in Nicaragua and our nation.
4. requests the Council for Mission Outreach and Social Responsibility to encourage the churches of the Massachusetts Conference to study these problems and communicate their concern to President Reagan and members of Congress;

5. requests that a copy of this resolution be sent by the Conference President, in addition to letters from individuals, to President Reagan, Secretary of State George Schultz, Senators, and the Massachusetts Congressional delegation.

Appendix C - RESOLUTION ON CALLING ON UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST
CONGREGATIONS TO DECLARE THEMSELVES OPEN AND AFFIRMING

WHEREAS the Apostle Paul has said that, as Christians, we are many members, but we are one body in Christ, and recognizing that lesbian and gay people are already members of the church of Christ through baptism and that these same persons have gifts of ministry and faith to offer the United Church of Christ; and

WHEREAS the United Church of Christ has historically affirmed a rich diversity in its theological and biblical perspectives and, as a free church, has encouraged freedom of individual response to the Gospel of Christ; and

WHEREAS the Tenth through the Fourteenth General Synods have adopted a number of resolutions affirming the civil rights of gay and bisexual people, encouraging the inclusion of gay and bisexual people on association church and ministry committees within the United Church of Christ, and addressing the concerns of same-gender oriented persons and their families within the United Church of Christ; and

WHEREAS the Executive Council of the United Church of Christ adopted in 1980 equal employment opportunity policy which does not discriminate against any employee or applicant because of sexual orientation; and

WHEREAS the United Church Coalition for Lesbian/Gay Concerns has urged the implementation of a process whereby United Church of Christ congregations adopt a statement of openness and affirmation of lesbian, gay and bisexual persons in the life and mission of the local congregations:

THEFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the 185th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ calls upon all Massachusetts UCC congregations to adopt a statement of openness and affirmation of gay, lesbian and bisexually oriented people who seek to lead Christian lives such as statements adopted by the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) "More Light" churches and Lutheran Church in America "reconciled in Christ" churches; the UCC congregations may adopt the following statement or write one of their own:

AFFIRMATION OF OPENNESS AND WELCOME

We know, with Paul, that, as Christians, we are many members, but we are one body in Christ, and members of one another. With Jesus, we affirm that we are called to love our neighbors as ourselves and that we are called to act as agents of reconciliation and wholeness within the world and within the church itself.

continued

We know that lesbian, gay, and bisexual persons are often scorned by the church and devalued and discriminated against both in the church and in society. We wish to witness to our caring and concern for our gay, lesbian, and bisexually oriented brothers and sisters in Christ by affirming the following:

--That we believe that lesbian, gay, and bisexually oriented people share with all others the worth that comes from being unique individuals created by God;

--That gay, lesbian, and bisexual persons are welcome as members and participants in this congregation through the same affirmation of membership as is made by all other members of this church;

--That we expect to celebrate and use the gifts, talents, and resources of our gay, lesbian, and bisexual members as we use and celebrate the gifts, talents and resources of all our members to build a church which is faithful to the mandate of God and working to bring about the fullness of God's reign;

--That we welcome gay, lesbian, and bisexual members to participate fully in the life, leadership and employment of this church.

and:

FURTHER urges all Massachusetts UCC congregations to initiate immediately an education process that would be helpful in enabling lesbian, gay, and bisexual Christians to find all churches a home in which they would be truly welcomed; and

FURTHER calls upon the Massachusetts Conference of the UCC to provide and promote educational resources which local churches may use in seeking to become churches which will be welcome homes for gay, lesbian, and bisexual Christians; and

FURTHER calls upon all Massachusetts UCC congregations to adopt a non-discrimination employment policy covering lesbian, gay, and bisexual seminarians, clergy, other church professionals, and support staff persons.

Appendix D - RESOLUTION ON WORLD PEACE TAX

WHEREAS Jesus Christ told the apostle in the garden to put away his sword;

WHEREAS we are called to be peacemakers and commanded to love God and our neighbors;

WHEREAS preparations for war in the nuclear age not only threaten combatants in a military situation but pose a clear and present danger to innocent civilians, to the natural environment, and to all of God's creation, which is our greatest gift and for which we have been charged with responsibility as stewards of the Earth;

WHEREAS many people of faith are engaging in war tax resistance as a moral alternative to payment for war preparations, General Synod 14 voted to support those who choose to protest war and preparations for war by non-payment of taxes, and the Massachusetts Conference Board of Directors has endorsed the Synod resolution;

WHEREAS the UCC has stood in support of conscientious objectors and those who oppose military service, resisting the draft as a matter of faith;

WHEREAS the World Peace Tax Fund would offer a legal alternative to non-payment of taxes for those who feel they cannot participate in war and preparations for war, just as conscientious objection provides an alternative to those who are unwilling to take up the sword;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the 185th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ go on record as supporting legislation which would create a World Peace Tax Fund and, through the Council for Mission Outreach and Social Responsibility,

1. advise MACUCC churches and their members that war tax resistance is now an act of civil disobedience as well as a matter of conscientious objection but stands as a concrete method of protest to taxation for war;
2. provide information to churches on proposed World Peace Tax Fund as a legal alternative to war tax resistance;
3. encourage individuals, congregations, and organizations associated with the Massachusetts Conference to contact their legislators to cosponsor and support the WPTF legislature proposal.

WHEREAS, the 184th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference and the XIV General Synod of the United Church of Christ recognized that economic issues are closely related to issues of justice, peace and international security and "opposed the identification of the peace issue with primarily white communities and the justice issue primarily with the Third World and "minority" communities and insists that these two goals not compete with each other in the life of the church but rather be pursued in harmony."

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the 185th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ affirms the above stated positions and our desire that Peace with Economic Justice be the priority of the United Church of Christ for the biennium 1985-1989.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that local UCC churches in Massachusetts be encouraged to affirm this priority in the General Synod testing and selection process and in the life of their churches.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Minister and President of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ communicate this action to the Executive Council of the United Church of Christ.

Appendix G - RESOLUTION ON LATINO STAFF FOR THE MACUCC

WHEREAS the 182nd Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ referred the resolution of the Latino Ministries Task Force which called for the establishment of a full-time Latino Conference Staff person to the Massachusetts Conference Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS no full-time position in Latino concerns has been created by the Massachusetts Conference of the UCC; and

WHEREAS we are called as the people of God to baptize, serve and welcome all persons to the fellowship and church of Jesus Christ; and

WHEREAS 200,000 Latinos live in Massachusetts, 45% of whom are under the age of nineteen, and with their population growing; and

WHEREAS our life in Massachusetts is characterized by richness of cultural diversity and experience, and as the Massachusetts Conference of the UCC, we wish to enhance our intercultural relationships; and

WHEREAS there is evidence of significant unmet religious need among Latino people in Massachusetts, and the United Church of Christ offers a ministry for Latinos who are seeking a spiritually strong church combined with a social action concern; and

WHEREAS transition in urban neighborhoods provides unique opportunities to respond to the spiritual and community needs of new constituency and thereby revitalize our urban churches through a ministry which is meaningful to the people who live in the neighborhoods where they are located; and

WHEREAS there is a need to strengthen and develop a Massachusetts Latino church in program network to address church, state, national and international issues of concern to Latino people and the whole church; and

WHEREAS there is a continuing need for the Massachusetts Conference to speak for social justice for Latinos in churches, communities and government regarding issues of services, education, jobs, policy and funding of resources; and

WHEREAS the realities of peace and national self-determination in the Caribbean, Central America and South America are of major concern to us;

THEREFORE BE IT RECOMMENDED by the 185th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference to the Board of Directors of the Massachusetts Conference to meet these challenges by establishing a full-time conference-level program staff position in Latino ministry whose responsibilities would include:

1. Developing support with the two existing Latino UCC churches in Massachusetts.

2. Aiding urban communities in Massachusetts in establishing new Latino congregations through NICD and other resources and methods culturally appropriate to Latino community groups.
3. Offering support and participation with UCC-related Latino agencies and organizations.
4. Encouraging seminary recruitment of Latino candidates for ordained and lay church and community leadership.
5. Encouraging inter-cultural conversation, theological understanding and mission cooperation with English-speaking people in our churches and communities.
6. Developing and strengthening the ecumenical fellowship throughout Massachusetts to deal with Latino-related issues and concerns.

Appendix H - RESOLUTION TO CELEBRATE THE SUCCESS OF THE NESTLE BOYCOTT

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven...

a time to kill, and a time to heal;
 a time to break down, and a time to build up;
 a time to weep, and a time to laugh;
 a time to mourn, and a time to dance..."

Ecclesiastes 3:1, 3-4

WHEREAS five years ago, the Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ endorsed the Nestle Boycott, urging members of the Conference to participate in consumer action to persuade the Nestle Company to alter its promotion of infant formula in the Third World, the Conference was instrumental in obtaining the endorsement of General Synod 12 of that year. Three years ago, the Conference celebrated the adoption of the International Code of Marketing of Breastmilk Substitutes passed by the World Health Assembly in Geneva. Throughout the time of endorsement, the members and churches of the Conference, supported by the Hunger Task Force, have been steadfast in their commitment to the cause until measurable changes in company behavior could be documented.

When the boycott began, mothers and children of the Third World were objects of unethical marketing practices of Nestle, including mass media advertising, use of 'milk nurses', distribution of free samples, and inappropriate pressure on medical personnel and institutions. As the boycott gained strength, announced policies of Nestle were changed. Gradually, changes were made in practices. With the WHO Code in place as an international standard, we have seen measurable progress toward our goal.

On January 25, 1984, Carl Angst, chief executive officer of Nestle, and the International Nestle Boycott Committee, signed an agreement that resolved the remaining differences between the boycott coalition and the company. The boycott was immediately suspended for a six-month evaluation period while careful monitoring of company progress proceeded. Reliable information indicates Nestle's good faith in abiding by the agreement.

What has been accomplished is significant. A major transnational company has made substantial changes in marketing practices. An international precedent has been established for regulating international business. A new international model for transnational organizing has been tested and found successful. This is cause for celebration.

But more important, a link has been forged between the people of the privileged, affluent developed world and the people of the developing world. We have established a relationship that in this instance replaces the impersonal oppressive economic ties established by Western corporations. That human link heightens our sensibilities so that our economic behavior cannot be as unconscious as in the past. The lives of the children we have helped to save depend on that increased awareness.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the 185th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ:

1. commends the perseverance displayed in the infant formula campaign that sustained the boycott until appropriate changes in Nestle practice were accomplished;
2. commends the Nestle Company for its leadership in adopting and implementing the provisions of the World Health Organization Code;
3. celebrates the possibility of new life that the changes in marketing practices represent;
4. gives thanks to God for the sustained commitment of the members and churches of the Conference in solidarity with our international partners;
5. recommends that the Hunger Task Force continue to monitor the infant formula industry for compliance with the World Health Organizationp Code.

Appendix I - RESOLUTION ON AFFIRMATIVE ACTION

"WHEREAS THE TWELFTH GENERAL SYNOD voted The Christian Imperative: The affirmative action imperative for Christians is embedded in the heart of the gospel. Our faith is one which seeks equitable treatment among all human beings but we know that humans both by overt and covert intentional and unintentional actions do act towards each other in discriminatory and even invidious un-Christian ways. However, the gospel is always clear identifying with the oppressed and affirming those who are discriminated against.

The Christian imperative to act affirmatively to insure equitable treatment and justice is inherent in our devotion to the scriptures and in our devotion to the example and life of Jesus. All Christians who would call out "Lord, Lord," must also act affirmatively to insure that all people who are recipients of God's grace and love are treated justly by their global brothers and sisters and by the institutions in our society."

AND WHEREAS the Twelfth General Synod also affirmed Affirmative Action and encouraged advocacy groups, legal strategies, and the filing of supportive briefs, amicus curiae in local and national cases in which affirmative action programs are at stake; and continued and expanded support for Project Equality, the church-related program that enables churches to use their purchasing power to support affirmative action and equal opportunity;

AND WHEREAS, the 183rd annual meeting of the Massachusetts Conference U.C.C. voted a Conference Imperative on Racism and Economic Justice;

AND WHEREAS, the Supreme Court of the United States of America by a vote of 6-3 on June 12, 1984 stated that seniority systems outweigh the goals of Affirmative Action when an employer makes layoffs;

AND WHEREAS, the Chief of the Justice Department's Civil Rights Division stated that "the decision went beyond seniority questions to rule out all court mandated preferential treatment of minorities and women in employment, except remedies for proven individual victims of discrimination."

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the 185th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ:

- 1) expresses our deep concern and dismay that the recent Supreme Court decision will result in increased unemployment of persons of color, women and persons with physical disabilities;
- 2) urges members of Congress to press immediately to create legislation which protects and supports those who have no seniority because of past discrimination against persons of color, women, and persons with physical disabilities generally;
- 3) urges members of Congress to abolish the present Civil Rights Commission forthwith, and re-establish an independent Civil Rights Commission which can express its autonomy from any administration;
- 4) urges the Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination and the Boston Area Office of the U.S. Equal Opportunity Commission to monitor the effect of this decision within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts on persons of color, women and persons with physical disabilities;
- 5) urges the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ to reaffirm our own commitment to the goals and objectives of affirmative action;
- 6) requests this resolution be communicated to appropriate persons in the Federal and State government.
