

MASSACHUSETTS CONFERENCE OF THE UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST

BYLAWS

ARTICLE I

PURPOSE AND TERMINOLOGY

- 1. The purpose of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ as stated in its charter (1799) is "diffusing the knowledge of the Gospel of Jesus Christ . . . and in concert with other ecclesiastical bodies for the general increase of Christian union and spiritual efficiency and the advancement of Christ's Kingdom on earth."
- Whenever in these Bylaws the word "Conference" is used, it shall be held to refer to the Corporation as a Conference of the United Church of Christ and as a Conference of Massachusetts Congregational Christian Churches.
- All churches which are members of Associations in voluntary fellowship with and recognized by the Conference, whether or not such churches are a part of the United Church of Christ, are entitled to elect voting members of the Conference in accordance with these Bylaws.
- 4. Whenever in these Bylaws the word "Area" is used, it shall be held to refer to those Associations or combinations of the Associations decided upon by the agreement of the respective Associations and recognized by the Conference.

ARTICLE II

DENOMINATIONAL BASIS

Following Congregational principles, this Conference shall under no circumstances exercise authority over churches or individuals or interfere with the government or discipline of the churches. It shall advise and counsel the churches when requested but it is recognized that each church has the power of self-determination in all matters.

ARTICLE III

DOCTRINAL BASIS

This Conference declares its steadfast allegiance to the faith which our forebears confessed, which, from age to age, has found its expression in the historic creeds of the Church Universal and of this Communion.

ARTICLE IV

CONFERENCE MEETINGS

1. Stated Meetings:

In each year the Conference shall convene its Annual Meeting within the Commonwealth of Massachusetts within the period from April 15 through June 15, as the Board of Directors may deem expedient to elect officers, executive officers, committees, councils, and a Board of Directors for full or unexpired terms, as the case may be; hear reports; determine the annual rate of Fellowship Dues to be proposed to the churches; act on the recommendation of the Board of Directors concerning the proportion to be retained from Our Church's Wider Mission giving of the churches; adopt a budget for the following fiscal year, and transact any other business.

2. Special Meetings:

- A. Special meetings of the Conference may be convened by the Board of Directors, at such times and places within the Commonwealth as may be determined by the Board, provided, however, that notice of any special meeting and the purposes thereof shall, at least three weeks before the date of the meeting, be sent by mail to each of the churches entitled to send delegates to the meeting, posted in the general office of the Conference and printed in newspapers published in Boston, Worcester and Springfield.
- B. A special meeting of the Conference shall be convened by the Board of Directors upon receipt by the office of the Secretary of the Conference or Chairperson of the Board of Directors of a written petition stating the proposed purposes, and signed by not less than 100 persons who shall be voting members of the Conference as defined and who shall represent at least 50 churches, within 60 days of the receipt of such petition, unless an already scheduled meeting of the Conference will be held within 90 days.
- C. No action shall be taken on any item of business not specified in the notice of the meeting.

3. Call to Order:

The Moderator or, in the absence of the Moderator, the Vice Moderator shall call the meeting to order and preside. In the absence of both, a member of the Board of Directors shall call the meeting to order and conduct the election of a Moderator Pro Tempore.

4. Budget:

Not later than one month prior to the meeting of the Conference at which the budget will be presented for approval, there shall be mailed to each church entitled to send delegates to the meeting sufficient copies of the budget and of the Treasurer's report to provide one copy for each minister and for each delegate to which the church is entitled. Changes in the budget, with increases or decreases, (except as hereafter noted), shall not be considered on the floor of the Conference Meeting unless a written proposal has been filed with the office of the Treasurer at least 10 days prior to the meeting. However, any increases or decreases in the budget may be proposed on the floor of the Conference meeting without advance notice, provided that two-thirds of the delegates vote to consider the proposal. The rate of Fellowship Dues and the proportion to be retained from Our Christian World Mission shall be voted at the Annual Meeting and may not be changed by a subsequent meeting in any given year.

5. Quorum:

At all meetings of the Conference, a quorum shall consist of 200 voting members.

ARTICLE V

CONFERENCE MEETING MEMBERSHIP

1. Voting Members:

The voting membership of a Conference Meeting shall consist of:

A. the following representatives from each church or congregation which is a member of an Association in fellowship with the Conference:

- (1) two delegates chosen by and from each such church or congregation to serve at its pleasure, and one additional delegate chosen by and from each such church or congregation to serve at its pleasure for every 300 members or major fraction thereof in excess of a multiple of 300, as determined by the number of its members as of December 31 of the year immediately preceding. (The churches are urged, in conformity with the spirit of actions taken by General Synod, to choose delegates from all areas of interest, in order to have a lay delegate body with equal representation of men and women, representation of minority groups, and with a goal of 20% of all lay delegates under 30 years of age.)
- (2) the pastor(s), including lay pastors, of each such church or congregation, provided such pastor shall have standing in an Association in fellowship with the with the Conference, and
- (3) the Christian Education Director(s) of each such church or congregation, provided such Director holds United church of Christ certification.
- (4) the other ordained persons who are members in each such church or congregation and who have standing in an Association in fellowship with the Conference.
- (5) Commissioned Workers who have standing in an Association in fellowship with the Conference.
- B. the officers and executive officers of the Conference, including any person who shall have been elected an officer emeritus;
- C. the members of the Board of Directors;
- D. the members of the Conference committees and councils;
- E. the members of the professional staff of the Conference, as such staff may be determined by the Board of Directors; and

2. Honorary Members:

The honorary membership of a Conference Meeting, with privilege of speaking but not of voting, shall consist of:

- A. the delegates from corresponding bodies;
- B. the persons appointed to speak before the Conference;
- C. the persons who may be made honorary members by vote of the Board of Directors;
- D. such other persons as may be made honorary members by a vote of the Conference.

ARTICLE VI

OFFICERS AND STAFF

- 1. As officers of the Conference, there shall be a Moderator and a Vice Moderator who shall be elected by ballot at each Annual Meeting of the Conference for a term of one year or until their successors are chosen. The Moderator or Vice Moderator, in the absence of the Moderator, shall preside over the meetings of the Conference.
- 2. The Conference executive officers shall be a President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and such other executive officers as the Conference may, from time to time, elect. Any of the said executive offices, except those of President, Secretary, and Treasurer, may be abolished by vote of the Conference. The Board of Directors shall make nominations for Conference executive officers for terms of one year. Elections shall take place by ballot at each Annual Meeting. Those elected shall hold office to the end of their term or until their respective successors are chosen. They

shall bear such additional titles as the Conference or the Board of Directors may determine.

- A. The President shall be the Chief executive officer of the Conference and shall, subject to the direction of the Conference and of its Board of Directors, have general charge of its mission and of its activities. The President shall be a member ex officio of all standing committees named in the Bylaws and shall have the power to delegate to members of the staff the authority to represent the office upon any of the said standing committees. The President shall be the representative of the Conference and its Board of Directors among all the churches (both those financially independent and those aided by the Conference), and in all denominational and interdenominational gatherings (including meetings of the Conference executives), unless representation is otherwise provided by the Conference President or the Board of Directors. The President may seek to assist pastors and churches with counsel and shall be kept informed as to opportunities for extension work through founding new churches or strengthening old ones, and shall recommend to the Conference and to the Board of Directors measures for meeting such opportunities.
- B. The Secretary shall keep the records of the Conference. The Secretary shall perform the duties incident to the office and such others as may be assigned to the office by the Board of Directors or the President. The Secretary shall have the custody of the records, the seal of the Conference, and of all bonds given by the Treasurer as hereinafter provided, and shall furnish copies of the records certified under the seal of the Conference to such persons as may be entitled thereto.
- C. The Treasurer shall receive and hold the property of the Conference subject to the direction of the Board of Directors and shall keep particular accounts of the Conference funds and of the disposal thereof. The Treasurer shall, under the direction of the President, assist in the general work of the Conference and shall perform such other duties as may be assigned by the Board of Directors. The Treasurer shall make a report at each Annual Meeting and shall make such other reports as the Conference or the Board of Directors may from time to time require. The Treasurer shall receive all contributions sent to the Conference by churches and by individuals, and shall disburse the same in accordance with the instructions of the donors. The Treasurer shall give such bonds as may, from time to time, be required by the Board of Directors. Any Assistant Treasurer shall perform such duties as may be assigned by the Treasurer or the President in the absence or incapacity of the Treasurer.
- 3. Area Ministers: The Conference may, from time to time, employ such staff as is deemed necessary to fulfill pastoral and fellowship functions and purposes within the Conference in the established Areas of the Conference. The staff shall give counsel and leadership to the churches and ministers in those Areas and shall be employed by the Board of Directors in consultation with the Conference President and in consultation with, or upon the recommendation of the Area committee/council involved, and/or in consultation with other appropriate parties.
- 4. Conference Program Staff and Administrative Staff: The Conference may, from time to time, employ such staff as is deemed necessary to fulfill the program purposes and administrative needs of the Conference. The staff shall be employed by the Board of Directors in consultation with the President of the Conference, and where applicable with such committee/council and parties as may seem appropriate to the function which said position is to fulfill.
- 5. Performance Evaluation, Job Review, Professional Support: The President shall present to the Board of Directors, for all executive officers and for staff other than himself, periodic reviews of job performance, job content, and professional support status. The Board of Directors shall be responsible for seeing that such periodic reviews are carried out for all executive officers and staff, that such reviews are based upon sufficient facts and consultations, and that the scope, findings and recommendations of such reviews are appropriate. Persons nominated or employed by

the Board of Directors as executive officers and staff shall be informed of Conference practice with regard to review of job performance and content and professional support status.

- 6. Retirement Annuities: The Conference expects every paid officer, staff member, or other employee to be a member, as appropriate, of the Annuity Fund for Congregational Ministers or the Retirement Fund for Lay Workers and will pay the full normal annual premium to the Fund, except as otherwise specified in employee policies for general staff. It will not provide any other retirement annuity.
- 7. Employee Benefits: The Conference, as an employer, may provide such other employee benefits as the Board of Directors deems appropriate, and such programs and the extent to which the Conference bears the expense shall be reported in the Treasurer's annual report.

ARTICLE VII

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

1. Organization

- A. There shall be a Board of Directors consisting of:
 - (1) One Director elected by the Annual Meeting from each Association with additional members elected by the Annual Meeting so that no Area has fewer than three Directors. Membership of the Board of Directors is to be distributed as equally as possible among men and women of the MACUCC and at least two-thirds of the members shall be lay persons. Efforts shall be made to have diversity in the membership in terms of race and age.
 - (2) The President, Moderator, Vice Moderator, Chairperson of the Council for Local Church Life and Ministry, and Chairperson of the Council for Mission Outreach and Social Responsibility, ex officii.
- B. The term of an elected Director shall be four years, and no Director, having served a full four-year term, shall be eligible for re-election for one year. A Director who moves from one Association to another shall be expected to resign from the Board of Directors at the close of the next Annual Meeting.
- C. Nine members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum.
- D. At its first meeting after each Annual Meeting of the Conference, the Board of Directors shall choose one of its members to served as Chairperson and another member to serve as Vice Chairperson for the ensuing year. It shall also choose a Clerk to maintain a record of its proceedings.
- 2. General Powers: Subject to the provisions of Section 3 of this Article, the Board of Directors shall have and may exercise all of the powers of the Conference between meetings of the Conference, and actions taken shall be reported to the next Annual Meeting of the Conference.
- 3. Except as otherwise provided in the charter of the Conference or in these Bylaws, the Board of Directors shall administer and dispose of the property of the Conference and shall manage all of its business and affairs, subject to the following limitations:
 - A. Corporate assets other than real property or tangible personal property which are not restricted as to use by the donor shall not be disbursed or granted between two consecutive Annual Meetings in an amount exceeding 20% of the value thereof at the previous year-end or \$250,000, whichever is greater, except as authorized or directed by a vote of the Conference.

B. Title to real property with a market value of \$250,000 or more shall not be encumbered, or conveyed in whole or in part, except as authorized or directed by a meeting of the Conference.

4. The Board of Directors:

- A. Shall have responsibility for policy formulation, program development, budget development, coordination between the functional committees or councils of the Conference, evaluation and planning;
- B. Shall employ staff and other agents in support of Conference activities and operations and define or approve the definition of their duties;
- C. Shall cause the accounts of the Treasurer to be audited at least once a year by certified public accountants selected by the Board;
- D. Shall provide direction for all officers, executive officers, staff and agents of the Conference.
- 5. Without restricting the generality of the foregoing, the Board of Directors shall in particular have the following powers:
 - A. To appoint its own meetings and form its own rule of business, to appoint committees and delegate any of its powers to such committees.
 - B. To remove at pleasure any member of the staff, any employee or any agent of the Conference.
 - C. To remove any officer, executive officer, or Director of the Conference who may be guilty of disregard of the duties of the office or of such conduct as shall be seriously prejudicial to the interests of the Conference.
 - D. To fill any vacancy in any office, executive office, committee or council of the Conference including vacancies in the membership of the Board until the succeeding Annual Meeting of the Conference.
 - E. To direct efforts to promote missionary interest and giving among the churches of the Conference.
 - F. To direct efforts to promote ecumenical concerns, interests and relationships of the Conference.
 - G. To direct efforts of evaluation and planning with respect to the program and activities of the Conference.
 - H. To appoint one or more Directors to the functional Conference committees and councils as liaison between the committees and councils and the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VIII

COMMITTEES AND COUNCILS

- 1. The Moderator shall appoint from the membership of the Board of Directors and Program Committee a Business Committee for Conference Meetings. The Business Committee shall prepare the agenda for the business sessions, recommend changes therein during sessions, and appoint any necessary committees to expedite the business of the meeting. The Moderator shall appoint a Committee on Credentials at least one week prior to the opening of any regular Conference Meeting.
- 2. There shall be a Program Committee to plan the program of each regular meeting and such other meetings of the Conference as the Board of Directors may request. The committee shall consist of the Moderator and the Vice Moderator, plus 15 elected members. At each Annual Meeting, five members shall be elected by voice vote for three-year terms.

3. There shall be two councils: the Council for Local Church Life and Ministry and the Council for Mission Outreach and Social Responsibility. Each shall have 24 members, with eight elected each year for three-year terms. No person who has completed a three-year term on any council may be re-elected to that council until one year shall have elapsed. The membership of each council shall be drawn from each of the five geographical regions of the Conference, shall be drawn from different ages and races, and shall include at least 40% of each gender. Not less than one-half shall be latty.

The two councils shall function as program arms of the Conference. They shall be responsible for both research and development of program. The work of the councils shall be carried out by task forces appointed by the appropriate council. The Council for Local Church Life and Ministry shall be responsible for programs fostering evangelism, education and our mutual ministry. The Council for Mission Outreach and Social Responsibility shall develop and relate to specific mission and social action tasks.

4. There shall be a Nominating Committee consisting of 18 members, with six elected the the Annual Meeting each year for three-year terms. No person who has completed a three-year term on the committee may be re-elected to that committee until one year has elapsed. The membership of the committee shall be drawn from different ages and races and shall include at least 40% of each gender. Not less than one-half shall be lay persons.

The Nominating Committee shall be concerned with the discovery and appropriate utilization of leadership within the Conference. This committee shall make nominations for the following offices and positions: Moderator, Vice Moderator, members of the Board of Directors, Program Committee, Councils, and General Synod delegates. At the request of the Board of Directors, it shall also suggest nominees to fill any vacancies occurring between Annual Meetings. The Board of Directors shall nominate members of the Nominating Committee to be elected by the Annual Meeting.

- 5. All committees and councils are free to organize their work, to establish sub-committees for special assignments, and to co-opt other persons with special interest and skill as required. A person who is a member of any committee or council ex-officio shall be entitled to vote.
- 6. The reports of all committees and councils that are to be presented to the Conference Annual Meeting shall be furnished to the Secretary eight weeks before the Annual Meeting, and shall be printed and distributed to the churches not less than four weeks before the Annual Meeting. These reports need not be read to the Conference Meeting, but the Program Committee may arrange for the adequate discussion of any or all of the topics presented in the reports.
- 7. Such committees, councils, or other ad hoc groups as the Conference may vote to constitute or recognize shall be established by voice vote at each Annual Meeting for such terms as the Conference Meeting shall determine. The Board of Directors shall present at each Annual Meeting a list of committees, councils or other ad hoc groups, the appointment of which it recommends.

ARTICLE IX

CONDITIONS OF OFFICE

- Qualifications: Each officer, executive officer, Director, committee member of council member may serve only while a member in a church or congregation eligible to send delegates to the Conference Meeting.
- 2. Beginning of Term: The terms of officers, executive officers, Directors, or members of a committee or council of the Conference shall begin at the close of the meeting at which they are elected; however, in the event a meeting is recessed for more than one month following election, the terms of those elected shall commence at the close of the session in which the recess was declared.

- Unexpired Term: Any person elected at an Annual Meeting of the Conference to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of that vacancy.
- 4. Automatic Resignation: Any person elected to the Board of Directors or any committee or council of the Conference who shall fail to attend two consecutive regular meetings thereof without an explanation of absence, or fail to attend three consecutive meetings for any reason, shall be considered to have resigned. Whoever is nominated to the Board of Directors or any committee or council of the Conference on the basis of residency in one of the five Areas of the state shall be considered to have resigned if during the term of office the person moves to a different Area of the state or moves from the state. It will be the responsibility of the Board of Directors, committee, or council involved to determine whether to accept a resignation.

ARTICLE X

RELATIONSHIPS

- As a Conference of the United Church of Christ, the Massachusetts Conference is a
 body of the United Church of Christ and is related to the General Synod as described
 in the Constitution and Bylaws of the United Church of Christ. It discharges those
 duties and provides those services set forth in its own charter and Bylaws and which
 are not inconsistent with the Constitution and Bylaws of the United Church of
 Christ.
- 2. Delegates of the Conference to the General Synod, as provided for in the Constitution and Bylaws of the United Church of Christ, shall be elected from the membership of the churches in the Massachusetts Conference which are affiliated with the United Church of Christ, and such delegates shall be elected by voice vote at a meeting of the Conference.

ARTICLE XI

BOARD OF MINISTERIAL AID

The Board of Ministerial Aid shall be the agent of the Conference in the work of aiding needy ministers and their families and shall make an annual report to the Conference. On notice of a vacancy in the membership of the Board of Ministerial Aid, the Conference shall nominate a person to fill the vacancy.

ARTICLE XII

BOSTON SEAMAN'S FRIEND SOCIETY

The Boston Seaman's Friend Society shall be the agent of the Conference in the work of promoting the spiritual and temporal welfare of seamen and shall make an annual report to the Conference. The Conference meeting shall annually elect by voice vote five members, for a term of three years each, to the Board of the Society.

ARTICLE XIII

CORPORATE SEAL

The seal of the Conference shall consist of two or more concentric circles, with the words "Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ" around the circumference between these circles and the words "Inc., 1808" within the inner circle.

ARTICLE XIV

SPECIAL ORDERS

 All matters of business presented to the Conference Meeting shall be referred to the Business Committee unless referred to some other committee or council by special vote of the Conference.

- All matters of business referred to the Business Committee shall be reported for action before the final adjournment of the meeting.
- There shall be a "Revolving Fund for Cash Flow" designated to the purpose of providing cash at times of low flow during a given year.
 - A. The limit of the Fund will be determined, from time to time, by the Board of Directors.
 - B. The sources of capital will be from unrestricted monies designated to the Fund by the Board of Directors or from special gifts restricted to the purpose of the Fund, with the distinction between the two preserved.
 - C. The cash of the fund may be borrowed by action of the Conference executive officers for the specific purpose with the expectation that it can and will be returned to the Fund within the calendar year of use. In the event that this is not possible, due to unforeseen circumstances, there will be no borrowing from the Fund during the succeeding calendar year until outstanding borrowing has been repaid.
 - D. At no time will the Fund be used as collateral for other loans.
 - E. No interest will be paid to the Fund for the use of its cash.
 - F. Unrestricted monies placed in the Fund may be withdrawn only by vote of the Conference Meeting.
 - G. The Fund shall be invested in a manner appropriate for its purposes, as determined by the Board of Directors. Income earned shall be administered as unrestricted receipts from invested income.

ARTICLE XV

RULES OF ORDER

All proceedings of the Conference Meeting shall be governed by the latest revised edition of Robert's Rules of Order, and, unless otherwise required thereby or by these Bylaws, action of the Conference shall be by the majority vote of voting members present.

ARTICLE XVI

AMENDMENTS

- 1. These Bylaws except Article II and III, may be amended at any Annual Meeting, or other meeting, of the Conference by a two-thirds vote, provided the amendment is recommended by the Board of Directors or was proposed at a previous Conference Meeting. Any amendment to the Bylaws must be received by the churches and delegates at least 30 days prior to the Conference Meeting at which the amendment will be considered.
- 2. Articles II and III may be amended by a two-thirds vote at any Annual Meeting, but only after the proposed amendment has been submitted to the Conference in writing at a previous Annual Conference Meeting and notice has been sent to each church entitled to send delegates at least three months prior to the Conference Meeting at which action is to be taken.

MINUTES OF THE 186th ANNUAL MEETING of the MASSACHUSETTS CONFERENCE OF THE UNITED CHURCH OF CHRIST June 14, 15, 16, 1985 South Hadley, Massachusetts

The 186th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ began at 1:00 p.m. on Friday, June 14, at Mount Holyoke College, South Hadley, Massachusetts, with an opening worship in Abbey Chapel, with the Rev. Dr. Peter Gomes, Plummer Professor of Christian Morals, Harvard School of Divinity, giving the sermon. The theme of the meeting was "Ministry: Servants Sharing the Living Waters".

The first plenary session was called to order at 3:00 p.m. in Woolley Hall by the Rev. Dr. Eric Bascom, Moderator. The Moderator announced his appointment of the Business Committee, in accordance with the Bylaws, consisting of Ms. Marnie Warner, the Rev. Gary DeLong, Mr. Edmond Steele, Ms. Esther Haskell, and the Rev. Carole Baker as Chairperson.

The Moderator announced his appointment of the Credentials Committee consisting of Mr. Edmond Steele and the Rev. Jeffrey Larsen. Mr. Steele presented the report of advance registrations as follows: 253 clergy, 545 delegates, 89 visitors and 63 others, making a total of 950.

The Moderator declared a quorum present. He announced his appointment of the ushers as tellers, and noted that they were being coordinated by the Rev. Paul Laubi.

The Moderator introduced the Vice Moderator, the Rev. Yvonne Schaudt; the Parliamentarian, Mr. Richard Osterberg, Esq.; the Recorder, Mrs. Florence Hand, and Mr. Steele, Timekeeper.

The chair of the Program Committee, Ms. Bonnie Dinges, was called on by the Moderator to review the highlights of the Proposed Standing Rules. It was moved, seconded and voted that:

STANDING RULES $\,$ The 186th Annual Meeting adopts the Standing Rules as printed. 85-AM-1 $\,$

The Moderator called on Ms. Dinges to present the Proposed Order of Time and Events, and it was moved, seconded and voted that:

ORDER OF TIME $\,$ The 186th Annual Meeting adopts the Proposed Order of Time and Events as AND EVENTS $\,$ as printed. 85-AM-2

The Rev. Dr. Alfred E. Williams, Minister and President, was called on by the Moderator to introduce honorary delegates, and it was moved, seconded and voted that:

The 186th Annual Meeting designates the following persons as honorary delegates with voice but not vote: the Rev. Dr. Barbara Brown Zikmund, the Rev. Dr. James Nash, the Rev. Charles Lake, Ms. Valerie Russell, Mr. Ronald McLean, Mrs. Ruth Evans, the Rev. Peter Savage, and Mrs. Mary Lou Eugley.

The Moderator introduced the Secretary of the Conference, Mrs. Marion Vuilleumier.

Mr. Gordon Thorp, Treasurer, who was introduced by the Moderator, gave his report. The Moderator then called Mr. Merrill Ewing, chair of the Finance Committee, to come to the platform, and he honored Mr. Thorp, who is retiring, and presented him with a gift.

The Moderator introduced the Rev. Dr. Daniel Leavitt, chair of the Board of Directors, who gave a report on the work of the Conference and an audiovisual about the Conference was shown. Dr. Leavitt called upon Dr. Williams, who gave a report on the Racial and Economic Justice Imperative of the Conference.

The Moderator introduced the Rev. Harold McSwain, who led the meeting in singing.

Mrs. Margaret Sammons, chair of the Nominating Committee, was introduced by the Moderator, and she presented the slate of nominees for Conference officers, members of the Board of Directors, the Program Committee and the two Councils, and General Synod delegates and alternates, and pointed out existing vacancies.

The Moderator called on Dr. Leavitt, who reviewed the "Guidelines for Clergy Compensation 1986," recommended by the Board, which he noted would be voted upon Sunday morning. Dr. Leavitt also pointed out the Proposed Bylaw Changes regarding mandatory retirement (Article VI, paragraph 6) and regarding the number of persons serving on the Conference Program Committee (Article VIII, paragraph 2) and it was moved, seconded and voted that:

BYLAW The 186th Annual Meeting adopts the amendments to Articles VI and VIII AMENDMENTS of the Bylaws as indicated on Goldenrod II of the delegate materials. (The amendments are included in the Bylaws printed in this yearbook.)

Ms. Marnie Warner was called on by the Moderator to explain the resolutions process. She pointed out the Recommendations on Resolutions printed in the delegate materials, and the listing of locations of resolution hearings to be held. She explained the poll that would be taken to determine the order in which resolutions would be taken up.

The Rev. Ms. Schaudt was called upon by the Moderator to explain the "speakout" process. Several persons had speakouts, and there was a one-minute "pitch," followed by which the Moderator declared a recess until 7:45 p.m.

The evening plenary session was opened by the Moderator, who called on Dr. Williams to lead in Bible study. The Moderator introduced the speaker, the Rev. Dr. Barbara Brown Zikmund, Professor at the Pacific School of Religion, who spoke on the theme of water, bartism and ministry.

Ms. Warner was called on by the Moderator to moderate the presentation on resolutions, during which the manager of each resolution reported on the hearing of that resolution.

Following announcements, the Moderator declared a recess until Saturday morning.

SATURDAY, JUNE 15

The plenary session was reconvened by the Moderator at 8:30 a.m. The meeting was led in Bible study by Dr. Williams. Speakouts followed, and announcement of the results of the poll on resolutions, and it was moved, seconded and voted that:

ORDER OF The 186th Annual Meeting will take up resolutions in the order determin-RESCLUTIONS ed by the poll of delegates.

Dr. Williams was called on by the Moderator to introduce members of the Executive Staff, General Staff, and Consultants. He called forth several staff members who are retiring or leaving, for special recognition and presentation of gifts. They were Mr. Clinton D. Grant, Accountant; the Rev. Joseph Neville, Associate Conference Minister in the Northeast Area; Mrs. Elizabeth Simpson, Central Area Secretary, and the Rev. Dr. Donald A. Simpson, Associate Conference Minister in the Central Area. Dr. Simpson received a standing ovation.

Dr. Williams gave his annual report, which he began by explaining the search process for persons to fill positions vacated by the above persons, then speaking on ministry and the power of God, and issues the Conference and its churches must face in coming years.

The Moderator called upon Mr. Merrill Ewing, chair of the Finance Committee, who urged delegates to study "Revised Recommendations 1986 Budget" and to attend the afternoon budget hearing. Cards were passed out for delegates to write questions they have about the budget, to later be answered by Mr. Ewing. It was moved, seconded and voted that:

BUDGET CON-SIDERATION 85-AM-6 The 186th Annual Meeting will consider the budget recommendation as as printed on Buff ${\tt VI.}$

The meeting was led in singing by the Rev. Mr. McSwain.

The Moderator introduced the Rev. David Butler, who spoke on the document "Process for a Considered Statement," which was outlined in delegate materials. He explained that the delegates would be polled concerning which issues they wish to have studied in depth throughout the Conference, including a number of public hearings, during the ensuing two years. A Study Commission would study all findings and write a Considered Statement to present to the 1987 Annual Meeting for debate and vote.

The attention of the meeting turned to action on resolutions, and the Moderator called the attention of the delegates to the Standing Rules in the delegate packets. A "Resolution on Sanctuary" was presented by the Rev. Ms. Holly Johnston and spoken to by the Rev. Frank Dorman, and it was moved, seconded and voted that:

RESCLUTION The 186th Annual Meeting adopts the Resolution on Sanctuary as printed ON SANCTUARY (Appendix A).

A "Resolution on the Church's Response to Homosexual and Bisexual People" was presented by the Rev. Norman Norton. In the midst of much discussion on this, the Moderator called for a few moments of silent prayer. A motion to table lost, a motion to close debate passed, and it was moved, seconded and voted that a "Resolution on the Church's Response to Homosexual and Bisexual People" be <u>defeated.</u>

Attention was turned from resolutions to other business, and the Moderator called on Dr. Williams to present honorees. Dr. Williams introduced the Rev. Dr. Harold Wilke, who spoke briefly, and then introduced new ordinands who were asked to stand. Two 50 -year ordinands were honored: the Rev. Lloyd Yeagle and Chaplain Lt. Col. Louis Beasley.

Following announcements, the Moderator declared a recess until the afternoon plenary session.

The Moderator called the plenary session to order at 3:30 p.m. and called upon Ms. Sammons, who announced an addition to the slate. It was moved, seconded and voted that nominations be closed.

Dr. Williams led the meeting in Bible study, which was followed by a panel discussion on on "Ministry" with the Rev. Peter Conley, Ms. Susan Dickerman, the Rev. Dr. James Nash, the Rev. Dr. Zikmund and moderated by Mr. Hubert Jessup, who also included audience participation.

The meeting turned to the business of the day, and the Moderator called on Mr. Ewing to answer questions related to the budget which had been written on cards by delegates. Dr. Williams was called upon to answer some of the questions. It was moved, seconded and voted that:

1986 OCWM GOAL The 186th Annual Meeting adopts a total OCWM Basic Support goal for 1986 of \$1,845,000.

It was moved, seconded and voted that:

Following the defeat of a motion to amend by increasing Fellowship Dues to \$5.00 per church member, it was moved, seconded and voted that:

1986 FELLOW-SHIP DUES 85-AM-10 The 186th Annual Meeting sets the 1986 Fellowship Dues at \$3.80 per church member as reported for January 1, 1986; 15 cents of each per member charge is designated to be applied to the reduction of the internal debt for Framingham development and renovation.

It was moved, seconded and voted that:

1986 BUDGET The 186th Annual Meeting adopts a 1986 budget with income and expenses 85-AM-11 of \$2,019,000.

Following announcements and pitches, the Moderator declared the meeting recessed until $7:00\ p.m.$

The Vice Moderator, the Rev. Ms. Schaudt, presided over the Saturday evening plenary session. Following the speakouts, she called on Dr. Williams to introduce the Rev. Dr. Russell Loesch, a 50-year ordinand, who was presented with a gift. The Vice Moderator called on the Rev. David Butler, who told delegates more about the Process for a Considered Statement and explained the Response Sheets on which delegates would choose the subjects that they would most like to have as Considered Statements. The responses were collected for announcement on Sunday.

A "Resolution on South Africa" with an amended page two was proposed by Dr. Carole Camp, who explained the minor changes, and it was moved, seconded and voted that:

RESOLUTION The 186th Annual Meeting adopts the Resolution on South Africa as amend-ON SO. AFRICA ed (Appendix B). 85-AM-12

Two motions to amend passed, changing the title to add "and American-Soviet Dialogue"; changing the second "through" in line 1 to "whereas"; adding the word "responsible" after "all" in the fourth paragraph, line 2, and adding a comma and the words "including both government and private efforts" to the end of the same paragraph. It was moved, seconded and voted that:

RESCLUTION ON The 186th Annual Meeting adopts the Resolution on Arms Control Negoti-ARMS CONTROL NE-GOTIATIONS AND AMERICAN-SOVIET DIALOGUE

The Moderator declared a recess for an 8:30 p.m. worship service.

SUNDAY, JUNE 16

The plenary session was called to order by the Moderator at 8:30 a.m., and began with Bible study by Dr. Williams. Following several speakouts, the Moderator called on Mrs. Sammons, who presented the slate. The Recorder was instructed to cast a single ballot for the election of executive officers, officers, members of the Board, councils and committees and General Synod delegates and alternates. Dr. Williams asked Synod delegates to stand and introduce themselves and gave them a message.

The Moderator called on Dr. Leavitt to present the "Guidelines for Clergy Compensation 1986" and it was moved, seconded and voted that:

GUIDELINES FOR CLERGY COMPENSATION 1986 85-AM-15 The 186th Annual Meeting approves the "Guidelines for Clergy Compensation 1986" as printed (Appendix E).

The Moderator called on the Rev. Mr. Butler who announced that the poll on a subject for

A "Resolution on Economic Justice", presented by the Rev. William R. McCoy, who noted attached revisions, was spoken to by the Rev. Dr. William Abernethy, and it was moved, seconded and voted that:

A "Resolution on the Inclusive Language Lectionary" was presented by the Rev. David Goode, and it was moved, seconded and voted that the resolution be defeated.

A "Resolution on a New Resolutions Process" was presented by Dr. Willis Elliott, one of the proposers, and it was moved, seconded and voted that the resolution be defeated.

A "Resolution on 'A Just Peace'" was presented by Ms. Beverly Smith of the CMOSR, who noted the following changes: delete the fourth and fifth "whereas" paragraphs; add, following "drafted" in the last "Whereas", the words "for study and response", and delete the balance of the sentence; under "Therefore be it resolved" No. 1, change the word "work" to "team", add a comma after UCC, and delete the balance of the sentence; delete No. 2 and renumber the succeeding sentences, and delete the word "all" and change the word "attempts" to "efforts" in the new No. 2. It was moved, seconded and voted that:

RESOLUTION IN The 186th Annual Meeting adopts the Resolution in Support of the UFW SUPPORT OF THE UFW TABLE GRAPE BOYCOTT 85-AM-21

A "Resolution on Church Access for Persons with Disabling Conditions" was presented by the Rev. Carole Baker as having been submitted after the deadline. The Business Committee will refer this resolution to the Council for Local Church Life and Ministry.

Mr. Steele, chair of the Credentials Committee, reported attendance as follows: 557 lay delegates, 279 clergy, 2 lay preachers, 18 executive officers, 3 directors of religious education, 1 commissioned worker, 86 visitors, and 54 others, for a total of 1,000 persons present at the meeting.

The Moderator called upon Dr. Williams for closing words. He spoke of the upcoming General Synod in Ames, Iowa, and other places where persons would be going representing the MACUCC. He presented gifts to the Rev. Ms. Baker and Mr. Alan Macy, the outgoing members of the Conference Board of Directors, and thanked them. He also thanked Dr. Bascom, and presented him with a gift. He introduced the Moderator and Vice Moderator for 1985-86, the Rev. Ms. Schaudt and Mr. Donald Pearsall, and turned the gavel over to the Rev. Ms. Schaudt. She called upon Ms. Dinges, chair of the Program Committee, who asked the delegates to thank a number of persons who helped plan the meeting. The meeting was adjourned at 11:15 a.m. for worship.

Appendix A - RESOLUTION ON SANCTUARY

WHEREAS our faith is grounded in God who demands justice and calls us to show love for our neighbors, and

WHEREAS the Judeo-Christian faith was born in the travail of escape as Yahweh commanded Moses to set aside cities and places of refuge in Canaan where people could seek asylum from the "blood avengers," cities of refuge which were for the Israelites "as well as the stranger and sojourner among you." (Num. 35:15); and

WHEREAS God was remembered as the one who brought us out of the bondage of Egypt (Ex. 20:2), and God's identity was rooted in action and proclaimed in the verbs of struggle: leading, delivering, freeing; and

WHEREAS the Refugee Act of 1980 states that a refugee qualifies for political asylum in the U.S. if it can be established that he or she: "owing to a well-founded fear of persecution for reasons of race, religion, nationality, membership of a particular social group or political opinion, is unwilling to avail himself of the protection of that country"; and

WHEREAS the United States is a signatory to the United Nations Convention relating to the status of refugees which states, "No contracting state shall expel or return a refugee in any matter whatsoever to the frontiers of territories where his life or freedom would be threatened on account of his race, religion, nationality, membership of a particular social group, or public opinion"; and

WHEREAS refugees from El Salvador and Guatemala are fleeing to the United States to escape persecution, murder and civil war; and

WHEREAS the United States Government has refused to grant refugee status to Salvadorans

and Guatemalans, contrary to the definition of "refugee" stated in the U.N. Convention and Protocol Relating to the Status of Refugees of 1977, signed by the United States and adopted by the U.S. Congress in the Refugee Act of 1980; and

WHEREAS in our country, large numbers of Salvadorans and Guatemalans are arrested, confined for extended periods of time, returned to their homelands where their welfare and lives are further threatened, or forced to live "underground"; and

WHEREAS The Fourteenth General Synod of the United Church of Christ voted to issue "an immediate call to all pastors and congregations urging an active advocacy campaign to call upon the United States Government to grant to El Salvadoran and Guatemalan nationals seeking refuge in our country the privilege of (extended voluntary departure status) until they can return home with a reasonable degree of safety.

"The Fourteenth General Synod applauds those congregations granting sanctuary to El Salvadorans and Guatemalans and encourages all our congregations to consider providing sanctuary until such time as extended voluntary departure status is granted"; and

(Extended Voluntary Departure is a legal category in the Immigration and Naturalization Act granting temporary asylum to foreign nationals caught outside their country during times of strife. The State Department suspends this status as soon as these nationals can return home safely.)

WHEREAS the Conference Ministers throughout the United Church of Christ stated in February, 1985:

We hold in our hearts and cherish the oppressed of every land; the people of South Africa and Afghanistan, Ethiopia and the Philippines, Poland and Korea, Chile and Peru and in the United States, for we believe that, wherever human rights are denied and the human spirit is crushed, Jesus Christ is denied and the Gospel despised.

"During these days together, we have been stunned by eyewitness accounts of the violence being done to the church in Central America and by the message on the lips of trusted friends telling of misery, fear and heavy burdens that have become the common experience of people in that part of the world."

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the 186th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ joins with the United Church of Christ Conference Ministers and calls upon congregations to

- "Explore the Biblical concept of sanctuary and the historic place of the United States as a 'safe and propitious asylum for the unfortunates of other countries' (George Washington);
- "Support with your prayers and, if possible, with your gifts those congregations and individuals engaged in non-violent civil disobedience; those who risk penalties by offering shelter, refuge and a home to those fleeing the violence of the world;
- 3. "Urgently and prayerfully consider participating in the 'sanctuary movement'."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council for Mission Outreach and Social Responsibility be instructed to communicate this action of the Annual Meeting to the appropriate state and national bodies and provide appropriate resources for the above study and action.

BE IT THEREFORE RESCLVED that the 186th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ urges the U.S. government to grant to El Salvadoran and Guatemalan nationals seeking refuge in our country the privilege of "extended voluntary departure status" until they can return home with a reasonable degree of safety.

Appendix B - RESOLUTION ON SOUTH AFRICA

WHEREAS the 176th Annual Meeting of the MACUCC in 1975 stated, "We as Christians reaffirm the love of God between all people, assert the right of each person to justice and realize that peace by repression is not the true peace of Jesus, and, as the Body of Christ, continue to deplore the dehumanizing effects of apartheid, realizing that 'liberation of one particular group of people can be authentic only insofar as it includes freedom for the others' (Moltmann)"; and

WHEREAS the 177th Annual Meeting of the MACUCC in 1976 voted to "intensify efforts to bring the moral and financial leverage of the church to bear on corporations to work in South Africa for effective reform of present injustice"; and

WHEREAS, after many years of struggle, the 178th $\,$ Annual Meeting of the MACUCC in 1977 voted:

"The apartheid policies of the White minority government of the Republic of South Africa are supported and in truth encouraged by the continual presence of United States businesses and corporations. Those corporations should cease operations and withdraw from the Republic of South Africa until the time when there is a majority government chosen by the people of South Africa in free elections.

WE THEREFORE URGE that individuals, churches, conferences, and instrumentalities exert moral pressure on United States corporations and businesses to withdraw from the Republic of South Africa and to take all actions necessary to achieve this goal. In the event that withdrawal is not accomplished, we as individuals and as a corporate church shall continue to reap the financial and material benefits accruing from the physical and spiritual misery of the majority of South Africans who are Black and Coloured."; and

WHEREAS "The World Alliance of Reformed Churches, in which the United Church of Christ is a member, in its June, 1982 meeting in Ottawa, Canada declared apartheid a "theological heresy,...a travesty of the gospel...in the persistent disobedience to the Word of God"; and

WHEREAS the political situation is deteriorating in South Africa. The government has responded brutally to protests against the new constitution which denies Blacks, who constitute 72 per cent of the population, the rights of citizenship, voting, and political representation, killing several hundred unarmed civilians. The government also has accelerated the forced removals of Blacks from urban areas to the desolate so-called homelands. When Black workers in November, 1984 staged a mass strike in the key industrial areas around Johannesburg, the government detained leaders of the stayaway. The government continues to harass religious leaders such as Bishop Desmond Tutu, 1984 Nobel Prize laureate and Anglican bishop of Johannesburg; Allan Boesak, President of the World Alliance of Reformed Churches, and Archbishop Dennis Hurley, Archbishop of Durban and President of the Southern African Catholic Bishops' Conference; and

WHEREAS Bishop Desmond Tutu has said, "Those who invest in South Africa invest in a system which we have described as being evil, as unchristian as Nazism ever was. They invest in a system that depends on Black misery and suffering."

Bishop Desmond Tutu in January, 1985 once again called for political, diplomatic, but above all, economic pressure on South Africa as the last chance to avert the blood bath; and

WHEREAS in consultation with ecumenical partners, the Directors of the United Church Board for World Ministries in November, 1984 adopted guidelines and criteria to determine which corporations operating in South Africa should be considered supportive of the apartheid system and, therefore, candidates for divestment. This policy now has been adopted by other denominations, and there is likely to be an ecumenical coalition cooperatively evaluating corporate operations, pressuring corporations to change policies, and pursuing divestment when such efforts are unsuccessful;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the 186th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference

of the United Church of Christ supports the following United Church Board of World Ministries resolution on South Africa related to the 15th General Synod:

That the United Church Board of World Ministries Board of Directors, in view of the escalating repression in South Africa, refusal of the apartheid regime to commence significant political change, and requests from South African church leaders to undertake significant forms of economic pressure in this critical period to avert a major bloodbath:

- 1. "Commits the United Church Board for World Ministries to a principle of full divestment from corporations with direct investments in South Africa and banks and other financial services institutions engaging in loans, credits, or services to the government of South Africa or its instrumentalities or agencies or making loans to the private sector for the provision of products, services, or technology that maintain the apartheid system.
- Supports the adoption of a pronouncement and proposal for action at the Fifteenth General Synod advocating full divestment.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the 186th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of of the United Church of Christ:

- Reaffirms its continued solidarity with all of the people of South Africa who
 are in the pursuit of freedom, justice, and political rights;
- Requests that all members of the United Church of Christ remember the people of South Africa in their prayers; and
- 3. Calls upon members of the United Church of Christ to actively participate in the anti-apartheid struggle as an urgent matter of Christian conscience. To that end, it asks that members of the United Church of Christ:
 - A. Refrain from purchasing Krugerrands, the South African gold coin;
 - B. Participate in vigils and demonstrations against the apartheid system;
 - C. Support legislation that would impose restriction on U.S. economic investment in and trade with South Africa;
- 4. Urges that all congregations participate in the anti-apartheid struggle through:
 - A. Providing educational and action programs to members and their community on the situation in South Africa;
 - B. Placing signs which state 'Free South Africa' on their grounds;
 - C. Remembering the people of South Africa and their problems in corporate prayers.

BE IT FURTHER RESCLVED that the Board of Directors of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ recommend to the Congregational Fund investment policies consistent with the action of the United Church Board for World Ministries, these guidelines be followed, and request a report on investment actions taken.

 Appendix C - RESCLUTION IN SUPPORT OF G.S. XV PROPOSAL ON: EMPOWERING THE LAITY FOR MINISTRY

The 186th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference commends the following resolution to the 15th General Synod for adoption:

Proposal for Action: Empowering Laity for Ministry

<u>Background</u>: The following PROPOSAL FOR ACTION seeks to assist in the further implementation of the Pronouncement: EMPOWERING THE LAITY FOR MINISTRY, which was introduced and adopted by the 13th General Synod meeting in Rochester, N.Y. in 1981. Original sponsors of the Pronouncement included the Eastern North Carolina Association, the Western North Carolina Association, the Eastern Virginia Association, and the Board of Directors of

the Southern Conference of the United Church of Christ. This PROPOSAL FOR ACTION is being recommended to the 15th General Synod by the Church Life and Leadership Commission, the Board of Directors of the Southern Conference, and the Eastern North Carolina Association.

Summary: This PROPOSAL FOR ACTION, like the Pronouncement upon which it is based, affirms the concept of ministry as the calling for all people of God (the lacs). "Ministry" is defined as service to others in the name of Christ through the use of one's gifts in response to the Holy Spirit. It embraces an understanding of ministry that can find expression and be carried on within, through, and beyond the programs and activities of the institutional church. It seeks to draw out the fuller range of implications for the life and mission of the United Church of Christ stemming from the Pronouncement.

The Call to Action:

WHEREAS the 13th General Synod of the United Church of Christ has adopted the Pronouncement entitled "Empowering the Laity for Ministry"; and

WHEREAS that Pronouncement includes a "Statement of Christian Conviction" which calls upon the United Church of Christ and all its related institutions to "at once" begin examining many fundamental issues related to ministry;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the 15th General Synod of the United Church of Christ:

- 1. Calls upon the Office for Church Life and Leadership to commission a major theological study for use by local congregations. The study shall address:
 - *The biblical and historical foundation for affirming the ministry of the laity and its theological implications,
 - *The doctrine of the Priesthood of all believers as interpreted by its present day ecclesiastical and mission significance,
 - *The implications of the ministry of the laity for theological education including approaches, curricula, and training experiences, and
 - *Those forces which enable and block empowering of the ministry of the laity within the life of the church. This shall include, but not be limited to, problems related to language, traditional doctrine, polity, practice, and structure within the life and work of the United Church of Christ:
- 2. Calls upon the Office for Church Life and Leadership in consultation with the Division of Christian Education of the Board for Homeland Ministries and the Association of the United Church Educators and other instrumentalities as appropriate, to develop resources and consultative services which shall assist local congregations in:
 - *Educational programs and consciousness-raising events,
 - *The use of materials to help laity identify their God-given gifts for ministry,
 - *Helping laity identify and claim specific calls to ministry,
 - *Assisting laity to design and plan their ministries,
 - *Providing a means of recognizing, supporting, and then being accountable for, the ministries undertaken, and
 - *Developing ways of meeting the requirements for specific ministerial skills;
- 3. Calls upon local and regional structures of the United Church of Christ to commit themselves to enable the whole people of God to be in ministry and to communicate such needs and resources as they have for doing so to the appropriate national judicatories;
- 4. Calls upon the Office for Church Life and Leadership and all UCC-related theological

schools to offer opportunities to laity for study and reflection which would help to inform their ministries and to develop their skills and effectiveness;

- 5. Calls upon the Office for Church Life and Leadership to examine thoroughly current issues of clergy crisis, burnout among church leadership, multiple role expectations and demands, and forms of clergy/lay conflicts in the context of mutual ministry between clergy/laity (exploring the role of spiritual disciplines and of support groups in relation to sustaining both in ministry);
- 6. Calls upon the Office for Church Life and Leadership to examine within the UCC, other denominations, and ecumenical movements successful models of faith renewal and development and lay empowerment as they relate to the above-mentioned Pronouncement and adapt them for use within the UCC;
- 7. Calls upon the Office for Church Life and Leadership to give a progress report of its activities in implementing this PROPOSAL FOR ACTION to the 16th General Synod;
- 8. Calls upon the Office of Communication to feature articles and stories related to the empowerment of the laity for ministry;
- 9. Calls upon the Stewardship Council to emphasize the stewardship of one's gifts for ministry as well as one's financial resources and to put special emphasis on investment of local church resources in the preparation of the laity for ministries in, through, and beyond the institutional church setting; and
- 10. Calls upon all local congregations, regional judicatories, and national instrumentalities of the United Church of Christ to affirm, celebrate, and seek ways to enable the ministries of the whole people of God to be at all levels of the church's life and mission.

* Appendix D - RESOLUTION ON ARMS CONTROL NEGOTIATIONS AND AMERICAN-SOVIET DIALOGUE

WHEREAS the United Church of Christ, through its General Synod and through the Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference, has urged arms reduction by both the U.S.S.R. and the U.S.A., in obedience to the biblical instruction to "beat swords into plow-shares"; and

WHEREAS in votes since 1980, citizens of the U.S. have polled large majorities favoring negotiation of a joint, verifiable freeze on nuclear weapons; and

WHEREAS the administration of President Reagan in 1984 began a process of negotiation with representatives of the U.S.S.R. to control and reduce armaments of the two countries;

THEREFORE BE IT RESCLVED that the 186th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ reaffirms support for all responsible attempts to negotiate reduction of armaments and urges that the negotiations be assisted by new efforts to cultivate friendly exchange and dialogue between the two countries in a wide variety of areas, including both government and private efforts.

BE IT FURTHER RESCLVED that this resolution be communicated to the President and the U.S. Senators from Massachusetts and that the Conference, Associations, and churches of the United Church of Christ in Massachusetts be urged to find ways to support and take part in programs of exchange.

* Appendix E - GUIDELINES FOR CLERGY COMPENSATION 1986

The 186th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ, concerned with the growth of its churches and the compensation of its ordained leaders, commends the effort of the local churches in endeavoring to reach the goals recommended in <u>Guidelines for Clergy Compensation 1985</u>.

The 186th Annual Meeting recommends:

- 1. that churches pay a minimum salary of \$15,000 for a full-time pastor;
- that churches not at the new minimum salary work toward the minimum and also at improving C, D, E, and F below;
- that churches already at or above the new minimum and also providing for C through F
 give at least a cost-of-living increase.

(PLEASE NOTE that these abbreviated guidelines are designed to be used in conjunction with <u>Guidelines for Clergy Compensation</u> booklet from the Conference office,)

A. CONSIDERATIONS FOR DETERMINING CLERGY COMPENSATION:

While the ministry is a unique profession requiring special patterns of financial compensation, several overall factors can be considered in determining the level of support for clergy. The total compensation package could justly be comparable to the median income of the parish and perhaps be on a par with that of the local high school principal, showing consideration for years of service and special skills and training and including annual cost-of-living increases. The federal tax structure is unique for clergy and the compensation package can be designated in a way to maximize the pastor's income.

B. CASH SALARY:

The cash salary (not including housing and other expenses) ought to be no less than \$15,000 for a full-time person in ordained ministry; less than \$15,000 would indicate a person called to part-time work. This is a modest increase of approximately 3.5% over the minimum voted for 1984.

C. SOCIAL SECURITY ALLOWANCE:

The church, as an employer, should provide an amount equal to at least one-half of the self-employment SS tax of 14%; such an allowance would be taxable income but would ease the burden of the big SS tax bite.

*D. HOUSING THAT PROVIDES:

- (1) a furnishings allowance, all utilities, and an equity development plan for those living in a parsonage; OR
- (2) a housing allowance for those who want to rent or own their homes.

E. BENEFITS SHOULD INCLUDE:

- (1) a pension plan, with a church contribution of 14% of salary basis, which is (a) at least 130% of cash salary plus any furnishings allowance for those living in a parsonage or (b) cash salary plus housing allowance for those with such allowance;
- (2) a family protection plan, including disability insurance, which is an additional 1% of the base used for the annuity;
- (3) group life insurance, which costs \$50 per year;
- (4) medical and health insurance, plus dental care, as provided through the United Church of Christ (e.g. \$3030 in 1985 per family or \$1515 for single);
- (5) continuing education funding;
- (6) sabbatical education funding;
- (7) holiday and vacation time;

(8) maternity/paternity paid leave.

F. ALL PROFESSIONAL EXPENSES:

These expenses are the cost of "doing business" for the church and should be paid directly or fully reimbursed and not considered salary. Included are:

- (1) books, professional subscriptions;
- (2) professional memberships:
- (3) travel expenses and car allowance (church-owned car or travel reimbursement);
- (4) any other expenses incurred by the pastor and directly attributable to the exercise of ministry.

According to the IRS, "housing" includes furnishings and the miscellaneous running expenses (everything except food and maid service) of a home, including appurtenances such as a garage, sidewalks, front and back yards.

- Appendix F RESOLUTION ON ECONOMIC JUSTICE

WHEREAS the Bible asserts the importance of economic justice and affirms that the justice of a community is measured by that community's treatment of the powerless:

Give justice to the weak and the fatherless: maintain the right of the afflicted and the destitute. Rescue the weak and the needy: deliver them from the hand of the wicked. (Psalm 82:3-4)

Come, O blessed of [God], inherit the realm prepared for you from the foundation of the world; for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you me, I was in prison and you came to me.

Truly I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my sisters and brothers, you did it to me. (Matthew 25:34-36, 40b);

WHEREAS in 1984, the 185th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ reaffirmed its commitment to economic justice by adopting the Resolution on Peace with Economic Justice (vote 84-AM-13); and

WHEREAS in 1983, the 14th General Synod of the United Church of Christ established an "Economics and Theology Covenant Group" which is presently drafting a study document intended as an invitation to discuss and debate the issue of faith and economics; and

WHEREAS the United States Roman Catholic bishops have already drawn up a first draft (dated November 11, 1984) of a "Pastoral Letter on Catholic Social Teaching and the U.S. Economy" (copies available for \$3.50 from Origins, United States Catholic Conference, 1312 Massachusetts Avenue NW, Washington, DC 20005), and Dr. Avery Post, President of the United Church of Christ has commended that pastoral letter to the United Church of Christ for study.

THEREFORE BE IT RESCLVED that the 186th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ affirms the following assertions of the Catholic bishops' Pastoral Letter (numbers in brackets refer to paragraphs of that letter):

"Three priority principles should shape our economic policies and institutions both domestically and internationally: [Outline]

First: "The fulfillment of the basic needs of the poor is of the highest priority. Our society has to consider goals such as productivity and economic efficiency, but not to the further detriment of the disadvantaged of our world. This evaluation of decision, policies, and institutions primarily in light of their impact on the poor constitutes the 'preferential option for the poor' which flows from biblical faith." [103]

This support of private ownership does not mean that any individual, group, organization or nation has the right to unlimited accumulation of wealth. Especially when there are so many needy people in our world, the right to own must bow to the higher principles of stewardship and the common use of the goods of creation. There is a 'social mortgage' on private property which implies that private property does not constitute for anyone an absolute or unconditioned right. No one is justified in keeping for his exclusive use what he does not need, when others lack necessities. In our increasingly complex economy, true stewardship may also sometimes demand that the right to own cede to public involvement in the planning or ownership of certain sectors of the economy. The church's teaching opposes collectivist and statist economic approaches. But it also resists the notion that an unimpeded market automatically produces justice.

"We propose here certain necessary elements for a national strategy to deal with poverty...

- 1. A key element in removing poverty is prevention through a healthy economy....
- 2. Vigorous action should be undertaken to remove barriers to full and equal employment for women and minorities...
- Reforms in the tax systems should be implemented that would reduce the burden on the poor....
- 4. Government programs and policies should stimulate and foster self-help programs among the poor....
- Schools should adopt policies leading to higher quality education for poor children,...
- 6. Improved child-care services should be made available to working parents. [208-216]

"Americans have a tendency to blame poverty on laziness, to stigmatize welfare recipients, to exaggerate the benefits actually received by the poor, and to overstate the extent of fraud in welfare payments...We strongly recommend that the United States undertake a thorough reform of the welfare and income support programs. Building on our earlier discussion of moral principles, we propose six guidelines for that effort.

- Public assistance programs should be adequately funded and provide recipients with decent support....
- 2. The United States should establish national eligibility standards and a national minimum benefit level for public assistance programs....
- Public assistance programs should strengthen, rather than weaken, marriage and the family....
- 4. Within the limits just stated, public assistance programs should encourage, rather than penalize, gainful employment....
- 5. The design of public assistance programs should involve the participation of the recipient population and avoid or minimize stigma to clients....
- The administration of public assistance programs should show respect for clients." [222. 226-238]

"Voluntary action to overcome the wounds of injustice through almsgiving, sharing possessions, hospitality, and other forms of charitable assistance is part of the

Christian vocation and the duty of all human beings. Such acts of charity are, at their best, attempts to heal the pain which injustice causes. But all have a larger responsibility to remove the causes of this injustice in the community....The works of charity cannot and should not have to substitute for humane public policy." [123. 124. 208]....

The second priority principle is that "increased participation for the marginalized takes priority over the preservation of privileged concentrations of power, wealth, and income." [104]

"Efforts to generate employment should be aimed specifically at bringing marginalized persons into the labor force; should give priority to long term jobs; should produce goods and services needed by society; should be as economically efficient as possible; and should include both the private and public sectors." [Outline]

"The Church fully supports the right of workers to form unions or other associations to secure their rights to fair wages and working conditions...Along with these rights of workers and unions go a number of important responsibilities....They must not use their collective power to press demands whose fulfillment would damage the rights of others....Racial and sexual discrimination has sometimes marred the exercise of power by the U.S. trade unions. Organized labor has an important responsibility to work positively toward eliminating the effects of the injustice this discrimination has caused." [111. 113]

"The degree of well-being which society enjoys today would be unthinkable without the dynamic figure of the business-person, whose function consists of organizing human labor and services necessary for the prosperity and progress of the community. The rights and responsibilities of persons engaged in business and finance flow from the dual necessity of both protecting their freedom to make these contributions and ensuring that this freedom is accountable to the norms of justice and the common good of society....The work of business people, managers, investors, and financiers is a genuine Christian vocation when carried out as a form of stewardship." [115. 122]

"We want to suggest several specific policy objectives which hold promise of improving the employment picture in the United States....

- 1. We recommend that the nation make a major new policy commitment to achieve full employment....
- 2. We recommend increased support by the government for direct job creation programs targeted on the structurally unemployed....
- 3. We recommend expansion of apprenticeship and job training programs in the private sector which are administered and supported jointly by business, labor unions, and government....
- 4. We recommend the formation of local, state, and national coalitions to press for the design and implementation of job creation strategies....
- 5. We recommend improvement and expansion of job placement services on both the local and national level. [178-185]

"Whatever the difficulties, the need for assistance to the developing world is undeniable....The relationship between expenditures on armaments and on development points to a massive distortion of resources....Rather than promoting U.S. arms sales to countries that cannot afford them, we should be campaigning for an international agreement to reduce this lethal trade." [307. 314]

The third priority principle is that "meeting human needs and increasing participation should be priority targets in the investment of wealth, talent, and human energy...This principle presents a strong moral challenge to policies that put large amounts of talent and capital into the production of luxury consumer goods and military technology while failing to invest sufficiently in education, in the basic infrastructure of our society, or in economic sectors that produce the jobs, goods, and services that we urgently need. [105]

"The founders of our nation...launched an experiment in the protection of civil and political rights that has prospered through the efforts of those who came after them. We believe the time has come for a similar experiment in economic democracy: the creation of an order that guarantees the minimum conditions of human dignity in the economic sphere for every person...All persons really do have rights in the economic sphere and ...society has a moral obligation to take the necessary steps to ensure that no one among us is hungry, homeless, unemployed, or otherwise denied what is necessary to live with dignity." [89. 86]

BE IT FURTHER RESCLVED that the 186th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ communicate this resolution both to the National Conference of Catholic Bishops, and to the United Church of Christ "Economics and Theology Covenant Group" as input for the study document which that Covenant Group is preparing;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the 186th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ direct the Racism and Economic Justice Task Force of the Council for Mission Outreach and Social Responsibility to conduct at least five hearings throughout the state to listen to and engage in dialogue with the churches and community concerns about economics and justice which emerge from the Bishops' Fastoral Letter, the "Economics and Theology Covenant Group" of the UCC, and other related documents. The data and recommendations from these hearings will be compiled and presented in plenary at the 187th Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the 186th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ remind all churches that the goals of this resolution cannot be achieved by human effort alone. Churches and members are urged to seek spiritual renewal as preparation for working toward economic justice.

* Appendix G - RESOLUTION ON "A JUST PEACE"

WHEREAS we are all called to be peacemakers and there can be no lasting peace without justice; and

WHEREAS the Bible presents us with the vision of shalom, linking peace with justice; and

WHEREAS the apostle Paul looks to the church as "first fruits of God's gift of grace and Peace," challenging the church to prepare the way for a larger transformation of all creation into shalom; and

WHEREAS peace is inextricably tied to justice and can only be realized in an atmosphere of equity in which power is shared; and

WHEREAS the United Church of Christ has been for many years in the forefront of advocacy for peace and justice; and

WHEREAS the theology paper "A Just Peace" has been drafted for study and response;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the 186th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ

- 1. Affirms the work of the peace theology development team of the UCC;
- Encourages further efforts made towards the UCC becoming a church committed to peace with justice;
- Affirms the continuation of Peace With Justice as a priority of the UCC.
- 4. Encourages individual members and groups within UCC congregations to read and discuss "A Just Peace":

5. Recommends that all member bodies (Conference, Associations, and local churches) incorporate Peace with Justice into the life of its organization, recognizing it as integral to the faith and necessary to the life of the church.

* Appendix H - RESOLUTION ON PRESUMPTIVE SENTENCING

WHEREAS the Old Testament teaches us that healing in the community must involve a restitution for evil done (Exodus 22:5-6); and

WHEREAS Jesus cared for all people, including the sick, the poor, the foreign Samaritan, the self-destructive prodigal son, and even the tax collector, considered to be a menace to the financial health of the community; and

WHEREAS as Christians, we are called to be concerned about a situation in which, in the midst of great prosperity, low-income people are refused Medicaid benefits, the infant death rate soars, and homeless people walk the streets, and repression against the poor who commit crimes out of frustration with their lives includes stepped-up use of the death penalty in the South, and higher national rates of incarceration in jails and prisons exist than anywhere but South Africa and the Soviet Union; and

WHEREAS there is a need in our criminal justice system for truth in sentencing, for more uniformity of sentencing for similar offenders, and generally for more rationality in the criminal justice process; and

WHEREAS the Governor of Massachusetts has introduced H.5009, Presumptive Sentencing, into the Massachusetts General Court; and

WHEREAS H.5009 has the following goals, provisions, and problems:

- It would revise the criminal code of Massachusetts, which has over 300 years of history; a worthwhile project, but one not to be undertaken in haste.
- 2. It would standardize criminal justice sentencing for violent crimes against persons by requiring judges to sentence within narrow guidelines, or explain fully why they sentenced outside those guidelines. This has merits, but as presently constructed, H.5009 would increase time served to the point that the Department of Corrections estimates that as many as 2,000 beds will have to be added to our already totally overcrowded Massachusetts prisons.
- 3. All studies show that, when prisons are built, they are filled, and it is inconceivable that this bill, if passed, would not cause us to build a major new prison in Massachusetts. Recent average national figures show that \$14,000 per year will be required to maintain each new prisoner. And prison building costs are staggering. Average Massachusetts Department of Corrections projections show that we are already planning to spend up to \$98,000 per bed for prison space during the period 1978-88. The use of this Massachusetts taxpayers' money must be considered against its possible alternative uses for more positive concerns. Prisons are generally considered to be failures at changing the lives of offenders, while alternatives to incarceration have higher success rates.
- 4. H.5009 will not deal with serious criminal justice problems in Massachusetts, such as the fact that women prisoners in Hampden and Berkshire counties are held for trial in Framingham, making contact with attorneys and family extremely difficult, if not impossible. The 1980 census showed that, in this Commonwealth, 1.3 White women per 100,000 were in jail or prison, while 23.2 Black women per 100,000 were incareerated; the rate for all Whites was 39.0 and for all Blacks was 529.2/100,000, and more than one Black male in 100 was in jail or prison in Massachusetts in 1980.
- H.5009 includes a provision for the prosecuting attorney to appeal the sentence if the judge sets it below the sentencing guidelines, a possibility recently approved by the U.S. Supreme Court and never before allowed in the history of our country; and

WHEREAS in Massachusetts the crime rate has declined every year since 1980, while the rate of incarceration has increased, calling us as Christians into questions about our treatment of the less fortunate, and H.5009 would only exacerbate this situation; and

WHEREAS more humane sentencing has been repeatedly called for in our church, most recently by General Synod XIV in 1983 and by the 182nd Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference in 1981; with these declarations, we have joined hands with Christians of many denominations at home and internationally who have called for mercy and humanity in criminal justice practices.

THEREFORE BE IT RESCLVED that the 186th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ opposes H.5009, Presumptive Sentencing, or any other bill in the Massachusetts General Court that would limit individualized treatment of criminal offenders and result in longer periods of incarceration for more persons without improving our prison facilities and strengthening our efforts at rehabilitation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be sent to Governor Michael Dukakis, to Senate President William Bulger, to House Speaker George Keverian, and to Senator Paul Harold and Representative Sal DiMasi, Chairpersons of the Senate and House Criminal Justice Committees; and to Senator Patricia McGovern and Representative Richard Voke, Chairpersons of the Senate and House Ways and Means Committees, and to principal Massachusetts media.

WHEREAS 1986 marks the centennial year of the first Northfield, Massachusetts Quadrennial Student Missionary Conference; and

WHEREAS the congregations of the United Church of Christ in Massachusetts have an unparalleled relationship to the historical development of advanced learning; and

WHEREAS the national mission agencies of the United Church of Christ have relegated responsibility for direct ministries in Higher Education to the Conferences; and

WHEREAS our ecumenical ministries through the United Ministries in Higher Education address many of the concerns of the Massachusetts Conference such as youth and young adults, family life, the peace ministry, minority students, economic and racial justice and ecumenism; and

WHEREAS we wish to reaffirm our ecumenical commitment to United Ministries in Higher Education (UMHE) and to reassess our present tasks and renew our historic mission to higher education:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- The 186th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ hereby declares 1986 to be "The Year to Celebrate our Ministry in Higher Education"; and
- The 186th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ declares its receptiveness to a theme for the 187th Annual Meeting on "Celebrating Our Ministry in Higher Education".

* Appendix J - RESOLUTION ON THE MIDDLE EAST

WHEREAS the Church of Jesus Christ is called to preach release to the oppressed and bring a message of reconciliation to all those in the midst of conflicting interest; and

WHEREAS the Middle East Arms race constitutes a major threat to regional and world peace; and

WHEREAS the 182nd Annual Meeting of the MACUCC in 1981 voted, "We wish to develop a spirit of unity and mutual understanding with the Church of Jesus Christ in the Middle East:" and

WHEREAS the Executive Council of the United Church of Christ in 1983 voted, "This arms race has made the Middle East, arguably the most volatile region of the world, now the most heavily militarized region of the world, with the highest per capita expenditure for arms"; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the 186th Annual Meeting of the MACUCC record its opposition to the sale or distribution of arms by the U.S. government to the governments of of Egypt, Israel and all other nations of the Middle East; and

BE IT FURTHER RESCLVED that our government be urged to make every effort to bring to the negotiating table as soon as possible representatives of all parties concerned with a just and lasting solution to the Middle East crisis, including representatives of the Palestine Liberation Organization; and

BE IT FURTHER RESCLVED that the 186th annual meeting of the MACUCC calls upon the appropriate national instrumentalities of the UCC and the Council for Mission Outreach and and Social Responsibility of the Massachusetts Conference to provide resources for local church study and action related to the Middle East; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be sent to President Reagan, Secretary of State Schultz and the Massachusetts Congressional delegation.

* Appendix K - RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE UFW TABLE GRAPE BOYCOTT

In order to be faithful to the scriptural mandate to establish justice and care for the poor, the National Farm Worker Ministry has endeavored for 64 years to improve the living and working conditions of farm workers, and, since the grape strike of 1965, has supported the efforts of the United Farm Workers of America to gain collective bargaining contracts that secure workers' rights.

WHEREAS the California Agricultural Labor Relations Act was passed in 1975 largely because of the pressure of a nationwide boycott of grapes (according to the Harris poll, 17 million Americans participated), and the officials of the State of California are failing to protect the rights of farm workers, as required by the Agricultural Labor Relations Act of 1975; and

WHEREAS over \$30 million in wages of over 8,000 grape pickers remains unpaid because of delays, up to eight years in length, and arbitrary action by the staff of the Agricultural Labor Relations Board; and

WHEREAS 90% of the grape growers of California are evading the mandate of the law (some by such tactics as transferring ownership of land and re-emerging as different companies) and, in the summer of 1984, have ignored the United Farm Workers' call for collective bargaining; and

WHEREAS the United Farm Workers, under the leadership of Cesar Chavez, has called for a renewed international boycott of all non-union table grapes produced in California; and

WHEREAS we of the religious community are convinced that a boycott is an effective, nonviolent method by which the workers' rights can be re-established;

THEREFORE BE IT RESCLVED that the 186th Annual Meeting of the Massachusetts Conference of the United Church of Christ hereby endorses the United Farm Workers' boycott of all non-union California table grapes and calls upon its members and all persons concerned with justice not to buy non-union table grapes.
