1. There will be an Eclipse of the Sun on the 25th of March, at 5h. 1m. in the afternoon, invisible to us on account of the Moon's southern latitude.

2. There will be an Eclipse of the Moon on the 9th of April, in the evening, visible

Digits eclipsed, 10 deg. 51m. on the Sun's south limb.

This eclipse will pass central and annular from Michigan through a part of Upper Canada, Lake Erie, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Virginia, and enter the Atlantic Ocean near Cape Charles. The Central eclipse will pass a little south of Washington, but the annular eclipse will extend to New York one way, and nearly to Raleigh the other. The duration of the ring, at places where the eclipse is central, will be about 6m. 6s. of time.

4. There will be an Eclipse of the Moon on the 3d of October, at 10h. 2m. in the morning, consequently invisible.

The Convention of the Congregational Ministers in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts

Is a voluntary Association, embracing all the Congregational Clergy of the Commonwealth, but vested with no particular authority or control over the churches.

Their meeting is held in Boston, on the last Wednesday in May, annually, at half past three, P. M. and the following day. After transacting the usual business of the Convention, a sermon is delivered in public before them, and a collection made for the charitable purpose of relieving the indigent Widows of Congregational clergymen.

For the purpose of investigating cases of necessity, and of application for the charity of the Convention, there are two standing Committees; a Central Committee, chosen centrally, and a Reporting Committee, whose members reside in different parts of the State. The Reporting Committee are required, each year, to investigate the circumstances of the objects of this charity, whether already on the list, or needing, or applying the first time for aid, and make a particular statement to the Central Committee, directed to the Scribe of the Convention, at least one week before the meeting of the Convention. Should any member neglect so to do for two successive years, his place in the Reporting Committee shall be vacated. The Central Committee receive from the members of the Reporting Committee applications and statements of facts in behalf of subjects of the charity of the Convention, and, having considered the same, are to judge of the persons to be relieved, and the proportion to be given to each, and make report to the Convention, on the first day of their meeting, annually.

The statements of the members of the Reporting Committee are expected to contain answers to the following questions—

1. What is her age?
2. What are the number, the sex, the ages, and the circumstances of her children?
3. What is a fair estimate of her property?
4. What is her ability to help herself?
5. What connexions has she, who are bound to afford her assistance? And in what way do they assist her?
6. What is her income?
7. What peculiar circumstances render her an object of charity; or make it desirable that she should have aid this year?

The Censors for the Society at Large, and for the first Medical District, meet in the city of Boston, for the examination of candidates for the practice of medicine, surgery, and midwifery, on the Thursday next preceding the annual meeting of the Society, as provided in the Act of Incorporation; and on the last Wednesdays of January and July.

Those for the Second Medical District, in Worcester, on the Wednesday following the third Monday in June. Those for the third Medical District, in Northampton, on the Wednesday following the third Tuesday in September. Those for the fourth Medical District, in Pittsfield, on the day previous to the day of Commencement of the medical institution in that place.

By an Act of the Legislature of this Commonwealth, passed February 10, 1819, it is provided, That no person entering upon the practice of Physic or Surgery, after the first day of July, 1819, shall be entitled to the benefit of law, for the recovery of any debt or fee accruing from his professional services, unless he shall, previously to rendering those services, have been licensed by one of the foregoing Boards of Censors, or shall have been graduated a Doctor of Medicine in Harvard University, and shall have deposited a copy of his license, or diploma, with the clerk of the town in which he resides.

Medical School in Boston.

The Massachusetts Medical College, an edifice belonging to Harvard University, was erected in Boston in 1815; and is situated in Mason Street.

The *Medical Lectures* of Harvard University begin in this building annually, 1st Wed. in November, and continue three months. For one month after the close of the Lectures, the dissecting room of the Medical College will be open; also some Lectures will be given to those of the class who may remain. They will also be admitted for the above time to the practice of the Massachusetts General Hospital. The students attending the Lectures are admitted to the Medical and Surgical practice of the Massachusetts General Hospital, and to Clinical Lectures by the Professors of Surgery, and Theory and Practice of Physic, without fee. The fee for a whole course of Lectures is \$70. The students have abundant opportunity for practical Anatomy.

SECOND CIRCUIT.

In *Connecticut*, at New Haven, on the last Wednesday of April; and at Hartford, on the 17th of September.

In *Vermont*, at Windsor, on the 21st day of May; and at Rutland, on the 3d of October.

In *New York*, last Monday in February, July, and October, and 1st Monday in April.

DISTRICT COURTS.

In *Maine*, at Portland, the first Tuesday in June, and the 1st Tuesday in December; and at Wiscasset, the last Tuesday in February, and on the first Tuesday of Sept.

In *New Hampshire*, at Portsmouth, 3d Tuesday in March and September; and at Exeter, 3d in June and December.

In *Vermont*, at Rutland, 6th of October; and at Windsor, 24th of May.

In *Massachusetts*, at Boston, 3d Tuesday in March, and 4th in June, 2d in September, and 1st in December.

In *Rhode Island*, at Newport, 2d Tuesday in May, and 3d in October; at Providence, 1st Tuesday in August, and February.

In *Connecticut*, at New Haven, 4th Tuesday in February and August; at Hartford, 4th Tuesday in May and November.

Exclusive of the above mentioned stated Courts, the District Judges have power to hold Special Courts, in their respective Districts, at their discretion.

ARMY REGISTER.

On the 19th of May, 1837, an alteration was made in the line marking the limits of the two great military divisions. This line now commences at the mouth of the Mississippi, thence proceeding up that river to Cassville, in the Territory of Wisconsin; and thence north to the line of demarkation between the United States and Canada. All west of that line forms the *Western Division*; and all east, the *Eastern Division*.

The two Divisions are subdivided into the following seven Departments.

Department 1. All the country embraced within the Western Division above the 37th deg. N. Lat.

Department 2. All the country within the Western Division below the 37th deg. N. Lat.

Department 3. The States of Kentucky, Tennessee, Mississippi, Louisiana, Alabama, Georgia, and the Territory of Florida.

Department 4. South Carolina, North Carolina, and Virginia.

Department 5. Maryland, Delaware, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and New York.

Department 6. Connecticut, Rhode Island, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Vermont, and Maine.

Department 7. Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, and that part of the Wisconsin Territory embraced within the Eastern Division.

THE MARINE TELEGRAPH OBSERVATORY,

Central Wharf, under the direction of Mr. J. R. Parker.

This Observatory will enable vessels, by the assistance of only 7 flags, (admitting of 9330 changes,) to communicate intelligence to each other with ease when they are at sea, and to the shore when they are approaching it, and to announce their arrival in our bay.

The name of the vessel, her passage, and the port from whence she came, is communicated from the pilot boats in the bay, to the outer station, located upon Point Alerton Hill at Nantasket, from thence to the repeating station at George's Island, or to the maritime station at Rainsford Island, thence to the Observatory on Central Wharf, all which communications are immediately transmitted to the City Hall Reading Room, to the Insurance Offices, and to the owners of the vessels thus announced. Already 1500 sail of vessels have adopted this system.

In connection with this establishment, Mr. Parker, the superintendent, has a Telegraphic Repeating Station on the cupola of the City Hall, to designate and give the following information, by hoisting flags and balls.

A *red and yellow* conversation flag at the *south side* of the cupola, denotes the arrival of the Southern Land Mail; and black balls hoisted here, tell the arrival of *ships* in the harbor, and for *barques* white balls are used. To denote the arrival of the New York Steam Boat Mail, a *white flag* is displayed on the north side of the cupola; black balls are also used here to give the arrival of *brigs*.

In cases of fire, *red and yellow* balls are displayed here to give information as follows:—

Fire in the southeastern section of the city, denoted by a red and yellow ball on the southeast corner of the cupola.

Fire in the southwestern section of the city, denoted by a red and yellow ball upon the southwest corner of the cupola.

Fire in the northwestern section of the city, denoted by a red and yellow ball upon the northwest corner of the cupola.

Fire in the northeastern section of the city, denoted by a red and yellow ball upon the northeast corner of the cupola.

Treasury Notes. There have been issued from the Treasury Department of the United States, \$2,992,989 in Treasury Notes, to the 31st of Dec. 1837.

East Boston was first occupied by Samuel Maverick in 1629, where he built a fort, mounting four guns. Mr. Maverick was an Episcopalian, and was esteemed "the most hospitable man in all the country, giving entertainment to all comers gratis"

In 1633, the General Court made a grant of this island to Mr. Maverick, he paying to the Court "a fat wether or a fat hog annually, or £10 in money." The title passed to George Briggs in 1650, in 1668 to Richard Newbold, and from him to Sir Thomas Temple, from Temple to Col. Samuel Shrimpton, and from his heirs to the East Boston Company. Mr. Henry H. Williams had been in possession of this island from 1793.

In 1814 the citizens of Boston erected a fort on its eastern extremity, called Fort Strong. In 1831 a few capitalists purchased this island, containing 660 acres, with only one house, portioned it out into streets and lots, and have made it an important part of the city. It has now over 100 houses, a Sugar Refinery, a Cast Iron Foundry, a Church, an extensive Hotel, and the Depot of the Eastern Rail Road.

Charles River Bridge was opened for passengers on the 17th of June, 1786. Length, 1503 feet. Cost \$50,000.

West Boston Bridge opened 23d of Nov. 1793. Length, 2483 feet. Cost \$77,000.

South Boston Bridge opened in the summer of 1805. Length, 1551 feet. Cost \$56,000.

Craigie's Bridge opened Aug. 30th, 1809. Length, 2796 feet. Prison Point Bridge is 1821 feet in length.

Western Avenue opened July 2d, 1821. It is a mile and a half in length.

South Boston Free Bridge opened in 1828.

Warren Bridge opened Dec. 25th, 1828. Length, 1390 feet. Declared free March 2d, 1836.

Boston Common. The malls around the Common, contain a little more than 7 acres. The Common, enclosed by these malls, including the burial ground, contains 42 acres. The flats west of Charles street contain 25 acres; making in all 75 acres.

Dr. Franklin died at Philadelphia, April 17th, 1790, aged 84, and bequeathed \$4,444, to be loaned by the city of Boston to young married artificers. This fund has accumulated to the amount of \$25,636,75.

An Act to Reduce the rate of damages on Inland Bills of Exchange.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

SEC. 1. The third section of the thirty-third chapter of the Revised Statutes is hereby so far amended, as that damages on Inland Bills of Exchange, drawn after the passage of this Act, shall be reduced from the rates therein specified to the following, that is to say; on bills payable in the States of Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Rhode Island, Connecticut and New York, two per cent.; on bills payable in New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Maryland and Delaware, three per cent; on bills payable in Virginia and the District of Columbia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Georgia, four per cent.; and if payable elsewhere, within any other of the United States or the territories thereof, five per centum.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect from and after the passing of the same. [Approved by the Governor, April 20, 1837.]

Observations.—1. The nearer the time of the moon's change, first quarter, full and last quarter, are to *midnight*, the fairer will the weather be during the seven days following.

2. The space for this calculation occupies from ten at night till two next morning.

3. The nearer to *mid-day* or *noon*, the phases of the moon happen, the more foul or wet weather may be expected during the next seven days.

4. The space for this calculation occupies from ten in the forenoon to two in the afternoon. These observations refer principally to the summer, though they affect spring and autumn nearly in the same ratio.

5. The moon's change, first quarter, full, and last quarter, happening during six of the afternoon hours, i. e. from four to ten, may be followed by fair weather; but this is mostly dependent on the *wind*, as is noted in the table.

6. Though the weather, from a variety of irregular causes, is more uncertain in the latter part of autumn, the whole of winter, and the beginning of spring, yet, in the main, the above observations will apply to those periods also.
