TO THE PUBLIC.

On the recurrence of our 8th edition of the Baltimore Director; we deem it unnecessary to dwell long. We have on former occasions sufficiently explained the difficulties of so arduous a publication, the impossibility of using any rule in spelling person's names—the vague information given by children, servants, illiterate persons, and the unwillingness of others to have their residence known, the many persons who do business in one house and street, and dwell in another, both individuals and firms, indeed some are engaged in three or four kinds of business in different parts of the city, (therefore a name being repeated in such a case is unavoidable, as the person who calls at each place, cannot tell it is the same, and is no error,) almost all names, admitting of various orthography, viz. Nicholson Nicolson, Vicary Vickery, Stuart Stewart, &c. a person may look for a name in the alphabetical order by which he spells it, and not finding it, conclude it is not in the book, when he should use such other spelling as will produce the name until he find it, (by so doing he will find very few omissions. No publisher of a record of the names of householders in this or any other city will venture to say there are none.)

The publisher has employed careful men to call at every house in Baltimore for the address of the tenant. This is the only correct mode of doing, and the name of an acquaintance, or an old residenter, is just as liable to be omitted as any other. In the "Catalogue of Avenues, Streets, Lanes, &c., as enlarged by the Commissioners, and laid down by their surveyor," which is the only one we could obtain, complaint has been made against us, that their location, and direction is not sufficiently plain; this we cannot help in any other way in the present edition than by our map, but if we live to issue another, we pomise to endeavour to make such correction. The want of numbers being on the houses uniformly throughout the city is another considerable difficulty in our way of giving exact direction, which we would gladly correct if it were our province,

TO THE PUBLIC.

Determined to give value for what we receive for our publication, we have with much labour, added to this edition a "View of Baltimore," giving concisely, its Topography, History, Population and Health—Privileges of the Corporation, City Government, &c.—Public Buildings for civil purposes, Improvements, &c. Buildings for the purpose of Literature, Science, Charity, and Public Amusements—Manufactures—Commerce—Literature, Benevolent Societies, and Miscellaneous—which we hope will be found both interesting and useful.

The price of the book with a map of the city is but \$1,50 \$1,25 without the map, and admitting that its defects could be magnified two fold, we consider it worth that amount. We have printed but a small edition, no more than we expect to sell. For the generous and honourable support tendered us from individuals we offer our grateful acknow-

iedgements. We shall ever be proud to serve such.

BALTIMORE,

ITS GEOGRAPHICAL SITUATION—HISTORY—POPULATION—
PUBLIC BUILDINGS—MANUFACTURES—COMMERCE—PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS—LITERATURE, ETC.

Chapter I .- Topography of Baltimore.

Our purpose being to present a clear and concise view of our City, its present condition, its government, its manufactures, its commerce, its public buildings and other improvements; (together with a variety of other information which we take not to be generally available;) we intend to confine ourselves to plain matter of fact; preferring accuracy to ornament. As we write, in part, for the benefit of those who are not acquainted with the localities of Baltimore, we propose in the first place, to give a brief geographical description of the City; with which the reader will find it necessary to become acquainted, in order to have a full conception of some other subjects which we propose to treat of.

The city of Baltimore is situated on a creek or inlet of the Patapsco river, commonly called the basin, the average breadth of which is a quarter of a mile, its length one mile and three quar-The depth of water for more than half the length of this inlet is sufficient to float ships of the largest dimensions, and the harbor which it forms is uncommonly spacious and commodious. As yet, the city is chiefly confined to the north side of the basin. but there can be no doubt that in the course of a very few years, it will extend along the other side also. Indeed, there are already many streets laid out in that quarter; manufactories and works of various descriptions are erected there, and every thing seems to promise that that district will, ere long, be the centre of considerable business. At the same time, the City is rapidly progressing along the northern side of the harbor, to which result the efforts of the Canton Company, aided by an immense capital, contribute in an eminent degree.

The site of Baltimore is, in most parts hilly; a circumstance which, on some accounts, is far from being a disadvantage. In the neighborhood, there are a number of streams, some of which intersect the city; the principal one of these latter is Jones's Falls, (by some termed the northern branch of the Patapsco,) which, as it approaches the basin, may well be called a small

It passes through the city in a direction varying little from north and south. This fine stream is of incalculable benefit in affording the city a constant supply of pure and excellent water, which is raised by machinery, and distributed by pipes through every street. Nor is this the only advantage for which the citizens of Baltimore are indebted to Jones's Falls;—it gives motion to a number of milts and factories, and that portion of the stream which runs through the City, answers many purposes of True, the falls, are productive of one evil, a common sewer. which, at the first glance, appears almost to neutralize the benefits we have just mentioned. The ground through which this stream flows being of a loose nature, and having a very considerable descent, the consequence is that, (especially after copious rains,) a large alluvial deposit is carried into the basin, the removal of which deposit is a constant expense to the city. As a remedy for this evil, it has been proposed to divert the course of the falls, by means of a canal or tunnel, to Herring Run, which is four miles distant from the city. The expense of this scheme it is thought would not exceed a sum the interest on which is now expended in temporary removals of the inconvenience. be observed, however, that to this evil, so called, the City is in a great measure indebted for the vast improvements about the City Block; where many acres of good ground have been formed of the aforesaid deposits, raised by the mud-machines and applied to that purpose. The space thus recovered from the river will, at some time, (we have reason to think,) be as valuable as any other ground in Baltimore; besides the health and beauty of that portion of the city have been greatly improved by the process of its formation.

When it has been stated that there are many streams in the neighborhood—and that the ground is generally hilly, the reader will probably suppose that the water power is considerable. This is truly the case, and in this respect Baltimore is unrivalled by any other city on the American continent. On this topic we shall enlarge when speaking of Manusactories, Mills, &c. See chap. viii.

From those immediate topographical advantages of Baltimore, we proceed to speak of those which, though more remote, are of the greatest importance, as being highly conducive to her prosperity. Patapsco river empties into that magnificent sheet of water called Chesapeake Bay, at about the distance of fourteen miles from the city. This bay also receives the waters of the Susquehanna, the Potomac, the Choptank and numerous other streams, and is connected at Capes Charles and Henry with the Atlantic Ocean. In a commercial point of view, the benefits of this situation are incalculable. Besides a favorable vicinity to the ocean which it affords, the tributary streams of the Chesapeake open a communication, by water, with a vast extent of country, including distant portions of several different States. On the waters of the Susquebanna alone, immense quantities of mer-

chandise of various kinds are transported to Baltimore from the interior of Pennsylvania and New York. The Potomac offers a medium of communication with Virginia and North Carolina, and the Choptank, Elk, Pocomoke and several other rivers, serve to convey many valuable commodities from the Eastern Shore of Maryland, and afford a market in that section of the state for the manufactures and imports of Baltimore. For further information on this subject we refer the reader to chapter ix.

Besides the water communication just spoken of, the trade of Baltimore carried on with the back country by means of railroads and turn-pikes, is very considerable. In our present division, we mention this fact only to show the advantages of our location in this respect; as our City thereby becomes the mart of a large and wealthy district, which the progress of internal improvement continues to make more and more extensive. See

Chapter ix.

On the whole, the geographical situation of Baltimore combines every requisite to health and prosperity, and we are happy to add that there exists among her citizens a spirit of enterprize and patriotism sufficient to develope and improve the benefits she

has received from the hand of nature.

Chapter II.-History.

The early history of Baltimore presents rather an unpromising aspect, when we consider the unexampled growth and the rapid increase in commerce and manufactures for which the subsequent annals of this city are particularly remarkable. For nearly one hundred years after the formation of the county, the progress of improvement was exceedingly slow, and there were few indications of that prosperity which, at no distant period, was to clevate

Baltimore into the first rank of American cities.

The county of Baltimore was formed in the year 1659, and just seventy years after, the legislature passed an act for erecting a town, to be called Baltimore Town, on the north side of Patapsco river; for which purpose sixty acres of land were designated and accordingly laid out into the same number of lots. From this time to 1758 the place continued, to be a very inconsiderable village, and as late as 1792 the population was only 13,503. The war of the revolution, during its continuance, doubtless had a malign effect on the growth of the town, as we find that after that great struggle was over, it began to make rapid advances towards prosperity. Much of this effect may also be ascribed to the removal of the old government and the establishment of a new one. Baltimore became the county town in 1798, previously to which time the courts had been held at Joppa, a small village then lying about twenty-five miles from

the present site of Baltimore. This place, which was once the rival of Baltimore, and was believed by many persons to be the future capital of the State of Maryland, has not now a single house standing. A few scattered bricks and stones alone mark

the spot where the village once stood.

Baltimore became a chartered city in 1796, and from that time her march has been onward, (with a few draw-backs and interruptions,) to the present day. A few minor particulars in the early history of the city may be of some interest to the reader, and with these we shall conclude the chapter. The first house in the limits of the city was built by Mr. David Jones, to whom the Falls are indebted for a name. This building, (probably of logs,) was erected near the present site of Finn's bridge, in the year 1696. The first brick house was built by an Irish gentleman, named Fotterall, in 1740. The first wharf was commenced in the same year, at the south end of Calvert street. market house was erected. The first engine company, (the present Mechanical,) was formed in 1769. The first newspaper was This publication was called the "Maryland commenced in 1773. Journal and Baltimore Advertiser." The editor and proprietor was a Mr. Wm. Goddard of Rhode Island.

Thus much of the history of Baltimore we thought sufficient for our present purpose, and for this we are chiefly indebted to Mr. Griffith's "Annals," a book with which every Baltimorean should be intimately acquainted, and which many others may

peruse with pleasure and profit.

Chapter III .- Population, Health, and Mortality.

From the best data which we have been enabled to obtain, we suppose the present population of Baltimore to be at least 100,000. At the taking of the last census in 1830, the number of inhabitants was 80,625, of which number nearly 19,000 were colored,—slaves 4,100. The increase of the colored population is supposed, in ordinary circumstances, to exceed that of the whites, but as the climate of this city is rather unfavorable to the health of the blacks, and the deaths among them are comparatively more numerous than among the whites, it is probable that nearly the same proportion in numbers is preserved. Supposing this to be the case, the present white population will be about 76,500, the colored 23,500,—5,200 slaves. Total 100,000. In this estimate, we do not pretend to be very exact; which, at this time, cannot be expected; but if there is any error in the calculation, it is most probable that we fall short of the true amount, rather than exceed it.

In 1790, the population was 13,503: in 1800, it amounted to 26,614, the increase in ten years thirty-three and two-thirds per

cent. In the year 1820, the population was 62,738; increase in ten years seventy-six and a quarter per cent. In 1830, the population was 80,622, increase in ten years twenty-eight and a half per cent. Average increase every ten years, for forty years, fifty-eight and three quarters per cent. Supposing the present population to be 100,000, the increase since the taking of the last census, (seven years,) would be twenty-one per cent; which is equal, in proportion, to thirty per cent in ten years.

In speaking of the climate of this city, and its unfavorable influence on the blacks, the reader must not suppose that the white inhabitants share this inconvenience. On the contrary, as it respects them, there is no American city more salubrious, as the weekly reports of our Board of Health are sufficient to testify.

The following is the official statement of the mortality during

There is an idea prevalent in many parts of the country that the State of Maryland is generally unhealthy; and indeed for this hypothesis we have the authority of some eminent geographers, but as far as it concerns Baltimore, (at least,) the opinion is certainly very erroneous. We admit that the low, level district which constitutes the Eastern Shore of Maryland, and several other counties which border on the Potomac and Chesapeake, partake of those inconveniences to which all regions, similarly situated, are more or less liable; and we are not prepared to deny that the situation of Baltimore did originally share, in some degree, in the same inconveniences. But even before the hand of art had removed some of the former defects of the location, the site of Baltimore, presenting an undulated surface, was eminently superior in salubrity to the level tracts we have just men-Still, however, in those early periods of our history, there was much room for improvement, and the present race of our citizens will find it difficult to believe in the extent of the Those parts of the original alterations which have been made. town of Baltimore which were immediately adjacent to the water were chiefly of a very marshy nature; and some places indeed were occasionally overflowed by the tide; which could not fail to produce effects very prejudicial to the health of the inhabitants. The ground on which the Centre or Marsh Market now stands, was a mere bog, which extended along the present site of Frederick street as far as Gay street. It is unnecessary to inform the residents of our city that the said bog has entirely disappeared, and that the portion of the City which it formerly occupied is now closely covered with substantial buildings, for which the ingenuity of man has provided a secure foundation. At a much later period than that to which we have just referred, a considerable alteration, (which must materially improve the health of the city,) has taken place in the vicinity of what is called the City Block. A large portion of low marshy ground has been filled up and effectually secured from inundation, so as to present the miasma which must arise from stagnant water and vegetable

matter, alternately overflowed and exposed to the rays of the sun. The improvements about Harris's creek may be regarded as having similar effects in that neighborhood. Thus, the causes which might formerly affect, in some measure, the health of Baltimore, having been completely removed, we are enabled to make the assertion, with confidence, that in the enjoyment of the greatest of earthly blessings we are not surpassed by any other city in the Union.

Chapter IV.—Privileges of the Corporation, City Government, &c.

Baltimore sends annually four delegates to the lower branch of the State Legislature; the city and county send two representatives to the Congress of the United States. The City is governed by a Mayor and City Council, the latter in two branches. The Mayor and the Second Branch of the City Council are elected by the people every two years; the First Branch is elected annually. The Mayor is required to be at least twenty-five years of age, ten years a citizen of the United States, and to possess property to the amount of \$500. The members of the Second Branch of the Council must have the same property qualification, and the members of the First Branch must be assessed to the amount of \$300 each.

The Mayor and City Council have the right of passing all ordinances whose operations are immediately confined to the city; such as those for lighting and paving the streets, licensing hacks, carts and drays, to provide for the security of the City

from fire, contagion, &c. and to regulate the police.

The City is divided into twelve wards; each of which wards sends two members to the First Branch, and one to the Second Branch of the City Council. The following is a list of the municipal offices, with their present incumbents and their respective salaries.

The Mayor is, by virtue of his office, a justice of the peace. It is highly important to the welfare of the city that a man of integrity, energy and abilities should fill this office, which is by no means a sinecure. The members of the City Council receive a per diem of \$1 50 for their services; these also should be persons of sound discretion, and less devoted to private interest than to the public welfare. We admit that it is sometimes extremely difficult to discover persons who possess the latter qualification, but they who make the greatest approximation to this species of excellence should always receive the preference. When we consider that to the hands of these officers the destinies of a city are almost entirely committed, those remarks will not appear to be either unnecessary or misplaced.

Chapter V.—Public Buildings for Civil Purposes; Improvements, &c.

In this, and some of the following chapters, we intend to adhere as much as possible to an alphabetical arrangement, which we presume will be best adapted to the purpose of reference.

Alms-House.—This building is situated two and a half miles from the courthouse, on the Franklin road. It has a very handsome appearance, and is under the best possible management. It was formerly the country seat of Dennis A. Smith, Esq. but was

altered to suit present purposes. Cost. including the alteration, \$100,000. It is managed by five trustees, who, at present are William Dickinson, John King, Matthew Bennet, Samuel Rankin.

Arcades.—The Arcades now in use, are two in number, viz the Maryland Arcade, extending from Market Space to Frederick street, between Second and Water streets, and the Lexington Arcade, near the Lexington Market. In both are sold dry-goods, toys, fancy articles, &c.

Armistead Monument.—This is placed in a Gothic niche, behind the Calvert street City Spring. It was erected to the memory of Col. George Armistead, as a tribute of gratitude and respect from his fellow-citizens, for his gallant defence of Fort

McHenry, Sept. 13, 1814.

Arsenal.—Seven miles from Baltimore, at a little village called Pikesville, on the route of the Reisterstown turnpike, is situated a United States Arsenal; a small, but commodious establishment,

very well adapted to the purpose.

Bath House.—The Colonade Baths are situated in Saratoga street, between Calvert and North streets. This establishment has been fitted up with taste and elegance, but seems not to

receive the encouragement it deserves.

Battle Monument.—This elegant structure is placed in Monument Square. It commemorates the battle of North Point and the bombardment of Fort McHenry. It is of white marble, adorned with suitable devices of exquisite workmanship, and surmounted by a statue representing the presiding divinity of Baltimore. It was designed by Maximilian Godefroy. The sculpture is by Signior Capellano, an Italian artist.

Bazaar.—The Bazaar runs from Harrison street to the Falls, a little north of Baltimore street. It is divided into a number of stalls for the sale of dry goods, groceries, fancy articles, china and glass ware, &c. It was built by Mr. Jacob Daley, and cost

\$28,000.

City Hall.—This is a very plain building, but well suited to the purpose to which it is now applied. It was formerly Peale's Museum, and is situated in Holliday street, a little south of Saratoga. This building was purchased by the City from the stockholders of the Museum, and cost \$10,000, including the necessary alterations. It contains the offices of the Mayor, Register, City Commissioners and Port Wardens, Commissioners of Health and City Collector; also, the halls appropriated to the City Council, which are on the second floor and exceedingly handsome and suitable apartments.

Court House—Is situated at the corner of Lexington street and Monument Square, nearly in the centre of the twelve wards. This edifice is of brick, ornamented with pilasters of the Ionic order. Being on the edge of a declivity, the base in front is elevated ten or twelve feet above the level of Monument Square. A paved court yard surrounds the building. The Court House was much injured by fire in 1834, but it is now restored to its for-

mer elegance. The original cost of this building was \$150,000.



Fountains.—There are four public Fountains, or City Springs, in Baltimore. 1st in Calvert street, east of Saratoga. 2nd At the corner of Charles and Camden streets. 3d At the corner of Eden and Pratt streets, Fell's Point. 4th At the head of the Centre Market House. Exclusive of these, there are several smaller fountains near the Point Market. The three first named are not only conveniences but ornaments to the city, being surmounted by domes and placed in enclosures, adorned with trees, grass plots, gravel walks, &c. The water issuing from all these fountains is of the finest quality.

Fort McHenry.—This celebrated fortification is on the point of the peninsula which forms the southern boundary of Baltimore harbor. A better situation for a fort could scarcely be conceived. It is built on a regular and scientific plan, and its abilities for defence were well tested on the memorable 13th of September 1814. It belongs to the general government, which keeps there two or

three companies of artillerists.

General Dispensary.—In Holliday street, nearly opposite the theatre, president, Luke Tiernan, treasurer, Matthew Smith, attending physicians, Wm. E. Coale, G. H. Wetherall, Wm. Grier.

Hospital.—The Maryland Hospital is situated on the old Joppa road, on a rising ground, about a mile and a half from the court house. This building makes a beautiful appearance, and has within it accommodations for the "diseased of all maladies." One department is appropriated to lunatics, who are sent hither from all parts of the state. The hospital is of brick, ornamented with a cupola. The cost, including that of the grounds attached to it, was \$140,000. Potter's field, a free grave yard, is connected with the hospital.

House of Refuge.—The Legislature of Maryland, at December session 1830, passed an act of incorporation for a house of refuge in the City of Baltimore, and appropriated \$20,000 for the purpose of procuring the necessary buildings, but it seems the design is not yet carried into execution, for want of sufficient

funds.

Infirmary, -- Attached to the University of Maryland, situated in Lombard, west of Green street. Patients are received at three dollars per week, attended by the best physicians and nursed by the Sisters of Charity. 'This place is also used as the marine hose

pital of the port.

Jail.—The Baltimore County Jail is placed on the northern precincts of the City, near Jones's Falls. It was built in 1800, and cost \$90,000. We are told that it was modelled after an old Italian castle, having two circular turrets at each end. The jail is under the immediate charge of a warden, who acts under the supervision of a board of visiters appointed by the executive of

the State. The present warden is Mr. John Heron, the visiters are Messrs. James Carroll, George Williams, Robert Hamilton, John Hillen and William Pinkney.

Law Buildings.—An extensive range, occupied by the gentlemen of the bar as offices, &c. They are on the site of the former

Athenæum, destroyed by fire in 1834.

Lazaretto and quarantine grounds.—This is a large building, with rather a sombre aspect, but answers the purpose for which it was intended; viz. to prevent the introduction of contagious diseases into the city. An ordinance requires that "all vessels arriving from beyond sea, between the last of April and the first of November be detained at the quarantine grounds, if the health officers think necessary." The Lazaretto is on the point of land at the entrance of the harbour, immediately opposite to Fort

McHenry.


Market Houses .- The principal market house in Baltimore is the Centre or Marsh Market, situated between Baltimore and Water streets, one square W. of Jones's Falls. It consists of two buildings of suitable dimensions. 2d. Lexington Market is the next in importance, its location is in Lexington street, between Eutaw and Green streets. 3d. The next is the Hanover Market. at the corner of Hanover and Camden streets. This building is square, the only one thus shaped in the city. 4th. Then comes the Fell's Point Market, in Market street, between Alice Anna and Thames streets. 5th. The Bel Air Market, in Forrest street, between Gay and Low streets. 6th. The Richmond Market, at he intersection of North Howard and Richmond streets. These narkets are generally well supplied with fruit, vegetables, meat and poultry. The Fish Market is in Second street, near the Falls. The Horse Market is held in Swan street, near the Cenre Market House. The market days are as follow. On Monlays and Thursdays at Hanover; on Tuesdays and Fridays A. M. at Lexington and Fell's Point Market; P. M. of the same ays at Bel Air Market; on Wednesdays and Saturdays, at the Centre, Fish and Horse Markets; on Saturday nights at Centre, exington, Hanover and Fell's Point. For the names of the

Monuments.—The public spirit and gratitude of our City is displayed in those splendid memorials which she has erected in honor of the glorious dead. There are three Monuments in Baltimore which owe their origin to public munificence, and on this foundation rests our claim to the title of the "Monumental City;" an enviable distinction. See Armistead, Battle and Washington Monuments.

Odd Fellows' Hall.—A very handsome and appropriate building, in North Gay street, near the Shot Tower. See chap. x.

Penitentiary.—The Maryland Penitentiary is in the immediate vicinity of the county jail, and on the same square of ground. It is of brick; the main building being square, and having two wings of extensive dimensions. Exclusive of these, there are a number of work-shops for the different trades. The wall which

ourrounds the Penitentiary is several feet higher than that which encloses the jail. The sleeping apartments of the prisoners are arranged in a manner very similar to the stalls of an arcade. The prisoners are employed as weavers, comb-makers, shoemakers, hatters, stone-cutters, &c. The present keeper is Mr. Joseph Owens; directors Wm. McDonald, Thomas Kelso, Thomas W. Hall, James W. McCulloh, Dr. H. W. Barclay, Dr. Thomas E. Bond, John G. Proud, Wm. H. Hanson, Wm. Jenkins, Wm. G. Howard, Col. S. D Walker; one vacancy by death. The directors are appointed annually by the governor and coun-At this time the Penitentiary contains three hundred and ninety-five criminals, three hundred and thirty-one males and sixty-four females.

Post Office.—At the north east corner of North and Fayette streets: For rates of postage, arrival and departure of the mail,

State Tobacco Warehouses.—There are three in the City; 1st. No. 1 and 2 at the lower end of Dugan's wharf; and No. 3 at the

intersection of Light and Conway streets.

· Telegraph.—This great public convenience is erected on a considerable eminence, called Federal Hill, on the south side of It corresponds with another station on Bodkin point and again with the windows of the dome of the Exchange. that news of the arrival of a vessel thirty miles from the city may be transmitted in a few minutes to the latter establishment.

Watch-houses.—There are three watch-houses in the city: 1st. called the Eastern, at the corner of Market and Alice Anna streets, Fell's Point; 2d. called the Middle, in North street, corner of Orange alley; 3d. or Western, in Paca, near Fayette street. The custom of bringing the prisoners confined in the watchhouses by night to a public examination the next morning, (a custom which prevails in other cities, with doubtful advantage,) is dispensed with in Baltimore. For trifling offences, the punishment of a night's incarceration is deemed sufficient, without adding an exposure which cannot fail to make the culprit more hardened and shameless. They who are detected in offences of greater magnitude, of course, meet with more suitable punishment.

Water Works.—These are situated at the corner of Calvert and Centre streets. Their use is to raise the waters of Jones's Falls, to be distributed through the city. Two spacious basins or reservoirs have been built near the water works, which are enclosed in a very handsome manner, so as to be an ornament as well as a work of utility. The water works are the property

of an incorporated company.


The Public Store.—This superb building rapidly advancing towards completion, is situated S. E. corner of Gay and Water sts., is 98 feet fronting Gay st. by 72 feet Water st. in dimensions, four stories high, basement granite, and is admirably adapted for a convenient and safe depot for custom house stores, being completely fire proof.

Chapter VI.—Public Buildings for Religious Purposes.

Baptist Churches.—1st. Baptist, at the corner of Lombard and Sharp streets. This building is in a circular form, having a portico, with six Doric columns on the west side. The architect was Mr. Mills. Cost \$50,000. Pastor Reverend S. P. Hill; 2d. Baptist, in Fleet street, Fell's Point, pastor, J. Healy, 3d. or Ebenezer Baptist, North Calvert, between Saratoga and Lexington streets. Mount Zion—Corner Exeter and Balt. Total 4.

Bethel, or Seamen's Church,—On Fell's Point, fronting the narbor. This building, though not very large, is handsome and

convenient.

THE Mariners' Church is situated in Philpot Street, Fell's Point, fronting the harbour. The house is free for all Seamen.

It is opened for Public Worship on the morning of every Sabbath, at ten o'clockin summer, and eleven in winter; and in the afternoon, at three o'clock.

Catholic Churches .- 1st. The Cathredral, probably the largest church in the United States, is built of granite, in the form of a cross. It is situated near the corner of Mulberry and Charles streets, the principal entrance is on Cathredral street. The length of the building is one hundred and fifty-six feet, the breadth of each projection forming the arms of the cross is thirty-six feet. The height of the dome is ninety-five feet; the height of the towers, when completed, will be one hundred and twenty feet. The cost of the building, in its present unfinished state was \$225,000. 2d. The second Catholic church is St. Peter's, at the corner of Saratoga and Little Sharp streets. It is the oldest Catholic church in Baltimore. St. Peter's is attached to the Cathredral. The pastors who officiate in both are Rev. Samuel Eccleston, Archbishop, Rev. R. Smith, Mr. Windright and E. J. Damphoux. 3d. St. John's, on the corner of Saratoga and Park streets, Rev. G. Barth, pastor. 4th. St. Patrick's, Market street, Fell's Point, Rev. N. Kerney, pastor. 5th. St. Mary's Chapel, at the Seminary, Pennsylvania Avenue. This church is said to be a perfect specimen of Gothic architecture. 6th. St. James's Chapel, north of Monument street, Rev. Mr. Gildea, pas-It was built by the late Archbishop Whitfield, with his own private funds. In addition to these, we must mention the Carmelite Institution, a large brick building for monastic purposes in Aisquith street, to which a chapel has lately been added. Total of Catholic churches, seven.

English Lutheran .- In Lexington street, between Howard and

Park streets. Rev. J. G. Morris, pastor.

Episcopalian .- 1st. St. Paul's, at the corner of Charles and Saratoga streets. Length of the building one hundred and twenty-six feet, height of the steeple, the same. Cost \$142,000. The steeple is remarkable for the beauty of its architecture, embracing three different orders. Rev. W. E. Wyatt, pastor. 2d. St. Peter's, at the corner of Sharp and German streets, Rev. J. P. K. Henshaw, pastor. 3d. Christ Church. The present building is at the corner of Gay and Fayette streets. This is a church of large dimensions, is without a steeple, but has an elegant portico, supported by six fluted columns of the composite order. Rev. John Johns, pastor. 4th. Trinity church in Trinity street, near Exeter. 5th. St. Andrew's Church, formerly Christ Church, at the corner of East Baltimore and Front streets; Rev. Henry Johns, pastor. This building is now occupied by the former congregation of Trinity church. 6th. There is an African Episcopal church at the corner of Holliday and Saratoga streets; Rev. Mr. Livingston, pastor. Total 6.

German Lutheran.—In North Gay street, near the shot tower.
Ger. Reformed:—In Second st. the steeple, which is the highest in Baltimore, contains the town clock. Pastor Rev. Mr. Heiner.

German Evangelical Reformed.—In Conway, between Sharpe.

and Hanover streets; Rev. P. Harman, pastor.

Jewish Synagogue. - In Harrison street, formerly the residence

of Mr. B. Edes, printer.

Presbyterians.—1st. At the corner of Fayette and North streets. It has two steeples and a portico supported by four pillars. Rev. Mr. Backus, pastor. 2d. At the corner of East Baltimore and Lloyd streets; Rev. R. Breckinridge, pastor. 3d. In North Eutaw, between Saratoga and Mulberry streets; Rev. Mr. Musgrave, pastor. Associate Reformed, in Fayette, between Charles and Liberty streets; Rev. J. M. Duncan, pastor. 4th. West Baltimore street extended, Rev. Mr. Guiteau, pastor. 5th. Hanover street, Rev. J. G. Hamner, pastor. This is a new church which has been built during the last year. The associate (originally Scotch Seceders) Church, Courtland, east side, North of Saratoga street.

Reformed Presbyterian.—Church, Asquith street extended, Rev. W. L. Roberts, pastor, formerly called the Missionary Church, first Reformed Presbyterian, congregation occupy the

church built by Mr. Warfield, St. Paul's street.

Quakers or Friends.—1st. In Lombard, between Howard and Eutaw streets. 2d. Corner of Pitt and Aisquith streets. 3d.,

Corner of Saratoga and Courtland streets. Total 3:

Unitarian.—At the corner of Charles and Franklin streets.
This is a beautiful specimen of architecture. Cost \$100,000;

Pastor, Mr. Burknap.

Universalists.—This new and elegant structure, is corner Calvert and Pleasant sts.—Rev. L. S. Everret pastor, dw. High street, a few doors from Gay st. Total number of Churches in Baltimore 53.

Chapter VII.—Buildings for the purposes of Literature, Science, Charity, and Public Amusement.

Adelphi Theatre.—A very small establishment, so called, is placed at the corner of North and Saratoga streets. It is but rarely opened for dramatic performances, and is more frequently used for exhibitions of paintings, &c.

Asbury College.—Established in 1816; now situated at the corner of North and Fayette streets; it receives none but day students. The number of pupils at this time is sixty, M. Power.

Principal.

Assembly Rooms.—This building, located at the corner of Holliday and Fayette streets, has lately been altered in height from two to three stories, and otherwise improved. The dancing rooms are on the second floor. Cost of the building \$38,000.

before the alteration. It was built in 1787.

Baltimore College.—Nearly opposite the Cathedral, in Mulberry street. It is exclusively devoted to day scholars; the number of which at present are 130. This college is attached to the University of Maryland. The dimensions of the building are 82 feet by 50. Principal John Prentiss.

Concert Hall .- In south Charles street. It contains a large-

room very suitable for balls, &c.

Commerce Street Assembly Rooms. —These are situated in Commerce street, and adapted to the same purposes as the preceding.

Female Orphan Asylum.—Incorporated in 1803, and intended to afford shelter and education to destitute orphan children. It

is situated in Mulberry near Park street.

Front Street Theatre.—This is the largest theatre in the city, but very plain on its exterior. It can easily be arranged, to answer the purpose of a circus, for which, indeed, it was originally intended. The cost was \$27,000.

Holliday Street Theatre.—This house is small, but very tasteful; its front is ornamented with six Doric pilasters. It is the Baltimore Drury, the oldest and most fashionable theatre in the city.

The original cost of this building was \$50,000.

Library.—The Baltimore Library is on the lower floor of the Assembly Rooms, at the corner of Holliday and Fayette streets, entrance on Holliday street. It was incorporated in 1796. At present this is a very large and valuable collection of books.

McKim's Free School.—Among the public buildings which ornament Baltimore, we must consider as deserving of particular notice, the Free School, at the corner of east Baltimore and Aisquith streets. It is a superb structure, built after the model of the Temple of Theseus in Athens, and owes its origin to the munificence of Isaac McKim, esq. son of the late John McKim.

Museum.—The Baltimore Museum is at the corner of Baltimore and Calvert streets. Its external appearance is perhaps, superior to that of any similar establishment in the United States.

The paintings, natural and artificial curiosities, and exhibitions, and other attractions are deserving of particular attention, and cannot fail to afford the amusement for which they are designed. The saloon, where concerts and similar performances are carried on, is very spacious, and exceedingly well calculated for

such purposes. Proprietor Mr. DeSelding.

Public Schools.—These are eight in number. Male school No. 1, and female No. 2, are held in a very large and handsome stone building, 90 by 70 feet, at the corner of Greene and Fayette streets. This building will accommodate 400 boys, and as many girls in different apartments. The number of pupils at present is 160 boys and 82 girls. Teacher of the male school, Mr. McJilton, of the female Miss McConkey, Male school No. 2, is kept over the engine house, Fell's Point; number of pupils 136, teacher, Mr. Robinson. Male school No. 3, is in a convenient house, erected for the purpose, in Aisquith, near Pitt street, 80 pupils, Mr. Carter teacher. Female school No. 1, is over the engine house, Fell's Point, 65 pupils, Miss McDermot teacher. For other free schools, Sunday schools, &c. see chapter x.

Saint Mary's College.—Incorporated as an university in 1806. The buildings, which are of considerable extent, are situated near Pennsylvania avenue, and embrace the college aforesaid and a theological seminary. The establishment contains a library of 12,000 volumes, a chemical apparatus, and a botanical garden. The present number of students is 190 of which 123 are boarders. President of the College, Rev. John J. Chanche; Rev. Dr. L. R.

Deluol, President of the Seminary.


Saint Mary's Orphan Asylum.—For the support and education of destitute female orphans, a building for the use of this benevolent institution is situated in Franklin street, between Charles and Park streets.

Theatres.—Baltimore has three of these establishments, which have been already described, as the Adelphi, Front street, and

Holliday street theatres.

University of Maryland.—Situation at the corner of Greene and Lombard streets. The building is formed on a classic model; the portico, is supported by eight Doric columns. It has a dome surmounting a rotunda, 60 feet in diameter. This institution has four faculties, viz. Divinity, Law, Physic, and the Arts and Sciences. To this University is attached the Baltimore College, and Baltimore Infirmary, which see. The University of Maryland was incorporated A. D. 1812.

Washington Medical College.—The buildings lately erected by this institution, are said to be on the most elevated grounds within the limits of the city; they are constructed in a novel and magnificent style of architecture. The length is 195 feet. The centre building is circular, 40 feet in diameter, and four stories in height. At equi distant points connected with the main building

are four quadrangular turrets six stories high, with obelisk roofs. There are two wings each 60 by 40 feet. On the whole, the

college presents a most imposing appearance.

The reader will please to observe that there are some buildings intended for mercantile and manufacturing purposes, which remain yet to be described, and which are highly deserving of notice. But, as we have devoted the two following chapters to the consideration of all topics which relate to commerce and manufactures, we have, (to avoid repetition and to conform with the plan we have marked out,) deferred a description of the said buildings until we come to treat of those subjects with which they are more immediately connected.

Chapter VIII.—Manufactures.

Before we commence on this division of our subject, it seems to be a kind of necessity to make some allusion to the difficulties we have encountered in obtaining the requisite information, and to offer some apology for what we may have failed to accomplish. It was our particular wish to make this department of our work, as far as the nature of things would permit, perfect; and certainly we have spared no pains for the attainment of that object. For our original and chief design was to afford a fair and perspicuous view of the resources of our city, of which resources, the manufactures assuredly form a very material part. To this point we have probably devoted more care and attention than any persons who have preceded us in similar undertakings, and we should wrong ourselves to hint that our labors have been wholly ineffectual. We do not, however, pause to congratulate ourselves on what has been done; but we rather lament that we have fallen short of our wishes and expectations. The sources from which we were compelled to derive our knowledge of facts, appeared sometimes to be unaccountably reluctant in affording us the desired information; and, in a few instances, our enquiries were met by decided refusals. On the contrary, numbers of persons seemed to favor our design, with a liberality which did honor to their heads and hearts. To this cause, namely, the difficulty, (we may say the impossibility,) of obtaining correct information, may be attributed most of those deficiencies which we fear are to be discovered in this sketch of the manufactures of Baltimore.

But, as it was totally out of our power to be diffusive, in a work so circumscribed in limits as the present, it must be evident that those manufactures which are not of a rare or extensive nature could not receive any thing more, at farthest, than a casual notice in this treatise. We suggest this fact, that no person may conceive himself slighted by an omission which circumstances rendered unavoidable. Having premised this much. we now pre-

wed to a consideration of the principal "Manufactures of Baltimore."

Agricultural Implements.—A manufactory of these useful articles is carried on, in connection with a seed store, by Jonathan Eastman, No. 76 Pratt street. Another extensive factory of all kinds of Agricultural Implements, &c. is carried on by Messrs. Moore & Maynard in Light, near Pratt street. It is connected with the seed store of Mr. R. Sinclair, Jr. and also with the extensive nursery of fruits, flowers, and ornamental trees, under the management of Mr. R. Sinclair, Senr., at Claremont, about three miles from Baltimore.

Bakeries.—Several large manufactories of crackers and ship biscuit are in operation in different parts of the city. The process of manufacturing crackers has been greatly improved and facilitated by recent inventions. The bread bakeries, of course, are numerous, the latter are carried on in this city chiefly by Ger-

mans or persons of German extraction.

Breweries.—1st Claggett's, in Water street, near the Falls, manufactures annually, on an average, beer, porter and ale to the manufactures annually, on an average, beer, porter and ale to the manufactures.

Besides these, there are several minor breweries, the amount of whose manufactures, we have not been able to ascertain.

Brick Making .- This branch of business has of late years become one of peculiar interest to the citizens of Baltimore, as it presents a mean of profitable enterprise which at one time could by no means have been anticipated. Mr. Griffith, in his Annals of Baltimore, tells us that the first brick houses erected in this city were composed of the imported material. So remarkable a change has taken place in these matters, that the city of Baltimore now exports large quantities of this article, manufactured in her immediate vicinity. The clay in the neighbourhood of Baltimore is so admirably adapted to this manufacture, that the bricks of Baltimore are universally admitted to be the very best in the country; and this fact is sufficiently evident from the circumstance that the fronts of all the best houses in Boston, New York, Philadelphia, and the other large cities on the sea are built of Baltimore made bricks. It is not to be wondered at therefore, that the amount of this manufacture, has greatly increased within a few years, and that it is still rapidly in the advance. The principal brick makers in Baltimore are Messrs. Berry, Childs and Phillips, Samuel Moore, Wm. Krebs, Reese, Burns and Russell.

Brush Making.—There are eight persons in the city engaged in this line of business, and most of their establishments are on a very large scale. Brushes were formerly one of the articles made in the Penitentiary, but we believe the manufacture has been discontinued there.

Cubinet and Chair Making.—The products of these arts are manufactured in large quantities, and many of them, especially

of the latter, are prepared for exportation.

Candle and Soap Factories.—There are eight or ten in Baltimore, most of which are large establishments, and as we believe, they produce the articles not only in abundance, but of a superior quality. The Fancy and Windsor Soap Manufactory of the Messrs. Hyde in Pleasant street, affords some exquisite specimens of these fashionable requisitions of the toilette.

Carpet Factories.— A large establishment for the manufacture of Ingrain carpeting is carried on by Mr. C. G. Conradt, in Granby street, near the Falls. This factory can produce annu-

ally 50,000 square yards of an excellent quality.

Castor Oil Factory,—West Falls Avenue; George W. Wait, proprietor; Chocolate, Ginger and Mustard are made in the same

works. The mill is moved by steam power.

Coach Making.—Splendid articles in this line of business are produced in Baltimore. In this branch of the mechanic arts we do not succomb to any other place on the continent, as it respects beauty and durability of the workmanship. But one factory of this kind deserves particular attention, on account of the extent of its operations. Of this factory, (which is situated at the corner of North and Monument streets,) Stockton and Stokes are the proprietors. In this establishment water power is used for various purposes connected with the business; it also gives employment to about one hundred workmen and boys.

Coach Fringe, Lace and Cord Factories.—There are four in the city; one in Water street, near Calvert, one in South, near Baltimore street, one in South Charles street, and one in Lexing-

ton street.

Comb Factory.—A large comb factory, the property of M. De Young, was in operation several years ago, at the corner of Lexington and Eutaw streets. While those highly ornamented tortoise shell combs were in fashion, this manufactory produced a great quantity, for the making of which it had all the requisite machinery, some of which machinery was very complicated and expensive.

Chemical Works.—The Marvland Chemical Works, on the south side of the basin, near Federal Hill, manufactures alum, epsom salts, blue vitriol, yellow and green chrome, tartaric acid, rochelle salts, and many other drugs. These works are on a very large scale, and are sufficient to supply almost any demand. Besides these, there are six or eight other establishments for similar

manufactures within the bounds of the city.

Copper Rolling.—A large mill for this purpose is in operation on Smith's wharf. It is called the Vallona Copper Works.

Cotton Factories.—These are very numerous in Baltimore and its neighborhood. The following will present a view of this species of manufacture.

Savage, Lt. Patuxent, 5,100 spindles, 250 hands, 1,368,000 yds. Warren, Great Gunpowder Falls, conducted by a company, 120 hands; 2,400 spindles, 600,000 to 720,000 lbs. annually.

City Steam Duck Factory, French street, A. Mitchell, proprie-

tor, 130 hands; 2,100 spindles, 250,000 lbs. annually.

Cotton Carpets.—The manufacture of this article is carried on so extensively by numerous individuals in different parts of the city, that it is impossible to enter into particulars.

Drugs .- See Chemical Works.

Flour .- See Mills.

French Burr Mill Stones.—Are made by Morris & Egenton, near Pratt street bridge, and Jno. McMahon, Pratt st. w. of Gay.

Gas Works.—These works, by means of which not only our streets are illuminated, but many of the stores, the churches, museum, theatres, &c., occupy a building of most unprepossessing appearance at the south west corner of North and Saratoga sts. The utility of this establishment is almost beyond computation, but it is one unpleasant circumstance attending it that the effluvia it sends forth is very disagreeable to the alfactories, if not prejudicial to health. Its location, in the heart of the city, does not detract from this inconvenience.

Glass (Window) Factory.—The only one now in operation in Baltimore, (though two others have been built,) is for the manufacture of window glass, on the south side of the basin. It is the property of Mr. P. R. D. Frieze. It now manufactures 4,000 boxes of 100 feet each, but the business can readily be extended

to meet an increase of demand.

Glass Cutting.—A large amount of this kind of work is done by sundry individuals. One establishment for this purpose which

is situated on the Falls, near Baltimore street, is moved by a steam engine and is capable of performing a vast quantity of

work. The proprietor is Henry Bayley.

Iron Works.-There are a number of artificers in Baltimore who manufacture various kinds of iron work, with surpassing ingenuity and skill. Mr. Martin Mettee, in President street, near Pratt, is the patentee of those admirable pump irons, &c. which render the public watering places of Baltimore so vastly superior to any, (as we believe,) to be met with elsewhere. The excellence of these pump irons has been so well established, that their use bids fair to become general in this city, and, (if prejudice would allow it,) in every other city where they could be brought to the test of experiment. Mr. Mettee also manufactures fancy grates, railings, and fire proof doors. George Gillingham, in Gillingham Alley makes iron machinery of all kinds, rail road car wheels, &c. Besides these, there are many smiths, whose proficiency in the art deserves the highest commendation, but to this, as well as to many other branches of industry we are compelled to be unjust, (if the term will apply to us in such a case,) for want of room to particularise the merits of the different artists.

Iron Founderies.—Manufactories of cast iron articles, are met with in different parts of the city. Within a few years past several slove factories have been established among us; viz. The factory of Joseph Simms, denominated Baltimore Stove Factory, corner of Light and Lombard sts, John Gable, 45 Light st. and Oliver Parker, No. 45, S. Calvert st. See steam engine factories.

Mills in General.-Of the immense water power in and near Baltimore we have previously given a hint; but, not to let the matter rest wholly on our own authority, we quote the following observations, which, we think, will be sufficient to place the fact beyond a doubt. Mr Trimble, formerly a member of Congress from Kentucky, in a speech, on a certain occasion, gave it as his opinion, "that there is no equal space of ground in the Union, that has so much natural water power, united with so many local facilities, as the circle around Baltimore of thirty miles radius." The late General Harper, who had carefully examined the subject, says on a like occasion, "that a circle of twenty miles radius, of which, Baltimore is the centre, contains water power sufficient to put in motion from 1,000,000 to 1,200,000 spindles, with a corresponding number of looms, and all the machinery necessary for their repair and complete operation." The extent of this advantage will be better understood when the reader has become acquainted with the number of mills, &c. placed on the different streams in our neighborhood. This information we will endeavor to convey in the following table, which we do not promise will be altogether complete; as some new works have undoubtedly arisen, since the topographical survey from which we have derived our information on this subject.

On glancing an eye over the preceding table, it will probably occur to the reader that notwithstanding there is much water power taken up, a good deal remains out of use. In this supposition he will be right: the waters of Jones's Falls are very abundant and but little affected by drought. The head of this stream is 300 feet above tide water, at 15 miles from Baltimore. Gwynn's Falls head about 20 miles from Baltimore, 680 feet above tide. On Patapsco river, there are a number of convenient mill-seats unoccupied; and probably the other streams afford similar oppor-The capital invested in the flour mills on the aforesaid streams is said to be about \$1,200,000. Four of these mills can each make 200 barrels of flour in twenty-four hours; and they average from 16,000 to 18,000 barrels annually. seven others which average from 11,000 to 13,000 barrels in a year. These latter can make from 100 to 120 barrels in twentyfour hours. Fourteen other mills average about 9,000 barrels per annum, and four others about 4,000 each. The remaining flour mills are various in magnitude and power; most of the mills here mentioned are reported to be of the most excellent construction that skill, ingenuity and experience could devise.

Planing and Grooving Mill,—One, worked by steam power, is now situated near Light street wharf, in Barre street. It belongs

to a company.

Potteries.—This ancient and useful mystery engages the industry and talent of a number of persons. There are eight pot-

teries in the city, generally carried on by men of enterprise, in whose hands the art has attained considerable improvement.

Rope Making.—A steam apparatus, for the making of cordage is conducted by Mr. Ridgaway No. 66 South street. A very large rope-walk, the machinery moved by horse power, is situated near Market street, Fell's Point, in the rear of St. Patrick's church. There, are one or two others on Gallows hill and one near Fort Covington.

Sail Making .- This art, of course, is well cultivated in a city

of a commercial character equal to that of Baltimore.

Ship Building.—At a very early period, Baltimore became celebrated for the construction of small craft of extraordinary speed; so that the swiftness of the "Baltimore Clippers" is proverbial among the sailors. Of late years, the same superiority has become manifest in Baltimore made vessels of a larger class; and vessels of war have been built at our ship-yards for the use of other governments, which is a proof that the fame of our shipwrights has reached foreign countries; a circumstance which cannot fail to have a very favorable effect on the extension of this branch of business.

Steam Engine Factories.—Charles Reeder, south side of the basin, makes steam-engines, tanks and machinery in general. Watchman & Bratt, Williams street, Federal hill, manufacture the same articles, for which they have lately erected extensive buildings and furnished them with all the necessary apparatus. These gentlemen generally keep employed from 230 to 240 hands.

The Canton Iron Works are worthy of particular notice under this head. They are the property of Messrs. Johnson & Abbott. The power used is steam; and three engines are usually employed. There is said to be but one other manufactory in the United States, which makes the heavy work, such as piston and connecting rods, walking beams, &c. Consequently this establishment does that description of work for a large portion of the country. The other manufactory referred to is in New Jersey.

Stove Manufactories .- See Iron works.

Shot Factories.—The Phænix Shot Tower, which is 234 feet in height, can make 200 bags per day. Each bag contains 25 lbs., so that the daily quantity this factory can produce is 5,000 lbs. In a year, calling the year 300 days, which allows for Sundays and other holidays, it can turn out 1,500,000 lbs. of shot. Shot Tower Company of Baltimore, John Franciscus, President, situated in North Gay street, built in 1823, manufactures all sizes of drop shot, in quantity and quality equal to any in the United States. The Baltimore Shot Tower, near the Gay street bridge, was the first built in the city; the height is 187 feet. The Eutaw Company, was incorporated at the December session of the legislature, 1835. David Keener, Persident, John Myers, Secretary. This company prepares shot of all descriptions, and is especially celebrated for the perfection and beauty of the buck

shot and rifle balls made at their works by a new patent shot machine. These works are in South Eutaw street extended.

Type Foundry. -The only letter press type foundry now in the city, is situated in Lovely lane, between South and Calvert streets. It is owned by a company; Fielding Lucas, junr. agent, No. 136 Baltimore street. W, & J. Neale, have a Stereotype

Foundry, No. 174 Baltimore street.

Woolen Factories.—Messrs. Whitworth & Sons, Cove street, manufacture annually 80,000 yards of Linsey, the average value of which is forty cents per yard, and 200,000 yards of Satinett, averaging seventy-five cents per yard. These gentlemen nave another establishment in Lexington street, extended. Another smaller woolen factory is carried on by Mr. Knox in Lexington street, above Cove street. All these factories are worked by steam power. Near Franklin town, about six miles from Baltimore, is the woolen factory of Messrs. Wethered and Brothers. These gentlemen have several times received the premium offered by the American Institute of New York for the best superfine broad cloths, &c. They can make annually 12,000 yards, broadcloth, 30,000 do. cassimeres, 30,000 do. sattinetts, 40,000 do. Kentucky jeans. Total 112,000 yards per annum.

Besides the foregoing, it may easily be imagined that Baltimore is not deficient in those species of workmanship which are common in all cities. We have already fulfilled the promise made in the beginning of this chapter, by noticing in a compendious manner those manufactures which, from their variety and individual extent, seemed to be of the utmost importance to the reader, who seeks information. More than this could scarcely be expected from us; for in this city containing 100,000 inhabitants, two thirds of the population at least are engaged in handicraft employments, and it must be perceived at a glance that to enter into a description of those various operations would be to produce a work so voluminous as to be altogether inconsistent with our

present design.

Chapter IX.-Commerce of Baltimore.

The rapid advancement of Baltimore in prosperity and opulence is a circumstance in her history so notorious and so frequently remarked, that any thing additional we can now say on that topic would appear entirely superfluous. But there is another fact which seems not to be so generally known, or being known, is not so repeatedly urged on the attention of the public, and which nevertheless is a fact that involves too many interesting considerations to be passed over in silence. The fact to which we have reference is, that the advancement of Baltimore, for some years back, has by no means equalled what her former progress, as well as her native and adventitious advantages, might

have given reason to expect. If the population of a city may be referred to as indicating its progressive improvement, the reader will find, by turning to a former part of this work, that the increase of inhabitants, since 1820, has been proportionably much less than it was for thirty years antecedent to that period. Our surprise will not be lessened when we reflect that within the thirty years we speak of, there occurred a war with England and several other events which might reasonably be supposed to have an injurious effect on the growth of the city. As to the causes which have retarded our progress for the last 18 or 20 years, there appears to be a difference of opinion; and we do not wish to advance any hypothesis which might seem to invite a controversy. One suggestion, however, it seems to be our duty to make; namely, that our commercial interests, ought, at all times, to be our primary consideration, and when these are neglected for any other pursuit, the prosperity of our city must languish. The investment of capital in manufactures and internal improvement is highly to be recommended; but these matters should be regarded in their true light, as of secondary importance, and merely subsidiary to our commerce. Had this momentous truth received the attention it deserves, it is probable that New York, at this time, would not have been so far in advance of us, as we find, to our mortification, that she is. In order that we may reap the full advantage of those magnificent projects which are to open for us new avenues of trade with distant states, it is highly requisite that our commerce should be in such a flourishing condition that those states may find Baltimore the most eligible market for the purchase, as well as the sale of commodities; otherwise, our great works of internal improvement will bid fair to be of as much advantage to other cities as to our own. We must, therefore, be enabled, either by manufactures at home, or by importations from abroad, to supply amply those articles of traffic with which we propose to reciprocate that increase of inland trade for which was are making such extensive preparations. Very many of these articles, of course, cannot be supplied by home manufactures at least for the present, and for these we must trust to commerce. It is highly important, moreover, that the importation should be direct from those countries of which the said articles are the products, and not through the medium of any other American city. It will be found of great importance also that the merchandise we receive by our rail roads, &c. if intended for exportation, should be exported immediately from Baltimore to foreign ports; for if such merchandise be carried through Baltimore and exported from Philadelphia or New York, our city will receive but a small portion of the benefit. The true interest of Baltimore does not consist in making the city a thoroughfare, but a place of deposit, a mart, where merchandise must change owners, or be transferred from one mode of conveyance to another.

We trust the time is not far distant when Baltimore will start

forward once more in the race of improvement with renovated vigor and with increased confidence in her own powers. That she has achieved much is not to be questioned, and when we speak of her short comings, we speak of her as one to whom much has been granted, and from whom very much is to be expected. see no necessity for making Philadelphia or N. York a medium of communication with foreign ports; no necessity for obtaining our supplies of foreign merchandise, (or any part of those supplies.) through the aforesaid cities. By such impolitic measures, we afford a bad example to the western traders and others, who have sometimes (through equally mistaken motives of interest,) passed through our city to seek a market elsewhere. We say mistaken motives, for truly most articles of foreign merchandise may be obtained in our market on terms as advantageous to the purchaser, as in any other city of the Union; not to speak of the increased expense of travel and conveyance which must necessarily be incurred in going to a more distant place.

But we suppose it to be useless to dwell on the necessity of cultivating our commercial advantages; and we now proceed, with the same conciseness, which we have endeavored to preserve throughout this work, to show in what those commercial advantages consist. On the calmest and most impartial examination we can make, we find it impossible to discover any thing in the location of New York which should elevate its commercial character so much above that of Baltimore. On reference to our topographical situation, as described in chapter I., the reader will find that in many respects of consequence we possess an advantage over that island metropolis, the boasted commercial empo-

porium of the United States.

To those admirable vessels, the clipper-built craft of Baltimore, which have never been successfully imitated any where else, we must refer much of our former good fortune; and, if we are wise, we will look to the same source for much of our future aggrandizement. The noble art of ship-building, to which a monarch of Russia once became a laborious and voluntary disciple, to the prosperity of Baltimore is not of less moment than it must have been considered by that imperial mechanic to the welfare of his own dominions. In this art, Baltimore is already pre-eminent, and in that pre-eminence alone, she has a mercantile advantage which is scarcely to be appreciated. Her situation with respect to Chesapeake bay, of which we have previously spoken, her immense manufacturing resources, her comparative vicinity to some of the wealthiest western states, her great public works, and numerous minor particulars, all conspire to make us hope that she will be, at one time, without a commercial rival on this continent.

In speaking of the commerce of Baltimore, the coasting trade presents itself as worthy of especial notice; it is carried on chiefly by means of the Chesapeake and its tributaries, (as we before

remarked,) with very remote sections of the country. Much of this business is also transacted between Baltimore and the northern and southern ports of America; via the Chesapeake bay and Atlantic ocean. The number of vessels employed in the coasting trade is said to be more than 2.000.

The staple commodities of Baltimore are flour, grain, tobacco and cotton goods; besides these, however, there are a number of articles which become every day more and more important as

objects of our commerce.

Imports.—Our imports from foreign countries, beyond seas, are of the well known productions of those regions; many of which, however, at this time, we receive through the medium of New York. From the northern ports of America we obtain domestic dry goods, glass ware, candles, cheese, onions, plaster of paris, dried and salted fish, boots and shoes, rum, &c. From the southern states, we receive tar, timber, pitch, cotton, rice, &c. From Virginia come fire wood, ship timber, tobacco and coal. From the Eastern Shore of Maryland, we obtain timber, fire wood, &c. By means of the Susquehanna river, which empties into the head of Chesapeake bay, we receive from the interior of New York and Pennsylvania, immense quantities of lumber, including planks, lathes and shingles; also, whiskey, flour, coal, pig and manufactured iron, magnesia and plaster of paris. These articles are brought in arks and rafts as far as Port Deposit, where they are shipped in the small bay vessels for Baltimore.

Exports.—Our staple commodities, mentioned before, are carried, some of them at least, to every quarter of the globe. Besides; to the northern ports of America, we send flour, corn, tobacco, whiskey, sole leather, articles of chemistry, &c. To the southern states we send flour, corn, pork, whiskey, gin, domestic and European goods. To the various ports on the Chesapeake and its tributaries, we send flour, corn meal, sugar, coffee, molasses, whiskey, domestic and European manufactures. At present, there is no return trade up the Susquehanna, on account of the rapidity of that stream, which is only to be passed in any direction, at certain seasons of the year. When the Susquehanna rail road is completed this difficulty will be obviated, and the commodities of this city may be exchanged, instead of the cash, for the articles

we receive from the regions of the Susquehanna.

The goods transported to the city by means of rail-roads and turnpikes, from Alleghany, Washington and Frederick counties of Maryland; from Franklin, Adams, Cumberland, and York counties of Pennsylvania, &c. are flour, pork, beef, pig and cast iron, lard, sole leather, linseed oil, flaxseed, &c. We send them in return groceries, plaster of paris, domestic and foreign goods.

We will now notice the various institutions of a commercial character which seem proper to be disposed of under this head.

For the officers of the custom house, the port wardens, &c. See chapter, IV.

There are nine Insurance Offices in Baltimore for the insurance of property from loss by fire or by the seas, and two for the insurance of lives.

General Remarks.—Before we conclude this article, it may be as well to make some general remarks on the progressive improvement of our commerce, and the causes which lead to that desirable result. The rail-roads do much to favor us in this particular, as they are the means of bringing into our market much merchandise, which, without their aid, would never have reached

us. As an instance of this fact, we may notice the granite brought to our city on the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road. It is not only an article very useful for home consumption, but much of it is exported, and found to be of a better quality than the majority of that which has heretofore been in use.

Another benefit to our commerce is the employment of a steam boat, fitted up as an *ice-breaker*, which keeps our harbor open during the winter. The advantage of this is easily to be conceived. Measures have been taken to prepare another ice-breaker

brobably against the ensuing winter.

The establishment of a great number of brick-kilns near the city, affords us another article of trade which yields an abundant

profit. See article brick making in the preceding chapter.

The recent mineral discoveries in many parts of the State offer a fair expectation of future emolument. Nor must we forget to mention the epicurean production of Chesapeake bay those delicious shell fish which are not less palatable to the gourmond thau they are profitable to the speculator. The transportation of oysters westward by means of the turnpikes has lately become a considerable business, and several individuals have turned this ingenious device to a very good account.

In short, there seems to be a determination on the part of our fellow-citizens to employ every honest means which God has placed in their power to extend our commercial advantages, until Baltimore shall be second in this respect to no other city in the Union. This idea may not be quite so utopian as some persons

might be led to suspect it.

As for the trade of the west which the city of New Orleans seems now inclined to dispute with us, and which the steam nanavigation on the western waters has a tendency to carry to that port, there is little doubt that the completion of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail-Road will restore it to its original channel. The superiority of rail-road conveyance over all river navigation is not to be disputed; for, (not to speak of its greater safety,) its freedom from the uncertainty and delays of winds and tides, and from the suspension caused by the ice in the winter season, will always gain it the preference. These circumstances, and the advantages we possess with respect to distance will certainly obtain for Baltimore the trade of Ohio, Kentucky and Indiana; for this will be the shortest and most expeditious route from those States to the tide waters of the Atlantic.

Chapter X.—Literature. Benevolent Societies, Miscellaneous.

But while such strenuous efforts are made by our citizens in those laudable pursuits which have just passed under consideration, is the cultivation of the mind neglected; or is there no provision for the dissemination of that knowledge, which we are taught to believe is as essential to our public welfare as it is conducive to our private advantage. We are happy to answer in the negative. The importance of education seems to be deeply impressed on the minds of the Baltimoreans; of which fact no better proof can be demanded than that which is afforded by the numerous literary and scientific institutions which find liberal encouragement among us. The number of private schools in Baltimore is between fifty and sixty; in some of which the higher branches of learning are successfully taught. Of the public and free schools we have thought it best to present a view in the following manner:

Rail-Roads.—There are two rail-roads leading to Baltimore, which have been finished to such an extent as to admit of the transportation of passengers and merchandise. 1st. The Baltimore and Ohio Rail-Road is completed for eighty-two miles from the main stream, besides the branches. This expensive work is estimated to have cost as follows: from Pratt street to Elicott's Mills \$60,000 per mile on an average, and about \$20,000 per mile for the remaining distance. The work is intended to be continued to the Ohio River, a distance of three hundred and eixty miles from Baltimore. The ticket office of this Rail-Road, whence the passenger cars start and where they arrive, is in South Charles street, opposite the city spring. The Depot where

merchandise intended for transportation on the rail-road, must be deposited, is in Pratt street, a short distance from Light street wharf. 2.1. The Baltimore and Susquehanna Ruil-Road is to extend from this city to York, Pa. a distance of fifty-nine miles and a half. Concerning the advantages of these rail-roads we have already spoken.

Post Office. The Baltimore city post office, is on the north east corner of North and Fayette streets. The rates of postage,

established by law, are as follows:


Letters, which weigh an ounce or more, are charged with

quadruple postage, per ounce.

Letters or packages delivered at the same post office where

they are lodged are charged with one cent postage.

Ship letters, if delivered at the office of the port where the vessel arrives, pay six cents postage, but if conveyed from thence by mail to any other place, only two cents in addition to the ordinary rates of postage.


