Rev. C. Davis brought two stimulating messages on the sovereignty of God in protection and provision during the Congo rebellion.

Between sessions students had the opportunity to visit the booths of various missions and to get literature and talk to the missionaries.

Many students who believed that missions weren't

very needful any more, had to change their ideas as Rev. G. Middleton gave a very thought-provoking message. Communists told him he'd never get those "fat Canadians sitting in their fat churches" to go to people who need to hear the Gospel.

In the last two days of the conference God worked in a new way in the lives of many students. They were convicted of sin in their lives and the need to get right with God and fellow students and faculty. So as God led, students got up and confessed sin and the needs of their heart as well as praising Him for what He had done and was doing.

The last service brought the conference to a fitting close as many students publicly dedicated their lives to God to go wherever He led them. This missionary conference was used by God to continue His marvelous work in the hearts and lives of His children.

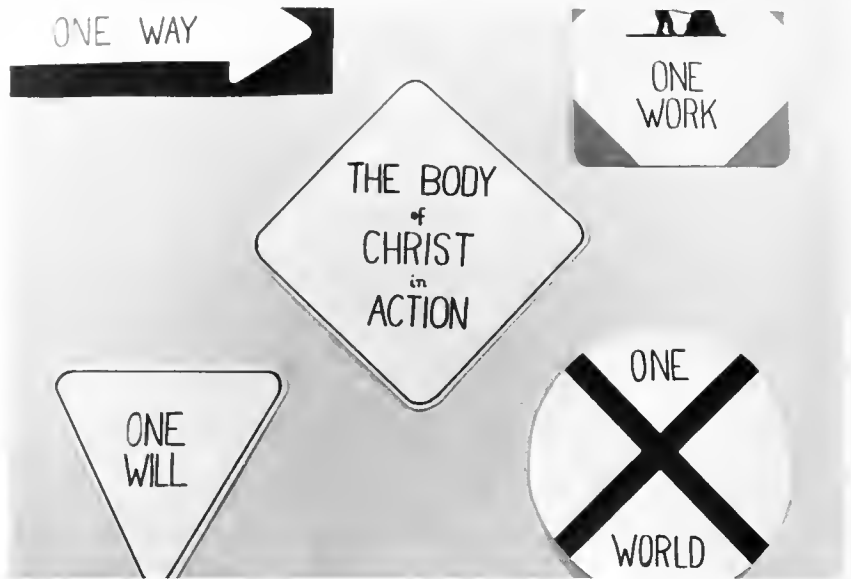

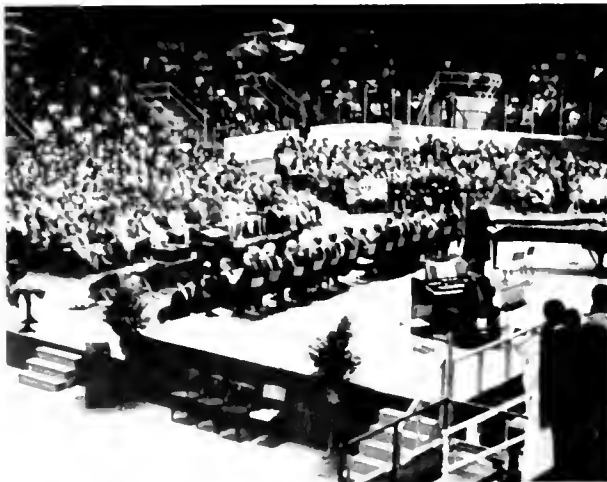

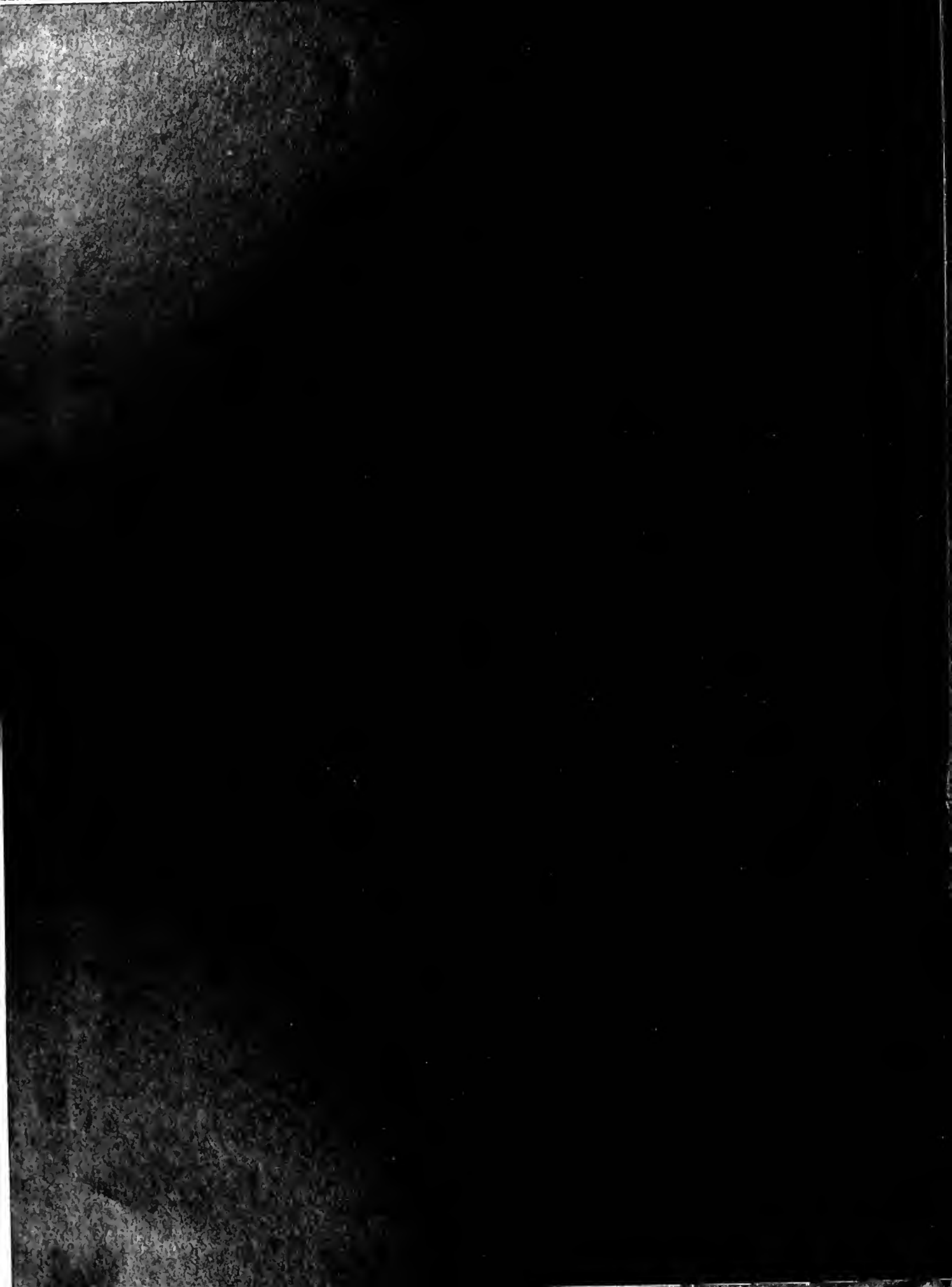


Dear Lord
