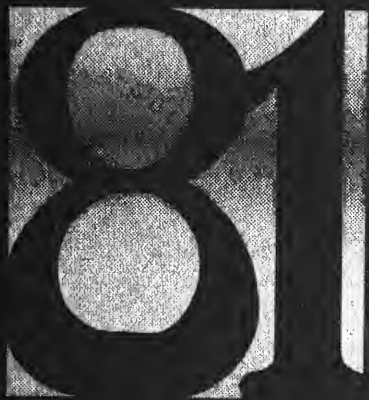



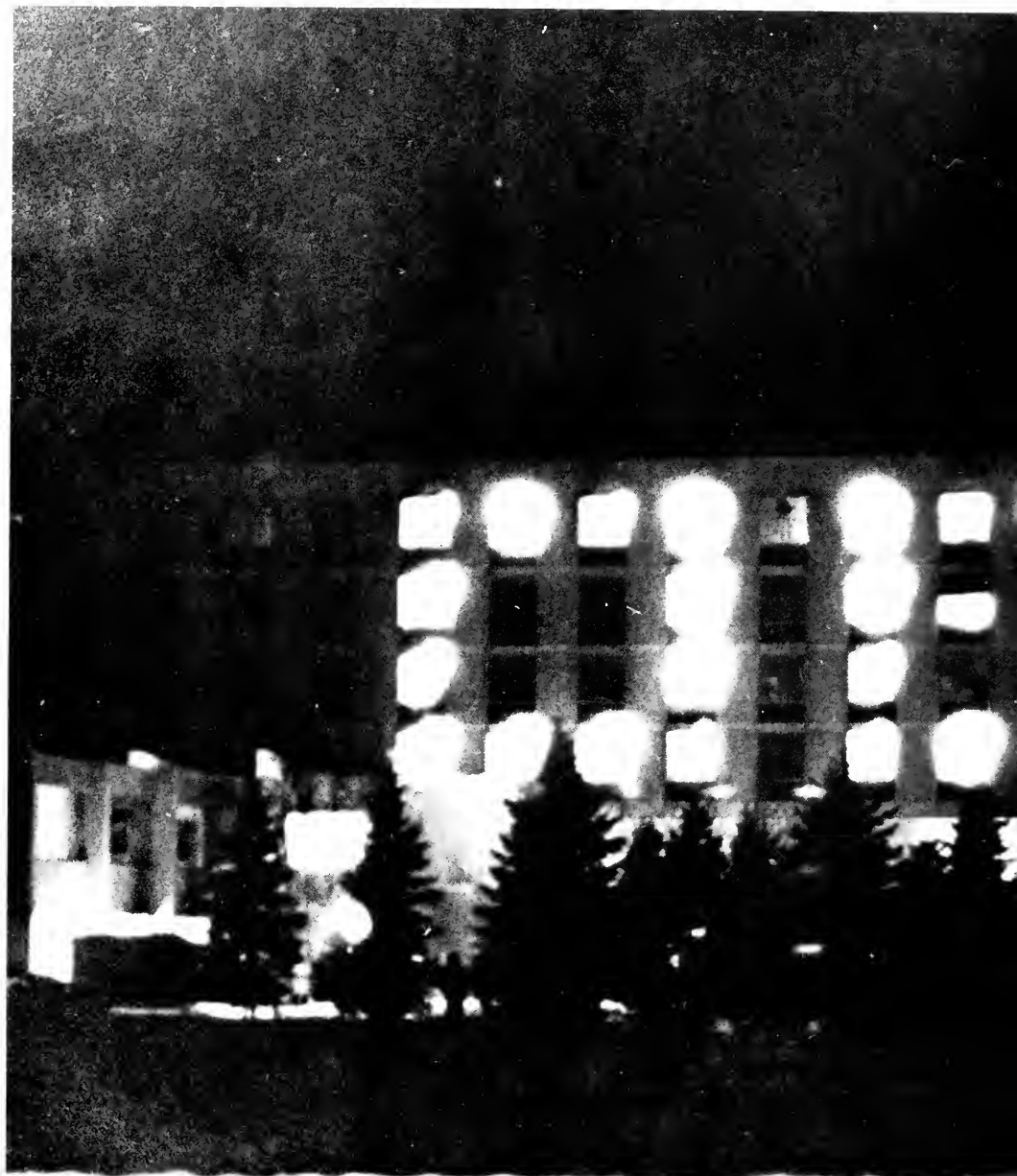

President's Message



TRUE DISCIPLESHIP IS EXPRESSED IN LOVE.

“All men will know that you are my disciples if you love one another.” (John 13:35)

Usually the first mental association we make with college life is lectures, books, papers, assignments, and intellectual stimulation! Jesus in the training of His class of disciples focused on the primacy of love! His followers were to be recognized not by their great insights, although these were to be apparent, not by their skilled rhetoric, but by the quality of love (AGAPE) in their lives - “all men will know that you are my disciples if you love one another.”

Sometimes, we as evangelicals, fail to acknowledge the high priority which the Scriptures place on love. Paul concludes his great chapter on love in I Corinthians with the words “And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.”

Somehow we feel more comfortable in emphasizing the priority of faith. Since the Reformation, faith has been viewed as the greatest (SOLA FIDE). While it is true that faith must precede love and that through faith alone we are saved, love is to be the foremost mark of a true believer of Christ. While it is also true that such love is in the first place to be directed to God, it's concrete manifestation in our world is to be seen in our loving relationship to fellow Christians and to all men. - “All men will know that you are my disciples if you love one another.”

In his gospel, John in chapter thirteen, sees such love modelled in Christ. He took the towel and the basin and washed His disciples' feet. After that He said, “A new commandment I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another.” The Lord taught us that love at its deepest levels meant being existentially concerned about the personal holiness and growth of fellow believers. He commanded us to wash each others feet, that is, to minister to each others needs so as to assist in cleaning and purifying each other in the midst of our daily tasks and our calling in the world.

It is my hope that during your time at OBC you have had the exhilarating experience of having your feet washed through loving and concerned Christian fellowship. It is important that you leave with us a record of your academic achievements and your Christian service involvement. Jesus would suggest that it is even more important that you leave a legacy of love - love to your Lord and love to your fellow students. “And now these three remain: faith, hope, and love. But the greatest of these is love.”

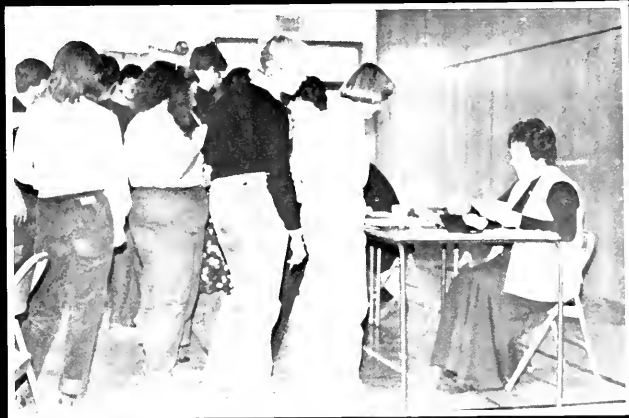
The foundation of it all stands out as a beacon light - "For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have everlasting life." (John 3:16)

In the intimate high priestly prayer of Christ to His Father in heaven, we read these stirring words - "Father, the time has come. Glorify your Son that your Son may glorify You. For You granted Him authority over all men that He might give eternal life to all those You have given to Him. Now this is eternal life: that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, Whom You have sent ..."

Young people, you can come to possess much learning during these days and years at Ontario Bible College. In fact, some of you will excel. You might well be known as "the brain" in your class, if not in the whole school. But, unless you are characterized by that love of which we've been reading, and which in turn promotes genuine unity it is all in vain. In fact, Paul describes it as but a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. In his concluding words in the great "love chapter", 1 Cor. 13, whereas he singles out faith, hope and love as the prior attributes of them all, he hesitates not to declare that the greatest of these is love.

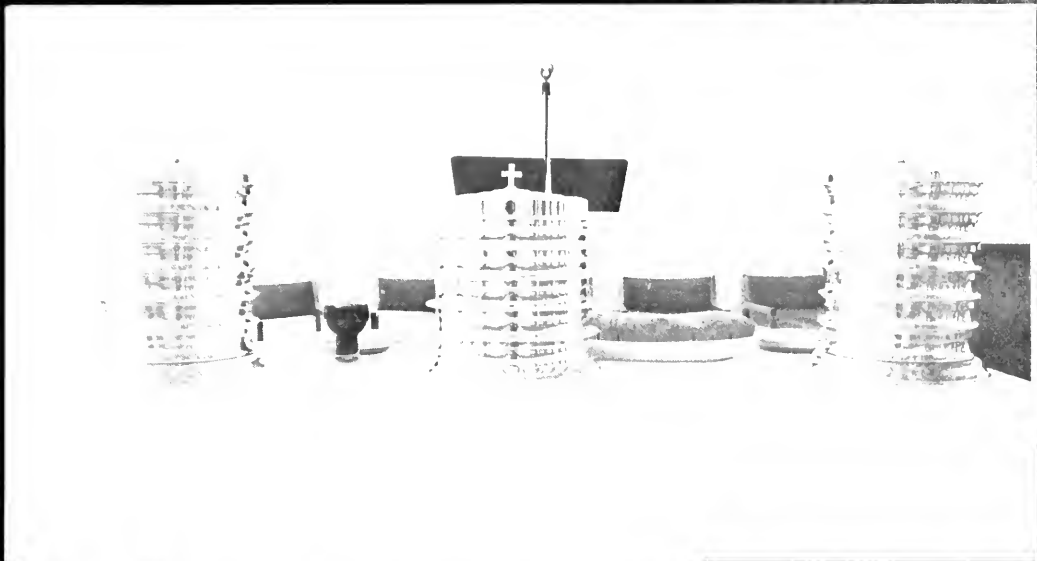
Very simply stated, true discipleship is a multi-sided thing. First and foremost is love for the Lord, and this should intensify with the passing of the days. Then, love for your peers will be an unmistakable badge of your spirituality. And, as the days darken and millions of lost souls continue to surround you in the world around, a genuine love for them will motivate you to do all in your power to reach them for Christ.

The greatest of all privileges, young people, is to be servants of the living God. Our prayer is that each and every student of OBC/OTS may demonstrate the badge of true discipleship wherever he goes. Then, our text will surely be exemplified- "All men will know that you are My disciples if you love one another."

Since its founding in 1976, O.T.S. has grown numerically, and currently has a student body of 116. The president of the seminary is Dr. V. Adrian, who also holds this title in the adjacent O.B.C. Along with his presidential duties, Dr. Adrian teaches theology classes.

The Dept. of Old Testament courses are taught by Dr. Foster, and Dr. Leggett. Dr. Matheson teaches the courses in the Dept. of New Testament.

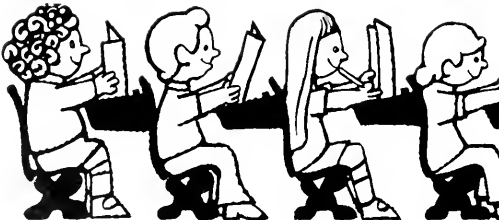
Dr. Lovelace is professor of Church History at Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary.

A memorable event during the O.B.C. year was the Baccalaureate Service held April 24 in Bayview Glen Church. This was the final worship time together for the O.B.C. family.

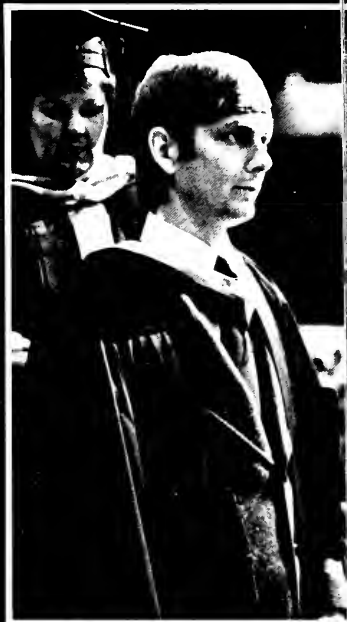

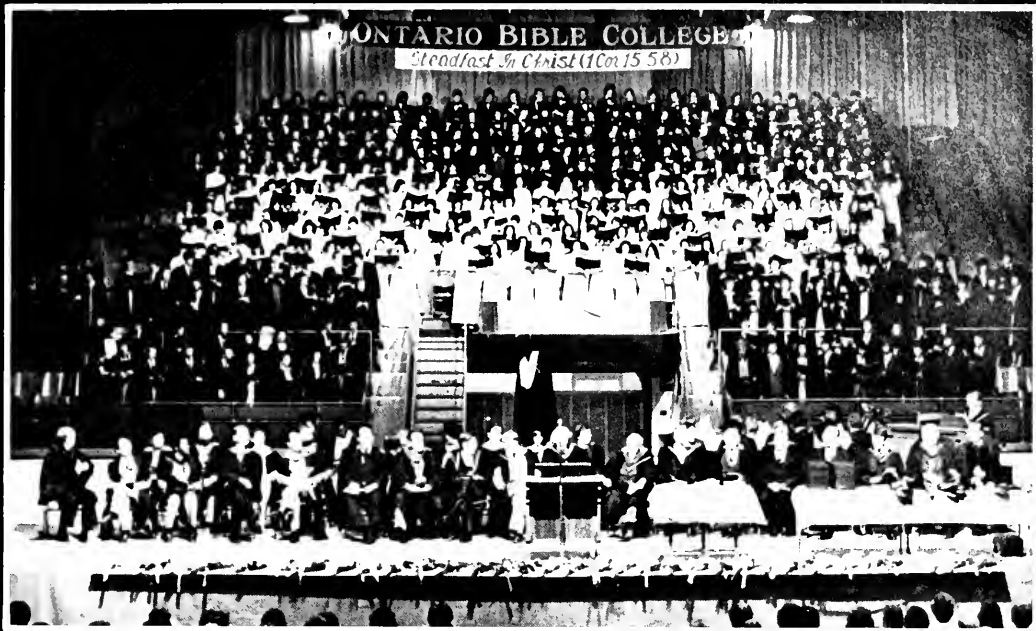

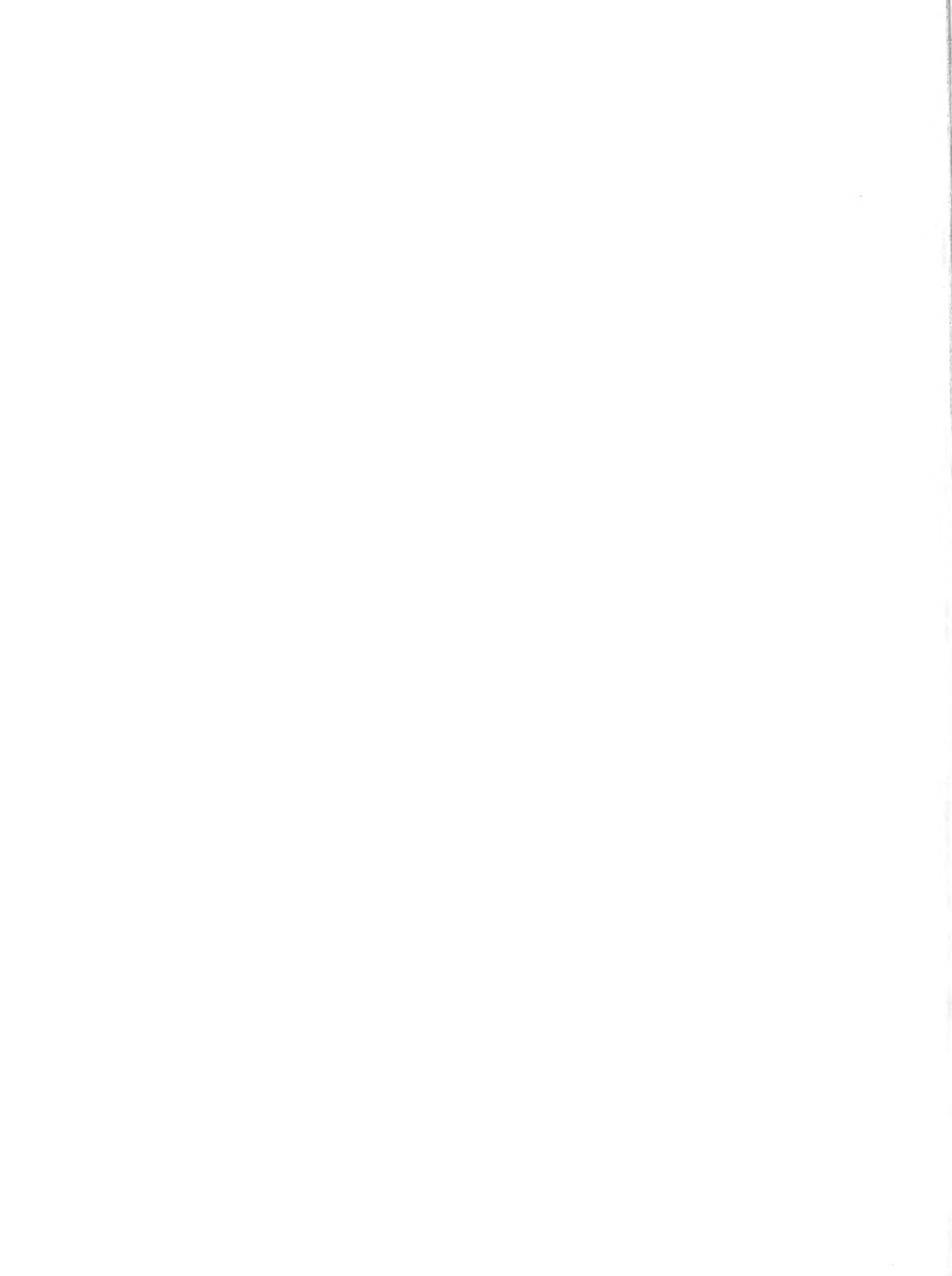
