





Toronto Bible College

Reflections

The most significant event this year has been the celebration of Ontario Bible College's Ninetieth Anniversary. When looking back one cannot help being filled with a sense of wonder at our God for the way he has worked in and through the college throughout the years.

In 1894, Dr. Elmore Harris founded the Toronto Bible Training School. During those early days classes were held in the basement of Walmer Road Baptist Church. Although Toronto Bible College was predominately Baptist in those days as time passed it became increasingly Interdenominational.

Four decades after the founding of Toronto Bible College, London Bible Institute was founded by a man named J. Wilmot Mahood. He is best known for his godly life. This man had a vision to establish a Bible institute in Southwestern Ontario and he was encouraged to do so by Dr. James M. Gray (the Dean of Moody Bible Institute at that time). Mahood began to make contacts in Ontario; one of which was J.H. Dudgeon (a pastor at the Gospel Tabernacle in London). In 1935 Mahood began to teach two night classes per week at the Tabernacle. The attendance increased and, in 1936, full time classes began; the beginning of London Bible Institute.

The discussions for London Bible Institute and Toronto Bible College to merge into one Bible school began in 1976. The mergence of the two schools led to the establishment of Ontario Bible College The nine years that have followed have been filled with excitement and growth as God's gracious hand has blessed. This blessing has also included the establishment of Ontario Theological Seminary which was founded in 1976.

This year- our ninetieth anniversary- marks the indelible stamp of God's love and approval. Surely our God is faithful!


Young People, the race is on. Some of us may be on the home stretch. Remember the psalmist said, "there is but a step twixt me and death".




- *If God is your Partner, then make your plans BIG.

- *When a man's ways please the Lord He maketh even his enemies to be at peace with him. Proverbs 16:7
















The She-Wolf

Closer - she crouches, and ever so silently her black form creeps closer to the forbidden prey...


A cry from the depths and beginning of time sounds from within her,
