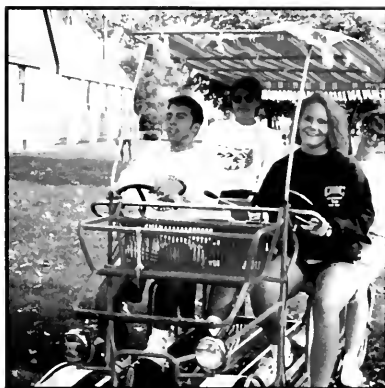

Well here's hoping that we get to know each other better this year. DON'T BE STRANGERS.

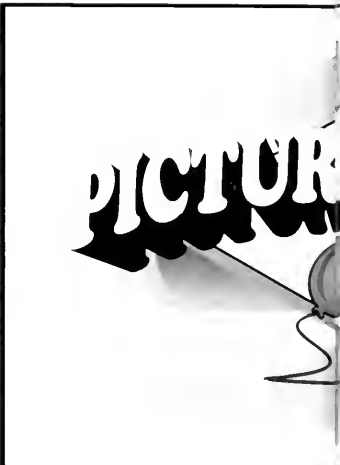
