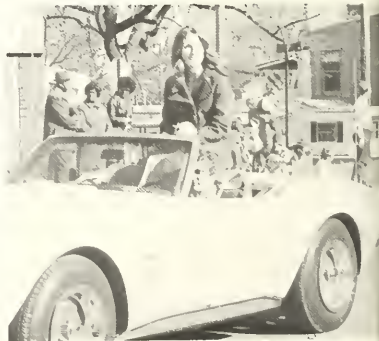
Homecoming



Parade

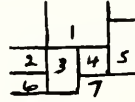

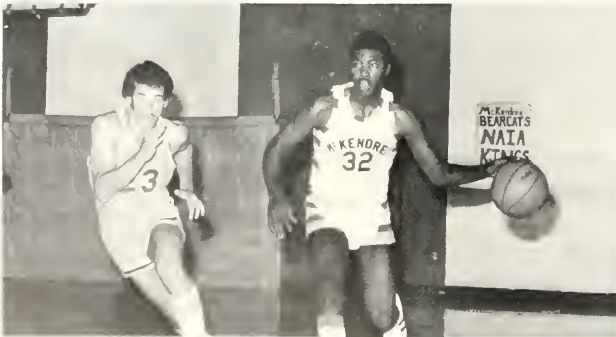

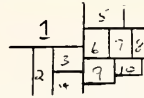
Alpha Omega

Alpha Phi Omega

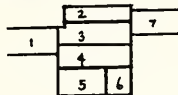

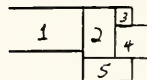

Delta Phi Sigma

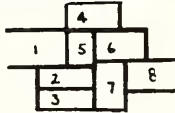

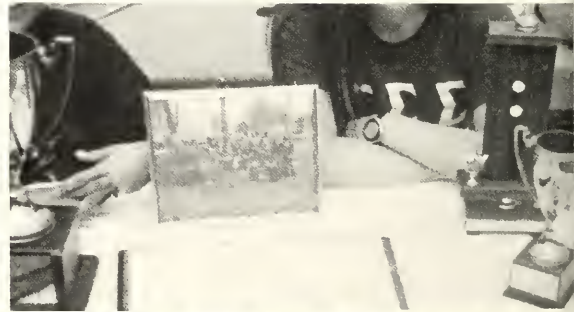

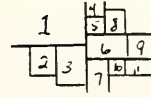

This honor is conferred on the basis of grade level, extracurricular campus involvement, citizenship within the McKendree community and overall excellence of contribution to McKendree.



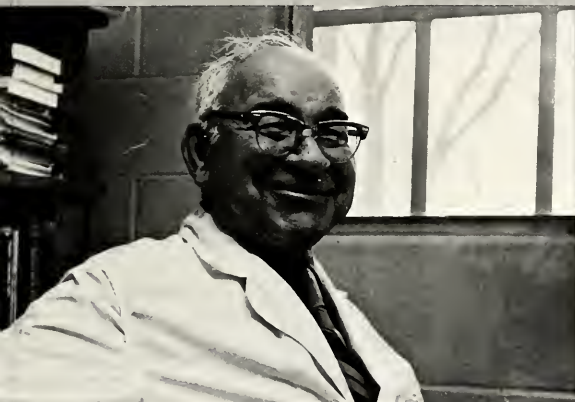
Fred Fleming Scholarship

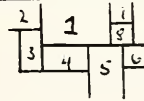

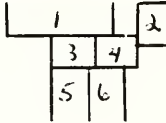

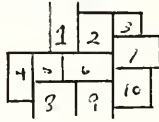

The McKendree Bearcats finished their fourth season of varsity soccer with their best record ever: 10 wins, 3 losses, and 1 tie. At the end of the season, McKendree ranked third in N. A. I. A. District 20, behind Quincy College and Lewis University.

McKendree scored a total of thirty-seven goals this season, averaging 2.6 goals each game. Only seventeen goals were scored against the Bearcats with an average of 1.6 goals each game. McKendree went undefeated the last six games of the season. Greenville was defeated for the second year in a row. Also defeated by McKendree was Illinois State University, an N. C. A. A. school.

Leading scorers for the season were Norm Seim with 7 goals and 5 assists, Kent Burroughs with 5 goals and 4 assists and Charlie Brown with 5 goals and 2 assists. The McKendree soccer team boasted eighteen lettermen with only three graduating seniors.
