The McKendree Bearcats finished their fourth season of varsity soccer with their best record ever: 10 wins, 3 losses, and 1 tie. At the end of the season, McKendree ranked third in N.A.I.A. District 20, behind Quincy College and Lewis University.

McKendree scored a total of thirty-seven goals this season, averaging 2.6 goals each game. Only seventeen goals were scored against the Bearcats with an average of 1.6 goals each game. McKendree went undefeated the last six games of the season. Greenville was defeated for the second year in a row. Also defeated by McKendree was Illinois State University, an N.C.A.A. school.

Her death leaves a great emptiness in the lives and hearts of her family and friends.








