The 1980 soccer Bearcats had a tough ladder to climb. It was billed as a rebuilding year and the 'Cats finished the season with a dismal 3-15 record. Despite their record, however, they received a NAIA District 20 post-season playoff berth.

McKendree College golf coach, John Randall was named District 20 Coach-of-the-Year.

Coach Van Smith's baseball Bearcats completed the most successful season of his 10 -year coaching reign, finishing the 1981 stint with a $26-16$ record.
