Duke University basketball coach Mike Krzyzewski, leader of the repeat NCAA champion Blue Devils, was the keynote speaker at McKendree College`s 1993 Founders Day celebration April 15. The evening also featured a silent auction and dinner.

Coach K has been crowned ACC "Coach of the Year" three times; Naismith National "Coach of the Year" twice, and the 1991 National "Coach of the Year," by the National Association of Basketball Coaches. Duke is the first repeat NCAA Champion since 1972-73; is three-time winner of the ACC title; and has made a halfdozen trips to the NCAA final four since 1986. However, Coach K's crowning achievement is not the victories of the titles. It is his dedication to the development of scholar athletes. "I don't expect them to be perfect," Coach K said. "I wasn't. There may be people who love them more than I do, but there aren't people who love them the way I do."

In Coach K's book, the player comes first, victory second. A Boston Globe columnist testified to this unique Coach K attribute: "A lot of college coaches bill themselves as teachers and quasi-academics, but few really are. Coach K is. He gets kids who can run, jump, shoot, and most important, think and then provides them with a forum to utilize all their gifts, both physical and cerebral."

## Model United Nations

The Model United Nations program originated on the McKendree College Campus in 1972. Known as the Public Affairs Forum, a small group of students won the support of the college to put on a small Model U.N. conference, serving only a handful of area schools.

Today, the Model U.N. serves fourteen high schools throughout Southern Illinois and Missouri. It contains over five hundred delegates. The program also remains the only one of its kind to offer tuitional scholarships to its outstanding delegates. In addition, the McKendree Invitational Model United Nations is recognized by the United Nations Association of the United States of America.


## McKendree English Language Institute

The McKendree English Language Institute students are admitted to McKendree College through certain English proficiency (TOEFL 400 or above) and a recommendation letter from their teachers in their high schools or colleges in their own countries. Japanese students are recommended to be sent by McKendree College-Japan. If their Test Of English as a Foreign Language score is not higher than 500 , they study in the MELI program to prepare
their English skills for college programs. During the year the international students took field trips to Eckert's Farm, St. Louis Art Museum, St. Charles Historical Districts and Showboat and the Science Museum in St. Louis. In addition to these activities, they also coordinated the first multicultural folkway festival and special presentation for three days on McKendree campus.

## Men's Basketball



The crowd watches intently as McKendree makes its way to victory.

Timely baskets and free throw shooting helped the McKendree Bearcats pull away from the HarrisStowe Hornets in the second half en route to a 102-90 victory Feb. 20, and their second straight Show-Me Collegiate Conference basketball championship.

The Bearcats have competed in the SMCC two years, capturing the regular season crown both years while compiling an 18-2 conference record over the two year span.

McKendree trailed Harris-Stowe 78-74 with 7:08 left in the contest. Then the Bearcats caught fire and went on a 13-0 run sparked by threepointers from freshmen Marc Derwort and Jon Kraus. McKendree maintained the lead by going 23 fro 29 from the free throw line in the
second half.
"We didn't play well in the first half but finally turned it up in the second half," said Coach Harry Statham.

The leading scorer for the 'Cats was senior Mark Markus who pumped in 19, with junior Todd Grigg adding 17. Senior Steve Davis led McKendree in the rebounding department with 11, and senior Chris Zupan led the squad with 5 assists.

By winning the regular season crown, McKendree gained the number one seed in the Show-Me Collegiate Conference Tournament. The 'Cats received a first round bye. In the second round fourth-seeded Missouri Baptist upset the 'Cats 81-71. Columbia won the tournament crown by knocking off Missouri Baptist 96-

62 in the championship game.
Entering the conference tournament McKendree had won nine of their last ten games. The Bearcats had moved into the number 30 spot in the NAIA Division I national poll

At the end of regular season play forward Mark Markus, from Aviston, Ill., led the 'Cats as the top point getter by averaging 16.3 points per game. At the other forward spot, Steve Davis, from Chicago, Ill., led the team in rebounding with six boards a game.

The Bearcats were scheduled to play IIT March 3 in the first round of the NAIA District 20 playoffs. The NAIA National Tournament is scheduled to get underway March 16 in Kansas City.
