



The McKendree Bearcats football team chalked up a 27-3 Homecoming victory against the University of St Francis. Senor kicker, Stephen Webb, and sophomore running back, George Smith, brought McKendree to a 10-3 lead in the first half. McKendree pulled away in the second half with runs by jumor fullback Adam Radno and jumor running back Dominique Jones. The Bearcat offense posted 313 yards on the ground against St Francis, while the Bearcat defense allowed only 187 yards.

Spring Storm



Damaging History

A White Oak tree believed to be more than 150 years old was brought down by a severe storm that rolled through Lebanon on May 26, 2004 April 3, 2006 a quickly moving storm, later identified as an 15-1 tornado, swept through Lebanon and the surrounding areas. The tornado fore the roof off of West apartment 1201, smashed cars, and broke numerous trees in half. First-year student Mandy Embrich was inside her car when a tree tell on it. Other students moved to interior halfs and basements to wait out the storm. Thankfully, no one was injured at McKendree.

The next day, classes were cancelled while more than 200 students, faculty, and staff volunteered their time to clean up the debris littering campus. President Dennis thanked the volunteers saying. It thank you for your efforts and quite honestly have nexer felt more proud to be at McKendree than I did as I watched you contribute your time and effort to this task."








The McKendrean Then & Now
