
Thy will be done in earth,


And lead us not into temptation,

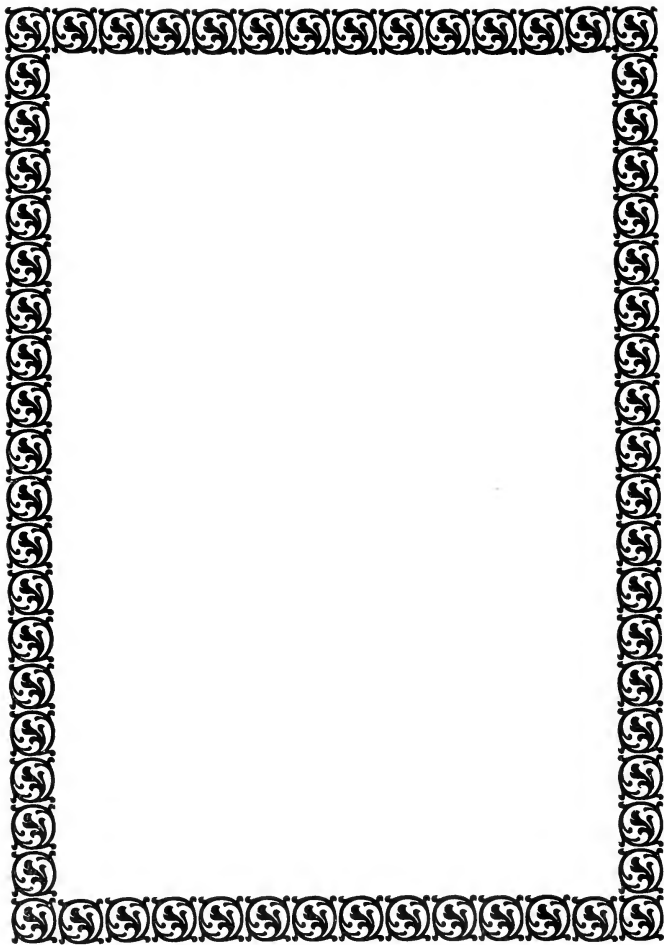
but deliver us from evil:
