


ACKNOWLEDGMENTS


If the reader of this book will but take the pains to look carefully at the copperplate engravings therein he must admit that he has rarely, if ever, seen work coming from a printing press which can so unreservedly and truthfully be called art. No matter how excellent a press may be, all that it can do with a poor plate is to make a better impression and a better general effect than would be possible with a poor printing press. The copperplates of the Barnes-Crosby Company are without flaw and without fault.

It is as impossible to make a good impression without a good press as it is impossible to make a good copperplate likeness of a person unless the original photograph were all that it should be. A large part, in fact the great majority, of the engravings used to illustrate "Men of Illinois" were made from photographs taken by Radnor Coover, whose studio is in the Schiller building, Randolph street, Chicago. Mr. Coover is without question in the very front of his profession. For his assistance in making this book pictorially excellent the publisher wishes to thank Mr. Coover heartily, and takes this as the best means of so doing.

The excellent appearance of the letterpress of "Men of Illinois" is due to the work of the Blakely Printing Company. The advance sheets of the work have been pronounced typographically perfect by men competent to judge. It was the aim of the publisher to have nothing but the best work enter into his book. The selection of the Blakely Printing Company was the natural outcome of this desire for perfection.



In the preparation of a book like “Men of Illinois” the publisher could be charged rightly with something worse than inconsistency if he failed to include in his work a word about the Illinois Central Railroad, whose origin, growth and success were due largely to the same qualities which made great the state.

The advance in material prosperity of the state of Illinois and the growth of the railroad system which bears its name were coincident. Few people, perhaps, at this day appreciate to how large an extent Illinois is indebted to this railroad for its development. Mr. W. K. Ackerman, in a history of the Illinois Central Railroad, in speaking of the license which was given the company by the state legislature to operate a railroad within the limits of Illinois, says: “The charter was a special one and in its bearing upon the future welfare and prosperity of the state was probably the most important ever granted.”

There are people living today who can remember the futile attempts that were made by the state itself and by a private corporation to construct a north-and-south railroad in Illinois. When finally the founders of the present Illinois Central received their charter and put their work through the people gave so much credit for the work that statesmen actually quarreled over the matter of credit for



having been the first to suggest the undertaking. An acrimonious correspondence passed between Stephen A. Douglas and Sidney Breese because each claimed to have been the first to suggest the railroad subject. Perhaps the credit really belongs, however, to Lieutenant-Governor Alexander M. Jenkins, who spoke of Illinois' railroad possibilities in the state senate as early as 1832.

The State of Illinois made a failure in trying to construct a railroad that was to connect ultimately the lakes with the gulf. The Great Western Railroad Company, so called, became bankrupt in trying to succeed where the state failed. In the year 1851 a little body of strong business men, headed by Jonathan Sturges, met, organized a corporation and from that hour the Illinois Central Railroad has existed.

It is but due to say that the officials of the Illinois Central Railroad have been interested in the progress of the publishing of "Men of Illinois," on account of the nature of the work and its intimate connection with the history of the state of which the story of the railroad forms so great a part. The publisher's acknowledgments are given sincerely to the officials of the Illinois Central Railroad for their courtesies on all occasions and for the information which they so readily supplied.
