









THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH AT THE SPOT WHERE



MINUTES

OF THE

SEVENTY-SEVENTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY

OF THE CUMBERLAND PRESBYTERIAN

CHURCH, HELD AT DICKSON, TENN.,

MAY 16th, TO 21st, 1907.

First Day, Thursday, Forenoon Session

MAY 16th, 1907, 10:30, A. M.

Pursuant to its own adjournment, the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church was convened for its Seventy-Seventh meeting at the birthplace of the Church in Dickson County, Tennessee, on the Third Thursday in May, 1907, at 10-30 o'clock, A. M.

DEVOTIONAL EXERCISES AND OPENING SERMON.

The Moderator, the Rev. J. L. Hudgins, made explanation of the occasion, after which the Rev. R. D. Shook, by the Moderator's request, led in a brief, fervent prayer.

The Moderator read Luke 6:12-23, and delivered a sermon from the text, Luke 6:17:—"And he came down with them and stood in the plain."

The Moderator and the Stated Clerk were directed to send fraternal greetings to the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in the United States in session at Birmingham, Alabama, to the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America, in session at Columbus, Ohio, to the General Baptist Convention, in session at Baltimore, Md., and to the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, Colored, in session at Providence, Ky. The greetings sent were in the following words:

The Seventy-seventh General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in Session at Dickson, Tenn., this May 16, 1907, sends to you its fraternal greetings.

See 2 Peter 1, 2.

ADDRESSES OF WELCOME TO BE HEARD.

Tomorrow morning at ten o'clock A. M. was fixed as the time for hearing addresses of welcome from the citizens of Dickson.

REGULAR RULE SUSPENDED.

The Assembly directed that the standing order of business for tonight be suspended, and that instead thereof, the Moderator preach a sermon.

ASSEMBLY TAKES RECESS.

The Assembly took recess until seven-thirty P. M. and was led in prayer by the Rev. H. Clay Yates.

First Day, Thursday, Night Session

MAY 16th, 1907, 7:30 P. M.

The Assembly was called to order at seven-thirty P. M. Prayer was offered by the Rev. Geo. W. May of Morgan Presbytery.

COMMITTEE ON SPECIAL PAPER.

On motion, the Moderator was instructed to appoint a special Committee of five to examine a paper held by Judge Joe H. Fussell, and that said Committee report to the Assembly at the close of the sermon tonight. The Committee so appointed were Judge Joe H. Fussell, Rev. J. L. Goodknight, Rev. W. M. Robison, Judge Jno. B. Talley and the Hon. J. J. McClellan.

SERMON BY THE MODERATOR.

The Moderator, the Rev. J. L. Hudgins, delivered a very able sermon. Prayer was led by the Rev. J. L. Riley of Indiana.

SERMON REQUESTED FOR PUBLICATION.

By unanimous vote the Assembly requested the Moderator, the Rev. J. L. Hudgins, to reproduce his sermon of tonight that it may be put into pamphlet form.

REPORT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEE.

The foregoing Committee of five appointed to examine a paper held by Judge Joe H. Fussell, reported the same to the Assembly; that it was an address from this Assembly to the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America. The Committee recommended the adoption of said paper and that the Stated Clerk forward a copy at once to the Moderator of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America.

The report of the Committee was unanimously adopted.

The address is as follows:

ADDRESS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE PRESBY- TERIAN CHURCH IN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

The General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in session at Dickson, Tennessee, to the General As-

sembly of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America, in session at Columbus, Ohio.

The year just now expiring has been an eventful year for your Church and for ours; eventful alike for each of them, but with different results. During that period, to our regret, perhaps as many as one-fourth of our lay members and more than one-half of our ministers have gone away from our Church and into yours on account of the so-called union and re-union between the two.

Notwithstanding all this the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, by the Grace of God, still survives; and it still feels that it has an important mission to perform in the world for our Divine Lord and Master. The vigor and zeal, the consecration and determination of our people in the performance of that mission are unabated. In this Assembly are now duly represented 76 of the 114 Presbyteries of our Church, the others having been disorganized for the present only, through the influx of a disabling number of our Ministers into your Church.

A large per cent of those leaving our communion for yours have been misled into that course by the often repeated statement in public addresses and otherwise, to the effect that your Church has abandoned the Westminster Confession of Faith as originally written and come to the doctrines of our Church. In the "Pastorial Letter" sent out by former Cumberland Presbyterians, as early as June, 1906, is found this statement: "But what is still more important to us is, that the Presbyterian General Assembly has declared that its amended creed is substantially the same as our own." And again, "The Presbyterian General Assembly by adopting the joint reports has also, in substance, declared that our Confession of Faith correctly expresses the meaning of its own Confession of Faith, which we have adopted."

It is not believed that a majority of your Church have sanctioned these misleading and unjustifiable statements, or that your Church desires to occupy the attitude indicated before the world.

The change of ecclesiastical allegiance by so large a part of our ministry and laity has brought profound regret and sorrow to our Church; yet that is not so distressing to our moral and religious sense, and to that of other Christian denominations,

as the cruel and relentless effort that has been made and is still being made throughout our Church on behalf of your Church and in its name, to coerce unwilling Cumberland Presbyterians and to compel them over their consciences to go into your Church, or, failing in that, then to coerce and compel them to give up their name, organization and Confession of Faith and surrender to your Church and in its name all of their houses of worship and other Church property. The demand thus made and pressed vigorously and incessantly, in court and out of court, on behalf of your Church and in its name, is, in substance and effect, that Cumberland Presbyterians shall worship as Presbyterians in the United States of America, or not at all; and, in the latter event, that they shall be forced to give up to that Church all of their houses of Worship and other property.

In the month of July, 1906, an injunction bill was filed at Fayetteville, Tennessee, by and in the name of certain former Cumberland Presbyterians, "and all other ministers, officers, and members of the Presbyterian Church in the U. S. A." The object of that bill, as recited therein, was to restrain and prohibit Cumberland Presbyterians (1) from using their own houses or worship, (2) from asserting any right thereto in any court of law or equity, (3) from the use of their church name, and (4) from using their Confession of Faith.

This suit and several others of like import, brought in like manner, in the States of Indiana, Missouri, Texas and may be in some other States are now pending. All of them are earnestly resisted by Cumberland Presbyterians, who, in self-defense and for self-protection have also brought several suits, which are likewise pending.

We cannot believe that the majority of your great Church have sanctioned this cruel and relentless course of oppression and wrong which is being pursued against us in the civil courts; or, if it has received that sanction heretofore, we cannot believe that upon sober second thought you will permit a continuance thereof in the future.

Your Church does not need our property; and even if it did, you, as Christian people, could not afford, if allowed, to take it from us. It is not yours and you ought not to claim it or to want it.

Our Church needs its own property and cannot well afford to do without it. Therefore, unless forced to that extremity by

the courts, which we do not look for, our Church will never surrender its property to your Church. We greatly deplore litigation, even in self-defense and for self-protection; yet litigation is better than tame submission to a great wrong and so great a deprivation.

Our people would not despair, however, if the worst should come to the worst, and our Church, at the end of prolonged litigation in every State, should find itself stripped of every house of worship and every vestige of other property, which is not expected; but they would trust, implicitly and confidently, the same God who so abundantly blessed the founders of our beloved Church, to bless them in like manner and enable them in due season to erect other houses of worship and acquire other necessary property.

Nor would anyone feel sure that our despoilers would enjoy the fruits of such a victory over us.

We can better afford to have our property wrested from us than others can to take it. Though worth contending for to the last extremity, this property is not indispensable to the continued life and usefulness of our Church. Cumberland Presbyterianism rests on a firmer foundation than that, and will survive these conflicts, property or no property. On the other hand, who can foresee or who will have the boldness to predict that our property, taken from us in the name of your Church and in its possession, would not prove to be like the wedge of gold in Achan's Tent?

You will not longer be misled or deceived by the interested declaration that the opposition among Cumberland Presbyterians to the so-called union and re-union is insignificant, and that it will soon pass away. The events of the last twelve months, so palpable before your eyes, have completely disproved that boastful assertion. Nor will future persistence in the unsanctified course of wrong and oppression and attempted coercion, if allowed by you, result in any gain to your Church or in the destruction of our Church. "But the more they afflicted them, the more they multiplied and grew."

Already the religious sensibilities of this whole country, if not of the entire world, have been shocked by this unfortunate and unnecessary conflict. It has brought discredit upon the cause of religion and apparently retarded the growth of our Master's Kingdom in those localities where the strife has been

greatest. It is the mistake, not to say the sin, of the present age! But the Cumberland Presbyterians have been powerless to prevent it. Nothing was left them but resistance. They preferred to stay where they were. Their consciences would not permit them to do otherwise. They entreated their brethren not to leave them, or, if leave they must, to go in peace. Their entreaties were disregarded; and they were told in effect that they must go too, notwithstanding their convictions, or, failing to do that, must be stripped of their houses of worship, their church name, and their Confession of Faith. The only alternative left them was and is resistance or ecclesiastical extinction. They chose the former, and by the Lord's help will maintain it. Who in this liberty-loving country can blame them? The right of self-defense and of self-protection is a sacred right the world over.

Finally, there is abundant room for both of these great churches, and abundant work for each of them to do, as separate and independent organizations of Christian men and women. Union without unity would be worse than no union at all.

It would be dishonoring to God and Man. Unity in this instance is an impossibility. This has been demonstrated. It was self-evident from the start.

Your houses of worship and other property are yours; your Church name, organization, and Confession of Faith are yours; and no one can take any of them away from you.

Ours are ours, and we deny the right of anyone to take them from us.

As to all of these and in mutual recognition of their inviolability in the future, we invoke the peaceable and unselfish spirit that moved the heart and controlled the action of Abram when he said to Lot: "Let there be no strife, I pray thee, between me and thee, and between my herdmen and thy herdmen; for we are brethren."

The Assembly voted to go into the election of Moderator; whereupon the Rev. A. N. Eshman, of New Hope Presbytery was by acclamation elected Moderator of the Assembly.

SPECIAL ORDER.

The Special order for this hour, 10 o'clock a. m. was to listen to addresses of welcome from those who had been delegated for that purpose from the citizens of Dickson. Very appropriate and highly interesting addresses were made by the Rev. J. A. Harris, pastor of the Methodist Episcopal Church, on the part of the churches; and by Mr. J. A. Clements, Attorney at Law, on the part of the citizens at large. To these the Rev. M. M. Smith, at the request of the Moderator, made a suitable response.

UNVEILING OF THE LOG HOUSE.

This was a very interesting exercise. The log house was a miniature exhibition of the home of the Rev. Samuel McAdow, in which was organized the First Presbytery of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. The unveiling of this model was accompanied with several highly instructive and very profitable historic addresses. Upon the rostrum were immediate descendants of Revs. Ewing, King and McAdow in the persons of four ladies, great grand-children and grand niece.

Saturday afternoon of this week, at 3 o'clock, was fixed for a Popular Educational Meeting, and the Rev. P. F. Johnson was appointed to prepare a program for the same.

Second Day, Friday, Night Session

MAY 17th, 1907, 7:30 P. M.

The Assembly was called to order by the Moderator.

POPULAR MISSIONARY MEETING.

This being the evening for a Popular Missionary Rally; after a few songs and prayers, the hour of 8:00 o'clock having arrived, and the Chairman of the evening, the Rev. J. L. Good-knight of Illinois presiding, the Rev. W. M. Robison of Texas, and Secretary of the Board of Missions, read the report of that Board. Following this, addresses were made by Rev. W. M. Your Committee appointed to consider the matter of the Board of Trustees of the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church beg leave to make the following report: The Board of Trustees of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church was regularly chartered in the year 1854, on the eighth day of March, by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of the State of Kentucky, which said Charter is here referred to, and made a part of this report.

Reference is also made to Stevens Digest, page 395. Said Charter amply provides and empowers the General Assembly to fill all vacancies created by death, resignation, or in any other manner, but specifically provides, "That should the time ever come when any religious body claiming to be the successor of the present General Assembly of said Church, and should hold and maintain doctrines and sentiments different from these now held by said Church; then the powers and privileges granted to the General Assembly of said Church inure to and be vested in that body of People professing and preaching the doctrines of said Church as now set forth in her Confession of Faith. (Section 13 of Charter.)

Now, whereas the Trustees heretofore elected under the provisions of said Charter, and now acting, have transferred their allegiance to another and different denomination, holding and teaching doctrines and sentiments different from the Confession of Faith and other doctrines of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, and are attempting to transfer all the property held by them in trust for the use and benefit of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, to said other and different Denomination which holds and maintains doctrines and sentiments different from those of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, and said Trustees have thereby violated said trust and forfeited their right to hold and remain as Officers and members of said Board of Trustees. We therefore recommend that this General Assembly, by the authority vested in it, declare the position of all of said members of said Board of Trustees vacant, and that this General Assembly proceed to fill said vacancies.

We further recommend that the following be elected to compose the Board of Trustees of the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, to-wit: The following names are proposed as suitable persons to constitute the Board of Trustees of the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church: Dr. T. W. Stone, Bowling Green, Ky.; Dr. J. F. Hendrick, Bowling Green, Ky.; W. J. Denhardt, Bowling Green Ky.; Judge Charles Drake, Bowling Green, Ky.; Joe D. Smith, Bowling Green, Ky.; C. W. Stone, Bowling Green, Ky.; Dr. W. R. Lundy, Bowling Green, Ky.; E. W. Beck Bowling Green, Ky.; M. R. Graham, Bowling Green, Ky., R. F. D. No. 1; L. J. Miller, Bowling Green, Ky.; Thos. W. "To the Moderator and Members of the 77th General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in session at Dickson, Tenn.

We, the undersigned citizens of Dickson, entertaining as we do the highest esteem for the personnel of this aggregation of Christian workers, and recognizing the great benefits of its social, moral and religious influence upon our citizenry; and with the profoundest sympathy for the persecuted Creed you espouse, which had its birth so near our front doors, conceived in agony of spirit, by as noble as the noblest Romans of the cross, who lived and strove, and wrought a work favored of God—a heritage, a charge, a blessing delivered to their posterity, whom we feel and think, are worthy sons and daughters of their sires, in the grand Christian work so humbly and prayerfully begun; and believing that no more favorable place could be selected for the renewal of the sacred pledges and vows, and the engendering of greater stamina and zeal for the everlasting good of the Church, than our little town, located so near its birth-place; we come with heart and hand and ask that you reconvene here in your next annual meeting.

"But with this we wish to offer as an apology, for the bad condition of our streets, and many other necessary conveniences to a better entertainment—that we were recently visited by a disastrous fire, that completely devastated the greater portion of our business interests, thereby greatly lessening our ability to entertain you this time in the manner we desired.

"And finally with the assurance of a most hearty welcome, should you in your wisdom see fit to select this for your next meeting place, or even to perpetuate it, we most respectfully submit this petition, with the assurance that it voices the sentiment of every citizen, whether his signature be affixed or not."

The Assembly extended a vote of thanks to this delegation of citizens of Dickson for its cordial invitation.

The Committee on Sabbath Observance through its Chairman, the Rev. H. Clay Yates, made its report which was concurred in and recommendations adopted.

RECESS.

The Assembly took recess until 7:30 o'clock, P. M. Prayer by the Rev. S. H. McElvain.

Fourth Day, Monday, Night Session

MAY 20th, 1907, 7:30 P. M.

The Assembly was called to order by the Moderator. Prayer by the Rev. J. M. Ashford.

SPECIAL HOUR—FRATERNAL DELEGATES.

This being the time fixed for that purpose, the Rev. J. T. Barbee and the Rev. B. H. Henderson, fraternal delegates from this Assembly to the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, Colored, in session at Providence, Kentucky, made verbal reports of their visit to, and what they did at said Assembly.

The Assembly extended them a vote of thanks for their work and directed the Stated Clerk to pay their expenses of \$8.57 each, which is a total of \$17.14.

II—Ministerial Relief, Report of Board of

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in the Seventy-Seventh Meeting, Dickson, Tennessee, May, 1907.

Dear Fathers and Brethren:

Your Temporary Board of Ministerial Relief appointed last year at Decatur, Illinois, most respectfully report to you a year of very pleasant service in receiving and disbursing the free will offerings of those of our people who have recognized the high honor and great privilege which the Lord has given us in permitting us to have part with him in tenderly caring for those whose lives are still spared after their more active service has ceased.

Not a note of complaint or of murmuring has come to this Board from any applicant for aid; but on the contrary there came such expressions of gratitude for the mere pittance which we could send, and also such expressions of heroic devotion to our Church, as would make any able bodied Cumberland Presbyterian blush for the failure to contribute for their temporal comfort.

RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS.

The total cash offerings coming to this Board may seem to be a small item, but it exceeds the amount contributed by the entire Church during the first year (1882—\$598.61) or of the second year (1883—\$419.89) and nearly equals that of the third year (1884—\$782.43) of the existence and the work of our Board at Evansville, Ind., the total for this year being\$611.76
 Add to this the cash and supplies from congregations and Presbyteries as paid to others and reported to us.. 85.99

 and the total is\$697.75
 From which sum there has been disbursed 394.42

 Leaving a balance of\$303.33
 Our books and vouchers are ready and open for your inspection.

OUR BENEFICIARIES.

"And he said to me, These are they which came out of great tribulation."

"Therefore are they before the throne of God, and serve Him day and night in His temple."

"They shall hunger no more, neither thirst any more;"

"For the Lamb which is in the midst of the throne shall feed them, and shall lead them unto living fountains of waters; and God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes."

We have eleven of them enrolled, and we are hearing of others. Your attention is called to the twenty-fifth annual report of the Board as recorded in the Minutes of our General Assembly last year pages 6a to 13a inclusive.

There is urgent need that steps be taken to save the Thornton Home and the \$34,955.67 Endowment Fund, as well as other gifts and legacies which have been reported during the year, and which are in danger of being diverted from our branch of the Church of Jesus Christ and of being subverted to the use of another Church.

Let our motto for the coming year be an offering, however small, from every man, woman and child in the Cumberland Presbyterian Church for the comfort of the ministers so

graciously spared to us, and for the widows and the orphans of those who have been called home.

We have managed the affairs committed to us informally and on faith. The Assembly should authorize suitable blanks and literature to be prepared, and fix the amount of bond to be given by the Treasurer and Corresponding Secretary.

III—Missions, Report of Board of.

Marshall, Texas, May 1, 1907.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church at Dickson, Tennessee:

Brethren:—The action of the old Board of Missions in May, 1906, in giving in its adhesion to that portion of the Cumberland Presbyterian General Assembly, which declared its allegiance to the Presbyterian Church in U. S. A., made it necessary for that portion of the Assembly which remained true to the Cumberland Presbyterian Church to speedily organize a new Board of Missions. This it did by selecting Rev. J. L. Joyner, of Cordell, Oklahoma; Rev. W. M. Robison, of Marshall, Texas; Wm. Clark, of Jefferson Texas; F. Y. Hall of Marshall, Texas, and F. H. Prendergast, of Marshall, Texas.

The Assembly did not formulate any rules nor give any directions as to the methods it desired employed by the Board in accomplishing the work.

The members of the Board have all along felt the lack of experience, and with no funds, we saw also that we had not only to look after the waste places, where the Gospel had not been usually preached, but many urgent calls came from places that had hitherto been self-sustaining. We found many congregations and communities that had been an ornament, a help, and a support for our Church in the past, now divided and their energies and funds dissipated in contentions over the Church property, or the cause of Union.

We have been confronted with many of our old time friends and co-workers, now busily tearing down our work and our Church, persuading our members to leave us and go to the Northern Presbyterian Church.

In many cases they have suppressed information as to our work, misrepresented our labors and traduced our laborers. We have not suffered where representatives have been met in the open and fairly combated, but we have suffered from the successful efforts of Unionists to prevent us and our representatives from being heard.

Starting anew from the epoch of May, 1906, without money and no past to guide or warn us as to the amount of funds we might expect, we have worked in constant dread lest we should incur financial obligations that we could not meet and thus bring reproach; with this idea we have failed on many occasions to respond to calls, which we knew were urgent. Let this one statement be a full explanation to all the Church of our seeming indifference to many calls.

We have spent money sparingly at all times and perhaps we should at some places spent more or none at all. We have done our best.

No member of the Board has been paid for his labors. The only expense has been a stenographer, in the office of the President at the salary of \$15.00 per month. What labor we have given, we have given ungrudgingly, but we have been so situated as to our other duties in life, that we could not give the Church enough of our time to justify our charging for it; we have also felt that the Church should have more than we could give without fee.

We desire that the Board should be organized on some basis that will include, at best, one salaried officer who could give the time needed to the work.

We think by far the most important work of the Church is comprised within the duties of the Board of Home Missions.

With this in view, we urge upon the Assembly that it devote one of the earlier days of its session to a free and full consideration of the Home Mission work. Resolve itself into a kind of Committee of the Whole so that as little restraint as may be, will be in the discussion, and the Assembly thereby come into possession of the calls, the needs, and the trials of all parts of the Church.

That the Woman's Board be given a place on the program, and its representatives be heard.

That at this meeting an efficient and active committee be appointed to report at a later day of the Assembly, and that said Committee be given full instructions as to plans, then when you select your new Board it will feel that its plans and its demands on the Church are backed up and approved by the highest Court of the whole Church.

Some of our former co-workers have been lured from the humbler walks of our modest organization, by the light of glory that they supposed gleamed from a great National Church, and have been blinded by the deceptive glory from a hoped for National Cathedral, and the wayside cottage with its freight of human souls as precious as the most exalted, is left in gloom and darkness,

There is yet room, there is yet need for our Church to go on as it has in the past, and though the Unionists seem now to have withdrawn fellowship, let us not be unmindful of our duty to our trust; we must forget all the passions and forget all the prejudices, in the contention of the last few years, and we should strive with each other in a rivalry to upbuild our glorious Church.

We submit below a statement of our work:

At the meeting of our Assembly in May, 1906, it was decided to leave the Foreign Mission work at rest for the present; in our judgment we are not yet ready to take it up.

With reference to our Chinese Mission post, heretofore situated in San Francisco, we entered into correspondence with Gam Sing Quah soon after our appointment, and at first he thought he would go with the Unionists and on that account declined aid from us, though assuring us that he was a true Cumberland. Later, in January, 1907, he assured us that he felt bound in conscience to stay with us and since that date he has been receiving aid from us. He needs more than we can pay him and urges us to send him an assistant. I attach hereto a resolution recently passed by the Presbytery in which he works, and join in its request that the Church take strong ground in the direction of sustaining Brother Gam in his work. We have been acting with the Woman's Board in this matter, and hope the Assembly will secure their co-operation in all our work.

Memphis. We have spent much time and thought on the importance of building up our work in Memphis, and furnish as it were, an asylum for all those who find uncongenial homes in the Northern Presbyterian Church.

Rev. J. D. Lewis is our representative in West Tennessee Synod, and is fully informed as to all their trials and needs.

Rev. T. E. Hudson has acted for us in Tennessee Synod, but owing to various causes he has not accomplished much.

Rev. R. D. Shook has been laboring faithfully in Alabama and has done some good work. The weight of years upon him has not lessened his zeal.

Rev. J. T. Barbee is at work for the cause in Kentucky and we are glad to know that the local interests have used him efficiently.

Rev. T. H. Padgett, at our request, has added to his duty as Stated Clerk, the work of looking after Arkansas, and was especially successful in urging that funds be sent to the Board.

In Missouri we have commissioned several to act for us, but none of them have been so situated that they could undertake the work.

Rev. N. G. Nicholson of Pueblo, has been acting for us in the Rocky Mountain country, but has not been able to accomplish much.

We have interests in some property and money at Colorado Springs which should receive attention and W. D. Marlow can and will give all the aid possible.

In Texas we have had Rev. S. C. Lockett, who has visited most of the state, and Rev. B. E. Bowmer, his assistant, have done good work against great opposition.

We have commisssioned all of these men to collect funds in our name and use the same to pay their per diem and expenses. This was largely necessary by our lack of funds, but we do not commend it as being proper, when it can be avoided.

All our correspondence we will deliver to our successors.

We hardly think it necessary to review the work further, as the Board will be represented at the Assembly and same will have to be re-arranged.

IV—Publication, Report of Board of

To the 77th General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in session at Dickson, Tennessee:

Your Board of Publication beg leave to submit the following report.

Your Board was named at the last General Assembly at Decatur, Illinois, under conditions very unfavorable for specific or aggressive work. Our publishing house and all publication interests being in the hands of the Unionists. We have held ourselves in readiness for any work that presented itself.

The first act of your Board was to suggest undenominational Sunday School literature temporarily until such time as we could be able to supply our Sunday Schools with Cumberland

Presbyterian literature and considerable correspondence was conducted on this account last year. We are glad that through the action of the Tennessee Synod and their committee on Sunday School literature, a special committee was appointed composed of R. L. Baskette, Frank Slemons, J. H. Zarecor.

This special committee advised with the Chairman of our board and with his endorsement secured the services of Rev. J. R. Goodpasture, so that we were soon able to recommend Cumberland Presbyterian literature prepared by our own people.

These brethren publish this literature on their own responsibility and our Board incurs no nancial liability, yet we recommend that all our Sunday Schools throughout our bounds support them and aid them in dessiminating Cumberland Presbyterian exposition of truth.

This temporary arrangement for the publication of Sunday School literature expires with the last quarter of the year 1907.

We would therefore beg to be advised by this body as to the course to further pursue after the expiration of preseth temporary arrangement.

We are glad to report the liberal and generous support that has been given the Cumberland Presbyterian Banner, and also the continued growth of its subscription list which now numbers about 10,000 and we recommend that some special effort be made to add at least 2,500 new subscribers at once.

Your Board has made no call for collections, but have incurred expenses to the amount of about \$200.00 in publication interests and we subbest that the amount be ordered paid from the general fund or special collection for the Board.

3. That said Board of Trustees of the General Assembly be and are hereby likewise requested and instructed to take such steps as may be deemed necessary and proper to secure and get possession of any and all other funds of Boards which may properly come before the Assembly's Board of Trustees and wherein legal action has not otherwise been provided for by this General Assembly.

VI.—Education: Beg Leave to Offer the Following Report, Your Committee on.

This is a time for action, not words; deeds, not promises; of

no part of our work is this truer than of the educational work of the whole Church.

This is a time not only to insist upon the importance of education, but to grasp the significance and meaning of the character of the education given and thrust upon our children by our free schools and Colleges.

There has never been a time in the history of advanced and "higher education," so called, than now when the character of the teaching, the things taught and the teacher, are of such vital importance to Christians and especially to Cumberland Presbyterian parents. You may say what you will, but nothing will or can strengthen our denominationalism more than that our own children shall be taught in their advanced education in denominational Academies and Colleges which are manned by Cumberland Presbyterians.

This is an axiomatic proposition: The Cumberland Presbyterian Church must educate her own children in her own denominational schools if she expects them to remain loyal to the denomination. The most disintegrating factor with the more highly educated young people in the past has been the sending them every-whither to Academy and College rather than sending them to our own denominational schools. Wherever you find loyal young people who have graduated from Colleges, they are mainly those whose fathers and mothers thought no school so good for them as Cumberland Presbyterian.

In the judgment of your Committee, we as a denomination have come to the parting of the ways in our educational work. We have to make up our minds that we will not only be loyal to the doctrines of the Church, but must be loyal to the institutions of the Church. There is no single institution that takes precedence of our educational institutions.

This very naturally brings us to speak of the present condition of our various schools, Colleges and Universities. They are mostly in the hands of men who are so void of a sense of honor, honesty and integrity, that they are trying to transfer these into the hands of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America, that this Sanhedrim may do what it pleases with them. All of which warns us that in the future the denomination should be more vigilant in guarding her educational institutions in two particulars: (1) The men who are on their governing boards, and (2) the teachers who answer to roll call in the class rooms. As a matter of fact for years the denomination has made good places in her Colleges and Universities for teachers who were hunting a job and were willing to become nominally, a Cumberland Presbyterian in order to get a good paying position, and readily accepted such in our denominational schools. Your Committee trusts that in the future it

shall be the policy of every Cumberland Presbyterian institution of learning to man them with Cumberland Presbyterian teachers, that the denominational atmosphere and spiritual and religious ideals may be taught by both precept and example. That our schools may be pre-eminently Christian and spiritual as well as denominational, which they have not been for twenty-five years or more. Denominational schools are a necessary factor in our existence. The founders of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church recognized this, and began early to have church schools all over the territory covered by the Church. Let us profit by their mistakes and failures; we should read our own history with profit, in this particular. It is our belief that in due time our schools now in the hands of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America will be put in our hands by the due process of law. Until then we must wait for definite plans as to what shall be done. However, when the educational institutions come into possession of the Church, let no Board of any of these be constituted with less than safe majorities of their members being loyal Cumberland Presbyterians. One member of our Committee, a layman, insists that he is tired of the young Ministers of our Church going to Presbyterian Theological Seminaries to learn their theology. The idea in the mind of this man is correct. But until we have a Professor of theology in our own Theological Seminary, who is not a Calvinist, it would seem that we who are in a glass house should throw rubber air balls and not stones. "First make our tree good, and then the fruit will be good." It is dishonest and dishonoring to God and Christian manhood for any man to occupy a denominational chair of theology and not teach the doctrines pure and simple of that denomination.

There has been read to this General Assembly the report of the Board of Education. We regard it one of, if not the ablest reports ever presented to the General Assembly by this Board. We have carefully examined the report and find no fault in it. The seemingly objectionable phrases to some, are properly safeguarded by being full quotations from other documents. We recommend the following:

1. That said report be embodied and made a part of our report and be printed in the minutes of the General Assembly, as such.

2. That the Board of Education be enlarged to nine members and the following named persons be added to your present Board, viz: Rev. J. L. Hudgins, Union City, Tenn.; J. N. Parker, Dyersburg, Tenn.; and C. L. Wade, Trenton, Tenn.

3. That the location of the Board remain as ordered by the General Assembly at Decatur, Illinois.

4. That if a Cumberland Presbyterian College is officially opened that it be given the preference and patronage by the whole denomination.

5. That we endorse Radnor College as the best school in the land for the daughters of Cumberland Presbyterians.

6. That the Board of Education arrange to have a representative in each Presbytery, who shall specially care for the interests of the Board of Education in the particular Presbytery.

7. That the appropriations of the funds for education in the hands of this Board be left absolutely to the Board, but it shall submit an itemized report of all funds received and for what expended to the General Assembly of 1908.

8. That all the various congregations be requested to take an offering for Education some Sabbath in September, 1907, and forward the same to the Board of Education, and that Pastors and Supplies are instructed to see that this request of the General Assembly is carried out wherever it is within their power.

9. That the Second Sunday in September, 1907, be set apart as the day when a sermon shall be preached upon a call to the Ministry; that this Sunday be made a special day for united prayers all over the Church that God will move and call young men into the Ministry and young women to special Christian work, by the special operations of the Holy Spirit.

10. That this General Assembly hereby extends a vote of thanks to the members of this Board for their services, and especially to the Secretary, Rev. P. F. Johnson, for his untiring work and zeal in the preparation of the report, and hereby commends the Board's work to all Cumberland Presbyterians and requests that all the Churches assist it with sympathy, prayers and money.

11. Whereas certain members, J. M. Hubbert, W. H. Holbert, R. M. Tinnon, M. A. Montgomery, W. B. Holmes, W. J. Darby, A. E. Turner, J. R. Henry, S. F. Stahl, A. R. Taylor D. E. Mitchell and E. F. Burcher of your incorporated Board of Education have declared their allegiance to the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America, and are endeavoring to divert and transfer the funds and property in their possession to the use and benefit of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America; therefore, the following persons be and are hereby elected and appointed as the Board of Education of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, whose duty shall be to call upon the said incorporated Board of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, that said incorporated Board take the necessary steps to elect the following persons as their successors as members of said incorporated Board, viz: Allen Foust, P. F. Johnson, J. W. Smith, W. E. Dunaway, J. D. Lewis, Frank Slemmons, J. L. Hudgins, J. N. Parker and C. L. Wade, and turn over to them

all property, rights and franchises, that belong to said incorporated Board. Should the said incorporated Board who have so attempted to divert the property and funds of said incorporated Board from the proper use to the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, fail or refuse to comply with the demand herein made, then in that event the said Board herein appointed, is hereby authorized, empowered, and they are directed to take such legal action as may be necessary to depose the members of said incorporated Board and to have appointed and constituted as said incorporated Board the following persons, viz: Allen Foust, P. F. Johnson, J. W. Smith, W. E. Dunaway, J. D. Lewis, Frank Slemons, J. L. Hudgins, J. N. Parker and C. L. Wade, to the end that the purposes for which said Board was created shall be perpetuated.

Twenty-Sixth Annual Report of the Board of Education.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church In Session at Dickson, Tenn., May, 1907:

Dear Brethren:—The Board of Education under the provisions and order of the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church at Decatur, Illinois, held its first meeting at McKenzie, Tenn., June 15, 1906, with the following members present: Rev. Allen Foust, Rev. J. D. Lewis and Elders W. E. Dunaway and J. W. Smith. Absent, Frank Slemons.

The meeting was called to order by the Rev. Allen Foust and prayer was offered by Elder W. E. Dunaway, Rev. Allen Foust was unanimously elected President of the Board and J. W. Smith was elected Recording Secretary. The Rev. P. F. Johnson, Dyer, Tenn., was elected to fill the vacancy in the Board caused by the refusal of W. W. Hamilton to serve as a member. The Rev. P. F. Johnson was elected as Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer of the Board under the following stipulations: "His expenses to be paid by the Board out of the general fund of the Educational Board, his salary to be made satisfactory to him according to the time taken to do the work. He is to make his reports to Board quarterly. He is expected to enter upon all duties pertaining to his office at once, urging prompt collections for Education by all the Congregations."

The President announced through the press the results of this first meeting, and the Corresponding Secretary made a call, in the Cumberland Banner for the collection, in accordance with the above instructions.

History.

The Board of Education was organized in 1881. The object for which it was organized is set forth in the following resolution, which was adopted at the time: "Resolved, that the Gen-

eral Assembly do establish a Board of Education, whose object shall be to render pecuniary aid to said candidates while in school. The Board was directed to secure a charter, and in the meantime "to receive and disburse any funds that may come into its hands according to the direction of the donors." The charter was secured and reported to the General Assembly in 1882. In 1883 the Board reported, "That nothing has been done by us as a Board to advance this great interest." The Board made its first financial report in 1884. Fourteen churches made offerings, which amounted to \$77.41. The Church reported that year 122,240 communicants. From the foundation of the Board up to May 10, 1886, it had received from all sources, the sum of \$219.63. From this time on the work increased rapidly, much funds were collected and a number of young men and women were assisted through school. The Church and the Board worked harmoniously. In 1895 the Board proposed to the General Assembly certain amendments to the charter which would change the name to "Educational Society of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church," and also give the Board authority to render assistance to the Theological School, or schools, established and endorsed by the General Assembly. The Rev. W. J. Darby, D. D., had been elected Corresponding Secretary, and the motto was "Education Before Ordination." The Board reported in 1896, the necessary changes made in the charter, and recommended much machinery for carrying out the new plans of the Board, which was adopted. Among which was prescribed a full six-year's course of study for those preparing for the ministry.

The educational interest of the Church at that time is shown by the following facts which are gathered from the Annual Report: Eighteen schools under the control of the Church reported: Teachers, 168, students enrolled, 3254; total value of school property, \$621,500, with a total endowment of \$333,793.63. The number of Probationers reported that year was 572, and the number of communicants was 165,847. The amount reported through the Board for educational purposes was \$12,560.45. This was the banner year in the work of the Board when considered as a whole. Upon the recommendation of the Board in 1897 the General Assembly "Instructed the Presbyteries to notify each Congregation in their several limits of the minimum amounts desired from each church for the work of the Educational Society, and to hold the Congregations to an account before the Presbyteries for the performance of this duty." This method secured the next year \$9,237.12, which is \$2,635.55 less than was received the previous year.

The greatest educational scheme ever launched by the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, was that of 1899, and known as the "Million Dollar Endowment Proposition." This proposition

was proposed to the General Assembly by the Educational Society. The plan adopted was centralizing in its effect. An Educational Commission was created and given power that even threatened chartered rights. For the time education overshadowed every other institution of the Church. The Committee on Education said: "We are at the parting of the ways, the very life of the Church itself is involved in the action taken by this General Assembly."

The importance attached to the Educational Commission is indicated by the time given to it in the General Assemblies and the space occupied by its reports in the Minutes. In 1900 there was a falling off in the amount loaned to students. The intention of Mr. James Millikin to make large gifts to the cause of education was made public. The James Millikin University located at Decatur, Illinois, was reported to the Assembly of 1901. In common with the other Boards of the Church, the Educational Society filed complaints at almost every meeting of the General Assembly against the non-contributing churches throughout the denomination. To reach this class of churches the plan of "Co-operation of Boards" was adopted in 1902. The year 1903 was noted: for the prosperity of the institutions of learning, the increase of the endowment of schools, the indifference manifested on the part of probationers for the ministry for an education, and the appointment of the Committee on Fraternity and Union. In 1904 the Board of Education presented in their annual report a tabulated statement, which exhibited an alarming decrease in the number looking to the ministry as their life-work. At the same time a severe reprimand was administered to the Presbyteries that ignored the mandates of the Assembly relative to the ordination of licentiates who had not complied with the new regime. The report for 1905 clearly indicates that the theory and plan of education adopted by the Assembly at Meridian, Miss., and further developed by subsequent Assemblies, was not fully endorsed by the Church at large and was meeting with much opposition. The Board of Education reached its Twenty-fifth Anniversary last year.

We submit the following figures which are taken from the Assembly Minutes for the years 1881 and 1906:

Despite the effort to belittle the progress of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church these figures show a healthy growth. In one point only do we find a falling off, viz: In the number of pro-

bationers for the ministry. To this table should be added the increase in value of the school buildings, endowment funds, publishing house, and all other property held in trust by the various Boards, which has kept pace with the other points illustrated by the above table.

Embarrassments.

Since the meeting of the General Assembly in 1903 the enterprises of the Church have been seriously embarrassed, and especially has this been so with the educational interests. The Endowment Proposition gradually lost its hold on the membership. The Report of the Educational Commission for 1906 opens with the following announcement, which explains the situation: "The great issues of union with the Mother Church continue to be discussed with such fervor in so many parts of the Church during the past year that it was difficult to get a hearing for our educational enterprises outside of the localities immediately interested." The embarrassments have increased greatly since the last report was made. The tendency on the part of many of the young men in training for the ministry to accept the offer of a wealthier Church, which was encouraged by the union agitators, has to a great extent interfered with the progress of this important work. The attempted union, or more properly the merger of our Church into the Presbyterian Church, U. S. A., has to a great extent, consumed the thought, energy and means of the entire Church. But none of these things move us. We are determined by the Grace of God to press forward toward the high mark set for the ministry by the Fathers and founders of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

In addition to the above the Educational Society of White River Presbytery of the Synod of Arkansas, reports in its Treasury \$12.87.

The receipts of the year are small, but when compared with the receipts of the Board for the first three years of its existence, and taking into consideration the present disturbed condition of the Church, they are encouraging.

The past is in the past and to theorize about it is a useless waste of energy and time. It is ours to utilize the present and plan for the future. We, therefore, present the following suggestions and recommendations for your consideration:

1. We desire that you make it clear to the Church that this Board is the creature and servant of the General Assembly, and through you as a body representing the laity, it is the servant of the whole Church.

2. We are of the opinion that the number of members placed on this Board by the last General Assembly is not as large as it should be to represent the whole Church. We therefore, recommend, that you increase the number to at least nine members, and that you also state the time each one is appointed to serve and give directions for the election of successors.

3. The Church is in great need of a school for the training of her probationers. While we are hopeful of success in the final results as to our property rights, yet the situation at present is such that we are not sure of absolute and undisturbed control of any one of our schools this year, and pending the settlement of this question we would recommend that you direct the Presbyteries to utilize the best schools in their reach and place their probationers in them, and that the Board of Education be instructed to take steps looking toward the opening of such school, or schools as shall be under the control of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

4. We call your attention to the fact that the Educational Society reported to the General Assembly last year a "Permanent Fund," which amounted to \$6,800. This "Fund" rightly belongs to the Cumberland Presbyterian Church; but will be claimed by the Unionists for the Presbyterian Church, U. S. A. We recommend that you take such steps as you may deem necessary to save this "Fund" to our Church, its legitimate owner.

5. Your Board is of the opinion that present demands are so pressing that it would not be wise to put means in the "Permanent Fund." We shall be governed by your directions.

6. It has been the custom of the Board to make recommendations relative to the schools and educational needs of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, Colored. We have had no official communication with the schools or Board of said Church; but we are of the opinion that a thorough investigation of their condition, needs and relation to the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, should receive your prompt attention.

7. We very earnestly lay before this Assembly the great need of the Church for more Ministers. We beg that you bring this question before the Church as one worthy of her consideration and prayers. So important is this question in the present struggles of our beloved Church, we suggest that you set apart

one hour of the time of this Assembly for prayer and conference. We need to call upon the Great Head of the Church for more laborers and confer with each other as to the outlook and needs of the various parts of the Church.

8. We recommend, that every minister be directed to preach at least one sermon every year to his congregations "On a call to the Ministry" and that every congregation be urged to take a collection every year for this cause and forward the same to the Board promptly so that any young men looking to the work of the ministry may understand that a consecrated membership is standing behind them and willing to assist them in securing an education.

Praying that the Holy Spirit shall guide you in your deliberations and for the peace, unity and purity of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

The Evangelist is the man sent of God to help the faithful Pastor gather in the crop that he has planted and cultivated so faithfully.

Hence all honor is due to the pastor.

Owing to the depleted condition of the office of Stated Clerk and Treasurer, after the closing of the Assembly at Decatur in May, 1906, made so by the Stated Clerk J. M. Hubbert carrying with him into the Presbyterian Church U. S. A., all the assets and belongings of the office of Stated Clerk and Treasurer of the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church—

In view of these facts—we say, “Well done.”

We would further report that we have in like manner examined the reports of Bro. J. J. McClellan, the Treasurer of your Legal Board, and find that he has received at various times and from sundry persons as per his report, the sum of Five Thousand, One Hundred and Ninety-eight Dollars and Ninety Cents. Thus leaving a balance due Bro. J. J. McClellan, your Treasurer, the sum of One hundred and Sixteen Dollars and Ninety Cents.

We believe that too much praise cannot be given by this General Assembly to this entire Board for the able, efficient

and sacrificing manner in which they have managed that part of our Church's business, and your Committee is of the opinion that said Legal Board should be continued with full power as heretofore—and we so recommend.

X.—Ministerial Relief, Reports of Committee on.

No. 1.

As dark as the outlook is, yet in a great many respects we are incomparably better off than the fathers were. They had no organized churches behind them; not a dollar of money, and an old and strong church doing all in its power against them. But in some things we are, by far, worse off than they. They were all young men, or in the prime of life; and they were burdened with no obligations but to "defend the faith, and persuade men to come to Christ. It is far different with us today. We not only have the faith to defend, but we have slanders and misrepresentations to refute; while combined against us, with all its prestige, numbers, influence and exhaustless resources, is the Presbyterian Church U. S. A., to back and second the efforts of our own treacherous brethren in a desperate effort to blot out and destroy forever, not only the doctrines, but the very name and memory of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

For years and years this scheme has been in incubation. A combine of men who are not in harmony with the simple and unostentatious polity and humble methods of our church, have been secretly preparing for the work.

This scheme was deeply and cunningly planned. Through our "leading men" "the right man" for their plan, was put in the right place; the pickets and camp guards were wisely set. By placing the right man in the right place FOR THEM, all of our Boards, and all of our interests were in a position that

when the mine was sprung they had entire possession of every particle of the machinery of the Church; they had control of all its agencies, and possession of all its assets, so that at the final separation we were left without a single Board, without a single Committee, and without a single Dollar. But we were not left entirely bankrupt; for while they took all that they controlled, and claimed to take all the learning and brains with them, we still retained the Truth of God, His precious promises and, I trust, the Baptism of the Holy Spirit. But we have been left increased responsibilities in multiplied directions. Among these none is greater than that of caring for aged and disabled ministers and the widows and orphans of men who have worn out their lives in the service of the Church, and the widows and orphans of others, have remained unshaken in their devotion to the Church.

Among these are some who are wholly or in part, dependent but still unshaken in their love and loyalty to our cause. The work of caring for them is not a burden, but a pleasure. This is a work of no small magnitude. We have a much larger per cent. of this work than we had before the division, for the reason that almost all of the old men remained true. This is not surprising when we reflect that these old men were thoroughly drilled in our system of faith, and trusted the leading and guiding of the Holy Spirit, and had gone out without pay, and done their work. But the younger men had been trained in their quest of "Larger Things" in a more systematic way; some having their minds poisoned at Lebanon, and other Seminaries.

Those faithful men of God were, no doubt, spared just for this time, that their counsel and prayers might strengthen and encourage us. This is no burden or hardship, but a privilege, and should prove a means of grace to everyone. Those old servants were, in many cases, abused and even threatened, and they were insulted with OFFERED BRIBES, but they refused to stultify their consciences and violate their convictions of truth, by going into the union, now so "happily consummated."

These noble men of God deserve, not only the love and gratitude of the Church, but its support and protection. God in His love and wisdom, has spared their lives, and thus indicates to us our duty to them.

Our people are abundantly able and willing also, if they are but informed.

In view of these facts your Committee recommends as follows:

(1.) That the Assembly devise means by which this matter may be brought more effectively before the people.

(2.) That the Assembly instruct the ladies to make this subject a special part of their work.

(3.) That your Committee is informed that all of the Board of Ministerial Relief have left the Communion of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church and have united with the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America, except Dr. G. W. Ralston, and as his being the only one left of the former nine members of that important Board, your Committee recommends that the Assembly proceeds at once to fill the eight vacancies caused by the apostasy of these men.

Your Committee on Ministerial Relief submit the following:

The report of the Temporary Board of Ministerial Relief, which was referred to us, recommend that the Assembly, at once, authorize the preparation of suitable blanks for the Boards; also that it furnish necessary literature.

We also heartily endorse the recommendation of the Temporary Board, that the Assembly fix the Bond to be given by the Treasurer and Corresponding Secretary.

We further present the names of the following brethren as the proper persons for said Board: E. M. Johnson, W. M. Freeze, J. L. Goodknight, G. W. May, J. H. Milholland, J. M. Wyckoff, J. A. Hill and R. D. Miller.

We recommend that the bond of the Treasurer and the Corresponding Secretary be \$5,000.00 each.

XI.—Missions and Church Erection, Report of Committee on.
To the Moderator and members of the Assembly:

Your Committee on Missions and Church Erection beg leave to submit the following report:

We have had under careful consideration the report of the Board of Missions and Church Erection and other papers reported to us bearing on this important department of our Church work, and from these and other available sources of information, have tried, as best we could, to see the most urgent needs of the Church on these lines at this time. We recognize mission work as the most important of all the enterprises of the Church, and that we may do our utmost along the most urgent and available phases of this work, especially submit the following recommendations.

1. That the Board of Missions and Church Erection, consisting of F. H. Prendergast, President, Marshall, Texas; F. Y.

Hall, Treasurer, Marshall, Texas; Rev. W. M. Robison, Secretary, Jefferson, Texas; Rev. A. A. Collins, Eldorado, Oklahoma; Wm. Clark, Jefferson, Texas, shall be continued as now constituted.

2. That the Secretary of the Board should receive remuneration, and that the Board itself decide what amount, and what further expense, if any, are necessary, and provided for them.

3. That we commend the Board's action in the selection of Field Workers, and recommend that as rapidly as it is found practicable, a Field Worker be placed in every Synod.

4. That each Presbytery be requested to appoint a standing Committee on Missions to act in co-operation with the Board of Missions and Church Erection.

5. That the Assembly urge upon the Presbyteries through their standing Committees on Missions to appoint and sustain Presbyterian Field Workers.

6. That the Board of Missions and Church Erection make strenuous efforts to project and establish a Chinese Mission School at San Francisco, California, under the supervision of Rev. Gam Sing Quah.

7. That if it is at all practicable, the Board employ Rev. J. D. Lewis as Field Worker in the Pacific Synod. In the judgment of the Committee this is a matter of urgent importance.

8. That as the Board is already in communication with the following Field Workers in their respective Synods, to-wit: West Tennessee Synod, Rev. J. D. Lewis; Tennessee Synod, Rev. T. E. Hudson; Alabama Synod, Rev. R. D. Shook; Kentucky Synod, Rev. J. T. Barbee; Arkansas Synod, Rev. T. H. Padgett; Rocky Mountain Country, Rev. N. G. Nicholson; Texas Synod, Revs. S. C. Lockett and B. E. Bowmer.

We recommend that special attention be given to the needs of Mississippi Synod where there is at present no Field Worker.

9. That in regard to the memorial from Gregory Presbytery of the Synod of Texas, asking for a division of the Mission funds of the Synod of Texas, we consider ourselves without jurisdiction, and that the memorial be referred to the Synod of Texas.

10. That the Board take immediate steps to secure whatever property we have in Indianola Synod, especially our interest in Chelsea Academy, and to place a Field Worker in this Synod.

11. That April and October be set apart as special periods for offerings to Missions.

12. That we heartily endorse the appointment and personnel of the Woman's Board, and commend their work, not only to their respective auxiliaries, but to all the congregations of the Church.

XII.—Monument, Report of Committee on.

Whereas, many of the members of this General Assembly, together with a great number of visitors, have for the first time visited the birthplace of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, and

Whereas, that spot of ground will in the future have a new meaning to and influence over all Cumberland Presbyterians; and on account of the events of this meeting of the General Assembly, so near it; and the struggles and epoch making experience through which our Church is now passing, and

Whereas, three years hence will be the Centennial of our beloved Church, therefore Resolved,

1. That a Committee of five be appointed to receive subscriptions from the whole Church, to erect a suitable monument on the identical spot where Rev. McAdow's house stood.

2. That said Committee erect said monument on said identical spot where the old log house stood, within the next three years.

3. That the erection of this monument is commended to each member of the whole Church, that each one may contribute a small sum to the end that the monument may be an expres-

sion of the loyalty to and the affection of the whole denomination for the Cumberland Doctrine and the founders of the denomination.

XIII.—Overtures, Report of Committee on.

To the General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in session at Dickson, Tennessee.

Your Committee on Overtures would submit the following report.

As touching the memorials from East Tennessee, and Morgan Presbyteries, we recommend that no action be taken.

The memorial from Columbia Presbytery asks the General Assembly to take action in organizing our young people into societies in which the distinctive doctrines of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church can be taught.

While your Committee deem this a wise and judicious course, we would urge and recommend the study of the Confession of Faith and Catechism of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. And we would further recommend that every family subscribe for and read the Cumberland Presbyterian Banner. We believe this would be productive of more good than any other means we can employ.

The memorial from Lebanon Presbytery asks the General Assembly to spend one day in fasting and prayer.

Your Committee deem this inexpedient at this late hour. But would recommend that this General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church would designate a day for fasting and prayer for the triumph of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

A memorial from the Corsicana Presbytery asking your venerable body to define the authority of an elder. We, your Committee, are of the opinion that a Ruling Elder is the representative of the congregation to which he belongs, and in no sense is he the representative of himself. See Con. II 95, Sec. 29. "Every particular Church which is willing to support the Gospel as God has prospered it, shall be entitled to be represented by a Ruling Elder in Presbytery.

"Every Ruling Elder not known to the Presbytery shall produce witness of his appointment from the Church he represents."

In view of the foregoing, we would recommend that in all instances where the Ruling Elder cannot represent the will of his congregation, that he decline to act as the representative of his Church in that particular case.

A memorial from Princeton Presbytery to this Assembly to curtail its statistical reports for congregations. We, your Committee, recommend that no change be made.

In regard to the resolution from Columbia Presbytery requesting that Sec. 41 be amended, we recommend that no action be taken.

Second—That all our Churches and Ministers give all co-operation, aid, and encouragement to Dale, Biddle and Horton in their plans for publishing a book of hymns and tunes for the use of Cumberland Presbyterians. Write to them. Biddle's Book of Forms is good. Try it.

Missouri, Texas and Tennessee all deserve our gratitude for giving aid to such self sacrificing publishers of needful literature.

We most heartily endorse the recommendation of our Board of Publication that at least 2,500 additional subscribers be speedily added to the list of the Cumberland Presbyterian Banner.

It will be good when all of our members shall again become readers of our excellent Banner.

1. It is also most heartily recommended that the Board continue their arrangements for our excellent S. S. supplies.

2. We also recommend that the Board be paid \$200.00 out of the Assembly's general fund, for the past year's expense.

3. Inasmuch as your Committee on Sunday Schools and Young People's Work has endorsed the Sunday School Literature published by the Synod of Tennessee, and as the representatives of the Synod of Tennessee offer to us freely and without charge a reasonable amount of space in their weekly paper known as Our Boys and Girls.

We recommend that you use this paper as one of the mediums of our Christian Endeavor Work and that we strive to get all our young people to take the same.

4. That the Assembly's Board of Publication co-operate with the Synod of Tennessee in publishing this literature for

the ensuing year for the reason that the Board of Publication has not come in possession of our Publishing House and other property that is necessary for such work.

5. We ask the General Assembly to endorse and adopt the following:

Whereas, the following named members of the Board of Publication of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church heretofore elected by the General Assembly as members of said Board, to-wit:—W. A. Provine, Hamilton Parks, Charles Manton, W. T. Hardinson, J. M. Johnston, J. H. Reynolds, John H. DeWitt, L. M. Rice and M. G. Wood, have denied allegiance to the Cumberland Presbyterian Church and have declared their allegiance to the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America, and are diverting the property, assets and belongings of said Board of Publication of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church from the use and benefit of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church and are now using the same in the interest of and for the benefit of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America, whose doctrine, polity and sentiments are materially and vitally different from the doctrine, polity and sentiments of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, which is a palpable and flagrant violation of the trust reposed in them.

1. Resolved, therefore, that this General Assembly does hereby depose and remove the aforesaid members of said Board and declare their office as members of said Board vacant and they shall no longer be members of said Board and they are hereby prohibited from exercising any of the powers or rights heretofore possessed by them by reason of their election or appointment as members of said Board of Publication of the Cumberland Presbyterians Church.

2. Be it further resolved, that J. H. Zarecor, F. M. Seagle, A. N. Eshman, R. L. Baskette, J. H. Fussell, Rev. A. C. Biddle, Rev. J. H. Zwingle, W. L. Danley, S. A. Cunningham and W. E. Dunaway be and they are hereby appointed elected and constituted members of the Board of Publication of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, and as such, shall have and possess all the powers, rights and privileges conferred by law upon the Board of Publication of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church by acts of State of Tennessee, 1859-1860, Chap. 167, Sec. 34 and 35, and the amendments thereto, and shall take and possess all property to which said Board is entitled.

Said Board of Publication of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to depose and remove from said Board all such members of said Board as have denied allegiance to the Cumberland Presbyterian Church and who are endeavoring to divert and devote the

use of the property entrusted to said Board from the Cumberland Presbyterian Church and are endeavoring to transfer said property to the use and benefit of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America. And to this end the said Board of Publication of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to bring and defend all suits to acquire and possess all property, assets and belongings of said Board as in the judgment of said Board may be necessary.

And this Board is fully authorized and empowered to do all other things necessary to the end that all property, assets and belongings may be restored to the use of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church to which the same rightfully belongs.

XV.—Sabbath Observance, Report of Committee on.

Your Committee on Sabbath Observance respectfully submit the following report:

That there is a great lack, on the part of a large portion of the membership of the Church today, as well as that of the masses outside of the Church, in observing in its true spirit and purpose, the Christian Sabbath, or what is commonly known as Sunday, and spoken of in the New Testament Scriptures as "The First Day of the Week," and also as "The Lord's Day."

The observance of the Christian Sabbath is even more binding upon all today than the Hebrew Sabbath was upon the Jews, under the Mosaic Economy. This is apparent, when considered in the light of The Purpose, or Design of the Christian Sabbath.

The true purpose or design of the Sabbath of the Old Testament Dispensation, as set forth in Gen. 2:3, Exodus 20:8-11, and in many other Scriptures, was the cessation from the daily avocations in life by man, every seventh day, for the rest and recuperation of his taxed and fatigued powers, and also to be observed as a monumental testimony to the fact that God was the Creator of all things, and hence to be observed in spiritual, devout, grateful recognition of God, as the author and bestower of all temporal and spiritual blessings enjoyed. The spirit and

purpose of the Sabbath of the seventh day, of the Old Testament, was transferred into the Christian Sabbath of the First day of the week, through Jesus Christ, the Lord of the Sabbath. As Jehovah, the Son of God, at the close of His six days labor in creation, set apart the seventh day in the beginning, not by command, but by act, as a Holy Day of rest and spiritual devotion, so Jesus Christ, the Incarnation of Jehovah, the Son of God, by the stupendous act of his resurrection, set apart the first day of the week as the Sabbath of the New Dispensation, adding the rest and the spiritual memorial design of the Jewish Sabbath—that is, its memorial of creation, to the spiritual commemoration of redemption through Jesus Christ. Hence the Christian Sabbath is designed to be kept as a memorial of the Resurrection of the Christ, as a monumental testimony to Jesus our Savior, as the God of both Creation and Redemption, and hence the source of all the privileges and blessings of the Great Divine Salvation, both temporal and spiritual, for Time and Eternity. Therefore to observe the Christian Sabbath, in its true spirit and object, is not only to cease from pursuing the daily avocations of life, to rest the mind and body, but also to spend it in devout thanksgiving and spiritual communion, worship and service of Christ, as a memorial of Him as our Creator, Preserver and Redeemer. Thus in the glorious light of the Gospel, we are under greater obligations to observe the Christian Sabbath than the Jews were to keep the Sabbath of the Mosaic Dispensation, with its enjoined, positive command and severe penalty. Upon the proper observance of the Christian Sabbath is conditioned the perpetuity and prosperity of the Christian Religion. As the Christian Sabbath is observed, neglected or desecrated, does Christianity prosper or decay. Therefore the command of the Decalogue, to “Remember the Sabbath Day to keep it Holy,” in principle, embodied in the spirit and design of the Christian Sabbath, comes to all today in much more sacred and binding force in the light of the full revelation of the Gospel, than it ever did to man in the epochs preceding our Gospel Era.

Hence those who are seeking to abolish our Christian Sabbath, or to employ it in the perversion of its true purpose, as a day of rest and worship and spiritual service, are truly undermining the foundation of morality and National and individual liberty, as truly as those who seek to evade or subvert the law of chastity or of commercial integrity.

There is a great tendency today to change our Sabbath from a Holy Day to a Holiday, in making it a day for worldly amusement, excitement and sinful pleasure. It is secularized even by church members by engaging in their regular secular bus-

iness, whether in buying or selling, or in spending it in shaping up affairs in preparation for the performance of the business of the incoming week. The intense spirit of greed, worldly pleasure and amusement are rapidly increasing the destructive tide of Sabbath breaking and desecration, through the rapidly widening circulation of the Sunday newspapers, in their demoralizing effects, and in the largely increasing business of Sunday excursion trains and also in the great increase of Sunday business, carried on in the open stores and open shops and on the streets, and in fact in all kinds of business, in many of our cities and towns. While in the larger cities Sabbath desecration has reached mammoth proportions, in the open theatres and open saloons, and of all kinds of traffic in business and of the wide open doors of gambling hells and of the houses in the black centers of prostitution and in the great open parks and beer gardens of the cities, and in the Sunday base ball games and races and other like amusements, has already made our Holy Sabbath a day of sinful pleasure and dissipation, to a large portion of the people of our land and to hundreds of thousands of others, it is made a day of toil and weariness, in being forced to labor to serve these worldly pleasure seekers or seekers of gain, or sensual gratification, and are thereby robbed of rest and worship on that day. By this terrible tide of Sabbath desecration, our Holy Sabbath is being swept towards obliteration. It is lowering the standard of morals and of spiritual intelligence, and curtailing the influence and paralyzing the power of the churches of the Christian world in all departments of their work, by depleting the spiritual strength of the membership, and of the attendance at God's House of Worship on the Sabbath Day, and of turning the thousands away from the Sanctuary and thus cutting them off from the weekly opportunity of spiritual instruction and worship in the Sanctuary of the Lord. The violation and desecration of the Sabbath today is not only robbing them of the boon of one of rest out of seven with their loved ones, but also of the privileges and blessings of the worship and service of God's House and at the same time placing them helpless as toiling slaves every day, into the hands of their employers of the large business firms, or of the powerful corporate combines, and is also the great source of supply to all of the destructive evils of today. The mammoth extent of Sabbath breaking and desecration calls with awful appeal to our beloved Church, as well as to all other churches of Christendom, to put forth in the name and power of God, the most strenuous effort to check this growing danger and overcome as far as possible, this awful monster. Therefore we recommend:

1. That the Ministry, Eldership and the Membership of the various congregations of the different Presbyteries and Synods of our Church as a whole, seek through the enduing influence of the Spirit of God, to more fully observe the Sabbath, in accordance with its Divine Spirit and Purpose, than ever before.

2. That neither Minister, Elder or Member of Congregation patronize or condone any phase of Sabbath desecration, however small or questionable it may appear. Such as fishing, hunting, visiting on the Sabbath, or in patronizing Sunday newspapers, Sunday excursions and places of amusement, or traveling on Sunday, or secularizing Sunday in performing secular business of any kind on that day, or by staying at home on that day, neglecting the attendance of worship and service of God's House, so that by strong, emphatic protest against Sabbath desecration, with all of its evils, and by forceful testimony in word, deed and personal example, in true Sabbath keeping, our beloved Church may be enabled to accomplish the most effective work possible in arresting and destroying this evil.

3. That the Ministry and Eldership of our various churches see that the membership of the congregation is duly enlightened concerning the pernicious errors of the Seventh Day Sabbatharians, and that they be warned, whenever necessary, against either aiding or condoning them, in their evil efforts against our Christian Sabbath.

4. That we, as a Church, through our own organic effort, and in united, co-operative organic effort with the other churches of Christendom, use all agencies and means possible under the Divine guidance, in the utmost endeavor for the advancement of the cause of Sabbath observance.

XVI.—Statistics for 1907, Standing Order on.

Whereas, there is no authority, power or right in the Constitution of the Church or inherent or otherwise in the denomination, either in its congregations, its Sessions, its Presbyteries, its Synods or its General Assembly, to transfer the members or the property of any congregation, session, Presbytery, Synod or the General Assembly, to any other denomination: Therefore be it resolved and enacted by this General Assembly as follows:

1. That the Stated Clerk of the General Assembly be and is hereby instructed and directed to retain on the roll of this General Assembly's minutes the names of all Congregations which were reported to the General Assembly by the various Stated Clerks or otherwise, in 1906, of whatsoever Presbytery or Synod.

2. That the various Presbyteries and Synods be and are instructed and directed to retain all the Congregations on their rolls which were there in 1906 before and at the time of the General Assembly of 1906, at Decatur, Illinois.

3. That where there is no report of statistics from Presbyteries and congregations the Stated Clerk of this General Assembly is instructed and directed to make up the statistics approximately from the statistics as reported to the Stated Clerk of the General Assembly for the General Assembly at Decatur, Illinois, May, 1906, and that they so appear in the minutes of this General Assembly.

XVII.—Sunday School and Young People's Work, Report of the Committee on.

We, your Committee on Sunday School and Young People's Work, respectfully submit the following as our report:

Lines of work which concern the youth of the Church are of such importance as to demand your most prayerful consideration and sincere advice. Without needlessly occupying space we make the following recommendations:

(1.) That the general oversight of the Sunday School work as well as all other work that pertains to the Youth of the Church, be committed to the Board of Sunday School and Young People's Work with the following provisions.

First:—That there shall be two departments to be known as the Sunday School Department and the Christian Endeavor Department.

The Sunday School Department should co-operate with the Board of Publications or other agencies found to be necessary in providing the best literature possible under existing conditions for the use of our Sunday Schools.

1. We recommend that the Christian Endeavor Department arrange as early as possible a Denominational Reading Course that will afford means for the education of our young people in the history, doctrines, policy and spirit of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

2. We recommend that the Board have constantly before it a purpose, to create a weekly paper that shall be devoted exclusively to the Sunday School and Young People's Work, but that such enterprise is not to be undertaken until such time as the Board may feel assured that such publication can be

sustained without involving the Board in any financial embarrassment.

Until such publication can be had we recommend that the Board seek to secure special departments in some of the now existing publications, such as the Cumberland Presbyterian Banner and Our Boys and Girls, and that the President of the Board or some one selected by the Board, be the editor of such special department.

Secondly:—It is of course understood that this Board has no power to usurp or interfere with the rights and powers of Church Sessions according to the provision of Sec. 27 of the Constitution of the Church.

1. We recommend that the general plan of prosecuting its work be left to the wisdom of the Board but with the restriction that it shall launch no enterprise likely to involve either the Church or the Board itself in financial embarrassment, without the consent and advice of the General Assembly.

2. We recommend that collections be taken in all congregations in the month of May of each year and forwarded to the Treasurer of the Board hereafter to be announced and that such funds be used by the Board in the prosecution of its work.

We most heartily commend the Sunday School literature now being published by Tennessee Synod through its agent Rev. J. R. Goodpasture of Nashville, Tenn., as being in every way an excellent literature and we would have you urge upon all your Sunday Schools the importance of giving to that enterprise your most hearty and liberal support.

3. We recommend that this Board aim and seek to work in the most absolute harmony with all other Boards of the Church.

4. We recommend that the following named persons be added to the personnel of the Board as it now exists, viz: T. W. Keller and J. M. Gallagher, of Knoxville, Tennessee.

We find a balance of \$40.32 now in the Treasury of the Board and we recommend that it be retained in the Treasury for the use in prosecuting the work of the Board.



We also recommend that you urge your Presbyteries to be very cautious and diligent through their respective Committees on examination, and otherwise, in giving religious and theological instruction to all young men under their care, and not to depend alone on their theological instructors.

We may be fewer in numbers, but I believe we are stronger in the Lord. God says: "Fear not, I am with thee, be not dismayed I am thy God, I will strengthen thee, yea, I will help thee, I will uphold thee, with the right hand of my righteousness."

This promise has been tried and proven as has been shown in this the 77th General Assembly of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. XXXV.—Miscellaneous Regulations.**I. The Assembly Stated Clerk.**

Besides discharging the duties named in Form of Government, the Assembly's Stated Clerk is required:

1. To discharge the duties of Engrossing Clerk, appointing such Temporary Clerks at each meeting of the Assembly as may be needed for his assistance. Minutes, 1872, p. 31; 1873, p. 34.
2. To furnish proper statistical blanks to the Stated Clerks of the lower Church Courts. Minutes, 1873, p. 34; 1897 pp. 24, 26.
3. To report inefficient Stated Clerks to their Presbyteries and Synods. Minutes, 1889, p. 52; 1891, p. 15; 1898, p. 51.
4. The Stated Clerk's salary is \$500.00 per annum.
5. As far as he can do so consistently with other duties, he is to visit Church Courts and congregations and give encouragement and direction toward the general welfare of the Church, and shall be permitted to use also the title "General Traveling Secretary." See Minutes of 1901, p. 115.

II. The Assembly Treasurer.

The Stated Clerk shall also act as the Assembly's Treasurer, for the collection and handling of Contingent Tax. See Minutes of 1900, p. 47.

III. The Assembly Contingent Tax.

1. That the Assembly's Contingent Tax be three cents per resident member.
2. That owing to the urgent and absolute necessity for a fund to conduct the legal expenses of the Assembly, we ask the Presbyteries to raise an amount equal to 20 cents per resident member, the Presbyteries to raise said amount as they in their wisdom may deem best.
3. That Presbyteries and congregations already pledged at this meeting of the Assembly for the Legal Fund shall be credited on this apportionment of 20 cents per member for this Assembly year. See Minutes, Report on Ways and Means, 1907.

The Assembly's Stated Clerk is not authorized to remit the Tax of a Presbytery. Any Presbytery regarding itself as, from any cause, entitled to relief from this tax or any portion thereof, may, by the Counsel and direction of its Synod, petition the Assembly to that effect. Minutes 1898, p. 73.

IV. The Assembly Minutes.

The Assembly Minutes will be sent, free of charge, to ordained ministers, clerks of sessions, the various Boards and schools of the Church, such Synodical and Presbyterian Stated Clerks and Treasurers as are not ministers or session clerks, to those appointed by the Assembly to serve on Committees in the in-

terim of Assembly meetings, to the Stated Clerk's "Exchanges," to all members of each Assembly, and a copy is to be sent to any probationer requesting it and sending ten cents to cover postage. Others desiring the Minutes can secure them by addressing Rev. J. L. Goodknight, Lincoln, Illinois. Minutes 1897, p. 46; 1903, p. 66, 1904, p. 66.

V. Presbyterial and Synodical Meetings.

The Assembly directs that every Presbytery shall hold a "Spring meeting," and as early as possible, and that Stated Clerks of Presbyteries shall have their reports in the hands of the Assembly's Stated Clerk not later than May 1; also that summer meetings of Church Courts shall be held late in the season, in order that there may have been sufficient time to become familiar with the deliverances of the Assembly. See pp. 39a, 67; Minutes, 1898, p. 52.

VI. Stated Clerks of Presbyteries.

The Assembly recommends that, as a matter of convenience and efficiency, Presbytery shall select the same person to serve as its Stated Clerk and Treasurer where this is practicable. Minutes 1897, p. 63.

VII. Examination of Assembly Minutes.

The Assembly directs that each Church Court, from session to Synod at its first meeting after the appearance of the Assembly Minutes, shall conduct in open meeting a careful examination of the Minutes, as a means of discovering whether there be errors and omissions in the same and who is responsible therefore, so that the clerks of Church Courts may be held to rigid account for the discharge of their official duties. See Minutes for 1901, p. 77.

VIII. Report of Board and Permanent Committees.

All the Assembly's Boards and Permanent Committees are ordered to close their books promptly on December 31 (except the Board of Ministerial Relief, which shall close books on January 31), and to have their annual reports in the hands of the Stated Clerk not later than April 1, in order that he may print the same and send them to Commissioners in advance of the Assembly's meeting. See Minutes for 1901, p. 117; 1903, p. 65.

XXXVI.—Assembly's Standing Rule.

In 1901, The General Assembly adopted the following: Resolved, That—

1. Popular meetings shall be held on successive evenings as follows, beginning at 8 o'clock:

Thursday, Home Missions.

Friday, Education.

Saturday, Sunday School and Young People's Work.

Monday, Foreign Missions.

Tuesday, Ministerial Relief.

Wednesday, Publication.

These popular meetings shall be under the direction of the Boards and Committees, respectfully, having these interests specially in charge.

2. Friday forenoon, Assembly business:

Appointment of Committees.

Stated Clerk's Report.

Communications and Overtures.

Reports of Boards and Permanent Committees, etc.

The Boards and Committees are each to occupy not exceeding thirty minutes, and in the following order:

Educational.

Missions and Church Erection.

Publication.

Ministerial Relief.

Assembly Trustees.

As a rule, papers that are in print and in the hands of the members shall be accepted as having been read, those presenting them having opportunity for making remarks within the limits named.

3. Friday afternoon. For so much of this period as may be necessary, the order of the forenoon is to be continued.

4. Assembly business in the forenoons of Saturday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

5. There shall be no business session of the Assembly on the afternoon of Saturday, Monday, Tuesday, the time being devoted to Committee work.

6. Reports of all Standing and Special Committees shall be considered in the order in which they are filed with the Stated Clerk.

7. All resolutions touching the general enterprise of the Church must be referred to appropriate Standing Committees for consideration before they can be taken up by the body.

8. No item of business in conflict with this Standing Rule shall be considered except by suspension of the Rule, by a two-thirds vote.

9. In all cases not provided for in its own Rules of Order, the Assembly is to be governed by Robert's Rules of Order.

10. That we believe it would be wise for arrangements to be made for preaching services at 11 a. m. on Saturday and Monday, and on Saturday and Monday afternoons, for the benefit of the visitors and of the Commissioners who are not engaged in the Committee Rooms; these arrangements to be made by the pastor-host.

Brethren:—

The General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America has received your telegram of greeting, the fraternal and Christian sentiments of which are cordially reciprocated.

We have also in hand your communication protesting against the Reunion and Union of the Presbyterian Church in the U. S. A., and the Cumberland Presbyterian Church, which Reunion and Union was constitutionally completed, May 24, 1906, by the General Assemblies of both Churches.

Replying to your protest, this first General Assembly of the Reunited Church records its deep regret that you and those associated with you has thus far declined to concur in the constitutional action of the majority of the Presbyteries and the two-thirds majority of the General Assembly of the former Cumberland Presbyterian Church, in favor of the Reunion. We hope that when you know the full significance of the Reunion and the full design and import of the steps that led up to it, you will recognize the wisdom of yielding to the legally expressed will of those who have long been your brethren in the Lord, and that you will join us in work for the salvation of souls and the winning of the world to righteousness, in the spirit of Jesus Christ. Believing that strife for the perpetuation of denominational churches of the same faith and order, churches which ought to be one in name and fact, is unwise, we rejoice in the present Reunion and shall pray and labor for Reunion with other Presbyterian churches.

We had not heard until your communication announced it, that anybody had claimed or induced others to believe, that the Presbyterian Church in the U. S. A., had abandoned the Westminster Confession of Faith. This is not true. The fact was in easy view of all, and nobody could have obscured it, if it had been attempted, that the Reunion was effected upon the doctrinal basis of the Westminster Confession of Faith as revised in 1903 and the other doctrinal standards of the Presbyterian Church in the U. S. A.

We feel that your refusal to accept this Reunion is the result of misunderstanding. Proof is found in the fact that you intimate that one of the reasons for your failure to accept the terms of Reunion is, that you did not believe that the Westminster Confession of Faith as revised in 1903, was regarded by this church as being in practical accord with the Confession of Faith of the former Cumberland Presbyterian Church. We emphasize that the General Assembly and the Presbyteries of this Church, in adopting the plan of Reunion declared that there was sufficient agreement between the systems of doctrine of the two churches to warrant this Union, a Union alike honoring to both. We reiterate this statement in the most solemn manner.

We further draw your attention to the quotations you make from the Pastoral Letter which was addressed to you by the Decatur Cumberland Presbyterian General Assembly. These are not justly described by you when you state that they are "misleading and unjustifiable," nor do we sympathize with you in characterizing the conduct of those Cumberland Presbyterians who have accepted the Union as being a "cruel and unsanctified course of wrong and oppression." Your additional charge against these pure and earnest men as "despoilers," whose purpose it is to "wrest" from you property to which you and your associates are entitled, is altogether unwarranted. In this connection, it is well to advise that we and you endeavor to observe the obligations of Christian courtesy.

Like yourselves, we regret that your unwillingness to accept the Reunion, and your appeal to the Courts, have rendered it necessary to ask the courts of the several States to determine the property questions involved. It has been repeatedly announced by the friends of Reunion in the former Cumberland Presbyterian Church and by the Reunited Church, that it is not the purpose of these suits, and it is not the design of any, to take away from former Cumberland Presbyterians who protest against the Reunion, any property or other right to which they are legally or morally entitled. Your assumption that all the property of the former Cumberland Presbyterian Church belongs to you and your associates is untenable in both law and morals. We shall be careful ourselves to follow in all our relations to

property and other matters, those equitable and reasonable principles which are given for our guidance in the Word of God, and to act towards you as becomes brethren in the Lord.

Brethren, there is a large work to be done for our common country, in the name and for the sake of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. There is in the heathen world an open door for united effort for its redemption. We tender to you a hearty invitation to accept the Reunion, and to co-operate with us, in all Christian work. Come with us and we will do you good, and our united labors will be a blessing to our country and to the world.
